## Maryland vs. North Carolina

(4-7, 2-5 ACC)

## FIRST-AND-10...

- Maryland closes out its 2012 campaign when it visits North Carolina this Saturday at 3 p.m. for the first meeting between the schools since 2008. The Terps have won five of the last six in the series, though the Tar Heels hold a 36-21-1 all-time edge, including a 20-14-1 advantage in Chapel Hill.
- The Terps have lost five straight after a rash of injuries has taken its toll on both sides of the ball. Ten Terrapins have been lost to season-ending injuries, all of them potential starters. Of the 10 starters lost, four are quarterbacks, leaving freshman Shawn Petty, a former linebacker, as the team's starter. Maryland has been without leading rusher Wes Brown and leading tackler Demetrius Hartsfield the past two weeks, both of whom suffered season-ending injuries. Combined with Perry Hills' season-ending injury in October, that meant the Terps were without their leading passer (Hills), rusher (Brown) and tackler (Hartsfield) the last three games of the year.
- Hartsfield, who suffered a torn ACL during the Georgia Tech game, had been the leader of a defense that ranked in the top-10 nationally for the first eight games of the season. One of four team captains, Hartsfield has remained Maryland's leading tackler and ranks 15th in school history with 338 in his career.
- The toughest part of Maryland's schedule has coincided with Maryland's ills. The Terps faced the top four offenses in the Atlantic Coast Conference in November - Clemson ranks first, Florida State second, North Carolina third and Georgia Tech fourth. Still, the Terps possess a top 15 defense. Maryland ranks 15th nationally in total defense (322.5 ypg), 20th in rushing defense (123.9 ypg) and 27th in passing defense (198.6 ypg). In 11 games, Maryland has held its opponent under 100 rushing yards five times, and under 55 yards four times.
- Maryland has an experienced front seven highlighted by senior defensive linemen Joe Vellano and A.J. Francis, and senior linebackers Kenneth Tate and Darin Drakeford. Maryland's 6.6 tackles for loss per game rank 29th in the FBS and its 2.55 sacks per game are tied for 25th. Vellano, who has played through an ankle injury for much of the year, is fourth in the ACC and is tied for 30th nationally with 1.27 tackles for loss per game. Vellano and Drakeford are tied for fifth in the conference with 6.0 sacks, and Cole Farrand has also provided solid play, with his 71 tackles ranking second on the team behind the injured Hartsfield. Against Florida State, Tate became the first Terrapin to record 3.0 sacks in a game since Shawne Merriman on Nov. 2, 2002.
- Petty took the reins at QB against Georgia Tech and has started the past three games. Petty starred on both sides of the ball and was an All-Met selection at Eleanor Roosevelt HS in Greenbelt, Md. As a quarterback, he threw for 1,300 yards and 15 TDs, and ran for 550 yards and 10 TDs. In his two games, Petty has completed 23 of 49 passes for 292 yards, five touchdowns and one interception. Against Florida State, Petty hit senior wide receiver Kevin Dorsey for a pair of scores as Dorsey surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Against Clemson, Brandon Ross took over starting duties at running back for the injured Brown and responded with the best game of his young career. Ross ran 16 times for 100 yards, an average of 6.25 yards per carry, and had a 44-yard run which is the longest by a Terrapin this season.
- Wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** has been Maryland's most dynamic playmaker this season. His 766 receiving yards rank 10th on Maryland's single-season list, while his 1,648 all-purpose yards rank fifth. Against Virginia, the freshman returned the game's opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and vs. Boston College he had a career-high 11 catches for 152 yards and a touchdown. He followed that up with a pair of touchdown catches against Georgia Tech and over his last seven games is averaging 88.6 receiving yards per game. Diggs has earned ACC weekly honors four times this season: he received Rookie of the Week honors against West Virginia, Wake Forest and Boston College; and Specialist of the Week honors against Virginia. Release as of Nov. 19

