FIRST-AND-10...

• The Maryland Terrapins close out the 2011 season Saturday when they travel to Raleigh, N.C., to face the NC State Wolfpack in an Atlantic Division game. The Terps lost to Wake Forest, 31-10, last Saturday in Winston-Salem, N.C., while NC State knocked off seventh-ranked Clemson, 37-13. The Wolfpack need a win against Maryland to become bowl eligible and keep their season alive. Saturday's game will be shown regionally on The ACC Network and broadcast on the Terrapin Sports Radio Network. Locally, the game can be viewed on WJZ-TV (Channel 13) in Baltimore and WTTG-TV (FOX 5) in Washington, D.C.

• Sophomore **C.J. Brown** has taken over the starting quarterback reins after splitting snaps for a number of weeks with **Danny O'Brien** who suffered a season-ending injury (fractured left arm) against Notre Dame (11/12). Brown has started four games and rushed for more than 100 yards in two of those contests. He set the Maryland single-season rushing record for a quarterback (497) by posting 110 yards on the ground vs. Wake Forest. Senior **Davin Meggett** has also been a rushing threat for the Terps. He ranks seventh in the ACC in rushing (73.2 ypg) and eighth (2,320) on the Maryland career rushing list. When in the lineup, junior WR **Kevin Dorsey** and senior **Quintin McCree** have been the top two receiving threats. Dorsey (missed two games) had a game-high tying eight catches vs. Wake Forest and now has a team-high 42 receptions. After posting 28 receptions in the last five games, McCree is second on the team with 38 catches, while junior **Kerry Boykins** is third with 34. Junior **Matt Furstenburg** has 29 catches (fourth on the team) and ranks third in the ACC among tight ends in both receiving yards (30.4 pg) and receptions (2.6 pg). The offensive line lost its leader in left guard **Andrew Gonnella** last month. The senior captain suffered a season-ending knee injury against Georgia Tech (10/8). However, junior **Justin Gilbert**, out of action since early last season, started at right guard the last two weeks after returning to the field against Virginia (11/5). **Bennett Fulper**, who started the previous 16 games at center, missed the Wake Forest game and will be out of action against NC State. **Sal Conaboy** will again start in his place.

• The defense has been in a state of transition due to a number of injuries which has seen as many as eight potential starters on the sideline, including four (LB **Kenny Tate**, DB **Matt Robinson**, DL **Isaiah Ross** and DL **Justin Anderson**) for the season. Junior DL **Joe Vellano**, one of four team captains, has been the leader of a defense which has forced 23 turnovers (tied for 23rd in the FBS), with three being returned for touchdowns. Vellano also has two fumble recoveries on the season (30-yard return for TD vs. Miami, 9/5) and leads the FBS in tackles by a lineman (7.8 pg). Junior **Demetrius Hartsfield**, who moved from Will LB to the Mike position in the off-season, ranks second on the team in tackles (90) despite missing three games with an injury. He returned to the lineup vs. Virginia (11/5) and has 39 tackles over the last three contests. Fellow starting linebacker **Darin Drakeford** returned from injury against Florida State (missed previous three games) and has averaged 8.0 tackles over the last five contests. The Terps started five freshmen defenders vs. Clemson (second most in the FBS in 2011 - see chart on pg. 5), including the entire linebacking corps. Sophomore **Dexter McDougale** and senior **Cameron Chism** are tied for the team lead with three interceptions apiece. Junior safety **Eric Franklin** ranks fifth in the ACC in tackles (8.9 per game) and is tied for the team lead with four pass breakups.

• **Nick Ferrara**, a 2009 freshman All-American, is handling all three phases of the kicking game. The junior ranks seventh in the ACC in punting (39.2 ypp) with nearly one third of his attempts (18 of 56) landing inside the opponents' 20-yard line. Ferrara is 12 of 19 on field goals, including a career-best four field goals against Miami (9/5). Senior **Tony Logan**, a 2010 first team All-ACC selection and record-setting punt returner, ranks fourth in the league (6.6 ypr). Freshman **Justus Pickett** is averaging 17.2 yards (eighth in the ACC) on 25 kickoff returns.

QUICK HITTERS...

• The injury report for the NC State game was released following Thursday's practice. Out for the Season: WR Tyrek Cheeseboro, DB Makinton Dorleant, OL Bennett Fulper, OL Andrew Gonnella, DB Avery Graham, LB Garrett Lederman, QB Danny O'Brien, DB Matt Robinson, DL Isaiah Ross, TE Dave Stinebaugh, LB Kenny Tate; Out for the Game: DB Titus Till; Questionable: WR Kevin Dorsey, DB Eric Franklin, LB Alex Twine.

• While C.J. Brown has split time with Danny O'Brien in seven of the nine games he's played, the sophomore was sharp in the two starts (vs. Clemson, at Wake Forest) where he was the sole QB. In those two games, Brown combined to go 37 of 77 for 363 yards, four TDs and one interception while also rushing for 272 yards and a TD. His 162-yard effort vs. Clemson (10/8) set a single-game school record for a quarterback and ranks eighth all-time in ACC history (see charts on page 6).

• In addition to his 100-yard rushing game vs. Wake Forest, Brown spread the ball around well, matching a season high by hitting nine different receivers (also vs. Clemson, 10/15). Kevin Dorsey led the way with eight receptions for 77 yards. For the game, Brown set career highs in pass completions (20), attempts (42) and passing yards (186).

• Andre Monroe had 2.5 sacks vs. Wake Forest (11/19) and now owns the team lead with 5.0 on the season. His output against the Demon Deacons was the highest sack total in a game by a Maryland player since Shawne Merriman had 3.0 at North Carolina on 11/2/2002. Monroe's season tally is the second most by a Maryland freshman in the last nine years (Adrian Moten - 5.5 in 2007; Merriman - 5.0 in 2002).

• Overall, the Terps are plus-six in the sack department the last two weeks. The defense has posted six sacks and the offense has not surrendered one. In fact, the Maryland offense has allowed just one sack over the last four weeks.

• Head coach Randy Edsall announced Tuesday that senior WR Ronnie Tyler will miss the season finale due to academic issues.

• Offensive lineman Justin Gilbert made his first start in over one year against Notre Dame (11/12). Gilbert opened the game at right guard where he played as a reserve vs. Virginia (11/5). Gilbert, the starter at left tackle last season, was sidelined with a knee injury since the 2010 West Virginia game.

• Safety Eric Franklin and linebacker Demetrius Hartsfield each have six double-digit tackle games which lead the team.

• Junior LB Darin Drakeford, who missed four games due to injury, is averaging 8.1 stops in seven contests. That mark would rank eighth in the ACC with enough games played this season. Drakeford has started at Star, a hybrid outside linebacker position, the last three contests.

• Drakeford also has a team-high three forced

fumbles. His 0.43 forced fumbles per-game average would rank tied for 12th in the FBS, but he has not played in 75 percent of the games.

• Lorne Goree has started seven games at LB and is first among ACC freshmen in tackles (5.4 pg). He is averaging 7.1 tackles in his seven starts.

• Nearly 50 percent of the players (10 of 22) listed on this week's defensive two-deep are freshmen (four true/six redshirt).

BROWN OUT...

C.J. Brown rushed for 110 yards against Wake Forest (11/19) and now has 497 on the ground this season. That mark is a school record for single-season rushing yards by a QB. The previous record was 448 by Mark Manges in 1976. Brown has three 100-yard rushing games this season. No other Terp signal-caller has more than one in his career.

O'BRIEN'S MILESTONE...

Before his season ended due to injury in the Notre Dame game (11/12), Danny O'Brien went 14 of 21 for 132 yards and became just the ninth QB in school history to reach 4,000 career passing yards. He now has 4,086 in his career. The sophomore moved past Brian Cummings (4,080, 1994-97) for eighth all time.

NEW GAME, DIFFERENT LINEUP...

Maryland used a different defensive lineup for the 11th time in 11 games this year in the Wake Forest game (11/19). With LB Alex Twine out with an injury, Demetrius Hartsfield shifted to Will LB and Lorne Goree started at Mike LB. On the offensive side, redshirt freshman OL Sal Conaboy made his first

career start at center with Bennett Fulper unable to play due to a hamstring injury. Conaboy is the 11th freshman to start for Maryland this year. Over the last 11 seasons, no more than eight freshmen (2009 and 2000) have started for Maryland. Six of the 11 first-year players who have started this season are true freshmen. Over the same period, the Terps have only started as many as three true freshmen twice (2009 and 2005).

MCCREE ON A ROLL...

