## 2010 Football Game Notes

# Season Review

(9-4, 5-3 ACC)

## FIRST-AND-10...

• Maryland capped off the 2010 season with a convincing 51-20 win over East Carolina in the Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman. **Da'Rel Scott** ran for a school bowl-record 200 yards and two touchdowns. Scott helped the Terps post a season-best 297 yards on the ground by scoring on runs of 61 and 91 yards, the fourth-longest rushing TD in ACC history. Freshman **DJ Adams** added four TD runs enabling Maryland to post its highest point total in a bowl game. East Carolina, which made its fifth straight bowl appearance, came into the game with one of the most potent offenses in the nation. The Pirates ranked seventh nationally in passing offense (319.3 ypg) and 12th in scoring (38.2 ppg), but the Terrapins forced four turnovers. Freshman LB **David Mackall** returned a Dominique Davis interception 35 yards to the ECU 1-yard line at the start of the second half, which set up Adams' second TD. Maryland added two more third quarter TDs to take a 37-13 lead and never looked back in **Ralph Friedgen's** final game as head coach.

• The Terrapins, who finished tied for second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and had the second-best turnaround in the FBS, ended with at least nine wins for the first time since 2006 and 14th time in school history. They concluded the year ranked for the first time since 2003 (No. 23 in the AP; No. 24 in the *USA Today* Coaches).

• The Maryland offense was an evolving and improving unit throughout the season under third-year coordinator and assistant head coach **James Franklin**. The Terps, who posted over 400 total yards in five of the last six games, ranked 29th nationally in scoring offense (32.2 ppg) and held onto the ball. Only four teams in the FBS had fewer turnovers than Maryland and QB **Danny O'Brien**, the ACC Rookie of the Year, posted the third-lowest interception (2.37) percentage in the country among freshmen. RBs **Da'Rel Scott** and **Davin Meggett**, and WR **Torrey Smith** provided big plays for an offense which has scored 11 times on the season on plays of 40 yards or more. Smith, one of the most dynamic players in the nation and a first team All-ACC choice, had 12 TD receptions which was tied for 11th in the FBS, while his 81.2 receiving yards-per-game average was 28th. O'Brien, 7-3 as a starter, threw for 2,438 yards which is the sixth best single-season total on the ACC freshman list (see chart on pg. 7). Despite being depleted by injury with the losses of LT **Justin Gilbert** (knee) and RT **Pete DeSouza** (fractured legs), the o-line allowed two or fewer sacks in 10 games. LG **Andrew Gonnella** was the only lineman to start all 13 games at the same position, while **Paul Pinegar**, an All-ACC selection, started at both center and right tackle.

• The linebacker corps, including three-time All-ACC performer **Alex Wujciak**, and a hard-hitting secondary anchored the defense under second-year coordinator **Don Brown**. The Terps, who scored four times defensively (tied for sixth in the FBS), ranked 38th nationally in points allowed (22.2 ppg), 39th in total defense (352.3 ypg) and tied for 18th in red-zone defense (75 percent). Wujciak ranked fourth in the league and tied for 37th nationally in tackles (9.0 pg). LB **Adrian Moten**, a playmaker throughout his career, tied for sixth in the ACC in interceptions (0.31 pg) and tied for 23rd in the ACC in stops (5.9 pg). LB **Demetrius Hartsfield** ranked third on the team and 15th in the league in stops (88). **Joe Vellano** ranked fourth in the ACC in tackles among linemen (4.7 pg) and had a team-high five sacks. The Terps were ranked ninth nationally in pass efficiency defense and that was due in large part to a play-making secondary which included first team All-ACC performer **Kenny Tate** who tied for 15th in the FBS in forced fumbles (0.31 pg) and was seventh in the ACC in tackles (7.7 pg), and SS **Antwine Perez** who was tied for sixth in the ACC in passes defended (0.85 pg) and tied for 23rd in the FBS in fumbles recovered (0.23 pg).

• Special teams was a strength for the Terps. **Travis Baltz**, a 2008 first team All-ACC punter, handled both kicking chores. Baltz, who was a candidate for the 2010 Ray Guy Award, connected on 14 of his 18 FG attempts and averaged 41.7 yards per punt (sixth in the ACC). Junior **Tony Logan** was one of the top punt returners in the nation. The first team All-ACC performer returned two punts for scores, becoming one of just two players in league history to post consecutive games with a return for a score. Logan averaged 18.1 ypr which was third in the FBS. Smith was one of the top kick returners in the country in 2009, posting an ACC single-season record 1,309 yards. He is the career leader in the league as well, setting that mark vs. Miami (11/6).



## QUICK HITTERS...

• Maryland was bowl eligible for the seventh time in 10 seasons under 2010 ACC Coach of the Year **Ralph Friedgen**. He posted his fifth bowl victory with the win over East Carolina. The five postseason wins are a school record and rank third in ACC history. The Terps improved to 11-11-2 all-time in bowl games.

• Maryland, 2-10 last year, posted the best turnaround in school history (+7 in the win column) and second-best in the FBS (see chart on pg. 5). Miami (Ohio) improved by eight wins from 2009 to 2010. Prior to this season, the Terps best improvement in the modern era was five games (1945 and 2001).

• The Terps were among the best teams in the nation this season at not committing turnovers. Maryland tied for fourth nationally in turnover margin (+1.15 pg). The Terps, plus-15 on the season, won the turnover battle in 10 of 13 games.

• **Danny O'Brien** threw for a career-high 417 yards against NC State (11/27) and ended the year in sixth place on the ACC single-season freshman passing yardage list (2,438). He finished the year with a freshman school-record 22 TD passes. O'Brien is just the second player in Maryland history to throw 20 or more TDs in a single season (Scott Milanovich had 26 in 1993 and 20 in '94). His touchdown mark is also third in ACC history among freshmen (25 by Philip Rivers, NC State in 2000; 24 by Chris Rix, FSU in 2001).

• **Torrey Smith** posted 272 all-purpose yards (224 receiving, 48 KOR) against NC State (11/27), breaking Lamont Jordan's school record (4,960) for career all-purpose yards. Smith, who declared for the 2011 NFL Draft after the Military Bowl, ended his career with 5,264 all-purpose yards, a mark that is seventh in ACC history. Smith's 67 receptions rank fourth on the Maryland single-season chart, while his 1,055 receiving yards are second.

• **Alex Wujciak** had a team-high 117 tackles on the season. The senior has at least 100 tackles in three straight seasons and is just the sixth player in school history to accomplish that feat (also D'Qwell Jackson, E.J. Henderson, Eric Barton, Ratcliff Thomas and Chuck Faucette). He earned All-ACC honors his final three seasons.

• The Terps posted 19 interceptions on the year which ranks tied for seventh on the school's single-season list. It was also the most since 2001 when they had 24. Nine of those interceptions came from linebackers (Moten - 4; Wujciak - 2; **Demetrius Hartsfield** - 1; **Ryan Donohue** - 1; **David Mackall** - 1).

• The Terps four defensive scores in 2010 (all interception returns for TDs) matched the team's total from the previous five years (two in 2009, one in 2006, one in 2005). In fact since 1987, the Terps posted as many as three just three times (1998-00).

• Moten had a career-best four picks which is second on Maryland's single-season chart for linebackers, trailing only Karl Edwards' five in 1987. The senior's

0.33 INTs per game ranks tied for second in the FBS among LBs.

• Moten was one of only three players in the ACC (also Davon Morgan, Va Tech; DeAndre McDaniel, Clemson) with at least four interceptions and 75 or more tackles.