## **QUICK HITTERS...**

- Maryland is one of seven schools to have started three different players at quarterback this season (also Southern Miss - 4; and Colorado State, Kentucky, Minnesota, Tulane and Utah - 3).
- The combination of a talented 2012 recruiting class and a number of injuries has led Maryland to play 15 true freshmen this season. That's tied for the third most in the FBS, behind only Texas and TCU who have each played 16.
- The quarterback position has been hit hardest by injuries, leaving the Terps in what seems to be uncharted territory. Four Maryland QBs have suffered season-ending injuries this year: C.J. Brown was lost in August with a torn ACL; Perry Hills was lost in the NC State game with a torn ACL; Devin Burns was lost after replacing Hills in the NC State game with a Lisfranc (foot); and Caleb Rowe was lost for the year after suffering a torn ACL in the Boston College game. An inquiry among FBS media relations contacts turned up no results of any school having a similar injury situation at quarterback this season or in the past.
- Perry Hills, Caleb Rowe and Shawn Petty have all started at QB this season.
   It's been nearly 30 years since Maryland last started three quarterbacks in one season. The last time was 1973, when Ben Kinard started six games, Bob Avellini started three games and Al Neville started two games.
- Maryland has lost 10 players to season-ending injuries this year, four of which are quarterbacks. QB C.J. Brown (knee), WR Kerry Boykins (hip), RB Wes Brown, QB Devin Burns (foot), PK/P Nick Ferrara (hip), LB Demetrius Hartsfield (knee), QB Perry Hills (knee), WR Marcus Leak (toe), DL Andre Monroe (knee) and QB Caleb Rowe (knee) have all been lost for the year.
- Stefon Diggs has earned ACC Player of the Week honors four times this year. Diggs won Rookie of the Week for his play against West Virginia (9/22), Wake Forest (10/6) and Boston College (10/27), and Specialist of the Week against Virginia (10/13).
- Diggs ranks fifth in the conference and first among freshmen with 76.6 receiving yards per game. Diggs, who has 46 catches for 766 yards, already ranks 10th on Maryland's single-season receiving yards list (see list page 6).
- Diggs is the only Maryland freshman to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games (vs. West Virginia and Wake Forest) since at least 1985, the earliest game-by-game statistics were recorded at the school.
- Maryland allowed Wake Forest to complete just 32.4 percent of its passes (13 of 38). That is the lowest percentage by an opponent with at least 30 passing attempts since Duke went 13 of 42 (30.9%) on Nov. 14, 1998.
- Joe Vellano's father, Paul Vellano, was inducted into the Maryland Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 5. The elder Vellano was a first team All-American in 1973, while Joe was a second team All-American in 2011. The father-son combo represent one of four known father-son All-America combos to attend the same FBS school (also Lee and Travis McGriff at Florida; Kevin and Drew Butler at Georgia; Archie and Eli Manning at Ole Miss).
- Fourteen players saw their first career action for Maryland against William & Mary, and 27 players have seen their first career action for Maryland at some point this season (15 true freshmen, eight redshirt freshmen, one sophomore, two juniors, one senior).
- The Terps are holding opponents to 3.34 yards per carry, which is ranks 14th nationally. Of the opponents' 408 rushing attempts this season, 246 (60.3%) have been for three yards or less (28 of 41 vs. William & Mary; 28 of 39 vs. Temple; 25 of 40 vs. Connecticut; 20 of 25 vs. West Virginia; 21 of 29 vs. Wake Forest; 25 of 42 vs. Virginia; 18 of 26 vs. NC State; 21 of 27 vs. Boston College; 18 of 56 vs. Georgia Tech; 26 of 42 vs. Clemson; 16 of 51 vs. Florida State).
- The Terps have done a good job controlling the clock. In 11 games, Maryland has had the ball for an average of 31:10 to 28:50 for the opponent. That's a major upgrade compared to 2011, when Maryland averaged just 25:16 a game to 34:44 for the opponent.

## **YOUTH A THEME...**

- Maryland has relied on a number of young players this season as injuries have taken their toll and underclassmen earned playing time and starting positions. In the season opener against William & Mary, the Terps played 12 true freshmen, including four that started (place-kicker Brad Craddock, safety Sean Davis, quarterback Perry Hills and running back Albert Reid). That marks the most true freshmen to play in a game for the Terps since at least 1998, the first year records of game-by-game starts were recorded at Maryland. The closest the Terps have come to that in the past 15 years was in 2009, when nine true freshmen played in three different games (Virginia, Duke, NC State).
- No team in the ACC has played more true freshmen than Maryland (15) so far. In fact, just two teams in the FBS - Texas and TCU with 16 - have played more than Maryland. LSU and Ohio State have also played 15.