Senior WR **Quintin McCree** has posted more than 100 receiving yards in two of the last five games. McCree started his hot streak against Florida State (10/22) when he had career highs in catches (9) and receiving yards (177). He also posted seven catches for 117 yards against Virginia (11/5). Over the last five games, McCree is averaging 5.6 receptions and 83.0 receiving yards. McCree had 31 receptions for 269 receiving yards in his first 31 career games, and 28 catches for 415 yards in his last five.

MASH UNIT...

The Terps have lost a number of key performers to injury this year with the defense getting hit especially hard. In all, eight potential starters, including the entire linebacking unit, have been sidelined for at least three games. So far this year, the Terps have lost 46 man-games to potential defensive starters (DL **Justin Anderson** - 11; LB **Darin Drakeford** - 4; LB **Demetrius Hartsfield** - 3; DL **Andre Monroe** - 3; DB **Matt Robinson** - 8; DL **Isaiah Ross** - 10; LB **Kenny Tate** - 7; LB **Alex Twine** - 1).

LEADING THE NATION...

Junior **Joe Vellano** is averaging 7.82 tackles per game, a mark which is first among defensive linemen in the FBS.

TOUGH OPENING STRETCH...

With three top 20 teams and two others (FSU and Notre Dame) which have been in the polls among the first 10 foes of the season, Maryland's strength

of schedule ranks tied for ninth in the FBS according to NCAA.org. The Terrapins' first 11 opponents have posted an aggregate record of 69-40 (.633). When you factor in upcoming opponents, the schedule is still tied for 12th toughest in the FBS at this point in the season. Maryland's 2011 opposition currently has an aggregate record of 75-45 (.625).

LEADERSHIP LOST...

The Terps have lost two of their four team captains (**Andrew Gonnella**, **Davin Meggett**, **Kenny Tate**, **Joe Vellano**) to injury in recent weeks. Gonnella suffered a season-ending knee injury against Georgia Tech (10/8). The senior and three-year starter had 26 career starts at left (18) and right guard (8). Sophomore **Pete White** replaced Gonnella in that game and has started the last five games at left guard. Tate, a 2010 first team All-ACC safety, started the first four games at Star, an outside linebacker position, but the senior missed the next three games due to injury. He had season-ending surgery on Oct. 28 and hopes to gain a medical redshirt season to play in 2012. Redshirt freshman **Mario Rowson** started four games at Star before **Darin Drakeford** played there the last three weeks. Rowson averaged 5.5 tackles in his starts, while Drakeford totaled 23 tackles the last three games.

STREAKS AND TRENDS...

- Maryland is on a seven-game losing streak, while NC State has won four of the last six.
- **Joe Vellano** has posted double-digit tackles in four of the last seven games. The nation's leader in tackles among defensive linemen (7.8 per game) is averaging 9.6 stops over the last eight contests, including a career-best 20 vs. Georgia Tech (10/8).
- **Quintin McCree** has two 100-yard receiving games in the last five contests.
- **Demetrius Hartsfield** has posted double-digit tackles in six of the eight games he's played in this season.
- **C.J. Brown** has rushed for more than 100 yards in three of the last seven games.
- Since the beginning of the 2010 season, Maryland is 10-5 when winning the turnover battle.
- OT **R.J. Dill** has started 29 straight times which leads the team. DT **Joe Vellano's** 24 straight starts leads the defense. CB **Cameron Chism** had his team-best streak of 32 straight starts snapped vs. Notre Dame when **Trenton Hughes** was in the opening lineup.
- The Terps have recorded 35 picks over the last 26 games. They had at least one interception in 11 of 13 games last season and have recorded at least one in eight of 11 games this year.
- The Terps turned the ball over just 14 times (10

interceptions/four fumbles) in 2010 and just four of those (two vs. Navy, 9/6; one vs. Miami, 11/6; one vs. FSU, 11/20) occurred in the red zone. Maryland was tied for fifth in the FBS in fewest turnovers. The Terps have 18 turnovers this season, tied for 49th in the FBS.

NO LAUNDRY ON THE FIELD...

After setting a school record for most penalties (102) last season, Maryland has been one of the least flagged teams in the nation this season. The Terps rank tied for fourth in the FBS in penalties per game (4.0) and fourth in yards penalized (33.6 per game). They had just two penalties for 11 yards against Towson (10/1) and one for 5 yards vs. Georgia Tech (10/8), the fewest flags the Terps have received in a contest since 2009 (one for 5 yards vs. Virginia Tech, 11/14).

NC STATE AT-A-GLANCE...

• NC State is 6-5 (3-4 ACC) and needs a win on Saturday to become bowl eligible because two of its win have come over FCS teams (Liberty, South Alabama).

• Last week NC State beat then-No. 7 Clemson 37-13 at behind Mike Glennon's 253 passing yards and three TDs combined with a strong defensive effort. The Wolfpack forced four turnovers and had six sacks.

• A junior, Glennon directs the 11th-ranked offense in the ACC (337.7 ypg). He is averaging 225.8 passing ypg (sixth in the league), while junior running back James Washington's 69.3 rushing yards per game ranks eighth in the conference.

• The defense has a league-high 31 turnovers gained and has a number of playmakers. No team in the nation has more interceptions (22), and 11 of those have come from sophomore CB David Amerson. That mark leads the nation and ties the ACC single-season record.

• Safety Earl Wolff and middle linebacker Audie Cole rank seventh and eighth, respectively, in the ACC in tackles. Wolff is averaging 8.3 pg along with two interceptions, three forced fumbles and two recoveries. Cole averages 8.1 pg and has forced a team-high four fumbles while recovering one.

• Weakside linebacker Terrell Manning is second in the ACC with 1.28 TFLs per game and third in the league with 0.56 sacks per game.

• Senior wide receiver T.J. Graham is a threat on offense and special teams. He leads the league in punt return average (13.3 ypr) and is fourth in kick return average (22.2 ypr). Graham's 607 receiving yards and five TDs lead the team and his 146.4 all-purpose yards per game are the third-most in the conference.

MARYLAND-NC STATE SERIES HISTORY...

• Saturday's game marks the 68th meeting between Maryland and North Carolina State. The schools first met in 1909 when NC State shut out Maryland 33-0. The teams have met every season since 1956, and Maryland holds a slight edge in the series (32-31-4).

• The Wolfpack took eight of nine from the Terps from 1991 to 1999, before the Terps turned things around in the new millennium. Maryland has won eight of 11 in the series since 2000, with the games frequently ending in dramatic fashion. Aside from a 37-0 Maryland win in 2007, the nine games since 2000 have been decided by an average of 5.5 points. Nick Novak hit game-winning field goals for the Terps in the final seconds in 2002 and 2003, and Maryland scored the decisive touchdown in 2001 with 41 seconds left. Quarterback Shaun Hill rallied the Terps from a 15-point halftime deficit in the 2000 game for a 35-28 double-overtime victory.

• The score of the last two games has been 38-31, with NC State coming out on top in 2009 at home and Maryland winning in College Park last year. The Wolfpack hold a 17-15-1 advantage in Raleigh.

• In 2007, Lance Ball and Keon Lattimore rushed for two TDs apiece in the regular-season finale which made the Terps bowl eligible. The Terrapins posted their first shutout since 2003 and first in a league game since 1996. Chris Turner was 19 of 24 for 206 yards and had a 41-yard keeper that set up a TD for Maryland which scored on four straight possessions in the first half to take control of the game.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR VS. NC STATE...

• **C.J. Brown** is averaging 7.8 yards per carry on 64 attempts this season. Should he get 11 more carries and maintain that average, it would rank second in school history (minimum 75 attempts). Chet Hanulak's 9.78 ypc in 1953 ranks first and Ed Modzelewski's 7.38 ypc in 1951 is second.

• **Davin Meggett**, who is eighth in school history in career rushing yards (2,320), needs 82 more to move into seventh place, currently occupied by Da'Rel Scott (2,401; 2007-10).

• **Eric Franklin** needs two tackles to become just the second DB (Kenny Tate - 100 in 2010) in the last 11 seasons to reach 100 stops. Tony Jackson has 101 in 2000.

• **Tony Logan** (782) needs six yards to crack the top 15 on the ACC's career punt return yards list.

• NC State and Maryland rank first and second in the ACC in turnovers gained. The Wolfpack have forced 31, including 22 interceptions (1st in FBS). The Terps have gained 23, including a league-best 13 on fumble recoveries (t-13th in FBS).

• NC State is t-4th nationally in turnover margin (+1.18 pg) and Maryland is t-27th (+0.45).