## SIX EARN ALL-ACC HONORS...

Six Terps earned spots on the 2010 All-ACC team. Headlined by four first-team All-ACC honorees in wide receiver **Torrey Smith**, punt returner **Tony Logan**, linebacker **Alex Wujciak** and safety **Kenny Tate**, the Terps had their most all-conference players since 2008 when they had nine chosen. Sophomore defensive tackle **Joe Vellano** was voted to the second team, while senior offensive lineman **Paul Pinegar** was an honorable mention selection. The four first-team selections were tied for the most with Clemson. The five first and second-team choices were tied for third with Clemson. Virginia Tech (11) and Miami (9) led the way. The Terps haven't had as many as four first team all-league choices since the 2003 season (also four).

## FRIEDGEN, O'BRIEN HONORED BY ACC...

**Ralph Friedgen** was voted ACC Coach of the Year and quarterback **Danny O'Brien** was tabbed the league's top overall and offensive rookie by ACSMA.

Friedgen received the Coach of the Year award for the second time in his career (2001), while O'Brien is the first Terp to be named ACC Rookie of the Year (award instituted in 1975). The Terps were in the running for their first-ever Atlantic Division title due in great part to the emergence of O'Brien, who is the fourth-ranked freshman passer in the FBS (135.20 rating). He has completed 179 of 315 passes for 2,257 yards, the

sixth-highest total for a freshman in ACC history. O'Brien received 54 of the 61 votes as the top overall rookie. Friedgen was the fourth Maryland coach to be honored by the league (also Jim Tatum - 1953, 55; Jerry Claiborne - 1973, 75, 76; Bobby Ross - 1982). Friedgen (29) outpaced Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech (19) in the voting.



## GETTING OFFENSIVE ON DEFENSE...

The Terps had four interception returns for touchdowns on the year, including three in the final six games. The four interception returns for a TD tied for fourth in the FBS (see below), while the team's four defensive scores tied for sixth in the country.

## CLAMPING DOWN...

After finishing 83rd in total defense (396.3 yards per game) and 100th in points allowed (31.3 pg) in 2009, Maryland's attacking-style unit gradually improved during the year. The Terps ended 2010 ranked 38th in scoring defense (22.1 ppg), 39th in total defense (352.3 ypg), 21st in rushing defense (124.5 ypg), tied for 18th in red-zone defense (75 percent) and tied for 18th in turnovers gained (29). Before surrendering a season-high 504 total yards to Miami (11/6), Maryland held Wake Forest (10/30), which was averaging 206.6 rushing yards per game, to minus-3 yards on the ground (lowest total by an opponent in 11 years). Fourth-down stops were a key in four victories, including a goal-line stand on Navy's final play in the season opener (9/6). The Terps also had important fourth-down stops at the end of the FIU (9/25), Duke (10/2) and BC (10/23) games.

## STREAKS AND TRENDS...

- Maryland was 8-2 when winning the turnover battle and 5-2 when being outgained by the opponent.
- The Terps were 4-1 in games decided by seven points or less. In 2009, they lost four games by four points or less and the last two by a combined five points. The Terps regained their form of 2008 when they were 6-1 in games decided by a TD or less.
- Despite a season-high four turnovers vs. FSU (11/20), the Terps turned the ball over just 14 times (10 interceptions/four fumbles) and just four of those (two vs. Navy, 9/6; one vs. Miami, 11/6; one vs. FSU, 11/20) occurred in the red zone. Maryland was tied for fifth in the FBS in fewest turnovers. The Terps had 24 turnovers (10 picks/14 fumbles) in 2009.

• Alex Wujciak started the final 38 games of his career, all at Mike LB. Paul Pinegar's 25 straight starts led the offense.

• Nine defensive players started all 13 games. Defensive coordinator **Don Brown** started three safeties four times with NT **A.J. Francis** sitting in three of those instances. There were five offensive players who started each game (see list on pg. 33). The Terps started four offensive line combinations.

• The Terps have recorded 26 picks over the last 18 games. They had at least one interception in 11 of 13 games in 2010.

• FS **Kenny Tate** posted at least six tackles in all but one game in 2010.

• In his seven wins as a starter, QB **Danny O'Brien** completed 129 of 209 passes (62 percent) for 1,654 yards (236.3 ypg) with 17 TDs and two interceptions.

• Maryland scored 40 or more points five times this year. It marks the first time since 2002 that the Terps have gone over 40 points five times during the regular season.

## DYNAMIC DUO...

Maryland had one of the top safety tandems in the country. A disruptive force who had an impressive season, **Kenny Tate** ranked seventh in the ACC in tackles (7.7 per game), which was second among defensive backs. He also led the conference and tied for 15th in the FBS in forced fumbles (0.31 per game). In addition, the All-ACC first team pick was the top sack producer among league defensive backs (0.27 pg). The junior, who was a candidate for the 2010 Thorpe Award, had three interceptions, returning one for a score vs. Wake Forest (10/30). Tate's counterpart **Antwine Perez**, who was an all-league pick by Phil Steele, had a strong finish to the season, averaging 8.2 tackles over the last five games. He earned ACC Defensive Back of Week after posting a career-best two interceptions and recovering a fumble in a 24-21 win over BC (10/23). He chipped in a sack and a forced fumble vs. Wake Forest (10/30) and eight tackles, including a season-best six solo stops, vs. Miami (11/6). Perez had seven tackles and one PBU vs. Virginia (11/13), and seven tackles and 1.5 TFLs against Florida State (11/20). He was again named ACC DB of the Week for his performance vs. FSU. Perez ranked tied for fourth in the ACC in passes defended (0.85 pg), tied for third in fumbles recovered (0.23 pg) and tied for 17th in interceptions (0.23 pg). The Perez-Tate duo was one of the keys to the Terps possessing the second best turnover margin in the ACC (tied for fourth in the FBS) and ninth-best pass efficiency defense in the nation.



## ...by the numbers

1...Despite losing two starting offensive tackles to season-ending injuries (**Justin Gilbert** – knee; **Pete DeSouza** – fractured legs), the Terps allowed just 12 sacks in their eight ACC games which was the third-fewest in the league.

2...**Tony Logan** returned two punts for TDs in 2010, while the other 11 ACC teams combined for six.

3...**Danny O'Brien's** 22 TD passes ranked third in the FBS among freshmen QBs.

6...Number of non-offensive touchdowns scored by the Terps (four interception returns; two punt returns) which led the ACC. It marked the most non-offensive TDs for the Terps since 2002 (seven).

6...Number of graduates on the 2010 roster. **Michael Carter**, **Emani Lee-Odai**, **Adrian Moten**, **Joey McQueeney**, **Antwine Perez** and **Da'Rel Scott** each earned a degree.

10...The Terps have placed a punter on the Academic All-ACC team in each of the last 10 seasons. **Travis Baltz** was a member all four years (Adam Podlesh 2003-06; Brooks Barnard 2001-02).

10...**Alex Wujciak** averaged 10.0 tackles per game in his career which was third in the FBS among active players at the end of the season.

12...Number of true freshmen who started during **Ralph Friedgen's** 10 years (2001 - **Domonique Foxworth**, **Randy Starks**; 2003 - **Vernon Davis**; 2005 - **Jeremy Navarre**, **Danny Oquendo**, **Jared Gaither**; 2006 - **Cory Jackson**; 2007 - **Travis Baltz**; 2009 - **Nick Ferrara**, **Bennett Fulper**; 2010 - **Desmond Kearse**, **Matt Robinson**).

15...The Terps were plus-15 in the turnover dept. on the season which was their best mark since 2001 (plus-16).

19...Number of players who scored a TD this season, the most in the **Ralph Friedgen** era (17 in 2002 was the previous high).

20...Number of points the opposition scored off 14 Maryland turnovers on the season. In contrast, the Terps scored 100 points off 29 opponent turnovers. The Terps surrendered a season-high 13 points off TOs to FSU (11/20).

