## FIRST-AND-10...

• Maryland will make its fourth bowl appearance in the last five seasons, and seventh in the last 10 years, when the Terps take on East Carolina in the Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman. The Terrapins, who finished tied for second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and had the second-best turnaround in the FBS, are looking to end the year with at least nine wins for the first time since 2006 and 14th time in school history. East Carolina, which is making its fifth straight bowl appearance, has one of the most potent offenses in the nation. The Pirates rank seventh nationally in passing offense (319.3 ypg) and 12th in scoring (38.2 ppg). Maryland and ECU have never met.



- The Maryland offense has been an evolving and improving unit throughout the season under third-year coordinator and assistant head coach James Franklin. The Terps, who have posted over 400 total yards in four of the last five games, rank 42nd nationally in scoring offense (31.4 ppg) and have held onto the ball. Only three teams in the FBS have fewer turnovers than Maryland and QB Danny O'Brien, the ACC Rookie of the Year, has posted the lowest interception percentage in the country among freshmen (1.90). RBs Da'Rel Scott and Davin Meggett, and WR Torrey Smith have provided big plays for an offense which has scored eight times this season on plays of 40 yards or more. Smith, one of the most dynamic players in the nation and a first team All-ACC choice, has 12 TD receptions which is tied for eighth in the FBS, while his 87.08 receiving yards-per-game average is 20th. O'Brien, 6-3 as a starter, ranks fourth in the ACC in passing efficiency (135.2) and fourth among FBS freshmen. Despite being depleted by injury with the losses of LT Justin Gilbert (knee) and RT Pete DeSouza (fractured legs), the o-line has allowed two or fewer sacks in nine games. LG Andrew Gonnella is the only lineman to start all 12 games at the same position, while Paul Pinegar, an All-ACC selection, has started at both center and right tackle.
- The linebacker corps, including three-time All-ACC performer Alex Wujciak, and a hard-hitting secondary anchor the defense under second-year coordinator Don Brown. The Terps, who have scored four times defensively (tied for fourth in the FBS), rank 38th nationally in points allowed (22.3 ppg) and are tied for 17th in red-zone defense (74 percent). Maryland is allowing foes to gain just 4.7 yards per play, which ranks tied for second in the ACC. Wujciak ranks fourth in the league and tied for 32nd nationally in tackles (9.3 pg). LB Adrian Moten, a playmaker throughout his career, ranks tied for 21st in the ACC in stops (6.0 pg) and tied for eighth in passes defended (0.83 pg). Demetrius Hartsfield, the third member of the linebacking corps, ranks third on the team in stops (74). Joe Vellano ranks fourth in the ACC in tackles among linemen (4.9 pg) and has a team-high five sacks. The secondary has a number of playmakers. First team All-ACC performer Kenny Tate ranks tied for fifth in the FBS in forced fumbles (0.33 pg) and sixth in the ACC in tackles (7.8 pg). SS Antwine Perez is tied for 11th in the FBS in fumbles recovered (0.25 pg) and leads the team in pass breakups (eight). CBs Cameron Chism and Trenton Hughes are tied for second on the team with seven pass breakups apiece.
- Special teams has been a strength for the Terps most of the season. Travis Baltz, a 2008 first team All-ACC punter, has handled both kicking chores this season. Baltz, who was a candidate for the 2010 Ray Guy Award, has connected on 13 of his 16 FG attempts and is averaging 42.0 yards per punt, which is sixth in the ACC. Junior Tony Logan has been one of the top punt returners in the nation. The first team All-ACC performer has returned two punts for scores, becoming one of just two players in league history to post consecutive games with a return for a score. Logan is also averaging 18.8 ypr which is third in the FBS. Smith was one of the top kick returners in the country last season, posting an ACC single-season record 1,309 yards. He is the career leader in the league as well, setting that mark vs. Miami (11/6).

## **QUICK HITTERS...**

- Maryland is bowl eligible for the seventh time in 10 seasons under 2010 ACC Coach of the Year Ralph Friedgen. The Terps are 4-2 in bowl games under Friedgen. The four bowl wins are the most in school history. He is also one of seven ACC coaches with four or more all-time bowl victories.
- · The Terps are seeking their 14th nine-win regular season in school history, including fifth under Friedgen (2001-03, 2006).
- · Maryland, 2-10 last year, has posted the best turnaround in the ACC (+6). No other team's win total has increased by more than three (NC State) from its 2009 record. The six-win increase is also the second-best turnaround in the FBS (see chart on pg. 8) so far this year (Miami [Ohio] - 8). The turnaround in the win column is the best in school history during the modern era (five was previous high - 1945 and
- · Friedgen became the 13th head coach in ACC history to amass 70 career wins with the victory over Duke (10/2). The win over NC State (11/27) was his 74th which put him third in school history. Curley Byrd is the all-time leader with 119 and Jerry Claiborne is second (77).
- Danny O'Brien threw for a career-high 417 yards against NC State (11/27) and is now in sixth place on the ACC single-season freshman passing yardage list (2,257). He finished the regular season with 21 TD passes and is just the second player in school history to throw 20 or more TDs in a single season (Scott Milanovich had 26 in 1993 and 20 in '94).
- Torrey Smith posted 272 all-purpose yards (224 receiving, 48 KOR) against NC State (11/27), breaking Lamont Jordan's school record for career all-purpose yards. Smith has 5,183 yards and ranks seventh in ACC history in career all-purpose yards. Smith's 65 receptions rank fifth on the Maryland single-season chart, while his 1,045 receiving yards are second.
- · Alex Wujciak had a team-high 112 tackles in the regular season. The senior has at least 100 tackles in three straight seasons and is just the sixth player in school history to accomplish that feat (also D'Qwell Jackson, E.J. Henderson, Eric Barton, Ratcliff Thomas and Chuck Faucette). He has earned All-ACC honors the last three seasons.
- The Terps have 17 interceptions this year, the most since 2002 when they had 18. Eight of those interceptions have come from linebackers (Moten - 4; Wujciak
- 2: Demetrius Hartsfield 1: Rvan Donohue 1).
- · The Terps four defensive scores this season (all interception returns for TDs) match the team's total from the last five years (two in 2009, one in 2006, one in 2005). In fact since 1987, the Terps have posted as many as three just three times (1998-00).
- · Moten has a career-best four picks which is second on Maryland's single-season chart for linebackers (see pg. 23), trailing only Karl Edwards' five in 1987.

The senior's 0.33 INTs per game ranks tied for second in the FBS among LBs.

· Moten is one of only two players in the ACC (also Davon Morgan, Va Tech) with at least four interceptions and 70 or more tackles.

## **SIX EARN ALL-ACC** HONORS...

Six Terps earned spots on the 2010 All-ACC team. Headlined by four firstteam All-ACC honorees in wide receiver Torrey Smith, punt returner Tony Logan, linebacker Alex Wujciak and safety Kenny Tate, the Terps had their most all-conference players since 2008 when they had nine. Sophomore defensive tackle Joe Vellano was voted to the second team, while senior offensive lineman Paul Pinegar was an honorable mention selection. The four first team selections were tied for the most with Clemson. The five first and second team choices were tied for third with Clemson. Virginia Tech (11) and Miami (9) led the way. The Terps haven't had as many as four first team all-league choices since the 2003 season (also four).

## FRIEDGEN, O'BRIEN **HONORED BY ACC...**

Ralph Friedgen was voted ACC Coach of the Year and quarterback Danny O'Brien was tabbed the league's top overall and offensive rookie by ACS-MA. Friedgen received the Coach of the Year award for the second time in his

career (2001), while O'Brien is the first Terp to be named ACC Rookie of the Year (award instituted in 1975). The Terps were in the running for their first-ever Atlantic Division title due in great part to the emergence of O'Brien, who is the fourth-ranked freshman passer in the FBS (135.20 rating). He has completed

179 of 315 passes for 2,257 yards, the sixth-highest total for a freshman in ACC history. O'Brien received 54 of the 61 votes as the top overall rookie. Friedgen is the fourth Maryland coach to be honored by the league (also Jim Tatum - 1953, 55; Jerry Claiborne - 1973, 75, 76; Bobby Ross - 1982). Friedgen (29) outpaced Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech (19) in the voting.

## **MARYLAND BOWL FACTS...**

- Maryland reached bowl eligibility for the seventh time in 10 seasons under **Ralph Friedgen** with its 62-14 win over Wake Forest (10/30). The Terps are playing in a bowl game for the fourth time in five seasons (see all-time bowl chart on pg. 8).
- The Terps have won four of their last five bowl games. Friedgen's four bowl wins are the most of any Maryland coach. He is 4-2 overall in bowl games, including a school-record three straight wins from 2003-06. Prior to Friedgen's arrival, Maryland made only one postseason appearance in the previous 15 years.
- The Terps have an all-time record of 10-11-2 in bowl games and have out-scored their last five bowl opponents 151-73.
- The Terps have not faced a Conference USA opponent in a bowl game, though the Terps did play Houston, a current member of the league in the 1977 Cotton Bowl. The Cougars downed the Terps, 30-21.

