Gary Williams On Dave Neal:

"Our only senior, we're all hoping Dave can stay healthy. He's been injured most of the time during his career at the university."

On Neal:

Lone senior on this year's team... has played 62 games in his three seasons with the Terrapins... outstanding physical presence whose strength helps solidify the front line... smart player and solid passer whose court sense has made him a contributor in key situations.

As a Junior (2007-08):

Played in 22 games ... earned the Maryland Basketball Academic Award for the second consecutive season ... made his first career start against North Florida (Nov. 11) and went 3-of-6 from the field for a season-high seven points while pulling down four rebounds ... played a career-high 20 minutes against the Ospreys ... missed nine games due to a separated shoulder ... scored five points off the bench at Duke (Jan. 27) ... scored six points in eight minutes at Charlotte (Jan. 5) ... returned to the Terrapins lineup after his injury and played 13 minutes and pulled down four rebounds against American University (Dec. 22) ... scored four points, grabbed two rebounds, and recorded two steals against Hampton (Nov. 12) ... hit a total of four three-pointers on the season, including three vs. ACC schools: Boston College (Dec. 9), Duke (Jan. 27) and Virginia (March 9) ... grabbed two steals twice, against Hampton and Charlotte.

As a Sophomore (2006-07):

Played in 27 games during his sophomore season ... averaged 1.6 points and 1.2 rebounds per contest ... came off the bench and grabbed a rebound against Butler (March 17) ... entered the

game late and knocked down two free throws against Davidson (March 15) ... played in a reserve roll against Miami (March 8), NC State (March 3) and Duke (Feb. 28) ... contributed off the bench at Clemson (Feb. 18) ... scored four points and grabbed five rebounds in 14 minutes at NC State (Feb. 14) ... played seven minutes and scored two points against Duke (Feb. 11) ... knocked down a three-pointer against Virginia (Feb. 6) ... scored four points and pulled down two rebounds in eight minutes against Georgia Tech (Jan. 24) ... came off the bench and contributed in wins over Iona (Jan. 4) and Siena (Dec. 31) ... chipped in two points vs. Mount St. Mary's (Dec. 28) ... scored six points on 3-of-5 shooting in four minutes against Missouri-Kansas City (Dec. 13) ... grabbed two rebounds in four minutes against Fordham (Dec. 6) ... played nine minutes off the bench and recorded his first career blocked shot against Winthrop (Nov. 20) ... scored two points in two minutes against Michigan State (Nov. 17) ... scored six points and grabbed four rebounds in 12 minutes against Florida A&M (Nov. 12) ... recorded career highs in points (8) and rebounds (8) against Hampton (Nov. 7).

As a freshman (2005-06):

Appeared in 13 games during 2005-06 ... averaged 1.0 points and 0.6 rebounds per game ... saw first-half action against North Carolina (Feb. 2) and N.C. State (Feb. 5) ... made his first career appearance in an ACC game against Duke (Jan. 11) and finished with two points, a rebound, and a steal ... scored a personal-best seven points in seven minutes against VMI (Dec. 31) ... went 2-for-2 from the foul line in four minutes against Western Carolina

(Dec. 7) ... recorded two rebounds in a six-minute stretch against Chaminade (Nov. 22) ... scored his first collegiate points and grabbed a rebound in five minutes against Fairleigh Dickinson (Nov. 18) in the season opener.

At Bishop O'Connell:

Starred at Bishop O'Connell in Arlington, Va., for four years, participating in 116 career victories (29 wins per season) ... averaged 20.2 points per game and 13.3 rebounds as a senior in leading O'Connell to a 31-3 record ... named MVP of the prestigious Alhambra Catholic Invitational Tournament in Cumberland, Md. and the MVP of the Virginia state tournament as a senior ... earned first team All-Met honors from the Washington Post and was a unanimous first team Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC) all league choice in his final season ... helped squad to the 2004 WCAC championship as a junior ... credited with seven game-winning shots in his career ... high school teammate and classmate of Marcus Ginyard, who he and the Terps will face at North Carolina ... high school coach was Joe Wootten.



Gary Williams On Eric Hayes:

"As a junior, he'll be expected to be one of our key players this year. We're looking for Eric to play a greater offensive role."

On Hayes:

Started 30 games in the backcourt as a sophomore and averaged 33 minutes per game... excellent long-range shooter, has hit 39 percent of 3-pointers in his career... equally adept at running the break or executing the half-court offense... son of a coach who understands the game.