• The Terps (33.5) and the Wolfpack (33.9) are the two least penalized teams in the league in terms of yardage.

• Both teams get after the quarterback. NC State had six sacks in its win over Clemson last week, while the Terps have three in each of the last two games.

• Maryland has the fourth-ranked rushing offense in the ACC (166.6 ypg) and NC State has the fourth-ranked defense (350.7 ypg). The Terps rushed for 229 yards against Wake Forest last week, while the Wolfpack held Clemson to 34 rushing yards.

WET BEHIND THE EARS...

Maryland has played eight true freshmen this season (Keith Bowers, Tyler Cierski, Marcus Leak, Alex Twine, Justus Pickett, Tyrek Cheeseboro, A.J. Hendy and Cole Farrand). The Terps played as many as eight true freshmen (high of nine) during six of the last seven games in 2009. Prior to that, Maryland hadn't played as many as eight true freshmen since 2002 (also eight vs. UNC, 11/2).

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS...

Junior defensive lineman **Joe Vellano** had one of the most impressive defensive performances (20 tackles, including 14 solo stops and one TFL) for a Terp in quite some time in the Georgia Tech game (10/8). He is just the sixth Maryland player since the start of the 1990 season to post 20 or more tackles in a game and the only defensive lineman to reach that mark. In addition, he is one of just two players (E.J. Henderson - four times) to record 14 or more solo stops since

the start of 1990. Vellano's 20 tackles rank tied for seventh on the 2011 single-game FBS chart and are the most by a defensive lineman this year.

D-LINE ADJUSTMENTS...

With Isaiah Ross, Justin Anderson and Andre Monroe (returned against Florida State, 10/22) on the shelf with injuries for long stretches, the Terps have adjusted the rotation along the defensive line. **Joe Vellano** has started every game and **Keith Bowers**, who became the first Maryland true freshman defensive lineman to start since Jeremy Navarre in 2005, has started the last nine games, but the other two spots have changed hands. **Maurice Hampton**, the lone senior on the line, earned his first career start at tackle against Towson (10/1). He also started vs. Georgia Tech (10/8), Clemson (10/15) and Virginia (11/5). Junior **A.J. Francis** was inserted back in the starting lineup against Florida State (10/22) and also started against Notre Dame (11/12). Monroe, meanwhile, started against Boston College (10/29) and Wake Forest (11/19). He had 2.5 sacks against the Demon Deacons, the most by a Terrapin since Shawne Merriman had 3.0 at North Carolina on 11/2/2002. Monroe leads the team with 5.0 sacks this season. DE **Marcus Whitfield** has started the last four games, replacing **David Mackall**, who is suspended for the remainder of the year. The Terps also moved sophomore **Cody Blue** from the offensive to defensive line after the Temple game (9/24) to serve as the backup Bowers.

TERPS IN THE NFL

Heading into week seven of the NFL season, Maryland had 27 former players on NFL active rosters, which ranks second in the Atlantic Coast Conference and 11th nationally. The list includes five rookies that played their final season with the Terps a year ago: linebacker Adrian Moten (Colts), running back Da'Rel Scott (Giants), wide receiver Torrey Smith (Ravens), wide receiver LaQuan Williams (Ravens) and tight end Will Yeatman (Dolphins). The positions most heavily represented are linebacker (6), offensive line (5) and defensive back (5).

FRESHMEN STARTERS...

So far this season, seven freshmen (DL Keith Bowers, LB Lorne Goree, DL Andre Monroe, LB Mario Rowson, DB Titus Till, LB Alex Twine and S A.J. Hendy) have started for the Maryland defense, including four vs. Georgia Tech (10/8), Florida State (10/22), BC (10/29) and Wake Forest (11/19), and five vs. Clemson (10/15). That was the most freshmen defenders to start for Maryland since Nov. 20, 1993, when five started in a 33-32 win over Wake Forest. That season the Terps had as many as six freshmen start in a game (on five occasions). In the game vs. the Demon Deacons, freshmen Sharrod Mack (DT), Johnnie Hicks (NG), Ratcliff Thomas (ILB), Andre Johnson (RC) and Lamont Gore (SS) started on defense. The five freshmen defensive starters vs. Clemson is the second most in the nation this season.

CASHING IN...

Maryland ranks tied for 27th in the FBS in turnover margin (+0.45 per game). The Terps forced four turnovers vs. Miami (9/5) and surrendered the ball just once to the Hurricanes. Maryland scored 16 points off the four Miami miscues, but did not allow the Hurricanes to score off its lone turnover. Despite turning the ball over three times vs. West Virginia (9/17), the Terps allowed just seven points off those miscues. Conversely, WVU turned the ball over three times and the Terps scored 10 points. On Sept. 24, Temple scored a touchdown off a Danny O'Brien interception. Maryland forced four Towson turnovers (two interceptions, two fumble recoveries) and scored 14 points off them. The Terrapins committed one but didn't surrender any points off the turnover. The Terps had two turnovers vs. Georgia Tech (10/8) and forced one Yellow Jackets' miscue. Neither team scored off the three turnovers. Against Clemson (10/15) the

WJZ 105.7 FM and WJZ AM 1300 in Baltimore serve as network's flagship stations, with 12 more affiliates across the state picking up the games. In July 2010, ESPN980 became the home for Terps football in Washington, D.C. All games will be "trimulcast" throughout the D.C. metropolitan area, suburban Maryland, and Northern Virginia on 980-AM (WTEM), 92.7FM (WWXT) and 94.3FM (WWXX).

Terps won the turnover battle two to one and gained 14 points off turnovers while surrendering seven. There was just one turnover in the Florida State game (10/22), when Dexter McDougale made an interception, but no points were scored off of it. The Terps forced Boston College (10/29) into four turnovers but couldn't convert them into any points. BC, meanwhile, forced a pair of turnovers and got seven points off of them. Maryland lost the turnover battle against Virginia (11/5), committing five, while Virginia committed three. Each team scored seven points off the miscues. The lone turnover in the Notre Dame game (11/12) was a Danny O'Brien interception which was returned for a touchdown. There was also just one turnover in the Wake Forest game (11/19), a Maryland fumble, but no points were scored off it. Since the beginning of the 2010 season Maryland has scored 161 points off turnovers (52) while the opposition has been held to 62 points (32).

DUAL-THREAT QB...

C.J. Brown has split time with Danny O'Brien for much of the season and has shown the ability to beat defenses with his arm and his legs. He earned his first career start against Clemson (10/15) and turned in a record-setting performance. The sophomore ran for 162 yards, the most ever by a Maryland quarterback, and also threw for 177 yards and three touchdowns on 17 of 35 passing. Brown earned his first significant action this season against Georgia Tech (10/8), entering in the second quarter and finishing the game. Against the Yellow Jackets, Brown ran for 124 yards, including a 77-yard TD. While he has split time with O'Brien in seven of the nine games he's played, he has been very good in the two starts (vs. Clemson, at Wake Forest) where he has been the sole QB. In those two games combined, Brown is 37 of 77 for 363 yards, four TDs and one interception while also rushing for 272 yards and a TD.

- Brown's 110 rushing yards against Wake Forest brought him to 497 on the year, which is a single-season record by a Maryland QB (see chart below). Brown already owns two of the top six rushing performances by a quarterback in school history and the 162-yard effort ranks 11th in the FBS this season (see below).

- Brown also saw limited action against Temple (9/24), entering the game for one series and leading Maryland on an eight-play, 80-yard scoring drive in which he went 4 of 4 for 42 yards through the air while running twice for 29 yards. Prior to that, Brown had played just one game in his career - against Morgan State on 9/11/10 when he suffered a season-ending injury on his first collegiate play.

STEADY SIGNAL-CALLER...

Danny O'Brien established himself as one of the top young quarterbacks in the nation last season, and has shown that same ability at times this year. The sophomore was splendid in the season-opening win over Miami, going 31 of 44 for 348 yards and a touchdown, the third 300-yard game of his career. He also ran for 37 yards in that game and his 385 yards of total offense were the third most in the FBS during the opening weekend. O'Brien followed that up with another big game against West Virginia (9/17), throwing for 289 yards and setting career highs in completions (34) and attempts (52), though he also threw three interceptions. In the next three games O'Brien went a combined 32 of 60 for 293 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He was replaced by C.J. Brown in the second quarter of the Georgia Tech game (10/8) and had his streak of 15 straight

starts snapped when Brown drew the start against Clemson (10/15) and played the entire game. O'Brien returned to action against Florida State (10/22), playing most of the second half after coming in for Brown, who took a helmet-to-helmet hit on a rushing play. He split time with Brown in the next three games since then, going a combined 39 of 89 for 586 yards, two touchdowns and three interceptions. Against Notre Dame (11/12) O'Brien started and was 14 of 21 for 132 yards, a touchdown and an interception when he took a hard hit and broke his non-throwing arm, an injury which will sideline him for the remainder of the season. The sophomore ranks eighth in school history with 4,086 passing yards and fifth with 29 touchdown passes.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES...