#### **NEAR THE TOP**

• A year after earning All-ACC and All-American honors as a junior, Joe Vellano is putting together another stellar season. The senior ranks third in the ACC in tackles among defensive linemen (5.8) and is tied for the league lead with 1.56 tackles-for-loss per game. Vellano ranks eighth on Maryland's career TFLs list with 32 and could move past Shawne Merriman for seventh on the list with one TFL this Saturday. (see chart to the left).

In the season opener against William & Mary, quarterback Perry Hills, running back Albert Reid, safety Sean Davis, defensive back Jeremiah Johnson, linebacker Cole Farrand, nose tackle Darius Kilgo and offensive lineman Nick Klemm debuted. Against Connecticut, wide receiver Stefon Diggs made his first career start; defensive back Isaac Goins and running back Brandon Ross made their starting debuts at West Virginia. Defensive back Anthony Nixon and offensive linemen Mike Madaras and Andrew Zeller made their first starts vs. Wake Forest. And Caleb Rowe, Nigel King, Wes Brown and Levern Jacobs made their first starts against Boston College. Quarterback Shawn Petty made his debut against Georgia Tech.

## MARYLAND-NORTH CAROLINA SERIES HISTORY...

- Saturday's game will mark the 70th meeting between the Terrapins and Tar Heels. North Carolina owns a 36-32-1 edge in the all-time series. The two schools first met back in 1920 when Maryland blanked Carolina 13-0. Maryland is 14-20-1 against North Carolina in games played in Chapel Hill.
- The teams last met in 2008 in College Park, a 17-15 Maryland victory. The Terps have won five of the last six in the series.
- The Tar Heels have won four of the last six meetings in Chapel Hill. The last meeting in Chapel Hill was in 2007, a 16-13 North Carolina victory.

## **HITTING 100...**

- The Terps have had two freshman running backs hit 100 yards rushing this season, a feat that has only been achieved 14 times in school history. Wes Brown rushed for 121 yards on 25 carries against NC State (10/20) to become Maryland's first 100-yard rusher of the season. That marked just the 13th time in school history that a freshman rushed for 100 yards in a game, and the first since Josh Allen on Oct. 5, 2002. Then, against Clemson, Brandon Ross ran for 100 yards on 16 carries, including a season-long 44-yard run.
- Brown's 121 yards are the seventh most by a freshman in school history. In the past 33 years, Brown and LaMont Jordan are the only freshmen to have rushed for that many yards in a game.

## **TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN...**

• With a talented and experienced front seven, Maryland's defense has been tough against the run all season. The Terps rank second in the ACC and 20th nationally by holding oppponents to just 123.9 rushing yards per game. Of their 11 games, they've held the opponent to under 100 yards in five of them and under 55 in four (Temple, West Virginia, NC State, Boston College).

## UNDERCLASSMEN STEPPING UP AT SKILL POSITIONS...

- Freshman Stefon Diggs and sophomore Marcus Leak have been the biggest playmakers in the receiving corps this season, though Leak was lost to a season-ending injury during the NC State game (10/20) and Diggs missed the Clemson game (11/10). Diggs has a team-high 46 catches for 766 yards, while Leak recorded 23 receptions for 393 yards before his injury. Diggs ranks first in the ACC in receiving yards per game (76.6) among freshmen and fifth nationally. Diggs also ranks second in the ACC in receptions per game with (4.2) among freshmen.
- The running back position is represented by all underclassmen with sophomore Justus Pickett, true freshmen Wes Brown and Albert Reid, and redshirt freshman Brandon Ross. Brown earned the starting job with a 121-yard performance against NC State and 73 yards vs. Boston College, though he missed the Clemson game (11/10) with an injury. He leads the team with 382 yards on the season and is averaging 4.2 yards per carry, the best by any Terrapin with at least 20 attempts. Pickett is tied for the team lead with three rushing touchdowns and is a receiving threat out of the backfield with 18 catches this year.