## **GETTING OFFENSIVE ON DEFENSE...**

The Terps have four interception returns for touch-downs this season, including three in the last five games. No other team in the ACC has posted more than two this year. In fact, the other 11 teams in the league have combined for 16 with BC, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Miami, UNC, Virginia Tech and NC State posting two apiece. The four interception returns for a TD are tied for second in the FBS (see below), while the team's four defensive scores are tied for fourth in the country.

## **CLAMPING DOWN...**

After finishing 83rd in total defense (396.3 yards per game) and 100th in points allowed (31.3 pg) last season, Maryland's attacking-style unit gradually improved this year, and now the Terps are among the better defenses in the FBS. The Terps rank 38th in scoring defense (22.3 ppg), 46th in total defense (353.1 ypg), 35th in rushing defense (132.2 ypg), tied for 17th in red-zone defense (74 percent) and tied for

25th in turnovers gained (25). Before surrendering a season-high 504 total yards to Miami (11/6), Maryland held Wake Forest (10/30), which was averaging 206.6 rushing yards per game, to minus-3 yards on the ground (lowest total by an opponent in 11 years). Fourth-down stops have been a key in four victories, including a goal-line stand on Navy's final play in the season opener (9/6). The Terps also had important fourth-down stops at the end of the FIU (9/25), Duke (10/2) and BC (10/23) games.

### STREAKS AND TRENDS...

- Maryland is 7-2 when winning the turnover battle and 5-2 when being outgained by the opponent.
- The Terps are 4-1 in games decided by seven points or less. Last year, they lost four games by four points or less and the last two by a combined five points. The Terps have regained their form of 2008 when they were 6-1 in games decided by a TD or less.
- Despite a season-high four turnovers vs. FSU (11/20), the Terps have turned the ball over just 12 times this year (eight interceptions/four fumbles) and just four of those (two vs. Navy, 9/6; one vs. Miami, 11/6; one vs. FSU, 11/20) occurred in the red zone. Maryland is tied for fourth in the FBS in fewest turnovers. The Terps had 24 turnovers (10 picks/14 fumbles) last season.
- Alex Wujciak has started a team-best 37 straight games, all at Mike LB. Paul Pinegar's 24 straight starts lead the offense.
- Ten defensive players have started all 12 games. Defensive coordinator **Don Brown** has started three safeties three times with NT **A.J. Francis** sitting in those instances. There have been five offensive players who have started each game (see list on pg. 36). The Terps have started four offensive line combinations this season.
- The Terps have recorded 24 picks over the last 17 games. They have at least one interception in 10 of 12 games this season.
- SS Antwine Perez has posted at least seven tackles in the last four games. He is averaging 8.25 stops-per-game over that span.
- FS **Kenny Tate** has posted at least six tackles in all but one game this season.
- TE **Will Yeatman** has 13 catches on the season, but 10 of those have come in the last two games.
- In his six wins as a starter, QB **Danny O'Brien** has completed 116 of 187 passes (62 percent) for 1,473 yards (245.5 ypg) with 16 TDs and no interceptions.
- Maryland reached 40 points for the fourth time this year in the 42-23 win over Virginia (11/13). It marks the first time since 2002 that the Terps have gone over 40 points four times during the regular season.



- 1...Despite losing two starting offensive tackles to season-ending injuries (Justin Gilbert knee; Pete DeSouza fractured legs), the Terps allowed just 12 sacks in their eight ACC games which was the third-fewest in the league.
- 2...Tony Logan has returned two punts for TDs this season, while the other 11 ACC teams have combined for six.
- 3...Danny O'Brien's 21 TD passes ranks third in the FBS among freshmen QBs.
- 6...Number on non-offensive touchdowns scored by the Terps (four interception returns; two punt returns) which leads the ACC. It marks the most non-offensive TDs for the Terps since 2002 (seven).
- 6...Number of graduates on the 2010 roster. Michael Carter, Emani Lee-Odai, Adrian Moten, Joey Mc-Queeney, Antwine Perez and Da'Rel Scott have each earned a degree.
- 9...The Terps have placed a punter on the Academic All-ACC team in each of the last nine seasons. Travis Baltz has been a member for the last three years (Adam Podlesh 2003-06; Brooks Barnard 2001-02).
- 10.2...Alex Wujciak has averaged 10.2 tackles per game in his career which is third in the FBS among active players (see chart on pg. 4).
- 12...Number of true freshmen who have started during Ralph Friedgen's 10 years (2001 Domonique Foxworth, Randy Starks; 2003 Vernon Davis; 2005 Jeremy Navarre, Danny Oquendo, Jared Gaither; 2006 Cory Jackson; 2007 Travis Baltz; 2009 Nick Ferrara, Bennett Fulper; 2010 Desmond Kearse, Matt Robinson).
- 13...The Terps are plus-13 in the turnover dept. this season which is their best mark since 2001 (plus-16).
- 19...Number of players who have scored a TD this season, the most in the Ralph Friedgen era (17 in 2002 was the previous high).
- 20...Number of points the opposition has scored off 12 Maryland turnovers this season. In contrast, the Terps have scored 93 points off 25 opponent turnovers. The Terps surrendered a season-high 13 points off TOs to FSU (11/20).
- 26...The Terps have 26 players on NFL rosters (plus three on practice squads), which ranks third among ACC squads, trailing just Miami (42) and FSU (27). See list on page 28.
- 136... The Terps have not had a punt blocked since the Florida State contest (11/13/99), a stretch of 136 games, which is the longest active streak in the nation.

## **DYNAMIC DUO...**

Maryland may have one of the top safety duos in the country. A disruptive force who is having an impressive season, Kenny Tate ranks sixth in the ACC in tackles (7.8 per game), which is tops among defensive backs (19th in the FBS). He is also tied for fifth in the FBS in forced fumbles (0.33 per game) and is the top sack producer in the ACC among defensive backs (0.29 pg). The junior, who was a candidate for the 2010 Thorpe Award, also has three interceptions, returning one for a score vs. Wake Forest (10/30). Tate's counterpart Antwine Perez, another candidate for postseason honors, is coming off six straight impressive performances. He earned ACC Defensive Back of Week after posting a career-best two interceptions and recovering a fumble in a 24-21 win over BC (10/23). He chipped in a sack and a forced fumble vs. Wake Forest (10/30) and eight tackles, including a season-best six solo stops, vs. Miami (11/6). Perez had seven tackles and one PBU vs. Virginia (11/13), and seven tackles and 1.5 TFLs against Florida State (11/20). He was again named ACC DB of the Week for his performance vs. FSU. Perez ranks tied for fourth in the ACC in passes defended (0.92 pg), tied for third in fumbles recovered (0.25 pg) and tied for 12th in interceptions (0.25 pg). The Perez-Tate duo has been one of the keys to the Terps possessing the second best turnover margin in the ACC (seventh in the FBS) and ninth-best pass efficiency defense in the nation.

### WUJCIAK DOES IT AGAIN...

One of the top tacklers in the nation the last three years, Alex Wujciak makes plays for the Terps in a number of ways. The senior intercepted Stephen Morris of Miami (11/6) and returned it 60 yards for a TD, the second pick-six of his career (also vs. NC State in 2009). He then intercepted Morris again in the third quarter and returned it 26 yards to set up a potential scoring drive. Wujciak set the Maryland single-season record for interception return yards (152) a year ago and he is now second in career interception return yards with 238, trailing only Tom Brown (275/1960-62). Wujciak is one of just five players, and the only linebacker, in Maryland history with two interception returns for TDs.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS STANDOUT...

Areserve wideout who has solidified his role as a punt returner, **Tony Logan** has been a game-changer for Maryland this season. Although recent opponents have utilized a line-drive punt to kick away from Logan, the junior is averaging an astounding 18.8 yards per return (third in the FBS and third on the ACC single-season list) on 30 chances this season. Logan is also one of just five players in the FBS who has at least two punt returns for touchdowns - an 85-yarder against FIU (9/25) and an 84-yarder vs. Duke (10/2). The TD returns came at crucial times for the Terps –

his TD against FIU (first punt return for a score since Steve Suter in the 2004 Gator Bowl) broke a 7-7 tie and the one against Duke gave Maryland a 14-9 lead. Logan has four returns over 50 yards and his 563 punt return yards are the second most in a season in both Maryland and ACC history (771 by Steve Suter in 2002) and more than 117 of the 120 FBS schools tallied all of 2009. Oregon (673) and Utah (616) are the only schools which have more yards than Logan this season. Logan has two of the top three punt returns in school history, trailing only a 90-yard TD by Dick Nolan in 1953. Logan had a career-high 135 punt return yards vs. FIU, his second 100-yard game of the season (also 128 yards vs. Morgan State, 9/11). Logan's 13.96 yard-per-return career average ranks fourth in the FBS among active players.

## **BREAKING UP IS EASY TO DO...**

The Terps, who rank ninth in the FBS in passing efficiency defense, have been an aggressive bunch this season. The defense has posted 51 pass breakups on the season after tallying 29 all of 2009. Antwine Perez ranks tied for fourth in the ACC in passes defended (0.92 pg) while Adrian Moten is tied for eighth (0.83 pg). In addition, Cameron Chism and Trenton Hughes are tied for second on the team with seven PBUs apiece. Perez has a team-high eight. Chism and Perez had two of the best games in the country this season knocking down passes. Chism had four PBUs vs. FIU (9/25) and Perez matched that total vs. Duke (10/2), tallies that are tied for the most in one FBS game this season.