• Due to various injuries, Maryland has lost 63 potential games to players who were potential starters this year: LB **Darin Drakeford** (4), OL **Justin Gilbert** (8), DL **Andre Monroe** (3), LB **Demetrius Hartsfield** (3), OL **Bennett Fulper** (1) and LB **Alex Twine** (1) have been out of action with injuries at different times this season. Additionally, DL **Justin Anderson** (11), LB **Kenny Tate** (7), S **Matt Robinson** (8), OL **Andrew Gonnella** (6), DL **Isaiah Ross** (10) and QB **Danny O'Brien** (1) are out for the season.

• The Terps have trotted out a different defensive starting lineup every game this season. Most recently, **Alex Twine** was out, causing **Demetrius Hartsfield** to shift from Mike to Will, with **Lorne Goree** starting at Mike.

• **Quintin McCree** (117) had his second career 100-yard receiving game (both coming over the last four games) and **Kerry Boykins** (101) notched the first of his career in the Virginia game (11/5). McCree and Boykins are just the second Maryland duo in the last 16 years to post 100 receiving yards in the same game. **Danny Oquendo** (111) and **Torrey Smith** (115) both went over 100 receiving yards vs. Boston College on Nov. 29, 2008. Prior to that, the feat hadn't occurred since 1995 when **Geroy Simon** (124) and **Jermaine Lewis** (102) went over 100 receiving yards vs. Florida State (11/18).

• **Alex Twine** was honored on Nov. 14 by the ACC for his play vs. Notre Dame (11/12). Twine was voted the ACC Rookie of the Week after posting a career-best 12 tackles in Maryland's 45-21 loss to the Irish. In just his third career start, the sure-tackling outside linebacker posted 3.0 tackles for loss, the most by any Terrapin defender this season, and one sack. The true freshman has played in all 10 games, but has averaged 10.0 tackles in his three starts. However, Twine will miss the Wake Forest game with an injury.

• OL **Bennett Fulper** and TE **Ryan Schlothauer** were nominated for Capital One Academic All-America honors in October. However, neither was voted to the District II team which was announced Nov. 10.

• Neither team recorded a sack during the Maryland-Boston College game (10/29). It marked the first time in five years that occurred during a Terps game. The last time it happened also came vs. BC (11/18/06). Maryland has not allowed a sack in five games this season.

• Freshman **Keith Bowers** had career highs in tackles (9) and tackles for loss (2.0) vs. Boston College (10/29). His previous career best was four stops (vs. Georgia Tech, 10/8). Bowers had the most tackles by a Maryland freshman lineman since **Trey Covington** had nine stops vs. Virginia Tech on Oct. 20, 2005.

• **Marcus Leak** became the first true freshman wideout to start for the Terps in six years when he was in the opening lineup vs. FSU (10/22). **Danny Oquendo** started at wide receiver as a true freshman

vs. NC State (11/26/05). Leak posted eight receptions for 61 receiving yards and had his first TD reception, a 15 yarder in the fourth quarter vs. the Seminoles. Leak also started against BC (10/29).

• Robinson, the starter at safety, played in the first three games of the season, but is out of action the remainder of the year with a shoulder injury. The sophomore, who ranked seventh in the FBS in tackles (12.0 per game) when he was sidelined, played as a true freshman in 2010 and hopes to secure a redshirt year.

• **Cameron Chism** has two interception returns for touchdowns this season. The senior had a 46-yard return for a score against Clemson (10/15) and posted a 54-yard pick for a TD in the season opener vs. Miami. Chism is just the third player in school history to post two interception returns for a TD in the same season. **Curome Cox** (2002) and **Bob Haley** (1966) also had two in one season.

• The 101 combined points (56-45) in the Maryland-Clemson game are the most in an ACC game this year (previously: Georgia Tech 45, Virginia 35) and just five shy of the league record (106 by Clemson [82] and Wake Forest [24], Oct. 31, 1981).

• **Matt Furstenburg** had career highs in receiving yards (104) and touchdown catches (2) vs. Clemson (10/15). It marked the highest yardage total by a Maryland tight end since **Vernon Davis** had 108 yards (on eight catches) against NC State (11/26/05).

• With his 5-yard TD run in the third quarter vs. Towson (10/1), **Justus Pickett** became the first true freshman running back to score a touchdown since Meggett in 2008. Pickett had season highs in carries (14) and yards (82). True freshman fullback **Tyler Cierski** also had a 5-yard TD reception.

• Maryland had its streak of 139 games without a blocked punt (the longest in the nation) snapped vs. Temple (9/24) when **Malcolm Eugene** broke through the line to block a **Nick Ferrara** first-quarter punt. The last punt blocked by an opponent occurred vs. Florida State (11/13/99).

• Despite the blocked punt, Ferrara had one of his best days punting vs. Temple. The junior punted six times for a career-best average of 47.2 yards per attempt (previous high 43.2 vs. Clemson, 10/3/09). He also put two punts inside the 10-yard line and had three over 50 yards, matching a career best.

• Junior wideout **Kevin Dorsey** recorded 17 catches over the first two games of the season. **Torrey Smith** is the only other Terp in the last 16 years to post that many over a two-game span. Smith had a combined 21 receptions (seven vs. FSU, 11/20; 14 vs. NC State, 11/27) last season. **Geroy Simon** had 22 catches over the last two games of the 1995 season.

• Just before the beginning of the season, head coach **Randy Edsall** announced that four former walk-ons (LS **Tim Downs**, WR **Webb Dulin**, DB **Anthony Green** and TE **Ryan Schlothauer**) were placed on scholarship.

SUDDEN CHANGE...

After going 41 games without scoring via a fumble or interception (Erin Henderson in 2006 vs. Virginia), Maryland has registered nine defensive touchdowns in the last 27 contests, including a pair vs. Miami (9/5). **Joe Vellano** returned a fumble 30 yards for a score and **Cameron Chism** had a 54-yard interception return for a TD. Chism also had a 46-yard interception return for a touchdown against Clemson (10/15). Late last season, Alex Wujciak had a 60-yard pick for a TD against Miami (11/6). **Kenny Tate** and **Ryan Donohue** both had interceptions for scores against Wake Forest (10/30/10). **Demetrius Hartsfield's** pick-six in the second quarter of the Morgan State game (9/11/10) was Maryland's first defensive score since Wujciak scored on a 70-yard interception return on 11/14/09 at NC State.

EXPERIENCED BACK...

One of the most experienced players on the team, running back **Davin Meggett** has played in each of Maryland's 49 games since the start of his true freshman season in 2008. The senior, who is the feature back for the first time in his career, ranks eighth in school history with 2,320 rushing yards and became just the 11th Maryland player to rush for 2,000 yards in a career on his first carry against Florida State (10/22). Meggett has recorded a pair of 100-yard games this season, rushing for a career-high 113 against West Virginia (9/17) and 102 against Towson (10/1). That marks the first time a Terrapin running back had two 100-yard efforts in a three-game span since Da'Rel Scott did it in back-to-back games at the beginning of the 2008 season. Meggett also came close to 100-yard games with 99 against Boston College (10/29) and 91 against Wake Forest (11/19). His 73.2 rushing yards per game ranks seventh in the ACC. Meggett is also a reliable option to catch the ball out of the backfield, with 15 receptions for 114 yards and a touchdown on the season. He is normally strong with the ball, though did have his first fumble in nearly two years vs. Towson (10/1). Meggett had a string of 230 consecutive carries with a fumble snapped vs. the Tigers. He also fumbled against Notre Dame (11/12) though the Terps recovered it.

REVAMPED DEFENSE...