26...At the end of the season, the Terps had 26 players on NFL rosters (plus four on practice squads), which ranked third among ACC squads, trailing just Miami (42) and FSU (27). See list on page 25.

137...The Terps have not had a punt blocked since the Florida State contest (11/13/99), a stretch of 137 games, which is the longest active streak in the nation.

### WUJCIAK DOES IT AGAIN...

One of the top tacklers in the nation the last three years, **Alex Wujciak** made plays for the Terps in a number of ways. The senior intercepted Stephen Morris of Miami (11/6) and returned it 60 yards for a TD, the second pick-six of his career (also vs. NC State in 2009). He then intercepted Morris again in the third quarter and returned it 26 yards to set up a potential scoring drive. Wujciak set the Maryland single-season record for interception return yards (152) in 2009 and ended his career second in school history in career interception return yards (238), trailing only Tom Brown (275/1960-62). Wujciak is one of just five players, and the only linebacker, in Maryland history with two interception returns for TDs.

### SPECIAL TEAMS STANDOUT...

A reserve wideout who solidified his role as a punt returner, **Tony Logan** was a game-changer for Maryland this season. Although opponents utilized a line-drive punt to kick away from Logan the second half of the season, the junior averaged an astounding 18.1 yards per return (third in the FBS and third on the ACC single-season list) on 31 chances. Logan was also one of just five players in the FBS who has at least two punt returns for touchdowns - an 85-yarder against FIU (9/25) and an 84-yarder vs. Duke (10/2). The TD returns came at crucial times for the Terps - his TD against FIU (first punt return for a score since Steve Suter in the 2004 Gator Bowl) broke a 7-7 tie and the one against Duke gave Maryland a 14-9 lead. Logan had four returns over 50 yards and his 560 punt return yards are the second most in a season in both Maryland and ACC history (771 by Steve Suter in 2002), and more than all but two FBS schools in 2010 (Oregon, 679; Utah, 616). Logan has two of the top three punt returns in school history, trailing only a 90-yard TD by Dick Nolan in 1953. Logan had a career-high 135 punt return yards vs. FIU, his second 100-yard game of the season (also 128 yards vs. Morgan State, 9/11). Logan's 13.63 yard-per-return career average ranks fourth in the FBS among active players.

### EXPLOSIVE PLAYS...

One of the keys to Maryland's success during the season was its ability to make explosive plays to score points.

- Maryland had 86 explosive plays (defined as 20 yards or longer) in 2010, and the Terps scored 21 touchdowns on those plays. In 2009, Maryland had just 13 TDs off explosive plays.

- The Terps had 19 plays of 50 yards or longer in 2010 - eight on passes, four on punt returns, five on rushes and two on interception returns. In 2009, Maryland had eight plays of 50 yards or longer.

### SUDDEN CHANGE...

After going 41 games without scoring via a fumble or interception (Erin Henderson in 2006 vs. Virginia), Maryland registered six defensive touchdowns in the last 16 contests. Most recently, **Alex Wujciak** had a 60-yard interception for a touchdown against Miami (11/6). **Kenny Tate** and **Ryan Donohue** both had interceptions for scores against Wake Forest (10/30). **Demetrius Hartsfield's** pick-six in the second quarter of the Morgan State game (9/11) was Maryland's first defensive score since **Alex Wujciak** scored on a 70-yard interception return on 11/14/09 at NC State. One week after Wujciak's TD, Jared Harrell fell on a fumble in the end zone vs. Virginia Tech (11/21/09).



## BREAKING UP IS EASY TO DO...

The Terps, who ranked ninth in the FBS in passing efficiency defense, were an aggressive bunch this season. The defense posted 58 pass breakups on the season after tallying 29 all of 2009. **Antwine Perez** was tied for sixth in the ACC and tied for 64th nationally in passes defended (0.85 pg). He was also tied for second on the team and 17th in the ACC in interceptions (0.23 pg), while **Adrian Moten** was tied for 11th in the conference in passes defended (0.77 pg), along with **Trenton Hughes**. In addition, **Cameron Chism** was tied for second on the team with eight PBUs. Chism and Perez had two of the best games in the country during 2010 knocking down passes. Chism had four PBUs vs. FIU (9/25) and Perez matched that total vs. Duke (10/2), tallies that are tied for the most in one FBS game during 2010.

## BLOCK PARTY...

Maryland has not had a punt blocked in 137 straight games, but over that time span the Terps have blocked 16 of the opposition's, including four in 2010 (two vs. Wake Forest, 10/30; two vs. Morgan State, 9/11). **LaQuan Williams** registered the Terps' third blocked punt of the season in the opening quarter vs. the Demon Deacons. The 11-yard punt gave the Terps the ball at the WF 32. Maryland kicked a field goal 10 plays later. **Nick Peterson** added Maryland's fourth block punt of year in the second quarter. That block was recovered by **Kevin Dorsey** and the Terps scored two plays later on a 3-yard pass from **Danny O'Brien** to **Haroon Brown**. The Terps have scored following all four blocked punts this season (also 10 points vs. Morgan State). Maryland also blocked an extra point vs. Miami (11/6) and a field goal vs. NC State (11/27). The six blocked kicks were the most in the **Ralph Friedgen** era (4 in 2001, 2004, 2008).

## MISCELLANEOUS NOTES...

- **Austin Walker** led the team with 13 special teams tackles, but others were close behind. **Darin Drakeford** and **LaQuan Williams** had 12 apiece, while **Kerry Boykins** and **Matt Robinson** had 11 each. **Avery Graham** and **Emani Lee-Odai** were tied for sixth (10). Walker, Boykins and Robinson led the way on kickoff returns with 11. **Tim Downs** was first in punt-return tackles (six).
- Maryland's 62 points vs. Wake Forest (10/30) matched its highest total ever in an ACC game (see chart on the right). The Terps had 62 vs. Virginia on 11/22/75. The 48-point margin of victory against the Demon Deacons was also the most in an ACC game under **Ralph Friedgen**. The Terps posted 60 or more points twice in a year for the first time in school history (62 vs. Morgan State, 9/11).
- Maryland held Wake Forest (10/30) to minus-3 yards rushing. It was the first time Maryland held an opponent on the negative side of rushing since

11/3/01 when Troy State rushed for minus-1 on 26 attempts in a 47-14 Terps victory. It also marked the best performance by a Maryland defense since holding Duke to minus-5 yards on 10/30/99.

- **Desmond Kears** started as a third safety against FIU (9/25), becoming the first Terp true freshman defensive player to start since **Jeremy Navarre** (vs. Boston College, 11/19/05). Kears was also the first true freshman DB to start since **Domonique Foxworth** (vs. NC State, 11/17/01). Fellow true freshman **Matt Robinson** started at safety vs. Wake Forest (10/30).
- Maryland played 24 freshmen (10 true/14 redshirts) in 2009, which was the most during **Ralph Friedgen's** first nine seasons. The Terps played 20 freshmen in both the 2001 and 2004 seasons. Last year's freshmen are now sophomores, but the Terps were still relatively young, though more experienced. Of the 111 players on the roster at the end of the year, 65 were freshmen or sophomores, but just 16 are seniors. Maryland also had a relatively low senior class (14) in 2009.

## NO FRESHMAN JITTERS...

**Danny O'Brien** started the last 10 games of the season (7-3 record) and showed incredible poise and presence for a freshman signal caller. Despite not starting the first three games of the season, his 22 TD passes were third in the country among freshmen.