## **BLOCK PARTY...**

Maryland has not had a punt blocked in 136 straight games, but over that time span the Terps have blocked 16 of the opposition's, including four on the season (two vs. Wake Forest, 10/30; two vs. Morgan State, 9/11). LaQuan Williams registered the Terps' third blocked punt of the season in the opening quarter vs. the Demon Deacons. The 11-yard punt gave the Terps the ball at the WF 32. Maryland kicked a field goal 10 plays later. Nick Peterson added Maryland's fourth block punt of year in the second quarter. That block was recovered by **Kevin Dorsey** and the Terps scored two plays later on a 3-yard pass from Danny O'Brien to Haroon Brown. The Terps have scored following all four blocked punts this season (also 10 points vs. Morgan State). Maryland also blocked an extra point vs. Miami (11/6) and a field goal vs. NC State (11/27). The six blocked kicks are the most in the Ralph Freidgen era (4 in 2001, 2004, 2008).

## DID YOU KNOW?...

Alex Wujciak's 238 career interception return yards are tied for fourth in the FBS among active players (first among linebackers).

#### HOLDING ONTO THE BALL...

The Terps were among the best teams in the nation this season at not committing turnovers. Maryland ranked second in the ACC and tied for seventh nationally in turnover margin (+1.08 pg). The Terps, plus-13 on the season, won the turnover battle in nine of 12 games. Only three teams in the nation (lowa, Wisconsin and Navy) committed fewer turnovers than Maryland (12).

## **EXPLOSIVE PLAYS...**

One of the keys to Maryland's success this season has been its ability to make explosive plays to score points.

- Maryland has 76 explosive plays (defined as 20 yards or longer) this year, and the Terps have scored 18 touchdowns on those plays. In 2009, Maryland had just 13 TDs off explosive plays.
- The Terps have 17 plays of 50 yards or longer this year eight on passes, four on punt returns, three on rushes and two on interception returns. In 2009, Maryland had eight plays of 50 yards or longer.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR VS. ECU...

- If Maryland wins the game, it will become the first team in the ACC's 58-year history to go from two or fewer victories in one year to nine or more the next.
- Maryland is seeking to reach nine wins for the 14th time in school history and the fifth time in Ralph Friedgen's 10 seasons.
- Senior LB Adrian Moten, who has 23.5 career tackles for loss, needs 0.5 more to reach the top 15 on the Maryland all-time list (see pg. 26).

- Junior Torrey Smith, who set the Maryland career all-purpose yards mark in the NC State game, ranks seventh in ACC history (5,183). He needs 139 yards to pass Warrick Dunn of Florida State (1993-96, 5,321) for sixth place.
- Smith has a school-record 12 TD receptions this season, which is tied for the ninth most in ACC history. One more would move him into a tie for fifth. The ACC record is 17 by Clarkston Hines of Duke in 1989.
- Smith ranks fifth on the Maryland single-season receptions list with 65. With five more, he could move into third all-time. Geroy Simon owns the school record with 77 in 1994.
- Danny O'Brien, who set the Maryland single-season freshman passing yards mark vs. Miami (11/6), currently ranks sixth on the ACC single-season freshman passing yardage list with 2,257. He needs 270 yards to move pass Kyle Parker of Clemson for fifth (see page 7 for complete list).
- Additionally, O'Brien could move into the Maryland top-10 list with 138 passing yards (see complete list on page 20).
- O'Brien is responsible for 23 touchdowns this season (21 passing, one rushing, one receiving), the third most in school history. Scott Milanovich owns the record with 29 in 1993, while Scott McBrien is second with 25 in 2003.
- Davin Meggett needs 36 rushing yards to reach the Maryland career top 20 list (see pg. 24).
- Kenny Tate needs six tackles to become the first Maryland DB to reach 100 stops since Tony Jackson (101 in 2000).

## **EAST CAROLINA AT-A-GLANCE...**

- East Carolina finished the season 6-6, with a league record of 5-3 that put the Pirates in a two way tie for fourth in Conference USA.
- East Carolina has an 8-8 record all time in bowl games, most recently losing to Arkansas in last year's AutoZone Liberty Bowl.
- The Pirates boast one of the most potent passing attacks in the nation, ranked seventh in passing yards per game (319.33) and 12th in scoring offense averaging over 38 points a game.
- QB Dominique Davis has proven to be one of the most effective passers in the nation, ranking first in completions (29.8 pg) and fourth in passing yards (308 pg). The junior has totaled 36 touchdowns through the air this season, while adding nine scores rushing.
- The receiving corps at ECU has also been strong this year, with help from senior Dwayne Harris and junior Lance Lewis. Harris leads the team with receptions, amassing 93 catches for 1,055 yards and 10 touchdowns. Lewis leads ECU receivers in touchdowns with 13, while totaling 979 yards on 78 receptions.
- Despite having one of the nation's most dangerous offenses, East Carolina has struggled on the other

side of the football. The Pirates rank last in the FBS in total defense, allowing an average of 478.83 yards and 6.40 touchdowns per game to opposing teams.

• Though their defense has allowed big games to opposing offenses, East Carolina has been able to force 20 turnovers this season. Defensive back Bradley Jacobs leads the Pirates in interceptions with three, while defensive lineman Matt Milner and defensive back Emanuel Davis each have a pair of fumble recoveries.

## DID YOU KNOW?...

Tony Logan is one of only five FBS players in the last eight years to return two punts of at least 80 yards for touchdowns in the same season. He is joined on the list by Quinton Jones of Boise State (2005), DeSean Jackson of Cal (2006), Javier Arenas of Alabama (2008) and LaVon Brazill of Ohio (2009).

## TRIPLE THREAT...

Zachariah Kerr is in his second season as a reserve defensive tackle, rotating in for starters A.J. Francis and Joe Vellano. But Kerr, who checks in a svelte 320 pounds, has also seen action on special teams and offense. He has served as blocker on kickoff returns the last few games and got into the fray offensively vs. Virginia (11/13), opening holes for D.J. Adams as a fullback. Kerr, who runs a sub 5.0 in the 40-yard dash, aided Adams in scoring two of his three touchdowns and was in on two plays at fullback vs. Florida State (11/20).

## **SUDDEN CHANGE...**

After going 41 games without scoring via a fumble or interception (Erin Henderson in 2006 vs. Virginia), Maryland has registered six defensive touchdowns in the last 15 contests. Most recently, Alex Wujciak had a 60-yard interception for a touchdown against Miami (11/6). Kenny Tate and Ryan Donohue both had interceptions for scores against Wake Forest (10/30). Demetrius Hartsfield's pick-six in the second quarter of the Morgan State game (9/11) was Maryland's first defensive score since Alex Wujciak scored on a 70-yard interception return on 11/14/09 at NC State. One week after Wujciak's TD, Jared Harrell fell on a fumble in the end zone vs. Virginia Tech (11/21/09).

#### MISCELLANEOUS NOTES...

- Darin Drakeford, Austin Walker and LaQuan Williams lead the squad with 11 special teams tackles. Drakeford has nine on kickoff returns and two on punt returns, as do Walker and Williams. Avery Graham and Emani Lee-Odai are third with 10.
- The Terps turned in three of the top 14 defensive efforts in terms of total yards in the Friedgen era this season alone (see pg. 5). Maryland allowed just 85 yards against Morgan State (9/11), the best outing in Friedgen's 10 seasons. The Terps had the No. 4 performance by allowing just 155 yards to Wake Forest (10/30) and the No. 14 performance against Clemson (213 yards).
- Maryland's 62 points vs. Wake Forest (10/30) matches its highest total ever in an ACC game (see pg. 5). The Terps had 62 vs. Virginia on 11/22/75. The 48-point margin of victory against the Demon Deacons was also the most in an ACC game under Friedgen. The Terps posted 60 or more points twice in a year for the first time in school history (62 vs. Morgan State, 9/11).
- Maryland held Wake Forest (10/30) to minus-3 yards rushing. It was the first time Maryland held an opponent on the negative side of rushing since 11/3/01 when Troy State rushed for minus-1 on 26 attempts in a 47-14 Terps victory. It also marked the best performance by a Maryland defense since holding Duke to minus-5 yards on 10/30/99.

- TEs Matt Furstenburg and Will Yeatman were key contributors vs. Clemson (10/16). The duo combined for eight catches and also saw time on special teams. Furstenburg set career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (98). Yeatman, in his first year with the team after playing lacrosse the previous two, made his first receptions as a Terp, matching his career high in receptions (3) and setting one in receiving yards (41). The eight combined receptions in the game were the most by Terrapin tight ends since 11/10/07, when Jason Goode and Joey Haynos combined for eight catches against BC.
- Desmond Kearse started as a third safety against FIU (9/25), becoming the first Terp true freshman defensive player to start since Jeremy Navarre (vs. Boston College, 11/19/05). Kearse is also the first true freshman DB to start since Domonique Foxworth (vs. NC State, 11/17/01). Fellow true freshman Matt Robinson started at safety vs. Wake Forest (10/30).
- Maryland played 24 freshmen (10 true/14 redshirts) last season, which was the most during **Ralph Friedgen's** first nine seasons. The Terps played 20 freshmen in both the 2001 and 2004 seasons. Last year's freshmen are now sophomores, but the Terps are still relatively young, though more experienced. Of the 111 players on the roster, 65 are freshmen or sophomores, but just 16 are seniors. Maryland also had a relatively low senior class (14) last season.