## DEPTH, EXPERIENCE ON THE D-LINE...

- The defensive line has been a major strength of the team, with All-American Joe Vellano (end), A.J. Francis (end) and Darius Kilgo (nose) having seen the majority of the action, with Keith Bowers, Justin Anderson and Isaiah Ross also in the rotation.
- The Terps rank highly in a number of key defensive statistics: Maryland is allowing just 322.6 yards of total offense which ranks 15th in the FBS; opponents are averaging just 3.34 yards per rush, which ranks 13th; and the Terps are surrendering 123.9 rushing yards per game, which ranks 20th. Maryland has held its opponent under 100 yards rushing in five of 11 games.
- In addition to that, the defensive line has been disruptive in getting to the backfield. Vellano is fourth the conference with 14.0 tackles for loss as well as fourth among defensive linemen with 5.5 total tackles per game. The senior ranks eighth in school history with 32.0 TFLs in his career. Francis has been equally important; he has 8.0 TFLs, four sacks, five pass breakups and three fumble recoveries.
- The Terps have held opponents to low rushing yards per attempt througout the season. William & Mary had just 2.5 yards per carry, Temple had just 1.3, West Virginia had just 1.0; Wake Forest had 2.4; NC State had 1.5; and Boston College had just 0.3.

## LINEBACKERS PRODUCING BIG PLAYS...

• The Terps have a talented and experienced group of linebackers that have made a number of big plays all season. The unit was dealt a blow, however, when

Demetrius Hartsfield suffered a season-ending injury against Georgia Tech. Hartsfield's 338 career tackles are the second most by an active player in the conference. The Terps still have experience, as senior Darin Drakeford has played in 43 games and has 19.0 career tackles-for-loss. His 6.0 sacks this year are tied for the fifth most in the ACC with teammate Joe Vellano.

- The return from injury of fifth-year senior Kenneth Tate, who made his season debut against West Virginia after missing the first four games with a knee injury, has bolstered the unit. Tate, a 2010 All-ACC selection, has 37 tackles, 6.5 TFLs, 4.0 sacks, four pass breakups, a forced fumble and two fumble recovies in eigh games. Cole Farrand starts opposite of L.A Goree and has provided very solid play, with 71 tackles (second on the team) and six tackles for a loss.
- Hartsfield was the leader, having played in 41 career games with 38 starts, the most by any active

Terp. Prior to being injured, he recorded 78 tackles, 3.5 sacks, an interception and two fumble recoveries. He helped seal wins in three games: he recovered a fumble late against William & Mary, intercepted a

deflected pass late against Temple; and sacked Wake Forest QB Tanner Price on fourth-and-15 with under a minute to play.

## **SECONDARY ROLES...**

- Maryland ranks 27th nationally in passing defense, having allowed just 198.6 passing yards per game. Opponents have completed just 177 of 328 passes (53.96 percent) and thrown 19 touchdowns. The Terps have been at their best in ACC play, as they rank second in the league with a 126.6 pass defense efficiency rating in their seven league games.
- Dexter McDougle, who is in his second season as a starting cornerback, is tied for third on the team with 60 tackles and is first with 49 unassisted stops. He's joined by freshman Jeremiah Johnson, who has 5.0 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble this year. He also has a team-high eight pass breakups, four of which came against Wake Forest. That's tied for the most in a game by any ACC player this year (also Ross Cockrell, Duke; Drequan Hoskey, Virginia).
- · Against Wake Forest, the secondary had perhaps

its best game yet, holding the Demon Deacons to a .342 completion percentage and 170 yards. The Terps combined for 11 pass breakups, led by Johnson's four.

• Senior safety Eric Franklin is the most veteran player in the secondary, having played in 38 career games. He has 42 tackles and five pass breakups this year. Matt Robinson, expected to be a major contributor this season, has only played in four games due to injuries - he returned against Clemson and had 10 solo tackles, one tackle for loss and a forced fumble. In his absence, freshmen Sean Davis and Anthony Nixon have filled in ably. Nixon got a game ball for his play against Wake Forest and made his first career interception against Virginia.

## **ELECTRIFYING FRESHMAN...**

• Stefon Diggs has been electric for Maryland as a return man and receiver this season. The true freshman ranks second in the ACC and 10th nationally with 164.8 all-purpose yards per game. That average is first all-time among freshmen in the ACC.

• Diggs is fourth in the ACC with 16.7 yards per catch and ranks fifth with 76.6 receiving yards per game. He has been named ACC Rookie of the Week three times (Sept. 24, Oct. 8, Oct. 29) after recording 100-yard receiving games vs. West Virginia, Wake Forest and Boston College. Diggs is the first Maryland freshman to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since at least 1985, when the school started recording game-by-game stats. He was also named Specialist of the Week after returning the opening kickoff of the Virginia game 100 yards for a touchdown. His six receiving TDs this season are tied for the third most in the conference.