- On the season, O'Brien had an efficiency rating of 134.5, a mark that was fourth-best in the ACC and fifth-best among freshmen QBs in the FBS. He did a good job spreading the ball around, hitting nine receivers in one start, eight different receivers in six starts, seven receivers in one start and six in two starts.
- Twelve different players caught a TD for Maryland this season (including O'Brien himself). The freshman passed, caught and ran for TDs in 2010 (4-yard TD reception vs. Clemson, 10/16; 12-yard TD run vs. Virginia, 11/13).
- The Kernersville, N.C., native became the first Maryland freshman QB to start since **Latrez Harrison** (11/20/99), and is one of only five freshmen QBs to start in Maryland history. O'Brien went 18 of 27 for 250 yards and a pair of touchdowns against FIU (9/25), including a 68-yard TD pass to **Torrey Smith**.
- O'Brien went his first 96 collegiate passes without a pick before throwing three in the fourth quarter against Clemson (10/16). He was second in the FBS among freshmen in TD-to-interception ratio (2.75-to-1), interception percentage (2.34) and TD percentage (6.53).
- O'Brien played in all 13 games, but saw just one play against Navy (9/6) and West Virginia (9/18). His first significant action came against Morgan State (9/11), when he went 5-of-10 for 79 yards. In that game, O'Brien threw three TD passes, all of which came on his first four pass attempts.

## MULTI-FACETED PLAYMAKER...

**Torrey Smith** established himself as one of the most explosive playmakers in the nation over his three seasons in College Park. Smith set the ACC single-season record for kickoff return yardage as both a redshirt freshman and sophomore, totaling 1,309 return yards in 2009. He led the team in receptions (67) and receiving yards (1,055). His 5.2 receptions per game ranked third in the ACC and his 81.2 receiving ypg were second.

- In his last regular-season game (vs. NC State, 11/27), Smith had a career day amassing 224 yards on 14 receptions and four touchdowns. The four TDs are a Maryland single-game record. The 224 yards rank third all-time in Maryland history and the 14 receptions are tied for second all-time.

- Smith has 28 receptions for 450 yards and five touchdowns in the last three games. His 12 TDs are tied for first in the ACC and rank first on the Terps' single-season list.

- The junior had at least one touchdown reception during a three-game span early in the season - he had two against Morgan State (9/11), two against West Virginia (9/18) and one against FIU (9/25). He became the first Terp to record consecutive games with multiple touchdown receptions since Jermaine Lewis in 1993.

- Smith's explosive play ability was evident in 2010. He had touchdown receptions of 60, 68, 71 and 80 yards, and averaged 15.5 yards every time he touched the ball. He also ranked first in the ACC with 126.7 all-purpose yards per game.

- With 149 yards receiving against West Virginia (9/18) and 159 against FIU (9/25), Smith recorded back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for the second time in his career. The 308 yards was the most by a Terp in a two-game span since Jermaine Lewis had 394 in 1995 (205 vs. Duke, 9/23; 189 vs. Georgia Tech, 9/28).

- Smith moved into first on Maryland's career all-purpose yards list (5,183) after a career day against NC State (11/27). LaMont Jordan previously held the school record with 4,960. Smith is also third on the Terps career receptions list (152) and is second on the receiving yards chart (2,215).

## SHIFTS ON THE O-LINE...

Despite being dealt two major blows, the Terps' offensive line played gutsy all season. The Terps were fourth in the ACC in sacks allowed (22), but eight of those came in the West Virginia (9/18) game. A season-ending injury to **Justin Gilbert** vs. WVU caused the Terps to reshuffle the line. **R.J. Dill** moved from right to left tackle and redshirt freshman **Pete DeSouza** stepped in at RT. DeSouza started the next three games, but was involved in a traffic accident just two days prior to the Boston College (10/23) game and missed the rest of the season. For the

final seven games, the Terps used a lineup with Dill at left tackle, junior **Andrew Gonnella** at left guard, sophomore **Bennett Fulper** at center, sophomore **Justin Lewis** at right guard and senior **Paul Pinegar** at right tackle. But against Florida State, Lewis suffered a knee injury, and **Pete White** replaced him. Fulper suffered a hand injury, forcing Pinegar to move to center, Dill to move to right tackle, and true freshman **Max Garcia** to enter the game at left tackle for his first action of the season.

- The Terps had 163 yards rushing and 269 yards passing against FSU (11/20). Against Virginia (11/13) the Terps rushed for 136 yards and passed for 289 and didn't allow a sack. In the 62-14 win over Wake Forest (10/30), Maryland had a season-high tying 261 rushing yards, while also accumulating 168 passing yards and not allowing a sack.

- The Terps allowed just one sack against FIU (9/25), which entered the game 12th in the nation in that category, and none against Duke (10/2). But they surrendered eight sacks to West Virginia (9/18) and three to Clemson (10/16). After the late changes to the line for the BC game, Maryland surrendered two sacks in the game.

- In the season opener, the Terps racked up 261 rushing yards (most since 271 vs. Delaware in 2008) on just 34 attempts - an average of 7.7 ypc. **Davin Meggett** had his first career 100-yard game, including a career long 67-yard run, **Jamarr Robinson** ran for 92 yards and **Da'Rel Scott** had 58.

- Against Morgan State (9/11), the Terps had their second consecutive 200-yard rushing game, going for 221. The last time Maryland had back-to-back 200-yard rushing games was 2007, when they had 200 against Wake Forest (9/22) and 239 against Rutgers (9/29) the following week.

## DEPTH AND EXPERIENCE AT LINEBACKER...

One of the strongest units on the team was linebacker with starters **Alex Wujciak** (Mike), **Adrian Moten** (Sam) and **Demetrius Hartsfield** (Will) and key backups **Darin Drakeford** and **David Mackall**.

- Wujciak ranked fourth in the ACC and tied for 37th nationally with 9.0 tackles per game. Moten was tied for 23rd in the league in stops (5.9 pg), had one forced fumble and tied for No. 2 in the nation in interceptions among linebackers (0.31 per game). Hartsfield was 15th in the ACC with 6.7 tackles per game.

- The starting trio combined for 282 tackles, including 17.5 tackles for loss, seven INTs and 14 PBUs on the season. That group also helped Maryland rank third in the ACC in rushing defense (124.5 ypg).

- Wujciak was a three-time All-ACC selection. He was one of only two players in the nation (also Nick Bellore, CMU) to post 130 tackles in 2008 and 2009. Moten ended his career 12th in school history in sacks (15.5) and tied for 14th in TFL (24.0). The Terps also had depth behind the starters, although

Sophomore **Ryan Donohue**, Pooler's replacement at Will, returned an interception for a TD against Wake Forest (10/30). Mackall, a true freshman who tied for the team lead with seven tackles against Morgan State (9/11), was the backup at Mike and Drakeford, who backed up Moten at Sam, had 5.5 tackles for loss.

## SECONDARY STEPPED UP...

Maryland's secondary was a strong point all season even after losing three of four starters from 2009. The lone returning starter was junior **Cameron Chism**, who moved into a starting role last season after an injury to Nolan Carroll and had a very productive year. Opposite of Chism was junior **Trenton Hughes**, with redshirt freshman **Dexter McDougale** also seeing time at cornerback. **Antwine Perez** and **Kenny Tate** took over the starting safety positions and both made a big impact.

- The Terps ranked ninth nationally in pass efficiency defense by holding opponents to a 107.6 rating. A big part of that is due to Maryland's ability to force turnovers - the Terps posted 19 picks, which was tied for second in the ACC.

- The Terps recorded at least one interception in 11 of 13 games this season. **Adrian Moten** and **Demetrius Hartsfield** each had a pick against Morgan State (9/11); Tate had one against WVU (9/18); Hughes made his first career pick vs. FIU (9/25); Perez and Moten each had one against Duke (10/2); Perez had two against BC (10/23); Tate and **Ryan Donohue** had interceptions for TDs against Wake Forest (10/30); **Alex Wujciak** had two picks against Miami (11/6), one of which he returned 60 yards for a TD; Moten and **Eric Franklin** each had a pick against Virginia (11/13); Tate had one against FSU (11/20), and Franklin added another pick against NC State (11/27).