The Maryland defense has been constantly changing this season, with the Terps putting out a different starting lineup in all 11 games. The linebacking corps already had to replace two key playmakers at the beginning of the year (Alex Wujciak and Adrian Moten) but expected to be stabilized with **Kenny Tate's** move to the Star position, two-year starter **Demetrius Hartsfield's** return to Mike and **Darin Drakeford's** emergence at Will. Due to injuries, however, those three only started two games together (Miami, 9/5, and Temple, 9/24), all three missed the Clemson game (10/15) with ailments, and Tate is out for the season. Drakeford missed four of the first six

games of the season, though he has started the last five. Against Virginia (11/5), Drakeford switched from Will to Star and had 11 tackles, one TFL, a forced fumble and an interception. Also against Virginia, Hartsfield returned to action after missing the last three games and manned the Mike position, recording a game-high 12 tackles. He also had 13 against Notre Dame (11/12). True freshman **Alex Twine**, who is just 17 years old, started at Will against the Cavaliers and made 10 tackles and then had a career game against Notre Dame. Twine had a career-high 12 tackles including three tackles for loss and a sack. The Three TFLs are the most by a Terp this year. But Maryland again had to adjust against Wake Forest (11/19) as Twine was out with an injury. Hartsfield took his spot at Will and freshman **Lorne Goree** started at Mike in that game. Additionally, starting safety **Matt Robinson** was lost for the season against Temple (9/24), defensive lineman **Isaiah Ross** was lost for the year in the season opener, potential starter **Justin Anderson** (defensive line) has yet to play a game after suffering an injury in preseason camp and **David Mackall**, a defensive end who was tied for the team lead in TFLs (6.0) and ranked second in sacks (3.0), was suspended for the remainder of the season for a violation of team rules. Sophomore **Marcus Whitfield** has started at that end position the last four games.

DEFENSIVE "STAR"...

Senior **Kenny Tate** had a breakout season in 2010, earning first team All-ACC honors while racking up 100 tackles, four forced fumbles and three interceptions from his safety position. Tate moved to Star, a hybrid outside linebacker/safety position, in the spring and through four games had made 35 tackles, two interceptions and a forced fumble. However, he missed the next three games and on Oct. 23 head coach **Randy Edsall** announced he would miss the remainder of the season with an injury. Tate, who underwent a successful surgery on Oct. 28, hopes to apply for a medical redshirt and return for a fifth year of eligibility in 2012. One of four team captains, Tate will be sorely missed from a production and leadership standpoint; he ranks first on the team in career forced fumbles (five), tied for first in career interceptions (7) and second in career tackles (197).

CLOSING THEIR OPTIONS...

Maryland's defense performed well against the high powered triple-option attack of Georgia Tech (10/8). The Terps held the Yellow Jackets well below their season averages in points (21 - GT averaged 51.6 ppg); rushing (272 - GT averaged 378.2 pg); and total offense (386 - GT averaged 587 pg). Maryland held Tech scoreless over the last 27:51 of the game. Georgia Tech's 272 rushing yards and 386 total yards were season lows (previously 296 rushing vs. NC State; 413 total offense vs. NC State).

HITTING THE GROUND RUNNING...

Maryland ranks fourth in the ACC in rushing at 166.6 yards per game. The Terps had great success running the ball against Georgia Tech and Clemson, piling up 246 yards against the Yellow Jackets (10/8) and 291 against the Tigers (10/15), a total of 537 yards. Since 2000, the Terps have combined to rush for more than 500 yards in back-to-back conference games seven times. Since then, however, the Terps have been somewhat uneven. They had just 59 against Florida State (10/22) which possessed the ninth-ranked rushing defense in the FBS. Maryland rebounded with 197 against Boston College (10/29), but was held to 84 against Virginia (11/5). The Terps had 145 against Notre Dame (11/12) and then had another 200-plus effort against Wake Forest (11/19), averaging a season-high 6.7 yards on 34 rushes for 229 total yards.

DID YOU KNOW?...

Since the start of the 2005 season (when the NCAA began compiling single-game tackles on its web site), **Joe Vellano's** 20 tackles vs. Georgia Tech (10/8) are the most by a defensive lineman in the FBS. In fact, just five linemen have more than 15 tackles in that six-plus year span: Jermaine Cunningham of Florida (17 vs. LSU, 10/6/07), Trevor Laws of Notre Dame (17 vs. Air Force, 11/10/07), Jeremiah Chapman of North Texas (16, vs. Western Kentucky, 11/24/07), Nate Collins of Virginia (16 vs. Georgia Tech, 10/24/09) and Abry Jones of Georgia (16 vs. Georgia Tech, 11/27/10). In addition, Vellano's 14 solo stops are the most by an FBS DL since Franklin Lloyd of Troy had 14 vs. Arkansas St. (11/1806).

SAFETY NET...

A.J. Hendy earned a start at safety against Notre Dame (11/12). Hendy, one of three freshmen defenders (also DL **Keith Bowers** and LB **Alex Twine**) to open the Irish game, is the second true freshman to start at safety for Maryland in the last 18 years. **Matt Robinson** started once last season, but prior to that Lamont Gore (vs. Wake Forest, 11/20/93) was the last true freshman to open a game at safety. Hendy responded with a career and game-high tying 13 tackles, including one TFL. He also started vs. Wake Forest (11/19).

TERPS UNVEIL NEW UNIFORMS...

On Aug. 22, Maryland Athletics unveiled its new football uniforms. **Randy Edsall** and players were on hand to showcase the new uniforms in a 30-minute fashion show at the Clarice Smith Center complete with a runway and a crowd of approximately 150 spectators. In all, 16 (of the 32) different jersey and helmet combinations were on display. The Terps have plenty of options to choose with jerseys and pants in red, black, white and gold, along with two helmets. "I know this: the kids are very, very proud of those uniforms," said Edsall. "I told the captains, you're the guys that are going to have to decide what we're wearing because there are too many options for me. The good thing is I think it gives us tremendous opportunities. We might not wear the same uniform all year long. To incorporate all our colors in those uniforms - it's unprecedented really in college football." The uniforms, which prominently feature "Maryland" on the front, were designed by Under Armour. "What we want within these uniforms is performance and technology that the world has never seen," said UA founder/CEO and University of Maryland alumnus Kevin Plank. "We will have the lightest, the strongest, the most durable uniforms that any collegiate football team will have facing off in the 2011 football season. There is no greater thrill, privilege or honor than having Under Armour be a part of this program and all the Terrapin athletic program. Many, many good things are to come."

MARYLAND PRIDE UNIFORMS...

In his Terp debut vs. Miami (9/5), **Randy Edsall's** Terrapins sported state-of-the-art 'Maryland Pride' uniforms inspired by characteristics specific to the state flag and the University of Maryland. From head-to-toe, the right and left sides of the uniforms coordinated with the two patterns found on the state flag, including a custom helmet. "It was about being prideful of your state, being prideful of the University and being prideful of all the people that have put on the Maryland football jersey before us," said Edsall of the uniforms designed by Under Armour. The 'Maryland Pride' outfit is considered a 'special occasion' uniform - the Terps also wore them vs. Notre Dame (11/12).

CAPTAIN'S CHOICE...

Maryland's four team captains - **Andrew Gonnella**, **Davin Meggett**, **Kenny Tate** and **Joe Vellano** - will make the team's uniform selection each week with head coach **Randy Edsall** announcing the choice Wednesday on his twitter account (@RandyEdsall).

COACHING STAFF AT-A-GLANCE...

With **Randy Edsall** taking over the reins of the Maryland football program in January most of the staff has turned over. **Tom Brattan** (11th year as offensive line coach) and **Lee Hull** (fourth year as wide receivers coach) are the lone holdovers from the previous regime. Here are brief sketches of the seven first-year Maryland assistant coaches:

- **Todd Bradford** (defensive coordinator/secondary) has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball, including the last three years as the DC and secondary coach at Southern Miss. The Golden Eagles' rushing defense ranked No. 13 (113.0 yards per game) in the FBS in 2010. They were also No. 14 in third-down conversions (34 percent) and No. 30 in turnovers gained. Bradford has also coached at Oklahoma State, BYU and Louisiana Tech. Bradford was hired by Edsall in January as the inside linebackers coach, but was elevated to defensive coordinator (as well as handling the secondary) when Don Brown left for UConn. He coached alongside **Gary Crowton** at BYU and Louisiana Tech.
- **Gary Crowton** (offensive coordinator/QBs) spent the last four seasons as offensive coordinator at LSU. Despite having three different starting quarterbacks in his tenure, the Tigers set a number of offensive records. The Tigers averaged over 30 points a game in his first

two seasons, including a school-record 38.6 points a contest in 2007 when LSU won the national title. He has also been a head coach at BYU (2001-04) and Louisiana Tech (1996-98) and an offensive coordinator with the Chicago Bears (1999-00) and Oregon Ducks (2005-06). Crowton has coached seven quarterbacks who have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft.