## **NO FRESHMAN JITTERS...**

Danny O'Brien has started the last nine games (6-3 record) and has shown incredible poise and presence for a freshman signal caller. Despite not starting the first three games of the season, his 21 TD passes are third in the country among freshmen.

- On the season, O'Brien has an efficiency rating of 135.2, a mark that is fourth-best in the ACC and fourth-best among freshmen QBs in the FBS. He has done a good job spreading the ball around, hitting nine receivers in one start, eight different receivers in five starts, seven receivers in one start and six in two starts.
- Twelve different players have caught a TD for Maryland this season (including O'Brien himself). The freshman has passed, caught and run for TDs this season (4-yard TD reception vs. Clemson, 10/16; 12-yard TD run vs. Virginia, 11/13).
- O'Brien ranks sixth on the ACC single-season freshman passing yardage list with 2,257 (see chart on pg. 7 for complete list).
- The Kernersville, N.C., native became the first Maryland freshman QB to start since Latrez Harrison (11/20/99), and is one of only five freshmen QBs to start in Maryland history. O'Brien went 18 of 27 for 250 yards and a pair of touchdowns against FIU (9/25), including a 68-yard TD pass to Torrey Smith.
- O'Brien went his first 96 collegiate passes without a pick before throwing three in the fourth quarter

against Clemson (10/16). His 3.5-to-1 TD to interception ratio is second in the FBS among freshmen, as is his 2.24 interception percentage.

• O'Brien has played in each of the first 12 games, but saw just one play against Navy (9/6) and West Virginia (9/18). His first significant action came against Morgan State (9/11), when he went 5-of-10 for 79 yards. In that game, O'Brien threw three TD passes, all of which came on his first four pass attempts.

## **MULTI-FACETED PLAYMAKER...**

Torrey Smith has established himself as one of the most explosive playmakers in the nation over the last two-plus seasons. Smith set the ACC single-season record for kickoff return yardage each of the last two years, totaling 1,309 return yards a year ago. He leads the team in receptions (65) and receiving yards (1,045). His 5.4 receptions per game ranks third in the ACC and his 87.1 receiving ypg ranks second.

- In his last game against NC State (11/27), Smith had a career day amassing 224 yards on 14 receptions and four touchdowns. The four TDs are a Maryland single-game record. The 224 yards rank third all-time in Maryland history and the 14 receptions are tied for second all-time.
- Smith has 28 receptions for 450 yards and five touchdown in the last three games. His 12 TDs are tied for first in the ACC and rank first on the Terps' single-season list.
- The junior had at least one touchdown reception during a three-game span early in the season he had two against Morgan State (9/11), two against West Virginia (9/18) and one against FIU (9/25). He became the first Terp to record consecutive games with multiple touchdown receptions since Jermaine Lewis in 1993.
- Smith's explosive play ability has been evident this season. He has touchdown receptions of 60, 68,71, and 80 yards and is averaging 16.1 yards every time he touches the ball. He also ranks first in the ACC with 130.5 all-purpose yards per game.
- With 149 yards receiving against West Virginia (9/18) and 159 against FIU (9/25), Smith recorded back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for the second time in his career. The 308 yards was the most by a Terp in a two-game span since Jermaine Lewis had 394 in 1995 (205 vs. Duke, 9/23; 189 vs. Georgia Tech, 9/28).
- Smith moved into first on Maryland's career allpurpose yards list (5,183) after a career day against NC State (11/27). LaMont Jordan previously held the school record with 4,960. He is also third on the Terps career receptions list (150) and is second on the receiving yards chart (2,205).
- Smith's value to the Terrapins doesn't stop on the field he is a member of the Terrapin Council, the team's leadership committee, for the second year in a row. "He's a very good receiver, he's a very good leader, he's a very good person," Friedgen said during fall camp. "He's very humble. He's really just a great kid. He has a tremendous work ethic. He's a good student. He's the ideal of low maintenance-high production...his meaning to our team just his presence alone makes us better. Take away that he's a good football player and everything. His presence in this program, his leadership qualities, his camaraderie, his unselfishness, his ability to communicate with me and all the other kids he's going to be very successful in life."

## SHIFTS ON THE O-LINE...

Despite being dealt two major blows, the Terps' offensive line has played gutty all season. The Terps are fourth in the ACC by allowing 22 sacks on the season, but eight of those came in the West Virginia (9/18) game. A season-ending injury to Justin Gilbert vs. WVU caused the Terps to reshuffle the line. R.J. Dill moved from right to left tackle and redshirt freshman Pete DeSouza stepped in at RT. DeSouza started the next three games, but was involved in a traffic accident just two days prior to the Boston College (10/23) game. DeSouza is expected to make a full recovery, but is out for the season. For the past four games, the Terps used a lineup with Dill at left tackle, junior Andrew Gonnella at left guard, sophomore Bennett Fulper at center, sophomore Justin Lewis at right guard and senior Paul Pinegar at right tackle. But against Florida State, Lewis suffered a knee injury, and Pete White replaced him. Fulper suffered a hand injury, forcing Pinegar to move to center, Dill to move to right tackle, and true freshman Max Garcia to enter the game at left tackle for his first action this season. Fulper returned to the game, but Lewis did not.

- The line has turned in solid performances in four of the last five games. The Terps had 163 yards rushing and 269 yards passing against FSU (11/20). Against Virginia (11/13) the Terps rushed for 136 yards and passed for 289 and didn't allow a sack. In the 62-14 win over Wake Forest (10/30), Maryland had a seasonhigh tying 261 rushing yards, while also accumulating 168 passing yards and not allowing a sack.
- The Terps allowed just one sack against FIU (9/25), which entered the game 12th in the nation in that category, and none against Duke (10/2). But they surrendered eight sacks to West Virginia (9/18) and three to Clemson (10/16). After the late changes to the line for the BC game, Maryland surrendered two sacks in the game.
- In the season opener, the Terps racked up 261 rushing yards (most since 271 vs. Delaware in 2008) on just 34 attempts an average of 7.7 ypc. Davin Meggett had his first career 100-yard game, including a career long 67-yard run, Jamarr Robinson ran for 92 yards and Da'Rel Scott had 58.
- Against Morgan State (9/11), the Terps had their second consecutive 200-yard rushing game, going for 221. The last time Maryland had back-to-back 200-yard rushing games was 2007, when they had 200 against Wake Forest (9/22) and 239 against Rutgers (9/29) the following week.

## DEPTH AND EXPERIENCE AT LINEBACKER...

One of the strongest units on the team is linebacker with starters Alex Wujciak (Mike), Adrian Moten (Sam) and Demetrius Hartsfield (Will) and key backups Darin Drakeford and David Mackall.

• Wujciak ranks fourth in the ACC and 32nd nationally with 9.3 tackles per game. Moten is tied for 21st in the

league in stops (6.0 pg), has one forced fumble and is tied for No. 2 in the nation in interceptions among linebackers (0.33 per game). Hartsfield is also tied for 19th in the ACC with 6.2 tackles per game.

- The trio has combined for 259 tackles and 15.5 tackles for loss on the season and has helped Maryland rank second in the ACC in rushing defense (102.4 ypg/conference games only).
- · Wujciak is a two-time All-ACC selection and a consensus preseason first team All-ACC pick. He is one of only two players in the nation (also Nick Bellore. CMU) to post 130 tackles in 2008 and 2009. Moten's 15.5 career sacks and 23.5 tackles for loss are tops on the team. The Terps also have depth behind the starters, although they were dealt a setback with the loss of junior Ben Pooler to a knee injury in the preseason. Pooler played in 11 games with five starts last season and was the backup at Will. Sophomore Ryan **Donohue**, Pooler's replacement at Will, returned an interception for a TD against Wake Forest (10/30). Mackall, a true freshman who tied for the team lead with seven tackles against Morgan State (9/11), is the backup at Mike and Drakeford, who backs up Moten at Sam, has 5.5 tackles for loss.

## **SECONDARY STEPPING UP...**

Maryland's secondary has been a strong point this season even after losing three of four starters from 2009. The lone returning starter is junior **Cameron Chism**, who moved into a starting role last season after an injury to Nolan Carroll and had a very productive year. Opposite of Chism is junior **Trenton**

Hughes, with redshirt freshman Dexter McDougle also seeing time at cornerback. Antwine Perez and Kenny Tate took over the starting safety positions and both have made a big impact.