As a Sophomore (2007-08):

Played in 31 games and made 30 starts for the Terrapins ... averaged 9.9 points, 4.5 assists and 3.2 rebounds per game ... finished the season sixth in the ACC in assists per game (4.45) and fourth in assist to turnover ratio (1.89) ... recorded 138 assists, the eighth highest single-season total at Maryland ... knocked down 56 three-point shots, the second-highest total for a sophomore in school history ... earned the team's Outstanding Free Throw Shooter Award after connecting on 85 percent of his attempts ... set a career high with 19 points vs. Morgan State (Dec. 6) ... scored in double figures 16 times, while dishing out five or more assists on 15 occasions ... tied his career high with seven rebounds while adding eight points against Florida State (Feb. 16) ... chipped in 14 points, going 4-for-5 from the floor and 4-for-4 from the foul line, against NC State (Feb. 9) ... scored 14 points and added eight assists at Georgia Tech (Feb. 2) ... recorded nine assists for the second straight game while adding 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting against Virginia (Jan. 30) ... handed out nine assists while recording eight points and five rebounds against Duke (Jan. 27) ... contributed seven points and six assists while tying a career high with four steals at Charlotte (Jan. 5) ... went 6-of-9 from the floor for 12 points while dishing out six assists against Savannah State (Jan. 2) ... tied a career high with seven rebounds against Delaware (Dec. 28) ... scored 16 points while going 6-for-11 from the floor, including 4-of-8 from

beyond the arc against American (Dec. 22) ... scored 13 points while tying a career high with seven rebounds against Boston College (Dec. 9) ... dished out seven assists while adding seven points and five rebounds against VCU (Dec. 2) ... scored 18 points while knocking down four three-pointers and recording a career-high four steals against Illinois (Nov. 28) ... recorded 11 points, seven assists, and four rebounds against Lehigh (Nov. 23) ... scored 10 points, secured a career high seven rebounds and dished out six assists against Missouri (Nov. 20) ... recorded 11 points, going 3-for-4 from beyond the arc, and added three rebounds against Northeastern (Nov. 15) ... tallied 15 points and eight assists against North Florida (Nov. 11).

As a Freshman (2006-07):

Played in all 34 games and made 11 starts as a freshman ... earned the team's Most Outstanding Free Throw Shooter Award ... dished out 132 assists, the sixth-highest single-season total for a freshman at Maryland ... finished ninth in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 3.88 assists per game ... ranked fourth in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.83) ... led the team in assists 10 times ... led the squad in steals on six occasions ... averaged 4.8 points per game ... connected on 39 percent (22-of-56) of his three pointers ... went 31-of-34 (.912) from the free throw line ... made his first 16 free throws to start the season ... recorded at least five assists 12 times as a freshman ... scored six points and dished out six assists against NC State (March 3) ... recorded five assists and five rebounds in 20 minutes against North Carolina (Feb. 25) ... tied his career high with eight assists against Florida State (Feb. 21) ... scored eight points and dished out six assists at NC State (Feb. 14) ... tied his season high with 12 points at Wake Forest (Feb. 3) ... set his career high with 12 points against Georgia Tech (Jan. 24) ... recorded seven assists, five rebounds

Capped a stellar four-year career at Potomac high school with a record of 100-9, including a mark of 79-3 his last three seasons ... played for his father Kendall, and guided the Panthers to an undefeated regular season (22-0) as a senior before losing in the regional semifinals ... team captain and team MVP as a junior and senior ... earned 3A First-Team All-State honors and First-Team All-Met honors from the Washington Post ... named First-Team All-Area by the Potomac News ... garnered Blackhawk Christmas Tournament MVP honors ... finished his career with 1,698 points ... scored 20 or more points on 14 occasions ... averaged 21.3 points, as a senior and connected on 71 three-pointers ... connected on 86-percent of his free throws as a senior ... tallied a season-high 40 points against Forest Park ... averaged 18.9 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.7 seals, and 6.4 assists as a junior, leading the Panthers to a 26-1 record ... named district MVP as a junior ... tallied 12.3 points, 7.6 assists, 2.5 steals, and 3.5 rebounds as a sophomore ... earned Second-Team Cedar Run All-District plaudits as a freshman after averaging 10.5 points and 4.4 assists per game ... earned first-team All-District honors as a freshman in football.