- **Keith Dudzinski** (inside linebackers) served as the defensive coordinator at UMass-Amherst the last seven years, including five under former Maryland assistant Don Brown, who was the Minutemen's head coach from 2004-08. During Dudzinski's time as defensive coordinator at UMass, the Minutemen maintained one of the top units in the nation. They finished among the top 20 in total defense three times (third in 2005; 20th in 2006; 13th in 2007). UMass was also first nationally in scoring defense in 2005 and fifth in 2006.

- **John Dunn** (tight ends/recruiting coordinator) spent the last three seasons as a graduate offensive assistant under Crowton with the LSU Tigers who went 11-2 in 2010. Dunn played quarterback and tight end for North Carolina from 2001-03 before spending four seasons on the Tar Heels staff.

- **Greg Gattuso** (defensive line) spent the last six seasons at Pittsburgh. The Panthers were one of the top sack producers in the nation the last two years. Brandon Lindsey (10.0) and Jabaal Sherard (9.0) both ranked in the top 20 nationally in sacks during the 2010 regular season and Pittsburgh led the nation in that category in 2009 (3.6 per game). Gattuso, the former head coach at Duquesne (1992-04), initially joined the Pitt staff as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first season, he helped the Panthers sign a recruiting class rated 10th in the nation by Scout.com. Gattuso was twice named the national Mid-Major I-AA Coach of the Year at Duquesne and was a seven-time MAAC Coach of the Year.

- **Lyndon Johnson** (special teams/outside linebackers) was on Edsall's staff at Connecticut, serving in a variety of roles. The UConn graduate coached tight ends and special teams his first three seasons (1999-01) before handling the outside linebackers his final nine years. He also coached special teams from 2005 through 2010. The Huskies were ninth in the FBS in kickoff returns in 2009 (25.8 yards per return) and Robert McClain ranked 18th nationally in punt returns (12.6 ypr). Johnson had the top kick returner in the nation this past season in Nick Williams who averaged 35.3 yards per attempt and had two TDs.

- **Andre Powell** (running backs) spent the last four seasons at Clemson where he coached running backs and coordinated the special teams his final three years. He tutored All-ACC running backs James Davis and C.J. Spiller, two of the top three rushers in Clemson history. Spiller finished his career No. 2 in NCAA FBS history in all-purpose running. The Tigers went to a bowl game every year Powell was at Clemson and finished in the top 25 of the final AP poll in 2007 and 2009. Maryland is Powell's fourth stop in the ACC, having also coached at Virginia (1996-00) and North Carolina (2001-06).

RANDY EDSALL

Head Coach
Syracuse '80 • First Year

With a reputation as a top-notch builder, leader and recruiter, Randy Edsall is in his first season as Maryland's head football coach.

Edsall, who is originally from nearby Glen Rock, Pa., spent the previous 12 seasons as head coach at the University of Connecticut where he took the program from FCS (formerly Division I-AA) status to five bowl games, including a BCS contest.

Edsall, who was hired in January as the 34th head coach in Maryland history, guided the Huskies to a pair of Big East Conference titles (2007, 2010) and postseason appearances in each of his final four years, including the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

The 2010 Big East Coach of the Year, who also had a successful run as an NFL assistant, led UConn to eight or more wins in each of the last four seasons as the Huskies successfully made the ascent to the FBS (formerly Division I-A). In fact, Connecticut was 33-19 over the last four seasons, including a pair of bowl wins.

UConn is also the first program to go from FBS newcomer to BCS bowl participant in only seven years.

During his time in Storrs, the program blossomed from a major college football newcomer upon his arrival to a team that made five bowl appearances in the past seven years. He left as the school's all-time leader in career wins (74) and most games coached (144). Edsall was also an impressive 65-46 (.586) in the school's first nine FBS seasons (since 2002).

The 2010 Huskies were typical of a hard working, blue-collar Edsall team. After starting out 3-4, including 0-2 in the league, UConn finished the year with five consecutive Big East wins to earn the conference championship and a spot in the BCS.

UConn's trip to the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl marked its fifth bowl trip since 2004. The Huskies defeated South Carolina in the 2009 Papajohns.com Bowl by a 20-7 score. Edsall guided Connecticut to a 38-20 win over Buffalo in the 2009 International Bowl, led the team to a victory in the 2004 Motor City Bowl and an appearance in the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl.

Edsall's Huskies won their final three regular season games in 2009 - including a historic double-overtime win over Notre Dame. UConn posted a 7-5 regular season record facing the 25th-toughest schedule in the country. In 2007, the Bryant and Munger Coach of the Year Award finalist helped guide UConn to a share of its first-ever Big East Championship in a season where the Huskies were picked to finish seventh in the league.

Edsall is a two-time recipient (2007, 2010) of the Bowl Championship Division Head Coach of the Year in New England by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston.

Edsall has been a prominent voice in the college football community as he was a member of the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees and the NCAA Football Rules Committee.

UConn joined the Big East Conference in 2004, finishing just one win shy of tying for the league championship. The Huskies led the conference in total defense each of their first two years and again in 2008. During its debut season in 2004, UConn also led the Big East in total offense. UConn finished in the national top 20 for total offense (2003, 2004) and total defense (2002, 2005, 2008) in multiple seasons. The Huskies finished an impressive sixth in the country in total defense in 2008.

Under Edsall's guidance, the Huskies defeated members of the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA and South-eastern Conference during their Football Bowl Sub-division tenure.

In addition to the great success on the field, UConn has performed admirably in the classroom under Edsall. In five of the past seven years, including 2007, '08 and '09, UConn was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its high graduation rate.

UConn was the top team in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in both October 2008 and '09 among league schools. The Huskies were third in the Big East in the 2010 GSR release and within four points of second.

In 2008, UConn had the highest GSR for African-American student-athletes among all state universities that participated in a bowl game following the 2008 season.

In 2009, the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) for the UConn football team was an impressive 951, which was third in the Big East Conference and just five points behind the second-place team. That mark also placed Connecticut ahead of the Bowl Subdivision average of 941 and among the top 30 percent of schools in the country.

In 2007, UConn was one of just six schools to play in a bowl game and also boast a GSR over 80-percent for both its Caucasian and African-American student-athletes. In 2003, UConn was the only public Division I-A school to graduate at least 90 percent of its football players and in 2005, UConn was one of only eight schools to both graduate 70

percent and win a bowl game.

Even in its first season at the Division I-A level, UConn was able to make its mark on the national scene.

Edsall guided the 2002 team to a 6-6 record in its first year with a full complement of 85 scholarships. UConn ended the 2002 season impressively, registering four straight wins to reach the .500 mark, including season-ending road wins at Navy and at bowl-bound Iowa State.

UConn's .500 season was its best record since the squad won 10 games in 1998. The Huskies' six wins were more than the Huskies posted in 2000 (three) and 2001 (two) combined. In 2002, the Huskies were the most improved Division I-A team in the country, according to preseason and postseason ratings by College Football News.

The excitement for Edsall and his team continued to swell in 2003 as the Huskies moved into their new home, Rentschler Field, and enjoyed the nation's largest attendance increase (+ 21,252 fans per game).

Finishing with a 9-3 record, many national media outlets, including Bristol-based ESPN, proclaimed that UConn should have received a bowl berth, a feat highly-uncommon for an independent team.

With their membership in the Big East for the 2004 season, another strong campaign by the Huskies resulted in a bowl berth. UConn went 8-4 against a challenging slate that fall as the program gained its highest-ever level of exposure. The Huskies capped their historic season with a resounding 39-10 win over Mid-American Conference Champion Toledo in the Motor City Bowl.

The 2007 season witnessed a new level of excitement in Storrs as the Huskies earned their first ever national rankings, peaking at No. 13 in the BCS standings on Nov. 5. UConn became just the second Big East team to ever go 7-0 at home and defeat three teams there which were ranked in the Top 10 at some point during the season. The Big East Champion Huskies finished that season at 9-4 with a berth in the Meineke Car Care Bowl, earning Edsall New England Division I Coach of the Year accolades.

Edsall was named the 27th head football coach at the University of Connecticut on December 21, 1998. He brought 19 years of coaching experience to the Husky program, including 15 seasons on the collegiate level and three in the NFL.

Edsall joined the Huskies after completing the 1998 season as the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech, where he helped the 14th-ranked Yellow Jackets complete a 9-2 campaign.

Prior to joining the staff at Georgia Tech, Edsall spent three seasons as the secondary coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars. In his three seasons on Tom Coughlin's staff, Edsall was a part of one of the most successful expansion franchises in the history of the NFL. The Jaguars reached the playoffs twice, including a berth in the 1996 AFC Championship Game.

