# **Pre-Spring Notes**

### TERPS OPEN SPRING PRACTICE...

- The University of Maryland will open spring football practice Tuesday, March 25 as the Terps hold their first of 15 workouts over the course of five weeks. The Terps will practice three times per week (each Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday), concluding spring ball with the annual Red-White Spring Game on Saturday, April 26. The spring game will kick off at 3:30 p.m. ET at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium. The game is the culmination of Maryland Day, a university-sponsored family celebration.
- Maryland will also hold a scrimmage at 2 p.m. on Saturday, April 19 in Byrd Stadium as part of Gridiron Bash, a venture to combine spring football and live music on campuses around the country. Maryland is one of 16 universities participating in the event. Good Charlotte and O.A.R., local bands with national followings, will hold a concert at 7 p.m. The scrimmage is free, while tickets for Gridiron Bash, priced at \$37 can be purchased through Maryland Athletics by calling 1-800-IM-A-TERP.
- The Red-White Spring Game and the Gridiron Bash scrimmage are open to the public, but the rest of the practice sessions are closed. Only members of the Maryland Gridiron Network and Terrapin Club, as well as Maryland students, will be allowed to attend the workouts. All practice sessions and scrimmages are open to the media.

Friedgen will be available in his office, while player interviews will occur in the offensive line room. Thursday workouts are open to the media, though there will be no post-practice availability.

### **QUICK HITTERS...**

- The Terps return 46 letterwinners, including 14 starters (nine offense/five defense), from last year's squad (see chart in the right column and on page 3).
- Maryland reached its fifth bowl game in the last seven years in 2007, appearing in the Emerald Bowl where the Terps had their school record three-game postseason victory string snapped in a 21-14 loss to Oregon State. The Terps ended the year 6-7 with four of their five conference losses coming by one score or less.
- The Terps faced three top-10 teams last season and went 2-1 in those contests. It marked the first time in school history the Terps defeated two top-10 teams in the same season. They lost to No. 4 West Virginia, 31-14, on Sept. 13, downed No. 10 Rutgers, 34-24, on Sept. 29, and defeated No. 8 Boston College (Nov. 10).
- The Terps were one of only four teams in the country (also Kentucky, LSU and Illinois) to defeat two top-10 teams in 2007.
- One season after being decimated with injuries on the offensive line, the Terps are poised to have one of the top lines in the ACC. The Terps will have four (LT Scott Burley, LG Jaimie Thomas, C Edwin Williams, and RT Dane Randolph) of their five starting

offensive linemen back, as well as starting QB Chris Turner and all of the receiving corps, headlined by All-America choice Darrius Heyward-Bey. Turner started the final eight games last season, ending the year third in the ACC in passing efficiency. Heyward-Bey leads a receiving corps which returns its top four wideouts from last season.

- Maryland will need to replace both its tailbacks as Keon Lattimore and Lance Ball have completed their eligibility. Ball finished his career No. 4 on the Maryland career rushing list while Lattimore is 14th on that list. Sophomores Da'Rel Scott and Morgan Green enter the spring No. 1 and 2, respectively, on the depth chart at tailback. Each has talent, but they have only combined for 17 career carries.
- The defense does not return nearly as many starters as the offense, but has a number of players who saw significant action last season. Senior linebacker Dave Phillistin is one five returning starters from a defense which finished 24th in the country in scoring defense and 40th in total defense last season. Philistin ranked fourth in the ACC and 38th nationally in tackles (9.5 pg). Returning starters Jeremy Navarre (DE) and Trey Covington (LEO) are two of the most experienced players on the team, having each started more than 30 career games. Navarre is expected to move inside along the line.
- The defense will have to replace three members of the secondary where senior cornerback **Kevin Barnes**, who had a team-high four interceptions and ranked tied for fifth in the ACC in passes defended, is lone returning starter.
- One season after overhauling the special teams unit, the Terps enter this spring with almost a full complement of starters. However, they will have a new field general as **Danny Pearman** is the new special teams coordinator. Senior **Obi Egekeze** and sophomore **Travis Baltz** form one of the top kicking tandems in the ACC, while senior **Danny Oquendo** is in his third season as the punt returner and Scott is back as the kick returner.