- Tate led the team in solo tackles (58), including a career-high 11 solos vs. Miami (11/6). He has also forced four fumbles, the most by a Maryland player since Milton Harris also had four in 2005.

- Defensive coordinator **Don Brown** rolled in a number of secondary players. Franklin, true freshman **Matt Robinson**, junior **Austin Walker** and senior **Michael Carter** were also in the rotation.

## MORE THAN A TACKLING MACHINE...

One of the top play-making linebackers in the country, **Alex Wujciak** proved he can do more than just wrap up opposing ball carriers. Wujciak was a first team All-ACC pick in 2009 after leading the team in tackles (career-high 131) and ranking eighth nationally in that category (10.9 per game). He ended up being a first team all-league selection again in 2010, as well as on the watch list for five awards - Lombardi Award, Nagurski Trophy, Lott Trophy, Bednarik Award and Butkus Award. He set a new career high with 18 tackles in the season opener against Navy (9/6) and ranked fourth in the ACC and tied for 37th nationally with a 9.0 tackles-per-game average. But the senior had four interceptions in his career - two this year and two in 2009. Against Miami (11/6) he returned an interception 60 yards for a TD and had another INT that he returned 25 yards. He is one of only five players in Terp history to return two picks for TDs. Wujciak totaled 152 return yards on his two picks in 2009 which set a single-season school record. For his

career, he has 238 interception return yards, which is third in school history. Wujciak's return yardage ranked fifth nationally in 2009 and was the most by any linebacker. He had a 70-yard interception return for a TD vs. NC State (11/7/09) and had a 82-yarder vs. FSU (11/21/09) which set up a TD. Over his final 18 games, he also forced three fumbles and broke up six passes.

## TAKING HOME THE HARDWARE...

The Touchdown Club of Annapolis presented the Crab Bowl Trophy to Maryland after its victory over Navy (9/6). The trophy will be presented for all subsequent meetings. The Touchdown Club of Annapolis, founded in 1954, has an extensive history with both Navy and Maryland, honoring both teams at its annual banquet. Commissioned by the club with underwriting from the D'Camera Group, the Crab Bowl is a large pewter bowl overflowing with pewter replicas of the Chesapeake Bay blue crab. The Crab Bowl sits atop an ebony-colored mahogany base that is engraved with the results of previous Maryland-Navy games.



**WEEKLY AWARDS...**

The Terps had five players honored weekly (eight times) in 2010 by the league (list on pg. 7). DB **Kenny Tate** and DL **Joe Vellano** picked up individual awards after helping the Terps down Navy (9/6), 17-14. Tate was voted as ACC Defensive Back of the Week, while Vellano was tabbed the top defensive lineman in the league. It marked the first weekly ACC honor for both players, who were instrumental in Maryland holding Navy to two scores in seven red-zone chances. Tate notched a career-high 12 tackles and also forced a pair of fumbles. Vellano, making his first career start, had 10 tackles, including five solo stops, as well as 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Tate was also named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and was the Jim Thorpe Award DB of the Week. Tate was added to the 2010 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List. **Danny O'Brien** earned ACC Rookie of the Week five times, after throwing for 250 yards against FIU (9/25), for completing 26 of 39 passes for 179 yards vs. BC (10/23), a four-TD performance vs. Wake Forest (10/30), a 289-yard effort vs. Virginia (11/13) and a 417-yard, four-TD effort vs. NC State (11/27). **Antwine Perez** was the ACC Defensive Back of the Week after picking off two passes and recovering a fumble vs. BC. He also won the award for the NC State game where he posted a career-high 11 tackles, a forced fumble and a PBU. **Torrey Smith** won the ACC Offensive Back of the Week for his 14-reception, 224 receiving-yard performance vs. NC State.

**FOUR TERPS ON ACADEMIC ALL-ACC SQUAD...**

P/PK **Travis Baltz** and DL **A.J. Francis**, along with offensive linemen **Bennett Fulper** and **Paul Pinegar**, were among 52 student-athletes named to the 2010 Academic All-Atlantic Coast Conference football team. Baltz hit both the Maryland and ACC record books with the selection. He was just the third player in school history, and one of 13 in league annals, to earn four appearances on the yearly academic team. Francis and Pinegar were selected for the second straight year, while Fulper was a first-time honoree. Baltz joined former Terps **Ralph Lary** (1977-80) and **Adam Podlesh** (2003-06) on the four-time honoree list. **Anthony Castonzo** of Boston College was also selected for the fourth time in his career this season. Maryland's four selections were tied for fourth-most in the league. Duke led the way with 13. Clemson had six and Virginia Tech five. It marks the 10th straight year a Maryland punter has been named to the team (also **Brooks Barnard** 2001-02).

**TERPS OWN NATION'S LONGEST STREAK...**

- During the last 10 seasons, Maryland has had three full-time punters (**Brooks Barnard**, **Adam Podlesh**, and **Travis Baltz**), three long snappers (**Jon Condo**, **Andrew Schmitt** and **Tim Downs**) and zero blocked punts. In fact, since the Wake Forest game on 10/9/99, only four players (**Barnard**, **Podlesh**, **Baltz**, **Nick Ferrara**) have started at punter. **Downs** made his debut in 2009, replacing **Schmitt**, a four-year starter at the position. However, with **Baltz** shelved with a injury in 2009, **Ferrara** took over punting duties for five games. In addition, **Ted Townsley** had one punt in the game against Rutgers (9/26/09).
- The Terrapins' streak without a blocked punt goes back 137 games, the longest active stretch in college football.
- The Terps have not had a punt blocked since the Florida State game (11/13/99). That amount of time became the longest in NCAA football when Georgia had a punt blocked by Ole Miss in 2006, snapping a streak which began earlier in the 1999 season.



# TERP HIGHLIGHTS UNDER FRIEDGEN

- Friedgen has a 75-50 record in 10 years, including the only three straight 10-win seasons in school history (10-2 in 2001, 11-3 in 2002 and 10-3 in 2003). His 75 overall victories rank 10th on the ACC's all-time list.
- The consensus national coach of the year in 2001 when he led Maryland to its first ACC title in 16 years, Friedgen guided the Terrapins to seven bowl game appearances, including a school-record five postseason wins. He is one of three coaches in ACC history with five or more bowl wins and one of eight with seven or more bowl game appearances. He became the 13th coach in ACC history to amass 70 wins with the victory over Duke (10/2).
- Friedgen's 75 wins are more than the Terps had (60) in the 15 years prior to his arrival. The victory total ranks tied for third in school history and his winning percentage is fourth (.600). He was twice voted ACC Coach of the Year (2001, 2010).
- Four of the school's 13 nine-win seasons have come in Friedgen's first nine years as head coach.
- Under Friedgen, Maryland has posted the second-best turnaround in the nation in 2010 (seven-game improvement).
- Maryland was among the best in 2008 playing ranked opponents. The Terps went 4-1 vs. ranked foes (AP poll) with wins vs. No. 23 Cal, No. 20 Clemson, No. 21 Wake Forest and No. 17 UNC. The Terps were one of only five teams in the nation (also Florida, Oklahoma, USC and Texas) to beat at least four top 25 teams. The other four all finished in the top five of the final polls.
- During 2007, the Terps defeated two top 10 teams (No. 10 Rutgers, No. 8 Boston College). The Terps had never beaten two Top 10 teams in the same season. They were also one of only four teams in the nation (LSU, Kentucky and Illinois) to accomplish that feat in 2007.
- The Terps posted a school-record three-straight bowl wins (2003, 04, 06), culminating with a 24-7 triumph over Purdue in the 2006 Champs Sports Bowl. The Terps have out-scored their last five bowl foes by a 151-83 margin.
- Maryland posted a school record-tying 11-victory season in 2002, when the Terps won 10 of their last 11 games. Only the 1976 team won as many games.
- Maryland was joined by only four other Division I-A schools - Miami (Fla.), Oklahoma, Texas and Washington State - to have won as many as 10 games in the 2001, 2002 and 2003 seasons.
- A Top 20 final ranking in both major national polls for three straight years (2001-03). Maryland ended 2003 ranked 17th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press. In 2002, the Terps were ranked 13th in both polls, and in 2001 the team finished 10th in the ESPN/USA Today poll and 11th in the AP. It was the program's best three-year final rankings since 1974-76 (when the Terps finished 13th, 13th and eighth).
- After seven years as the Terps' head coach, Friedgen ranked the third-most successful seventh-year coach in ACC history, with his 56-31 mark eclipsing those of league mentors Dick

Sheridan, Tommy Bowden, Bill Dooley and Mack Brown.