Edsall began his coaching career in 1980 at his

alma mater, Syracuse University. A former quarterback for the Orangemen, Edsall started as a graduate assistant from 1980-82. In 1983, Orange head coach Dick MacPherson named Edsall to oversee the running backs.

Edsall coached running backs for three seasons (1983-84 and 1986) and oversaw the tight ends in 1985 before making the switch to the defensive side of the ball. He coached the Syracuse defensive backs from 1987-1990 and during that period the Orangemen were ranked among the Division I-A leaders in pass defense.

He remained in the Big East for the next three years as he moved on to become the defensive backs coach at Boston College. Edsall served under Coughlin who was hired as head coach prior to the 1991 season.

Gary Crowton, Edsall's current offensive coordinator, and Fran Foley, who serves as Maryland's director of football operations, were also on the staff during that time, a period which saw the Eagles reach a pair of bowl games.

Edsall was a three-year letterwinner in football, basketball and baseball at Susquehannock High School (Pa.). He was an all-state selection in all three sports in his senior season and was inducted into the York Area Sports Hall of Fame.

He went on to Syracuse, where he was a member of the football team and earned one varsity letter as a quarterback for the Orangemen. He was a member of the Syracuse squad that captured the 1979 Independence Bowl title under head coach Frank Maloney.

Edsall earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Syracuse in 1980 and added a master's degree from the Big East school in health and physical education in 1982.

Edsall was honored with the Leadership Award at the Martin Luther King, Jr., Holiday National Liberty Bell Ringing Celebration in Hartford, Conn., in January, 2010. He was honored this last fall by the



UConn Alumni Association as an honorary alumnus of the school.

Edsall was an active member of the community and has supported a number of charitable events over the years.

He and his wife, Eileen, a former basketball and volleyball letterwinner at Syracuse, have a daughter, Alexi (21), and a son, Corey (18).

Maryland 32, Miami 24

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Nick Ferrara kicked a 32-yard field goal to put Maryland ahead with 1:39 left, Danny O'Brien threw for 348 yards and a touchdown, and defensive back Cameron Chism played a part in two touchdowns as Maryland won its ACC opener, 32-24, over Miami before a sellout crowd.

The Terrapins emerged from the locker room with new white uniforms patterned after the state flag. They wore helmets spashed with red and white on the left side and black and yellow on the right, and the pattern continued to the shoulders.

Maryland amassed 311 yards and 19 first downs in the first half alone and finished with 499 yards, including 92 yards on 21 carries by Davin Meggett.

The seasaw contest came down to the closing minutes. Soon after O'Brien completed a 52-yard pass to Kevin Dorsey down the right sideline, Ferrara entered only one series after missing from 23 yards out. This one, however, was right down the middle, giving the Terrapins a 26-24 lead.

Chism then provided the clincher.

Miami was playing its initial game under Al Golden without eight suspended players.

Stephen Morris capably filled in for Harris, going 19 for 28 for 195 yards and running for a touchdown. But on a fourth-and-4 in the final minute, the sophomore threw an interception that Chism took 54 yards to put the game out of reach with 39 seconds remaining.

The Hurricanes took a 21-20 lead early in the third quarter on a 5-yard run by Morris. Maryland regained the lead when Ferrara kicked his third field goal to end a 14-play drive.

Morris then directed a 67-yard march that ended with a 30-yard field goal by Jake Wieclaw for a 24-23 lead with 4:01 remaining.

The Terrapins led 20-14 at halftime. After blowing a 10-0 advantage, Maryland moved back in front when Chism caused Mike James to fumble and defensive lineman Joe Vellano lumbered 30 yards for a score.

No. 18 West Virginia 37, Maryland 31

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Danny O'Brien completed 34 of 52 passes for 289 yards and a touchdown, but threw three interceptions in a 37-31 loss to 18th-ranked West Virginia before a sellout crowd.

The last turnover, with 1:13 remaining, came after Maryland reached the West Virginia 35 and ended a strong comeback bid that brought the Terrapins back from a 24-point deficit.

WVU's Geno Smith threw for a career-high 388 yards, and the Mountaineers needed every one of them to hold of the Terps.

One week earlier, West Virginia (3-0) trailed Norfolk State at halftime before pulling away. The Mountaineers addressed that deficiency and built a 27-10 lead at the break against the stunned Terrapins.

The margin swelled to 24 points before Maryland rallied, closing to 34-31 with 10:29 remaining.

Both teams used the no-huddle offense with uncanny efficiency. West Virginia averaged six yards per play and Maryland amassed 477 yards on a whopping 87 snaps.

Smith had 232 yards passing in the first half to help the Mountaineers take a 17-point lead. The junior then threw a 34-yard touchdown pass to Stedman Bailey on West Virginia's first possession of the third quarter to make it 34-10.

The Terrapins scored three straight touchdowns to cut the gap to 34-31, thrilling the sellout crowd of 53,627. But Maryland couldn't complete the comeback.

Temple 38, Maryland 7

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Bernard Pierce set a school record with five rushing touchdowns, and Temple built a 31-point half-time lead in a 38-7 win over Maryland.

Temple (3-1) defeated Maryland (1-2) for the first time. The Terrapins fell to 6-1 against the Owls.

Temple led 21-0 with just over 11 minutes elapsed, boosted the margin to 31-0 at halftime and played conservatively to the finish. It was 38-0 before the Terrapins got their only score, on a touchdown pass by backup quarterback C.J. Brown with 4:31 remaining.

Pierce ran 32 times for 149 yards, including 108 in the first half. He had touchdown runs of 1,9-4, 44 and 13 yards, giving him 12 TDs for the season.

Starting for the first time this season, Temple senior Chester Stewart completed all six of his passes in the first half and finished 9 for 9 for 140 yards. He also ran for 43 yards.

Danny O'Brien was 17-for-33 for 153 yards and an interception, and he also absorbed his first three sacks of the season. The running game produced only 45 yards, and the defense allowed scores on all five of Temple's first-half possessions.

The Terrapins had a tough day on special teams, too. Maryland had a punt blocked for the first time since 1999 and missed an opportunity to get a comeback going in the second quarter by roughing the kicker on a fourth-and-14 punt at the Temple 16.

Given a second chance, the Owls completed a 93-yard drive to increase its lead to 28-0.

After holding the Terrapins to one yard on three plays on the opening drive, the Owls' first offensive snap produced a 54-yard completion from Stewart to tight end Evan Rodriguez, setting up the first of Pierce's four first-half scores.

Following another three-and-out for Maryland, Stewart ran for 18 yards on a third-and-5 and connected with Rodriguez on passes of 18 and 18 yards before Pierce made it 14-0.

Temple again forced a punt, and Rod Streater blocked the kick to set up a touchdown. Maryland had gone 139 straight games without having a punt blocked.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Danny O'Brien threw two second-half touchdowns and Maryland's defense forced four turnovers, all after halftime, helping the Terrapins pull away to a 28-3 win over in-state foe Towson.

O'Brien completed 14 of 21 passes for 123 yards. Davin Meggett added 102 rushing yards as Maryland finished with 335 total yards of offense, including a season-high 198 on the ground.

Towson came in leading all Football Championship Series teams in scoring defense, allowing an average of 10 points per game, but the Maryland (2-2) offense scored three second-half touchdowns.

The Tigers (3-1) had the ball for 21:30 of the game's first 30 minutes, keeping Maryland's offense off the field.

Maryland needed just 85 seconds to score against the Tigers when D.J. Adams ended a 65-yard drive with a 15-yard touchdown run. The score came one play after a roughing the passer penalty on an incompletion allowed the Terps a first down rather than facing a fourth down at the 30.

D.J. Soven's 23-yard field goal at the end of a nine-minute possession in the second quarter by the Tigers made it 7-3 after they were stopped on a goal-line stand by the Terps.

The Tigers missed a 24-yard field goal try as the first half ended, rushing to get the kick off with no timeouts left and the clock ticking down.

Maryland extended its lead to 14-3 on its first possession of the second half, which followed an interception by Kenny Tate at the Towson 45. Maryland scored eight plays later with Justus Pickett going in from the 5. The true freshman had career highs in attempts (12) and rushing yards (82).

Following a Towson punt, Maryland drove 78 yards and scored on a 7-yard pass from O'Brien to Kenny Dorsey for a 21-3 advantage with 7:09 to play.

Another Towson fumble gave Maryland the ball at the Tigers 26, leading to a 5-yard pass from O'Brien to Tyler Cierski, the first touch of the freshman's career.

