2006-07 REVIEW NOTEBOOK

- The Terrapins made their 14th consecutive postseason appearance by earning the No. 4 seed in the Midwest Region of the NCAA Tournament. Maryland finished the season 25-9, marking the 11th straight season the Terps have won at least 19 games. The Terrapins finished with a 10-6 record in the Atlantic Coast Conference, which tied for the second-best record in the league. Maryland's 10 conference victories was its highest win total in league play since 2002-03.
- Maryland finished the season ranked 18th in the Associated Press Poll and 23rd in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. The Terps were 13th in the Sagarin Ratings and finished the year 16th in RPI. Maryland's scheduled was ranked the 15th toughest in the nation.
- Maryland's 25 victories was the highest single-season win total since the Terrapins won 32 games en route to the 2002 National Championship. The Terps' 25 wins was tied for the fourth-highest win total of any Gary Williams-led team.
- The Terps finished the season 3-0 against Duke and North Carolina, marking the first time since 1938-39 that Maryland swept the Blue Devils and Tar Heels. With wins over Davidson, High Point, NC State and Wake Forest, Maryland swept the entire state of North Carolina for the first time since 1932-33.
- Scoring 79.0 points per game, the Terps ranked second in the ACC and 13th nationally in scoring offense. The Terrapins led the ACC in three-point field goal percentage (.385). Maryland averaged 17.3 assists, which ranked second in the league and 14th nationally.
- Maryland was among the nation's best defensive teams in 2006-07. The Terps led the ACC and were eighth in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.389). Maryland was tops in the ACC and fifth in the country for blocked shots (6.9 bpg). The Terrapins also led the ACC in three point field goal percentage defense (.302).
- Three Maryland seniors joined an elite club during 2006-07 as **Ekene Ibekwe**, **Mike Jones** and **D.J. Strawberry** each reached the 1,000-point plateau. Jones finished his career 30th on Maryland's all-time scoring list with 1,180 points. Strawberry tallied 1,126 career points to finish in 35th place, while Ibekwe recorded 1,109 points to rank 37th in scoring all-time.

Strawberry was named Second Team All-ACC as a senior. He finished 11th in the ACC in scoring (14.9 ppg) and ranked ninth in field goal percentage (.477). Strawberry was also named to the ACC All-Defensive Team as he paced the Terrapins and ranked fourth in the ACC in steals per game (2.03 spg). He was a three-time ACC Player of the Week honoree and was named to the USBWA All-District Team.



Ibekwe was named to the ACC All-Defensive Team and garnered honorable mention All-ACC plaudits. He led the league and was 15th in the country with 2.7 blocked shots per game and ranked fourth in rebounds (7.8 rpg). Ibekwe finished his career with 1,109 points, 781 rebounds, and 230 blocked shots, becoming just the fourth Terps to record 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 200 blocked shots.

Jones capped his career as one of the most prolific three-point shooters in school history. He finished with 203 career three-pointers, which ranked second all-time at Maryland. Jones attempted 495 career three pointers, which was the third-highest total in school history. He knocked down 81 three pointers this season, marking the third highest single-season total for a senior at Maryland.





NEW YORK (AP) — D.J. Strawberry scored 17 points for Maryland, which shot 55 percent from the field in beating Michigan State on Friday night to win the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

The Terrapins (5-0) were able to win despite scoring just two points over the final 3-1/2 minutes and survived a hectic ending.

Michigan State (4-1) used a 6-2 run to get within 62-59 with 1:21 to play. Each team turned the ball over and Maryland called a timeout with 12 seconds to play and 4 seconds left on the shot clock.

The Terrapins inbounded the ball near midcourt and freshman guard Eric Hayes was forced to let go a long 3-point attempt as the clock ran out. It appeared the ball missed the rim, which would have been a violation, but Michigan State's Ilong Ilok grabbed the rebound.


He turned with the ball with his arms raised and was called for an offensive foul.

Strawberry, selected the tournament's MVP, missed two free throws with 4.5 seconds left.

Michigan State's Drew Neitzel was fouled with 0.2 seconds left before he could get a shot attempt off. He made the first free throw and missed the second on purpose but the Spartans couldn't get off a clean tip.

Neitzel hit a 3 with 5:19 left to get the Spartans within 52-51, but Mike Jones and Greivis Vasquez each hit a 3 in an 8-2 run that put the Terrapins up 60-53 with 3:42 left. James Gist, who had 14 points, capped that run with a dunk with 3:42 left, Maryland's last field goal of the game.

Maryland, which crushed St. John's 92-60 in its semifinal, forced Michigan State into 18 turnovers, three off its average for the first four games of the season.

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) - Maryland freshman Greivis Vasquez wasn't bothered by Illinois' loud homecourt that has been intimidating to visiting non-conference schools for eight years.

Terps teammate Mike Jones even likened the atmosphere to the raucous one at Duke's Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Tuning out the orange-clad partisans, Vasquez and Jones led Maryland to a 72-66 win Tuesday night, ending Illinois' 51-game non-conference winning streak at Assembly Hall dating back to 1988.