### **NEW FACES...**

The Terps have three new coaches on staff, including assistant head coach/offensive coordinator James Franklin, special teams coordinator/tight ends coach Danny Pearman and wide receivers coach Lee Hull. Franklin was on staff during Ralph Friedgen's first four seasons. Franklin will also oversee the quarterbacks. Though the Terps will now employ more of a west-coast based offense, much of what Franklin has learned offensively comes from Friedgen's influence. Franklin was also the offensive coordinator at Kansas State the last two years after spending one season with the Green Bay Packers. Pearman spent the last two seasons with Duke and North Carolina, but also tutored for eight seasons under Frank Beamer at Virginia Tech, one of the top special teams coaches in the nation. Hull comes from Oregon State, which defeated the Terps in their last game, the 2007 Emer-

### **TOUGH ROAD IN 2008...**

According to the NCAA, the Terps' 2007 schedule was the 29th-most difficult in the nation, based on records of their opposition (76-59/.563). The 2008 schedule features seven teams which played in bowl games last season. In addition, all four of the Terps' ACC road games feature an opponent ranked at the end of last season or which received votes in the final 2007 polls. The four league teams Maryland will play on the road - Clemson, Virginia, Virginia Tech and Boston College - each won nine or more games in 2007.

### SELECT COMPANY...

- Ralph Friedgen's 56 career wins are the third-most by any ACC coach through seven seasons on the job, while his 50 wins through 2006 ranks tied for second in Atlantic Coast Conference history among coaches in their first six seasons. Danny Ford of Clemson posted 51 from 1979-84 and Dick Crum of North Carolina (1978-82) also tallied 50.
- · Though he was the top second-, third- and fourthyear coach in ACC history by wins, Friedgen's five-year win total (41) fell short of the mark of 44 victories set by Clemson's Danny Ford from 1979-83. That mark tied him for second on the list with former Terrapin great Jerry Claiborne (1972-76). Claiborne holds the league's seven-year mark with 58 victories. Friedgen currently has 55.

### BYRD UNDER CONSTRUCTION...

Maryland is in the constuction phase of a \$50.8 million expansion of Tyser Tower in Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium. The new facility will include suites, new areas for working media and new booths for radio and television. Construction is being done in phases with the goal of opening prior to the 2009 season. Phase One, which began in November 2007, includes the expansion of Tyser Tower which includes the addition of 64 suites, mezzanine seating for 500, new work area for television, radio and print media, new work area for coaches and gameday staff, a new merchandise outlet, enhanced seating for disabled customers and a new state-ofthe-art video scoreboard. Phase Two will include installation of railings in the north and south lower bowl, chairback seating in the 200 level on the north side and additional restrooms and consessions on the south side. The playing field will be lowered to improve site lines in the first 10 rows and converting those 3,000 seats into some of the best in the stadium.

# TERPS TO PARTICIPATE IN GRIDIRON BASH...

The University of Maryland will play host to Gridiron Bash™ The Ultimate Fan Competition™ on Saturday, April 19 in Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium. Gridiron Bash, an endeavor to combine spring football and live music on campuses around the country, will feature a Terps football scrimmage followed by performances of two nationally-renowned bands with local ties. The Maryland football team opens the festivities at 2 p.m. ET with a scrimmage, giving fans their first opportunity to see the 2008 edition of the Terps. Later that day there will be live music sandwiched around a pep rally. Maryland-based, roots-rock band O.A.R. (Of a Revolution) kicks off the music portion of the day-long event at 7 p.m. In keeping with the football gameday theme, the audience will then get treated to a pep rally followed by a performance from multiplatinum, MTV award-winning pop punk band Good Charlotte, which also hails from state of Maryland. "This is a unique opportunity for our fans and the local community," Maryland Coach Ralph Friedgen said. "They'll have a chance to see us play twice in the spring under game-like conditions, and see live music in a gameday atmosphere." Maryland is one of 16 universities participating in the inaugural event, which will take place over a two-day span (April 18-19). Other schools include Tennessee, Penn State, Colorado, Texas A&M, Arizona State, Kansas State, West Virginia and Rutgers. Musical acts performing around the country include ZZ Top, Fergie, Counting Crows, the Goo Goo Dolls and Kelly Clarkson. Admission to the scrimmage is free. Tickets for Gridiron Bash, priced at \$37, are on sale at the University of Maryland ticket office (1-800-IM-A-TERP). Tickets will also be available for purchase through www.gridironbash.com. All seating in the stadium will be reserved.

# TERRAPINS RISING' GOES BEHIND THE SCENES WITH MARYLAND FOOTBALL FOR A SECOND TIME...

'Terrapins Rising,' a reality television show chronicling spring practice, will give fans a behind-the-scenes look at the inner workings of a major college football program for the second straight season. The show is a first of its show of its kind. The 10-episode series, which was being presented by Under Armour, begins on June 16 and airs weekly each Monday on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic. 