- He is the second-most successful sixth-year coach in ACC history, with his 50-24 mark (through the end of 2006) eclipsing those of such former league mentors as Bobby Ross and Lou Holtz. Friedgen is currently 19th among all active coaches for Football Bowl Division (formerly Division I-A) victories.
- Friedgen set the ACC record for wins (36) by a fourth-year head coach. He tied for second in the ACC in wins by a fifth-year coach.
- Bowl appearances in seven of his 10 seasons, including dominating wins in the 2004 Toyota Gator Bowl (41-7 over West Virginia) and a 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl victory over Tennessee (a team ranked fifth in the two major pre-season polls). The Terrapins also earned a BCS Orange Bowl berth during the 2001 campaign.
- Friedgen led the Terps to the 2001 ACC title when the Terps became the first team other than Florida State to win an outright league title since the Seminoles joined the conference.
- By winning the 2001 ACC title, Friedgen became the first mentor in conference history to win the championship in his first year as a head coach. He also tied the mark of 10-2 set by Ken Hatfield (Clemson) in 1990, the best record ever by an ACC coach in his first season.
- 46 wins in 64 games at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium, where the Terps averaged a school-record 52,426 fans in 2005 and 51,263 in 2007.
- Three of the last 10 ACC Defensive Players of the Year.
- 57 national television appearances, including a school-record eight showings in 2002. The Terrapins played on national television or ABC regional six times in 2005, 2006 and 2007, eight times in 2008, and once in 2009.
- The program's first major national award winner since 1974 in linebacker E.J. Henderson, a two-time consensus first team All-American who was named the winner of the Dick Butkus Award (nation's outstanding linebacker) and the Chuck Bednarik Trophy (nation's outstanding defensive player) in 2002.
- Back-to-back school records in number of first team All-ACC performers in 2001 (7) and 2002 (8), and an ACC-best 13 overall all-league honors in 2001 and nine in 2008.
- A league-best 14 representatives on the Academic All-ACC teams during a two-year span (eight in 2008; six in 2007).
- 34 weeks in at least one of the country's two major Top 25 polls, including a streak of seven consecutive weeks at the start of the 2004 season.
- The only consensus national coach of the year award (2001) in Maryland football history. He was one of 20 coaches around the nation on the watch list for the 2008 Paul 'Bear' Bryant Coach of the Year Award.
- 22 of the top 29 all-time largest crowds at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium have come since 2001.
- Back-to-back school scoring records (2001 and 2002) and a two-year team scoring average of more than 33 points per

- A NCAA-low four passing touchdowns allowed in 2005. The defense also had four straight seasons (2001-2004) in which it allowed 20 points or less a contest.
- In his 10 seasons, the Terps earned 48 Academic All-ACC honors and 19 All-America accolades, including two first-teamers (Vernon Davis and D'Qwell Jackson) in 2005.

# 2010 University of Maryland Football Notes: Season Review

## GAME1

Sept. 6, 2010

### Maryland 17, Navy 14

BALTIMORE - Navy dominated the time of possession, outgained Maryland by nearly 200 yards and made 15 more first downs.

None of this lessened the enjoyment the Terrapins derived from their 17-14 victory.

Kenny Tate stopped Ricky Dobbs at the goal line with 34 seconds left, and Maryland stunned their in-state rivals to break a seven-game losing streak that began last October.

The Midshipmen (0-1) held the ball for nearly 19 minutes longer than Maryland (1-0), amassed 485 yards and collected 26 first downs. But in a game influenced by untimely turnovers and huge penalties, the outcome was decided by a gritty goal-line stand.

Trailing 17-14 with a fourth down at the 1, Navy decided to go for the win. Dobbs took the snap, went to his left and was met by Tate, who would not relent to the momentum Dobbs brought to the line.

Maryland raced to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter and then held on behind a defense that repeatedly excelled after Navy got inside the 20.

The Midshipmen had a 7 1/2-minute edge in time of possession in the first half, yet trailed 14-7 after coming up empty on drives of 52, 63 and 66 yards.

In the second half, Dobbs lost a fumble at the Maryland 1 and was stuffed by Tate on the game's pivotal play. Dobbs ran for 63 yards and a touchdown, but the senior quarterback fumbled three times -- losing two of them at the Maryland 1.

Navy didn't punt until early in the fourth quarter, and the short kick was returned 57 yards by Tony Logan to the Navy 16.

Maryland promptly fumbled the ball away on a missed exchange.

The Midshipmen pulled even at 14 with 1:52 left in the third quarter when Dobbs scored from the 1 on a drive that began with wide receiver Greg Jones running 53 yards on a reverse.

A crowd of 69,348 showed up for the second meeting between the teams since 1965.

## GAME2

Sept. 11, 2010

### Maryland 62, Morgan State 3

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - With Maryland coming off an emotional win and playing with only four days rest, coach Ralph Friedgen was worried about how the Terrapins would fare against in-state foe Morgan State. He got the answer rather quickly.

Maryland scored on its first three possessions Saturday night, and the Terrapins enjoyed their highest-scoring performance in 35 years with a 62-3 rout.

Despite the quick turnaround following Monday's win over Navy, the Terrapins reached the 62-point mark for the first time since a 62-24 blowout against Virginia on Nov. 22, 1975. It was also Maryland's largest victory margin since a 61-0 win over the Citadel on Sept. 13, 2003.

Maryland has already matched its victory total from last season and owns its first winning streak since 2008.

Morgan State (1-1) gained only six yards in the first half and finished with 85 - the fewest allowed by Maryland since Friedgen arrived in 2001.

Morgan State's lone score came on a 39-yard field goal by Kemar Scarlett in the third quarter.

Maryland backup quarterback Danny O'Brien entered for starter Jamarr Robinson in the second quarter with the score 24-0. On his third play, O'Brien unleashed his first career throw: a 27-yard touchdown pass to wide-open tight end Matt Furstenburg.

A 37-yard punt return by Tony Logan led to a 24-yard TD pass from O'Brien to Torrey Smith, and O'Brien closed out Maryland's prolific first half by connecting with running back Da'Rel Scott on a 22-yard score.

Robinson also had his first game with multiple touchdown passes, connecting with Smith on a 5-yarder and Adrian Cannon for 19 yards to end Maryland's first two possessions.

Late in the first quarter, a 6-yard punt by the Bears set up a 47-yard field goal by Travis Baltz for a 17-0 lead.

With the Bears backed up on their own 11, Maryland's Demetrius Hartsfield intercepted a Dickerson pass at the 14 and coasted into the end zone for a 24-0 lead.

## GAME3

### No. 21 West Virginia 31, Maryland 17

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. - Jamarr Robinson had third-quarter touchdown passes of 60 and 80 yards to Torrey Smith, but a fast start lifted No. 21 West Virginia past Maryland, 31-17, on Saturday.