Vasquez scored 15 of his 17 points in the second half as the Terps recovered after losing a large lead. Vasquez's steal and layup with 1:22 left to play gave the Terps the 65-60 lead.

With Jones scoring 19 and Vasquez playing like an experienced veteran, Maryland was able to overcome the absence of shot blocker and rebounder Ekene Ibekwe, who sat out with an ankle injury. The Terps' 8-0 start is their best since the 1988-89 team won its first 10.

Maryland (8-0) built a 14-point lead less than 8 minutes into the game and was up 20-6 when James Gist dunked with 12:55 left in the first half. Jones and Gist led Maryland in the first half. Jones had 13 points including 3-of-3 3-point shooting, and Gist added 9 points and 5 rebounds.

Maryland increased the lead to 29-14 when Jones hit another 3-pointer with just more than 7 minutes to go in the half. The Illini (7-1), behind Warren Carter, went on a 12-3 run in the last 6:48 of the first half to make it 33-28 at the break.

Illinois' Trent Meacham made two free throws cut it to three with 1:59 to go before Vasquez made his key steal. Osby, who filled in nicely for Ibekwe, made a pair of free throws to give the Terps a 67-60 advantage with 43 seconds to play.

Tyrese Rice scored 17 points — 12 in the first half when the Eagles (6-2, 1-0) opened a 19-10 lead and never trailed. Maryland (9-2, 0-1) tied it twice in the first half but never got closer than three points in the second.

James Gist had 17 points and 10 rebounds for the Terrapins, who were off to their best start since going 10-0 to begin the 1998-99 season, a year they went to the NCAA regional semifinals.

Bambale Osby had 10 points and nine rebounds for the Terps. D.J. Strawberry, Maryland's leading scorer at 15.2 points per game, picked up two fouls in the first 44 seconds and scored just two points in eight minutes in the first half. He finished with five points.

BC led 58-50 before Osby scored on a putback, but missed the foul shot that would have given him a three-point play. Mike Jones made a 3-pointer to cut the deficit to 58-55 with 6:25 to play.

It was 63-59 when BC scored the next six points, starting with a blocked shot by Williams and a fast-break jam by Sean Marshall. After Dudley missed three free throws, Williams hit a turnaround from the left side and Dudley hit a short jumper in the lane to make it 69-59 with 1:22 left.

Dudley moved into the top 10 on BC's all-time list with 1,654 points, passing Michael Adams. Adams was part of the Eagles team that went to the regional finals in 1982; that team was coached by Gary Williams, who is the head coach at Maryland with Adams as an assistant.

Wake Forest whittled away at Maryland's lead, pulling within 74-69 on Williams' 3-pointer with 30.6 seconds left. But the Terrapins hit 5 of 6 from the free throw line in the final 28 seconds to preserve their second ACC win in three games.

The win also made Maryland head coach Gary Williams the third coach in league history to reach 150 regular-season ACC victories, joining former North Carolina coach Dean Smith and Duke's Krzyzewski.

Ibekwe became the 44th Terrapins player and the second this season - the other was Mike Jones, who passed the mark on Jan. 30 against Florida State - to score 1,000 career points.

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) - Maryland is suddenly looking like a team that nobody wants to play in March.

Mike Jones scored 25 points and D.J. Strawberry had a pair of baskets during a decisive second-half spurt Wednesday night to lead the 24th-ranked Terrapins past No. 14 Duke, giving the Terrapins their sixth straight victory.

Strawberry finished with 17 points for the Terps (23-7, 9-6 Atlantic Coast Conference), whose win streak - all in

conference games - has firmed up its NCAA tournament resume.

The contributions came from everywhere Wednesday. Ekene Ibekwe also scored 17 points, while freshman point guard Greivis Vasquez showed no sign of nerves in front of a hostile Cameron Indoor Stadium crowd en route to 13 points, 12 assists and nine rebounds in 37 minutes.

Maryland led by 12 points midway through the second half. Then, after Duke made a run to tie it, the Terrapins took control in the final five minutes for their second season sweep of the Blue Devils (22-8, 8-7) in three years.

The Terrapins shot 52 percent for the game, hit 7 of 13 3-pointers and blocked eight shots while committing just 13 turnovers. Jones went 9-for-15 from the field and 4-for-5 from 3-point range.

The Blue Devils had won four straight since losing at Maryland 72-60, a defeat that dropped the Blue Devils out of The Associated Press Top 25 for the first time in 11 years. But they couldn't avenge that loss, shooting 41 percent and coming up empty on several key possessions down the stretch.

Maryland led 35-29 at the half and stretched the lead to 49-36, but NC State battled back until the decisive run that stretched the lead from six points to 20.

Brandon Costner led NC State with 20 points and Gavin Grant added 15 points.

The win completed a sweep of the four North Carolina teams in the conference for the first time since 1932-33, with a 6-0 mark. That year, they played only North Carolina and Duke.

The game was the last in the college careers for six Maryland seniors - Strawberry, Jones, Ekene Ibekwe, Parrish Brown, Will Bowers and Gini Chukura. The senior class of 2007 left the legacy, though, of returning the Terrapins to the NAAs after a two-season hiatus.