- The Terps rank third in the ACC and ninth nationally in pass efficiency defense by holding opponents to a 107.4 rating. A big part of that is due to Maryland's ability to force turnovers the Terps have 17 picks, which is third in the ACC.
- The Terps have recorded at least one interception in 10 of 12 games this season. Adrian Moten and Demetrius Hartsfield each had a pick against Morgan State (9/11); Tate had one against WVU (9/18); Hughes made his first career pick vs. FIU (9/25); Perez and Moten each had one against Duke (10/2); Perez had two against BC (10/23); Tate and Ryan Donohue had interceptions for TDs against Wake Forest (10/30); Alex Wujciak had two picks against Miami (11/6), one of which he returned 60 yards for a TD; Moten and Eric Franklin each had a pick against Virginia (11/13); Tate had one against FSU (11/20), and Franklin added another pick against NC State (11/27).
- Tate leads the team in solo tackles (55), including a career-high 11 solos vs. Miami (11/6) and is sixth in the ACC in total tackles (7.8 pg). He has also forced four fumbles, the most by a Maryland player since Milton Harris also had four in 2005. Perez is tied for fourth in the ACC in passes defended (0.92 pg).
- Defensive coordinator **Don Brown** rolls in a number of secondary players. Sophomore **Eric Franklin**, true freshman **Matt Robinson**, junior **Austin Walker** and senior **Michael Carter** are also in the rotation.

## MORE THAN A TACKLING MACHINE...

One of the top play-making linebackers in the country, Alex Wujciak has proved he can do more than just wrap up opposing ball carriers. Wujciak was a first team All-ACC pick in 2009 after leading the team in tackles (career-high 131) and ranking eighth nationally in that category (10.9 per game). He was a consensus preseason All-ACC pick heading into 2010 and was on the watch list for five awards - Lombardi Award, Nagurski Trophy, Lott Trophy, Bednarik Award and Butkus Award. He set a new career high with 18 tackles in the season opener against Navy (9/6) and ranks fourth in the ACC and tied for 32nd nationally with a 9.3 tackles-per-game average. But the senior has four interceptions in his career - two this year and two last year. Against Miami (11/6) he returned an interception 60 yards for a TD and had another INT that he returned 25 yards. He is one of only five players in Terp history to return two picks for TDs. Wujciak totaled 152 return yards on his two picks last season which set a single-season school record. For his career, he has 238 interception return yards, which is third in school history. Wujciak's return yardage ranked fifth nationally last season and was the most by any linebacker. He had a 70-yard interception return for a TD vs. NC State (11/7/09) and had a 82-yarder vs. FSU (11/21/09) which set up

a TD. Over the last 17 games, he's also forced three fumbles and broken up five passes.

## **COACHING STAFF AT-A-GLANCE...**

- Ralph Friedgen is in his 10th season as Maryland's head coach. Friedgen has a 74-50 (.597) record, won two ACC Coach of the Year Awards (2001, 2010) and has led the Terps to seven bowl games. He has won a school record four bowl games, while his victory total ranks third in Maryland history and his winning percentage is fourth. Friedgen became only the 13th head coach in ACC history to reach 70 career wins with the Terps victory over Duke (10/2). He is currently 10th in ACC history in all-time overall wins.
- Assistant head coach/offensive coordinator James Franklin was named the eventual successor to Friedgen in February, 2009. Franklin, 38, has spent the better part of this decade on the Maryland staff. He served as the wide receivers coach from 2000 to 2004, which spanned Friedgen's first four seasons. During that time, Franklin established himself as one of the nation's top recruiters. Rivals.com ranked Franklin as one of the nation's top 25 recruiters for two of those first four years and tapped him again last season.
- Don Brown is in his second year as defensive coordinator. Brown, who runs an attacking-style defense, served as head coach of the University of Massachusetts-Amherst the previous five years which included a trip to the 2006 NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) title game. During his tenure, UMass maintained one of the top defensive units in the nation. The Minutemen finished among the top 20 in total defense in three of his five seasons (third in 2005; 20th in 2006; 14th in 2007).

#### **BOOMING BALTZ...**

**Travis Baltz**, an All-ACC selection in 2008 as a punter, has been handling punting and place-kicking duties for the Terps.

- Baltz currently ranks sixth in the ACC and 44th nationally with an average of 42.0 ypp. Of his 64 punts on the season, 21 have been inside the opponents' 20-yard line and nine inside the 10. Twelve have been 50 yards or longer.
- While taking on kicking duties for the first time in his collegiate career, Baltz was 2-for-2 on PATs and made his only field goal attempt in the season opener against Navy (9/6), a 24-yard game winner.
- Against Morgan State (9/11), Baltz kicked two 47-yard field goals and was a perfect 8-for-8 on PATs. In addition to place-kicking and punting duties, the senior had to handle the kickoffs as well in the second half after an injury to **Ted Townsley**. Baltz averaged 60.5 yards on four kickoffs.
- Baltz averaged 45.3 ypp on seven punts against West Virginia (9/18), with a season-long 62-yarder. The senior put four punts inside the opponents' 20 and two inside the 10. He also made his only field goal attempt, a 35-yarder.
- Baltz made a career-high three field goals against FSU (31, 32, 32 yards).
- Baltz has been a reliable place-kicker, connecting on 13 of 16 field goals on the season and all 47 of his PATs. He hit a career-long 52-yard field goal in the regular season finale vs. NC State.

#### **WEEKLY AWARDS...**

The Terps had five players honored (eight times) this season by the league (list on pg. 8). DB Kenny Tate and DL Joe Vellano picked up individual awards after helping the Terps down Navy (9/6), 17-14. Tate was voted as ACC Defensive Back of the Week, while Vellano was tabbed the top defensive lineman in the league. It marked the first weekly ACC honor for both players, who were instrumental in Maryland holding Navy to two scores in seven red-zone chances. Tate notched a career-high 12 tackles and also forced a pair of fumbles. Vellano, making his first career start. had 10 tackles, including five solo stops, as well as 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. Tate was also named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and was the Jim Thorpe Award DB of the Week. Tate was added to the 2010 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List. Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Week five times, after throwing for 250 yards against FIU (9/25), for completing 26 of 39 passes for 179 yards vs. BC (10/23), a four-TD performance vs. Wake Forest (10/30), a 289-vard effort vs. Virginia (11/13) and a 417-yard, four-TD effort vs. NC State (11/27). Antwine Perez was the ACC Defensive Back of the Week after picking off two passes and recovering a fumble vs. BC. He also won for the NC State game where he posted a career-high 11 tackles, a forced fumble and a PBU. **Torrey Smith** won the ACC Offensive Back of the Week for his 14-reception, 224 receiving-yard performance vs. NC State.

## **CAREER DAY VS. NAVY...**

There were a number of Maryland players who posted career high numbers against Navy (9/6):

- Junior DB Kenny Tate recorded career highs in tackles (12), solo stops (9) and forced fumbles (2). His previous high in tackles was eight (vs. N.C. State 11/7/09). Tate matched that career high in tackles vs. Miami (11/6), a game he also eclipsed his career best in solo stops with 11.
- Senior LB **Alex Wujciak** posted a career-best 18 tackles (previous best: 17 vs. Rutgers, 9/26/09).
- Seeing his first extensive action, sophomore **Joe Vellano** recorded career highs in tackles (10), tackles for loss (3.0) and sacks (2.0). Vellano had just one career tackle before that game.
- Senior DE **Drew Gloster** had a career-high seven tackles (previous best: three vs. NC State 11/7/09).
- Sophomore LB **Demetrius Hartsfield** finished with a then career-best 12 tackles. He improved on that production with 13 stops vs. FIU (9/25).
- Sophomore DL **Justin Anderson** posted a careerhigh five tackles and his first forced fumble.
- Davin Meggett's 67-yard run in the first quarter was the longest of the junior's career. It was also Maryland's longest run since Darrius Heyward-Bey went 76 yards vs. Clemson (9/27/08). Meggett totaled 105 yards in the game on just eight carries, the first 100-yard game of his career. Meggett went on to eclipse that rush with a 76-yard TD against FIU (9/25).

## **GOAL-LINE STAND...**

The Terps had four key goal-line stands against Navy (9/6) which allowed them to come away with a 17-14 win:

- With Navy at the Maryland 1-yard line halfway through the second quarter, **Adrian Moten** leapt over the offensive line and forced a Ricky Dobbs fumble that **Antwine Perez** recovered.
- After Maryland went three-and-out, the Midshipmen again threatened to score as they drove to the Maryland 7. But Perez stopped Dobbs at the 2 on third down and time expired in the first half.
- The Terps had another big stop in the second half. After Navy went on a 13-play, 59-yard drive to get to the 1, **Kenny Tate** forced a fumble by Dobbs that Maryland linebacker **Ryan Donohue** recovered.
- Maryland came through with its biggest stop on a Navy fourth-and-goal from the 1 with just 0:37 to play. Tate smashed through the line and tackled Dobbs.

## **MORGAN STATE MILESTONES...**

Maryland downed Morgan State, 62-3, on 9/11 and there were a number of highlights in the game:

- The 85 yards in total offense allowed by Maryland against Morgan State were the fewest in the Friedgen era.
- Maryland's 17-point first quarter against Morgan State marked the most points in the opening stanza since the Terps scored 24 on 9/13/03 at home vs. The Citadel.
- Maryland's 45 points in the first half tied for the most in the Friedgen era. The Terps took a 45-21 halftime lead over North Carolina on 11/1/03 en route to a 59-21 home victory. It was the fourth time Maryland scored 40 in a half in the Friedgen era. Maryland's 28-point second quarter marked the most points since it had an ACC-record 39 in the second period against UNC in that 2003 game (also 28 in 3rd quarter vs. Wake Forest (10/30).
- The last time Maryland scored 50 or more in a game was 9/20/08 when the Terps beat Eastern Michigan 51-24. The last time Maryland scored 60 in a game was a 61-0 win over The Citadel on 9/13/03. The 62 points mark the most by the Terrapins in the Friedgen era and is the sixth-highest total in school history (see list on pg. 5). It is the seventh time Maryland has scored 50 points or more in the Friedgen era. Maryland's 62 points were the most since a 62-24 win over Virginia on 11/22/75. It was also Maryland's largest victory margin since that 61-0 win over The Citadel. The Terps hit the 60-point barrier again in the 62-14 win over Wake Forest (10/30).