No.13 Georgia Tech 21, Maryland 16

ATLANTA - Sophomore quarterback C.J. Brown ran for a 77-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter, sparking a Maryland rally that fell just short as No. 13 Georgia Tech held on for a 21-16 win over the Terrapins.

Georgia Tech led 21-3 before holding off the Terrapins' fourth-quarter comeback, as the Maryland defense held the Yellow Jackets well under their scoring and offensive averages for the season.

Georgia Tech (6-0 overall, 3-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) matched its wins total from 2010, when it finished 6-7. The Yellow Jackets averaged almost 52 points in their first five wins and began the day ranked first in the nation in rushing and second in scoring.

Following Brown's run to begin the rally, Davin Meggett, who had 86 yards rushing, scored from the 1 with 7:33 remaining to cut the lead to 21-16.

But Maryland was stopped on a fourth-and-8 play from its 46 on Brown's incomplete pass with 2:31 remaining, ending its comeback bid.

Brown was 4-of-17 passing for 36 yards and an interception. He had nine carries for 124 yards. O'Brien was replaced after completing only 1 of 6 passes for 17 yards and an interception.

Quarterback Tevin Washington, who ran for 120 yards and two touchdowns for Tech, had scoring runs of 7 yards in the first quarter and 3 yards in the third. Orwin Smith had a 10-yard scoring run in the second quarter.

Maryland's only points in the first three quarters were Nick Ferrara's 30-yard field goal at the end of a 14-play drive on the Terrapins' first possession.

Washington was Georgia Tech's leading rusher, but he struggled as a passer as he completed only 6 of 19 passes for 114 yards and an interception.

Coach Randy Edsall pulled O'Brien after the sophomore's second-quarter interception, his sixth of the year. Brown took over and remained in the game after he was picked off by Rod Sweeting in the end zone in the third quarter.

Georgia Tech led 14-3 at halftime but wasted two second-quarter chances to stretch the lead.

Maryland left guard Andrew Gonnella, one of four team captains, was taken off the field in an ambulance after suffering a season-ending knee injury.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - C.J. Brown ran for 162 yards, a single-game record for a Maryland quarterback, scored one touchdown and passed for three, but it wasn't enough to prevent Maryland from losing to No. 8 Clemson, 56-45.

In addition to his rushing total, Brown completed 17 of 35 passes for 177 yards.

Tajh Boyd threw four touchdown passes and freshman Sammy Watkins scored three TDs for the Tigers (7-0, 4-0 ACC), who trailed 28-10 late in the first half and 35-17 in the third quarter. Boyd went 26 for 38 for 270 yards as the catalyst of an offense that amassed 576 yards.

Watkins scored on an 89-yard kickoff return that put Clemson up 49-45 with 7:24 left. Watkins' 345 all-purpose yards set a school record.

Andre Ellington rushed for a career-high 212 yards and two touchdowns for the Tigers, who have scored at least 35 points in all but one game this season.

After Brown threw a 32-yard TD pass to tight end Matt Furstenburg to put Maryland up 45-42, Watkins took off on his decisive kickoff return and Ellington clinched it with a 44-yard touchdown run with 3:55 to go.

Maryland took its second 18-point lead early in the third when Brown capped a 78-yard drive with a 22-yard pass to Furstenburg, who had a career-high 104 receiving yards.

Boyd responded with a 13-yard TD pass to Watkins to make it 35-24. After each team kicked a field goal, Boyd connected with Watkins for 51 yards, ran for 4 and threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Watkins. The 2-point conversion got Clemson to 38-35 entering the fourth quarter.

The comeback became complete when Boyd threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Jaron Brown with 11:26 left to end an 80-yard drive.

Virginia 31, Maryland 13

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Danny O'Brien threw for 241 yards and senior receiver Quintin McCree had 117 yards receiving, but Virginia beat Maryland, 31-13.

The Terrapins (2-7, 1-5) committed five turnovers in a loss that ended any chance they had to earn a bowl invitation.

O'Brien started at quarterback but C.J. Brown also played. O'Brien went 16 for 36 for 241 yards and two interceptions; Brown was 4 for 7 for 28 yards and an interception.

Perry Jones ran for 139 yards and two touchdowns, Michael Rocco threw for two scores, and Virginia (6-3, 3-2) qualified for a bowl bid for the first time since 2007.

Playing on the road against a fierce rival, the Cavaliers trailed 13-7 in the second quarter. They responded by scoring the game's final 24 points for their fourth win in six games.

Rocco completed 23 of 36 passes for 307 yards in his second game since Virginia Coach Mike London ditched a two-quarterback rotation.

Jones scored on the game's initial play from scrimmage and added a 1-yard touchdown run in the pivotal third quarter, when the Cavaliers outscored the Terrapins 14-0 to take a 28-13 lead. He had 100 yards rushing in the first half alone.

Rodney McLeod has three interceptions for Virginia, which yielded only 121 yards in offense after halftime.

With Virginia up 14-13 in the third quarter, London kept his offense on the field for a fourth-and-goal at the Maryland 1. Jones bounced off left tackle for a touchdown, ending a 95-yard drive that lasted nearly six minutes.

O'Brien responded with a 39-yard completion to McCree, but two plays later the quarterback threw an ill-advised pass that was intercepted by McLeod at the Virginia 27.

That led to a 17-yard touchdown pass from Rocco to Max Millen, and a fourth-quarter field goal made it 31-13 with 13:38 left.

LANDOVER, Md. - Danny O'Brien passed for 132 yards and a touchdown, while D.J. Adams led Maryland with 55 rushing yards and a score, but the Terrapins fell to Notre Dame, 45-21, at FedExField.

Maryland's sixth straight loss dropped the Terrapins to 2-8 overall this season, while the Irish improved to 7-3 overall. Notre Dame has won seven of its last eight.

Quintin McCree had five catches for 76 yards for the Terrapins and hooked up with O'Brien on a 13-yard scoring pass. The touchdown put the Terps on the scoreboard, but down 17-7. The Irish went 70 yards in 13 plays on their next possession to take a 24-7 halftime lead.

Notre Dame took the second half kickoff 84 yards in 14 plays to set up a 3-yard run by Cierre Wood. O'Brien suffered an interception on the next drive that Lo Wood returned 57 yards for an Irish touchdown and a 38-7 lead.

C.J. Brown entered the game midway through the third quarter when O'Brien was hurt. He took Maryland 97 yards on a 10-play drive and scrambled himself for a 24-yard touchdown with 14:02 left in the game.

Following another Notre Dame touchdown, Maryland finished the scoring with a 2-yard touchdown run from Adams.

Brown finished with 31 yards on three carries and hit 6 of 10 passes for 87 yards.

Notre Dame quarterback Tommy Rees passed for 296 yards and a pair of touchdowns on a 30-for-38 evening. Jonas Gray had 136 yards and two touchdowns on 21 carries, while Wood had 99 yards on 18 rushes.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - Maryland's C.J. Brown accounted for 296 yards of total offense, but Wake Forest outlasted the Terps 31-10.

Tanner Price threw for 320 yards and three touchdowns to lead Wake Forest which snapped a three-game losing streak to become bowl eligible.

Brandon Pendergrass ran for 125 yards and a score and Jimmy Newman hit a 25-yard field goal for the Demon Deacons (6-5, 5-3 Atlantic Coast Conference), who also got a record-setting day from wide receiver Chris Givens.

Givens had eight catches for a career-best 191 yards and a score, and broke a 22-year-old Wake Forest single-season receiving record.

Brown threw for 186 yards and a touchdown and ran for 110 more (his third 100-yard game of the season) for the Terrapins (2-9, 1-6), who were tied 7-7 at the half but managed just a 42-yard Nick Ferrara field goal in the final two quarters despite reaching the red zone three times.

Givens broke Proehl's record during the Demon Deacons' lone scoring drive in the first half, pulling in a 14-yarder from Price to put the ball at the Maryland 2. Price then hit Cameron Ford on a 2-yard pass on the next play to put Wake Forest up 7-0 with 5:17 left in the first quarter.

Price also hit Terrence Davis with a 10-yard TD pass early in the fourth quarter, then gave Givens his career-high game with a 35-yard scoring pass midway through the final period.

Brown, who took over as Maryland's sole starting quarterback when Danny O'Brien suffered a broken arm last week against Notre Dame, put the Terrapins in position to tie the score with less than two minutes left in the first half.

Taking over with 1:27 remaining, Brown used runs of 14 and 20 yards to move the ball into Wake Forest territory, then found Justus Pickett in the back of the end zone on a 31-yard TD pass with 12 seconds left to tie the game.