Geno Smith threw a career-high four touchdown passes for the Mountaineers, while Noel Devine rushed for a season-high 131 yards.

Smith, a sophomore making his third career start, had two scoring tosses apiece to sophomore Tavon Austin and redshirt freshman Sledman Bailey as West Virginia (3-0) jumped ahead 28-0 early in the third quarter.

Except for Geno Smith's 5-yard scoring toss to Bailey to start the third quarter, West Virginia struggled on offense after halftime as it tried to eat up clock time. Smith finished 19 of 29 for 268 yards.

Torrey Smith caught three passes for 149 yards. His TD catches cut Maryland's deficit to 28-14. Terps added a 35-yard field goal from Travis Baltz in the fourth quarter.

West Virginia then put the game out of reach behind fullback Ryan Clarke, who carried eight straight times on the ensuing 16-play drive that ate up nearly nine minutes of clock and ended with Tyler Bitancourt's 23-yard field goal with three minutes left for the final margin.

Maryland was trying for a 3-0 start for the first time since coach Ralph Friedgen's first season in 2001.

Austin had a big day against the Terrapins with seven catches for 106 yards to add to his team-leading totals. Early in the game, he caught a 15-yard pass, threw a key block that sprang Devine on a 50-yard run, then caught a 6-yard scoring pass from Smith on a crossing route.

After West Virginia got the ball back near midfield, Geno Smith avoided the blitz and hit Sanders on a 32-yard pass play to set up Smith's 5-yard TD toss to a wide-open Austin for a 14-0 lead.

Bailey took over from there, stretching high to snare a 26-yard scoring pass in the back of the end zone early in the second.

Maryland entered the game averaging 241 yards rushing but was held to minus-10. Bruce Irvin had three of West Virginia's eight sacks.

# 2010 University of Maryland Football Notes: Season Review

## GAME4

Sept. 25, 2010  
Maryland 42, FIU 28

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Redshirt freshman quarterback Danny O'Brien threw for 250 yards and two touchdowns, and the Terrapins got an 85-yard punt return from Tony Logan in a 42-28 victory over winless FIU.

O'Brien completed 18 of 27 passes despite being bothered by a high ankle sprain for two weeks. His backup was Logan, a wide receiver, because junior Jamarr Robinson couldn't even lift his arm before the game.

O'Brien brought the Terps back from an early 7-0 deficit and directed two long scoring drives after FIU pulled into a tie at 21.

FIU amassed 472 yards on a whopping 98 snaps, but the Terrapins made the big plays when it counted most.

After the Panthers got within a touchdown with 4:16 left, Maryland's Davin Meggett ran for a 76-yard touchdown on the next play from scrimmage to clinch the victory.

Down 21-14 at halftime, FIU got a 5-yard touchdown pass from Carroll to Jonathan Faucher with 5:34 left in the third quarter.

After the kickoff, a pass interference call wiped out a third-down incompletion. On the next play, O'Brien lofted a 68-yard touchdown pass to Smith to put the Terrapins on top to stay.

A 9-yard run by Scott made it 35-21, and FIU subsequently missed two chances to get within a touchdown after getting inside the Maryland 11.

Maryland 21, Duke 16

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Maryland was in desperate need of a big play when Tony Logan wrapped his arms around a punt at his own 16-yard line.

Eight-four yards later, the Terrapins had their first lead against Duke.

Logan's electrifying punt return in the third quarter provided Maryland with the push it needed, and the Terrapins opened the ACC portion of their schedule with a 21-16 victory.

Maryland (4-1, 1-0) trailed 9-0 midway in the second quarter and 9-7 at halftime before coming back. Logan's touchdown made it 14-9, and the Terps held on.

Logan sidestepped a potential tackler immediately after catching the punt. He then headed upfield, juked to his left and then cut right at his own 25 before sprinting down the sideline to the end zone. It was Logan's second punt return for a score in two weeks.

Duke (1-4, 0-2) lost for the fourth-straight time. Sophomore Sean Renfree completed 28 of 56 passes for 351 yards and a touchdown, but he was intercepted twice.

Donovan Varner had eight catches for 128 yards, and Conner Vernon gained 99 yards on six receptions.

A 2-yard touchdown pass from Renfree to Brandon King made it 21-16 with 7:20 to go, and after a Maryland punt the Blue Devils moved from their own 19 to the Maryland 39 with two minutes left. Facing a fourth-and-15, Renfree threw a pass to Austin Kelly that was tipped away.

Duke has been tormented this season by too many turnovers and the Terrapins got their first touchdown late in the first half following an interception, and in the second half Logan and Scott scored on long plays.

But the Duke defense - which was allowing 44.5 points per game - made it tough on O'Brien, who was playing in place of injured starter Jamarr Robinson for a second straight week. O'Brien went 9 for 26 for 170 yards, including his TD pass to Scott.

Davin Meggett capped off an eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 3-yard TD plunge which cut Duke's lead to 9-7 with under two minutes left in the first half.

Will Snyderwine kicked three first-half field goals when the Maryland defense stiffened in the red zone three times.

### Maryland 24, Boston College 21

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. - Antwine Perez had two interceptions and a fumble recovery, and Danny O'Brien matched a career high with three TD passes to lead Maryland to an emotional 24-21 win over Boston College.

O'Brien completed 27 of 40 passes for 182 yards, hitting Torrey Smith, Ronnie Tyler and Kerry Boykins on touchdown passes for Maryland (5-2, 2-1 ACC) which held off a fourth-quarter rally by the Eagles.

The Terps were playing without Pete DeSouza, who was lost for the year in a traffic accident less than 48 hours before kickoff. Despite the emotions, O'Brien, also a redshirt freshman, didn't seem rattled.

He did not turn the ball over and connected with eight different receivers. Smith had receptions and Tyler added five catches for 57 yards for the Terps who utilized a short passing game to counter the ACC's top-ranked rush defense.

Maryland went ahead late in the first quarter on a 2-yard scoring pass from O'Brien to Smith. The score completed a 13-play drive which was set up by a 29-yard punt return from Tony Logan, the nation's second-leading returner.

After BC tied the game at 7-all with 12:09 left in the second quarter on a Chase Rettig to Bobby Swigert 3-yard TD connection, the Terps cashed in two of the Eagles' three turnovers.

Kenny Tate forced Montel Harris to do something he rarely does, fumble the football. The junior knocked the ball free and Perez recovered at the BC 38. Nine plays later O'Brien hit Tyler on a 9-yard TD pass.

On BC's next offensive play, Rettig was intercepted by Perez and he returned it to the Eagles' 22. O'Brien directed another short TD march, connecting with Boykins on a 6-yard scoring toss on third-and-goal with 2:38 to go in the opening half.

Maryland got a 26-yard field goal from Travis Baltz to go ahead 24-7 with 13 seconds to play in the third quarter before BC started to get things going.

Rettig hit Ifeanyi Moma for a 23-yard pass to the Maryland 7, and Harris ran it three times for the score that made it 24-14 with 11:20 to play. After BC forced a punt, Rettig threw a long pass to Moma that was high and off his fingertips, only to be caught by Swigert for a gain of 63 yards.

### Maryland 62, Wake Forest 14

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Danny O'Brien threw a career-high four touchdown passes, Kenny Tate and Ryan Donohue each scored on interception returns and Maryland rolled past Wake Forest 62-14 to become bowl eligible.

The Terrapins (6-2, 3-1 ACC) scored on their first four possessions and blocked two punts in taking a 27-7 halftime lead. During a 28-point third quarter, Tate and Donohue sandwiched their scores around a touchdown pass by O'Brien to assure Wake Forest (2-6, 1-4) its sixth straight defeat.