## TERPS SUPPORT WOUNDED WARRIOR PROJECT...

The Maryland Department of Athletics and Under Armour announced on Oct. 11 a continued partnership with the Wounded Warrior Project (WWP), a not-for-profit organization that provides programs and services for injured service members and their families. The Terrapins wore specially-designed head-to-toe uniforms for their matchup versus Florida State (11/20). Maryland took the field in black and desert camouflage uniforms featuring the Wounded Warrior Project logo. This marked the second year Under Armour designed custom uniforms to honor the U.S. Armed Forces, with cleats being a new addition for this year (Utah and Texas Tech took part in the intiative and wore the jerseys on Nov. 6). The gear is part of the UA Freedom initiative, launched in July to support our nation's military and public safety heroes, and Under Armour's partnership with WWP. The uniforms also had a unique twist; a core value embellishment - Duty, Honor, Courage, Commitment, Integrity, Country, and Service - replaced the players' last name on the back of each jersey. The custom gameday jerseys were auctioned off on www. umterps.com with 100 percent of the proceeds going to Wounded Warrior Project. Under Armour schoolspecific fan gear is on sale at university bookstores and www.underarmour.com with a portion of the proceeds going to WWP as well.

### **TURNING RED...**

The Maryland defense came up with the big stop time and again in the 17-14 win over Navy (9/6). The Midshipmen ran 82 plays and held the ball for close to 40 minutes, but when they got within scoring range, the Terps defense stiffened. Navy ran 32 plays in the red zone, but were only able to come away with points just twice in seven trips. Navy missed a 32-yard field goal on its first possession of the game, but went inside the Maryland 5-yard line on four trips without scoring. The Terps forced two fumbles, stopped a Navy drive at the end of the first half and had a goal-line stand in the final minute of the game to secure the win.

## TERPS ADD FLORIDA TRANSFER...

One of the most highly sought-after players in the 2010 recruiting class has joined the Terps. Adrian Coxson, a transfer from the University of Florida, began practicing with the team in September. Coxson will sit out this season and be eligible to play in 2011. The Baltimore native is looking forward to getting back on the field. "It's close to home and it's a good program with great coaches," Coxson said of his decision to come to Maryland. "I believe Maryland is really on the rise and I think we're going to have a great season." A four-star prospect who was rated the No. 19 wide receiver in the nation according to Scout.com and the seventh-best player in the state of Maryland by Rivals.com, Coxson had over 1,280 yards rushing with 11 touchdowns and 650 yards passing and eight touchdowns as a wildcat guarterback in 2009. Coxson averaged 12.08 yards per carry as a senior and had more than 200 rushing yards in four games. He finished his junior season with 40 catches for 987 yards and 12 touchdowns. Coxson was a 2009 Baltimore Sun first team All-Metro selection and a second team All-Metro pick in 2008.

## TERPS OWN NATION'S LONGEST STREAK...

• During the last nine seasons, Maryland has had three full-time punters (Brooks Barnard, Adam Podlesh, and Travis Baltz), three long snappers (Jon Condo, Andrew Schmitt and Tim Downs) and zero blocked punts. In fact, since the Wake Forest game on 10/9/99, only four players (Barnard, Podlesh, Baltz, Nick Ferrara) have started at punter. Downs made his debut last season, replacing Schmitt, a four-year starter at the position. However, with Baltz shelved with a injury, Ferrara took over punting duties for five games. In addition, Ted Townsley had one punt in the game against Rutgers (9/26/09).

# TERRAPIN SPORTS RADIO NETWORK

All of Maryland's football games are broadcast live on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network, which boasts one of the strongest coverage areas in college sports. Terrapin Sports Marketing (TSM), a division of CBS Collegiate Sports Properties, manages the radio network. In its ninth year as the multi-media marketing rights partner for University of Maryland Athletics, Terrapin Sports Marketing has built a stronger network that provides coverage in Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, Delaware, New Jersey, and Washington, D.C.

WJZ-FM 105.7 and WJZ-AM 1300 in Baltimore serve as network's flagship stations, with 13 more affiliates across the state picking up the games.

In July 2010, ESPN980 became the home for Terps football in Washington, D.C. All games will be "trimulcast" throughout the D.C. metropolitan area, suburban Maryland, and Northern Virginia on 980-AM (WTEM), 92.7FM (WWXT) and 94.3FM (WWXX).

- The Terrapins' streak without a blocked punt goes back 136 games, the longest streak in college football. The team has kept that streak intact under second-year special teams coordinator Charles Bankins.
- The Terps have not had a punt blocked since the Florida State game (11/13/99). That amount of time became the longest in NCAA football when Georgia had a punt blocked by Ole Miss in 2006, snapping a streak which began earlier in the 1999 season.

## TERPS AND THE NFL DRAFT...

- There are currently 29 players on NFL rosters (see list on pg. 28), including 26 who are active (three on practice squads). The 26 active players on rosters rank third among ACC schools. Miami has 42 players active in the NFL and Florida State has 27.
- There have been 24 Terps drafted during **Ralph Friedgen's** tenure as head coach. There have also been 57 players either drafted or signed as free agents over the last seven seasons.
- Maryland had two players selected in the 2010 NFL Draft OT Bruce Campbell (Oakland, fourth round) and Nolan Carroll (Miami, fifth round) and five players selected the year before (WR Darrius Heyward-Bey, CB Kevin Barnes, LB Moise Fokou, OL Jaimie Thomas, and TE Dan Gronkowski), which was the most since 2004 when the Terps also had five players chosen. The five selections were also the most for an ACC school in 2009.
- The Terps have had at least two players selected in seven of the last nine drafts.
- The Terrapins have had 15 players chosen in the first round of the NFL Draft, including two Top-10 picks in the last five years. Darrius Heyward-Bey was taken seventh overall in 2009 (Oakland Raiders) and Vernon Davis was selected sixth in 2006 (San Francisco 49ers).

## TAKING HOME THE HARDWARE...

The Touchdown Club of Annapolis presented the Crab Bowl Trophy to Maryland after its victory over Navy (9/6). The trophy will be presented for all subsequent meetings. The Touchdown Club of Annapolis, founded in 1954, has an extensive history with both Navy and Maryland, honoring both teams at its annual banquet. Commissioned by the club with underwriting from the D'Camera Group, the Crab Bowl is a large pewter bowl overflowing with pewter replicas of the Chesapeake Bay blue crab. The Crab Bowl sits atop an ebony-colored mahogony base that is engraved with the results of previous Maryland-Navy games.

## TERRAPINS RISING AIRED FOR FOURTH YEAR...

The fourth season of `Terrapins Rising' aired this past summer. The eight-episode reality series, which chronicles the Maryland football program, was shown locally on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and around the country. Each 30-minute show gave a behind-the-scenes look at the inner workings of a major college football program. This season's series followed head coach Ralph Friedgen and his staff as they prepared the Terps for the 2010 campaign. Each episode of the show featured in-depth player and coach profiles, as well as footage of heated position battles from spring practice and off-season workouts. A film crew, led by former University of Maryland and Washington Redskins place-kicker Jess Atkinson, followed the team both on and off the field. The crew also sits in on team and positional meetings. `Terrapins Rising' is the result of a partnership between Maryland Athletics, Comcast SportsNet, Under Armour and Atkinson & Co.

## FRIEDGEN AND THE TERPS ON THE AIR...

Maryland's football broadcasting lineup for 2010 includes the Ralph Friedgen Radio Show and the Ralph Friedgen Television Show. The Ralph Friedgen Radio Show airs from 8-9 p.m. each Wednesday during the season on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network which has 15 affiliates (see chart on pg. 9 for affiliates). The Ralph Friedgen Television Show, which is presented by Outback Steakhouse, airs weekly at 11:30 a.m. Saturday on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic with the first show airing this weekend. The fast-paced, 30-minute show goes behind the scenes with Friedgen and the Maryland football team. Replays of the show are scheduled for 7 p.m. Sunday on Comcast SportsNet, just prior to the rebroadcast of the Terps most recent football game. Comcast SportsNet will carry the official rebroadcasts of all 12 University of Maryland football matchups. Friedgen also appears each Wednesday during the season on Comcast's SportsNite wrap-up show. Comcast goes live "Inside the Coach's Office" with Friedgen at 6:45 p.m. each Wednesday.