- Ralph Friedgen is in his eighth year as Maryland's head football coach. He is the 33rd man to hold the post at the university and it is his first head coaching position.
- Friedgen's current record at Maryland -- which also serves as his career mark -- stands at 56-31 (.644), including the first back-to-back-to-back 10-win seasons in school history (10-2 in 2001, 11-3 in 2002 and 10-3 in 2003).
- The 56 wins in seven seasons are more than the Terps had (55) in the 14 years prior to his arrival.
- Four of the school's 13 nine-win seasons have come in Friedgen's tenure.
- During the 2007 campaign, the Terps defeated two top 10 teams (No. 10 Rutgers, No. 8 Boston College).
   The Terps had never upended two top 10 teams in the same season. They are also one of only four teams in the nation (LSU, Kentucky, Illinois) to accomplish that feat in 2007.
- Under Friedgen, the Terps posted a school-record three-straight bowl wins (2003, 04, 06). The Terps have out-scored their last four bowl opponents by a 109-38 margin.
- He has led Maryland to bowl appearances in five
  of his seven seasons, including dominating wins
  in the 2004 Toyota Gator Bowl (41-7) and a 2002
  Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (30-3) victory over perennial
  national power Tennessee (a team ranked fifth in
  the two major preseason polls). The Terrapins also
  earned a BCS Orange Bowl berth during the 2001
  campaign.
- Friedgen's 56 career wins are the thrid most by any ACC coach through his first seven seasons as head coach.
- In his first four years at Maryland, Friedgen set the ACC record for wins (36) by a fourth-year head coach. He tied for second in the ACC in wins by a fifth-year coach.
- Friedgen is the second-most successful sixth-year coach in ACC history, with his 50-24 mark (through the end of 2006) eclipsing those of such former league mentors as Bobby Ross and Lou Holtz. Friedgen is currently 19th among all active coaches for Football Bowl Division (formerly Division I-A) victories.
- Maryland posted a school record tying 11 victories in 2002, when the Terps won 10 of their last 11 games. Only the 1976 team won as many contests.

- By winning 11 games in 2002, Friedgen became just the second coach in school history to do so (Jerry Claiborne, 1976) while becoming the first coach in Terrapin lore to win 10 games in three straight campaigns.
- Friedgen led the Terps to a top 20 final national ranking in both major national polls for three straight years (2001-03).

Maryland ended 2003 ranked 17th in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press. In 2002, the Terps were ranked 13th in both polls and in 2001 the team finished 10th in the *ESPN/USA Today* poll and 11th in the AP standings. It was the program's best three-year ranking finish since 1974-76 (when the Terps finished 13th, 13th and eighth).

- Friedgen has a 33-23 (.589) Atlantic Coast Conference record, including a 7-1 mark in 2001 when the Terps became the first team other than Florida State to win an outright ACC title since the Seminoles joined the league, and a 6-2 mark and runner-up finish in 2002
- He has 33 wins in 44 games at Chevy Chase Bank Field at Byrd Stadium, where the Terps averaged a school-record 52,426 fans in 2005 and 51,263 in 2007.
- He led his 2001 team to just the fifth 10-win season in school history and its first ACC title since 1985.
- By winning the ACC title in 2001, Friedgen became the first mentor in conference history to win the championship in his first year as a head coach. He also tied the mark of 10-2 set by Ken Hatfield (Clemson) in 1990, the best record ever by an ACC coach in his first season.
- Prior to his current stint in College Park, Friedgen served as Georgia Tech's offensive coordinator for nine of the previous 14 years.
- From 1998-2000, Friedgen orchestrated a Yellow Jacket offensive unit that averaged 36.7 points and 444 yards of total offense per game, while posting a cumulative record of 27-8 (.771).
- Friedgen was the offensive coordinator at Maryland under Bobby Ross when the Terps won three consecutive ACC titles in the mid-'80s.
- The 60-year-old Friedgen owns the rare distinction of coordinating the offense of a collegiate national champion (Georgia Tech in 1990) and a Super Bowl participant (the San Diego Chargers in 1994).
- In his first five years as a full-time coach at Maryland (1982-86), Friedgen was instrumental (along with QB coach Joe Krivak) in the development of future pro quarterbacks Boomer Esiason, Frank Reich and Stan Gelbaugh, all of whom spent at least a decade in the NFL.
- A 1970 graduate of Maryland who also earned his master's degree in College Park, Friedgen came to