It was Maryland's most lopsided ACC win since a 59-7 rout of North Carolina in 2002, and the 62 points tied the school record for a conference game, set in 1975 in a 62-24 win over Virginia.

O'Brien, a redshirt freshman, went 13 for 20 for 168 yards before being lifted in the third quarter. He has seven touchdown passes in his last two games and 12 overall.

Davin Meggett ran for 94 yards and a touchdown for the Terrapins, whose sixth win made them bowl eligible for the seventh time in 10 years under Friedgen.

Wake Forest freshman quarterback Tanner Price completed 16 of 31 passes for 156 yards and a touchdown. Backup Skylar Jones played briefly in the third quarter, but one of his three passes was picked off by Donohue, who took it 25 yards into the end zone.

Wake's running game was held down by Maryland, finishing with minus-3 yards on 21 attempts. Josh Harris, coming off a 241-yard rushing performance against Virginia Tech, was limited to 24 yards on nine carries.

# 2010 University of Maryland Football Notes: Season Review

## GAME10

Nov. 13, 2010

### Maryland 42, Virginia 23

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. -- D.J. Adams ran for three touchdowns and Danny O'Brien ran for one and threw for two, leading Maryland to a 42-23 victory against Virginia.

The Terrapins (7-3, 4-2 ACC) remained in control of their chance to play in their first ACC championship game. Maryland will gain the Atlantic Division's berth if they win their final regular season games, both at home, against Florida State and North Carolina State.

Virginia (4-6, 1-5) saw its three-game winning streak in the series end on Senior Day, and lost to its northern border rival for only the fifth time in the last 19 meetings.

Adams scored his third touchdown on a 2-yard run just 35 seconds into the fourth quarter, capping a drive kept alive by a pass that went through the hands of Virginia linebacker Darnell Carter and into the arms of LaQuan Williams for a 26-yard gain on third-and-14.

After Virginia backed up inside its own 5 yard-line and punted, with the Terps taking over at the Cavaliers' 42, O'Brien drove them for the clinching score in eight plays. His 2-yard toss to Da'Rel Scott pushed the lead to 35-23, and the outcome was determined.

Two interceptions of Virginia's Marc Verica followed on the Cavaliers' ensuing possessions, and O'Brien hit Torrey Smith with a 12-yard TD pass with 2:35 remaining.

The Terps freshman finished 17 for 28 for 289 yards, and Smith caught seven for 157 yards. Verica was mistake-free before the final quarter, and was 25 for 43 for 265 yards.

The Terps led 21-20 at halftime, and all three scoring drives included a long pass.

## GAME11

### Florida State 30, Maryland 16

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -- Christian Ponder threw for 170 yards and a touchdown, and Florida State beat Maryland 30-16 to remain in the hunt to play in the ACC title game.

The Terrapins (7-4, 4-3) were eliminated from contention. Maryland, which became the last ACC team to lose at home this season, needed to beat the Seminoles and Wolfpack to win the division crown for the first time.

Down 23-16, Maryland drove to the Florida State 19 in the final minute before Nick Moody intercepted a fourth-down pass by redshirt freshman Danny O'Brien and took it 90 yards for the clinching score with 36 seconds left.

The Seminoles took advantage of four Maryland turnovers, including two interceptions and a fumble in the fourth quarter after FSU took a 20-16 lead. The Terrapins came in with an ACC-low eight turnovers in 10 games.

Neither team led by more than seven points until the closing seconds and the lead changed hands three times.

Chris Thompson ran for 95 yards, including a 70-yard touchdown, Ponder completed 16 of 26 passes and Bert Reed had six catches for 93 yards and a touchdown for the Seminoles.

Da'Rel Scott gained 84 yards rushing for the Terrapins and Davin Meggett ran for 72 yards. O'Brien went 25 for 45 for 269 yards and a touchdown.

Maryland took a 16-13 lead in the third quarter on a 32-yard field goal by Travis Baltz after Thompson lost a fumble at the FSU 47.

Florida State answered with a 44-yard touchdown pass from Ponder to Reed, who caught a short throw over the middle and weaved his way into the end zone.

Greg Reid then intercepted a pass by O'Brien at the Maryland 43. The Seminoles punted, but the kick hit Maryland's Cameron Chism and was recovered by FSU. That led by a field goal by Dustin Hopkins for a 23-16 lead with 4:37 left.

The Terrapins wore black helmets for the first time this season, along with black jerseys and pants with camouflage trim to support the Wounded Warrior Project. Maryland fans were also dressed in black.

## GAME12

Nov. 27, 2010

### Maryland 38, No.21 NC State 31

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Danny O'Brien threw for a career-high 417 yards and four touchdowns, all to Torrey Smith, and Maryland denied No. 21 North Carolina State a spot in the Atlantic Coast Conference title game by defeating the Wolfpack, 38-31.

Needing a victory to win the league's Atlantic Division, the Wolfpack (8-4, 5-3) scored touchdowns on their first two possessions to take a 14-0 lead. But the Terrapins (8-4, 5-3) rallied behind O'Brien, who made up for a running game that finished with negative yardage.

North Carolina State ended up in a second-place tie with Maryland behind Florida State, which will face Virginia Tech in the championship game on Dec. 5.

O'Brien, a redshirt freshman, completed 33 of 47 passes in the first 400-yard game by a Terp quarterback since Scott Milanovich in 1993.

Smith had a career-high 14 catches for 224 yards and became the first Maryland player with four touchdown receptions in a single game.

Smith scored on passes of 11, 10, 12 and 71 yards. The last touchdown came with 6:26 left immediately after Maryland's Drew Glover sacked Russell Wilson on a fourth-down play from the Maryland 8 with the Terrapins ahead 31-17.

Wilson scored on a 1-yard run with 2:39 remaining. The Wolfpack recovered the onside kick and Wilson threw a TD pass with 1:16 left, but Maryland pounced on the ensuing onside kick.

Travis Baltz had the wind behind him when he kicked a career-long 52-yard field goal to put the Terrapins up 17-14 at halftime.

Maryland made it 24-14 in the third quarter when O'Brien capped an 80-yard drive with a pass to Smith, who wriggled free in the left side of the end zone. O'Brien completed four passes on the drive, including three to Smith for 44 yards.

## Maryland 51, East Carolina 20

WASHINGTON - The Maryland Terrapins forced four turnovers and Da'Rel Scott ran for 200 yards with a 51-20 victory over East Carolina in the Military Bowl.

Scott had second-half touchdown runs of 61 and 91 yards on back-to-back offensive plays and posted the school's first 200-yard rushing game since 2003. D.J. Adams had four short touchdown runs for the Terrapins, who finished 9-4.

Dominique Davis completed 33 of 54 passes for 255 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions for East Carolina (6-7), which scored a season-low in points and committed 15 penalties.

The first half included 12 penalties, four turnovers, a blocked extra point and a missed 25-yard field goal. The Terrapins scored on a 45-yard touchdown pass from ACC rookie of the year Danny O'Brien to Kevin Dorsey, a 1-yard run by Adams and a 23-yard field goal by Travis Baltz.

East Carolina didn't score until Mike Barbour's 37-yard field goal with 6:08 left in the half - the longest the Pirates had gone into a game without scoring this season.

The Terrapins began scoring at will in the second half. They added to a 16-3 halftime lead when David Mackall returned a tipped interception 35 yards to East Carolina's 1, setting up Adams' second touchdown.

Dwayne Harris' 36-yard punt return led to East Carolina's first touchdown, a 20-yard pass to Lance Lewis that made the score 23-10, but the Terrapins responded with a 69-yard drive capped by another touchdown from Adams.

Scott ran up the middle untouched for a 61-yard score on the first play of a drive late in the third quarter, and did virtually the same from 91 yards on the first play of the next drive early in the fourth.