## TERP HIGHLIGHTS UNDER FRIEDGEN

- Friedgen has a 74-50 record in nine-plus years, including the only three straight 10-win seasons in school history (10-2 in 2001, 11-3 in 2002 and 10-3 in 2003). His 74 overall victories rank 10th on the ACC's all-time list.
- The consensus national coach of the year in 2001 when he
  led Maryland to its first ACC title in 16 years, Friedgen has
  guided the Terrapins to seven bowl game appearances,
  including a school-record four postseason wins. He is one of
  seven coaches in ACC history with four or more bowl wins and
  one of eight with seven or more bowl game appearances. He
  became the 13th coach in ACC history to amass 70 wins with
  the victory over Duke (10/2).
- Friedgen's 74 wins are more than the Terps had (60) in the 15 years prior to his arrival. The victory total ranks tied for third in school history and his winning percentage is fourth (.597). He has twice been voted ACC Coach of the Year (2001, 2010).
- Four of the school's 13 nine-win seasons have come in Friedgen's first nine years as head coach.
- Under Friedgen, Maryland has posted the second-best turnaround in the nation in 2010 (six-game improvement).
- Maryland was among the best in 2008 playing ranked opponents. The Terps went 4-1 vs. ranked foes (AP poll) with wins vs. No. 23 Cal, No. 20 Clemson, No. 21 Wake Forest and No. 17 UNC. The Terps were one of only five teams in the nation (also Florida, Oklahoma, USC and Texas) to beat at least four top 25 teams. The other four all finished in the top five of the final polls.
- During 2007, the Terps defeated two top 10 teams (No. 10 Rutgers, No. 8 Boston College). The Terps had never beaten two Top 10 teams in the same season. They were also one of only four teams in the nation (LSU, Kentucky and Illinois) to accomplish that feat in 2007.
- The Terps posted a school-record three-straight bowl wins (2003, 04, 06), culminating with a 24-7 triumph over Purdue in the 2006 Champs Sports Bowl. The Terps have out-scored their last five bowl foes by a 151-83 margin.
- Maryland posted a school record-tying 11-victory season in 2002, when the Terps won 10 of their last 11 games. Only the 1976 team won as many games.
- Maryland was joined by only four other Division I-A schools
   Miami (Fla.), Oklahoma, Texas and Washington State to have won as many as 10 games in the 2001, 2002 and 2003 seasons.
- A Top 20 final ranking in both major national polls for three straight years (2001-03). Maryland ended 2003 ranked 17th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press. In 2002, the Terps were ranked 13th in both polls, and in 2001 the team finished 10th in the ESPN/USA Today poll and 11th in the AP. It was the program's best three-year final rankings since 1974-76 (when the Terps finished 13th, 13th and eighth).
- After seven years as the Terps' head coach, Friedgen ranked the third-most successful seventh-year coach in ACC history, with his 56-31 mark eclipsing those of league mentors Dick

Sheridan, Tommy Bowden, Bill Dooley and Mack Brown

- He is the second-most successful sixth-year coach in ACC history, with his 50-24 mark (through the end of 2006) eclipsing those of such former league mentors as Bobby Ross and Lou Holtz. Friedgen is currently 19th among all active coaches for Football Bowl Division (formerly Division I-A) victories.
- Friedgen set the ACC record for wins (36) by a fourth-year head coach. He tied for second in the ACC in wins by a fifthyear coach.
- Bowl appearances in seven of his 10 seasons, including dominating wins in the 2004 Toyota Gator Bowl (41-7 over West Virginia) and a 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl victory over Tennessee (a team ranked fifth in the two major preseason polls). The Terrapins also earned a BCS Orange Bowl berth during the 2001 campaign.
- Friedgen led the Terps to the 2001 ACC title when the Terps became the first team other than Florida State to win an outright league title since the Seminoles joined the conference.
- By winning the 2001 ACC title, Friedgen became the first mentor in conference history to win the championship in his first year as a head coach. He also tied the mark of 10-2 set by Ken Hatfield (Clemson) in 1990, the best record ever by an ACC coach in his first season.
- 46 wins in 64 games at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium, where the Terps averaged a school-record 52,426 fans in 2005 and 51,263 in 2007.
- · Three of the last 10 ACC Defensive Players of the Year.
- 55 national television appearances, including a schoolrecord eight showings in 2002. The Terrapins played on national television or ABC regional six times in 2005, 2006 and 2007, eight times in 2008, and once in 2009.
- The program's first major national award winner since 1974
  in linebacker E.J. Henderson, a two-time consensus first
  team All-American who was named the winner of the Dick
  Butkus Award (nation's outstanding linebacker) and the
  Chuck Bednarik Trophy (nation's outstanding defensive
  player) in 2002.
- Back-to-back school records in number of first team All-ACC performers in 2001 (7) and 2002 (8), and an ACC-best 13 overall all-league honors in 2001 and nine in 2008.
- A league-best 14 representatives on the Academic All-ACC teams during a two-year span (eight in 2008; six in 2007).
- 33 weeks in at least one of the country's two major Top 25 polls, including a streak of seven consecutive weeks at the start of the 2004 season.
- The only consensus national coach of the year award (2001) in Maryland football history. He was one of 20 coaches around the nation on the watch list for the 2008 Paul `Bear' Bryant Coach of the Year Award.
- 22 of the top 29 all-time largest crowds at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium have come since 2001.
- Back-to-back school scoring records (2001 and 2002) and a two-year team scoring average of more than 33 points per

### Maryland 17, Navy 14

BALTIMORE - Navy dominated the time of possession, outgained Maryland by nearly 200 yards and made 15 more first downs

None of this lessened the enjoyment the Terrapins derived from their 17-14 victory.

Kenny Tate stopped Ricky Dobbs at the goal line with 34 seconds left, and Maryland stunned their in-state rivals to break a seven-game losing streak that began last October.

The Midshipmen (0-1) held the ball for nearly 19 minutes longer than Maryland (1-0), amassed 485 yards and collected 26 first downs. But in a game influenced by untimely turnovers and huge penalties, the outcome was decided by a gritty goalline stand.

Trailing 17-14 with a fourth down at the 1, Navy decided to go for the win. Dobbs took the snap, went to his left and was met by Tate, who would not relent to the momentum Dobbs brought to the line

Maryland raced to a 14-0 lead in the first guarter and then held on behind a defense that repeatedly excelled after Navy got inside the 20.

The Midshipmen had a 7 1/2-minute edge in time of possession in the first half, yet trailed 14-7 after coming up empty on drives of 52, 63 and 66 yards.

In the second half, Dobbs lost a fumble at the Maryland 1 and was stuffed by Tate on the game's pivotal play. Dobbs ran for 63 yards and a touchdown, but the senior quarterback fumbled three times -- losing two of them at the Maryland 1.

Navy didn't punt until early in the fourth quarter, and the short kick was returned 57 yards by Tony Logan to the Navy 16.

Maryland promptly fumbled the ball away on a missed exchange.

The Midshipmen pulled even at 14 with 1:52 left in the third quarter when Dobbs scored from the 1 on a drive that began with wide receiver Greg Jones running 53 yards on a reverse.

A crowd of 69,348 showed up for the second meeting between the teams since 1965.

Sept. 11, 2010

### Maryland 62, Morgan State 3

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - With Maryland coming off an emotional win and playing with only four days rest, coach Ralph Friedgen was worried about how the Terrapins would fare against in-state foe Morgan State. He got the answer rather

Maryland scored on its first three possessions Saturday night, and the Terrapins enjoyed their highest-scoring performance in 35 years with a 62-3 rout.

Despite the quick turnaround following Monday's win over Navy, the Terrapins reached the 62-point mark for the first time since a 62-24 blowout against Virginia on Nov. 22, 1975. It was also Maryland's largest victory margin since a 61-0 win over the Citadel on Sept. 13, 2003.

Maryland has already matched its victory total from last season and owns its first winning streak since 2008.

Morgan State (1-1) gained only six yards in the first half and finished with 85 - the fewest allowed by Maryland since Friedgen arrived in 2001.

Morgan State's lone score came on a 39-yard field goal by Kemar Scarlett in the third quarter.

Maryland backup quarterback Danny O'Brien entered for starter Jamarr Robinson in the second quarter with the score 24-0. On his third play, O'Brien unleashed his first career throw: a 27-yard touchdown pass to wide-open tight end Matt Furstenburg.

A 37-yard punt return by Tony Logan led to a 24-yard TD pass from O'Brien to Torrey Smith, and O'Brien closed out Maryland's prolific first half by connecting with running back Da'Rel Scott on a 22-yard score.

Robinson also had his first game with multiple touchdown passes, connecting with Smith on a 5-yarder and Adrian Cannon for 19 yards to end Maryland's first two possessions.

Late in the first quarter, a 6-yard punt by the Bears set up a 47-yard field goal by Travis Baltz for a 17-0 lead.

With the Bears backed up on their own 11, Maryland's Demetrius Hartsfield intercepted a Dickerson pass at the 14 and coasted into the end zone for a 24-0 lead.

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. - Jamarr Robinson had third-quarter touchdown passes of 60 and 80 yards to Torrey Smith, but a fast start lifted No. 21 West Virginia past Maryland, 31-17, on Saturday.

Geno Smith threw a career-high four touchdown passes for the Mountaineers, while Noel Devine rushed for a season-high 131 yards.

Smith, a sophomore making his third career start, had two scoring tosses apiece to sophomore Tavon Austin and redshirt freshman Stedman Bailey as West Virginia (3-0) jumped ahead 28-0 early in the third quarter.

Except for Geno Smith's 5-yard scoring toss to Bailey to start the third quarter, West Virginia struggled on offense after halftime as it tried to eat up clock time. Smith finished 19 of 29

Torrey Smith caught three passes for 149 yards. His TD catches cut Maryland's deficit to 28-14. Terps added a 35-yard field goal from Travis Baltz in the fourth quarter.

West Virginia then put the game out of reach behind fullback Rvan Clarke, who carried eight straight times on the ensuing 16-play drive that ate up nearly nine minutes of clock and ended with Tyler Bitancurt's 23-yard field goal with three minutes left for the final margin.

Maryland was trying for a 3-0 start for the first time since coach Ralph Friedgen's first season in 2001.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Maryland was in desperate need of a big play when Tony Logan wrapped his arms around a punt at his own 16-yard line.

Eight-four yards later, the Terrapins had their first lead against Duke.

Logan's electrifying punt return in the third quarter provided Maryland with the push it needed, and the Terrapins opened the ACC portion of their schedule with a 21-16 victory.

Maryland (4-1, 1-0) trailed 9-0 midway in the second guarter and 9-7 at halftime before coming back. Logan's touchdown made it 14-9, and the Terps held on.

Logan sidestepped a potential tackler immediately after catching the punt. He then headed upfield, juked to his left and then cut right at his own 25 before sprinting down the sideline to the end zone. It was Logan's second punt return for a score in two weeks.

Duke (1-4, 0-2) lost for the fourth-straight time. Sophomore Sean Renfree completed 28 of 56 passes for 351 yards and a touchdown, but he was intercepted twice.

Donovan Varner had eight catches for 128 yards, and Conner Vernon gained 99 yards on six receptions.

A 2-yard touchdown pass from Renfree to Brandon King made it 21-16 with 7:20 to go, and after a Maryland punt the Blue Devils moved from their own 19 to the Maryland 39 with two minutes left. Facing a fourth-and-15, Renfree threw a pass to Austin Kelly that was tipped away.

Duke has been tormented this season by too many turnovers and the Terrapins got their first touchdown late in the first half following an interception, and in the second half Logan and Scott scored on long plays.

But the Duke defense - which was allowing 44.5 points per game - made it tough on O'Brien, who was playing in place of injured starter Jamarr Robinson for a second straight week O'Brien went 9 for 26 for 170 yards, including his TD pass to Scott.

Davin Meggett capped off an eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 3-yard TD plunge which cut Duke's lead to 9-7 with under two minutes left in the first half.

The victory for the Tigers (3-3, 1-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) came when former Clemson star C.J. Spiller had his No. 28 retired. And Ellington did his best to emulate the excitement Spiller brought Death Valley the last four years.

Ellington broke through the Terps early in the second quarter for Clemson's first kickoff return score since Spiller had one against South Carolina last November

Ellington also had a 1-yard touchdown in the third quarter and Jaron Brown set up a TD later in the period with a 41-yard punt return.

Maryland (4-2, 1-1) had won three of its past four against Clemson, but got its lone TD on a 4-yard halfback pass from Da'Rel Scott to O'Brien who completed 24 of 45 passes.

Clemson defensive end Da'Quan Bowers had three sacks, giving him nine on the season. Cornerback Xavier Brewer had a 61-yard interception return touchdown in the final quarter.

Maryland's best chance at a late rally came in the third quarter, driving to the Clemson 29 down 24-7. However, the Terps were flagged for an illegal shift and the Tigers took over on downs

The Terps had Clemson's number the past few meetings, including the past two at Death Valley where they left with stunning victories against the favored Tigers.

Maryland outgained Clemson 350 to 213, but the Tigers made plays when they needed them.

Scott and Davin Meggett combined for just 47 yards on the ground, and receiver Torrey Smith was held to four catches for 55 yards.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. - Antwine Perez had two interceptions and a fumble recovery, and Danny O'Brien matched a career high with three TD passes to lead Maryland to an emotional 24-21 win over Boston College.

O'Brien completed 27 of 40 passes for 182 yards, hitting Torrey Smith, Ronnie Tyler and Kerry Boykins on touchdown passes for Maryland (5-2, 2-1 ACC) which held off a fourthquarter rally by the Eagles.

The Terps were playing without Pete DeSouza, who was lost for the year in a traffic accident less than 48 hours before kickoff. Despite the emotions, O'Brien, also a redshirt freshman, didn't seem rattled.

He did not turn the ball over and connected with eight different receivers. Smith had receptions and Tyler added five catches for 57 yards for the Terps who utilized a short passing game to counter the ACC's top-ranked rush defense.

Maryland went ahead late in the first quarter on a 2-yard scoring pass from O'Brien to Smith. The score completed a 13-play drive which was set up by a 29-yard punt return from Tony Logan, the nation's second-leading returner.

After BC tied the game at 7-all with 12:09 left in the second quarter on a Chase Rettig to Bobby Swigert 3-yard TD connection, the Terps cashed in two of the Eagles' three turnovers.

Kenny Tate forced Montel Harris to do something he rarely does, fumble the football. The junior knocked the ball free and Perez recovered at the BC 38. Nine plays later O'Brien hit Tyler on a 9-yard TD pass

On BC's next offensive play, Rettig was intercepted by Perez and he returned it to the Eagles' 22. O'Brien directed another short TD march, connecting with Boykins on a 6-yard scoring toss on third-and-goal with 2:38 to go in the opening half.

Maryland got a 26-yard field goal from Travis Baltz to go ahead 24-7 with 13 seconds to play in the third quarter before BC started to get things going.

Rettig hit Ifeanyi Moma for a 23-yard pass to the Maryland 7, and Harris ran it three times for the score that made it 24-14 with 11:20 to play. After BC forced a punt, Rettig threw a long pass to Moma that was high and off his fingertips, only to be caught by Swigert for a gain of 63 yards.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Danny O'Brien threw a career-high four touchdown passes, Kenny Tate and Ryan Donohue each scored on interception returns and Maryland rolled past Wake Forest 62-14 to become bowl eligible.

Wake Forest freshman quarterback Tanner Price completed 16 of 31 passes for 156 yards and a touchdown. Backup Skylar Jones played briefly in the third quarter, but one of his three passes was picked off by Donohue, who took it 25 yards into the end zone

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -- Christian Ponder threw for 170 yards and a touchdown, and Florida State beat Maryland 30-16 to remain in the hunt to play in the ACC title game.

The Terrapins (7-4, 4-3) were eliminated from contention. Maryland, which became the last ACC team to lose at home this season, needed to beat the Seminoles and Wolfpack to win the division crown for the first time

Down 23-16, Maryland drove to the Florida State 19 in the final minute before Nick Moody intercepted a fourth-down pass by redshirt freshman Danny O'Brien and took it 90 yards for the clinching score with 36 seconds left.

The Seminoles took advantage of four Maryland turnovers, including two interceptions and a fumble in the fourth quarter after FSU took a 20-16 lead. The Terrapins came in with an ACC-low eight turnovers in 10 games.

Neither team led by more than seven points until the closing seconds and the lead changed hands three times.

Da'Rel Scott gained 84 yards rushing for the Terrapins and Davin Meggett ran for 72 yards. O'Brien went 25 for 45 for 269 yards and a touchdown.

Florida State answered with a 44-yard touchdown pass from Ponder to Reed, who caught a short throw over the middle and weaved his way into the end zone.

The Terrapins wore black helmets for the first time this season, along with black jerseys and pants with camouflage trim to support the Wounded Warrior Project. Maryland fans were also dressed in black.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Danny O'Brien threw for a careerhigh 417 yards and four touchdowns, all to Torrey Smith, and Maryland denied No. 21 North Carolina State a spot in the Atlantic Coast Conference title game by defeating the Wolfpack,

Needing a victory to win the league's Atlantic Division, the Wolfpack (8-4, 5-3) scored touchdowns on their first two possessions to take a 14-0 lead. But the Terrapins (8-4, 5-3) rallied behind O'Brien, who made up for a running game that finished with negative yardage.

North Carolina State ended up in a second-place tie with Maryland behind Florida State, which will face Virginia Tech in the championship game on Dec. 5.

O'Brien, a redshirt freshman, completed 33 of 47 passes in the first 400-yard game by a Terp quarterback since Scott Milanovich in 1993.

Smith had a career-high 14 catches for 224 yards and became the first Maryland player with four touchdown receptions in a single game.

Smith scored on passes of 11, 10, 12 and 71 yards. The last touchdown came with 6:26 left immediately after Maryland's Drew Gloster sacked Russell Wilson on a fourth-down play from the Maryland 8 with the Terrapins ahead 31-17.

Wilson scored on a 1-yard run with 2:39 remaining. The Wolfpack recovered the onside kick and Wilson threw a TD pass with 1:16 left, but Maryland pounced on the ensuing onside kick

Travis Baltz had the wind behind him when he kicked a career-long 52-yard field goal to put the Terrapins up 17-14 at

Maryland made it 24-14 in the third quarter when O'Brien capped an 80-yard drive with a pass to Smith, who wriggled free in the left side of the end zone. O'Brien completed four passes on the drive, including three to Smith for 44 yards.