- Diggs' 239 all-purpose yards against Virginia are the most by a Maryland freshman since 2008 when Torrey Smith had 245 all-purpose yards against Boston College (11/29/08).
- Diggs' 27.0 yards per kickoff return on the season rank 20th in the country. In addition, he ranks 29th nationally in punt return average (10.05 yards).
- Diggs was one of the top ranked players in the country as a high school senior. He was rated the No. 2 wide receiver by Rivals.com and the best recruit in Maryland by Rivals.com. He was selected to participate in the 2012 U.S. Army All-American Bowl and finished his senior season with 770 yards receiving and eight touchdowns to go along with 277 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

## FRESHMAN UNDER CENTER...

- Perry Hills became the first true freshman to start for Maryland since Latrez Harrison in 1999 when he started the season opener against William & Mary.
   He also became the first freshman to start a season opener since redshirt freshman Calvin McCall on Sept. 2, 1999. In the game against NC State (10/20), Hills tore his ACL and will miss the remainder of the season.
- Hills was named the backup to C.J. Brown on Aug. 14 after a morning practice. Brown suffered a torn ACL that evening, and Hills earned the starting job.
- In week two against Temple, Hills, en route to ACC Rookie of the Week honors, went 11 of 21 for 190 yards, two passing TDs and a rushing TD. He led Maryland on six scoring drvies (four TDs, two field goals), including a 23-point second quarter in the 36-27 victory.
- Against No. 8 West Virginia, Hills turned in his best performance of the year. The freshman went 20 of 29 for 305 yards and three touchdowns.
- Hills was at his best in the fourth quarter. He was 24 of 35 for 390 yards and two touchdowns in the final stanza.

## SPECIAL TEAMS MAKEOVER...

 Maryland has all new faces on special teams this season. Freshman Brad Craddock, a native of Adelaide, Australia, handled the place-kicking duties through the first seven and a half games and is 8 of 14 on field goals this year. However, Brendan Magistro took over for Craddock during the Boston College game and made his only FG attempt, a 28-yarder. He is listed first on the depth chart and is expected to handle field goals from 35 yards in, while Craddock will handle long attempts. Craddock had a 39-yarder against Clemson. Redshirt freshman Nathan Renfro took over the punting duties, while junior Greg Parcher took over long-snapping duties for four-year starter Tim Downs, who graduated. Renfro is averaging 40.5 yards per punt.

## **COACHING STAFF AT A GLANCE...**

- · Mike Locksley was hired in December as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Locksley, a native of Washington, D.C., returned to Maryland after previously spending six years (1997-2002) as an assistant coach on the Terrapins staff. A veteran coach with over 20 years experience, Locksley most recently spent four years (2005-08) as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for the University of Illinois and two-plus years (2009-11) as head coach at the University of New Mexico. Locksley helped the Fighting Illini offense improve from No. 86 nationally in total offense (338.1 yards per game) in 2005 to No. 19 (438.3 yards per game) in 2008. The Illinois offense ranked in the top 10 nationally (No. 10 in 2006; No. 5 in 2007) in rushing yards. Known for strong recruiting skills, Locksley was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com.
- Brian Stewart was hired in January as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach. A former NFL defensive coordinator. Stewart recently completed a successful two-year stint with the Houston Cougars, who ended 2011 with a 13-1 record and a No. 14 ranking in the final USA Today poll. The Cougars had one of the best defenses in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2011, ranking in the top 15 in five categories: red-zone scoring (second - 67 percent), interceptions (t-third - 21), tackles for loss (sixth -7.7 per game), turnovers gained (t-10th - 31) and opponent passing efficiency (12th - 111.75 rating). Houston also improved from 96th nationally in scoring defense (32.2 points per game) in 2010 to 35th (22.4) this past year. Stewart went to Houston after an eight-year run as an NFL assistant, including two years (2007-08) as the defensive coordinator with Dallas.
- With the change to a 3-4 defense, Lyndon Johnson will now oversee both outside linebacker positions (Sam and Will), while Andre Powell will take over as special-teams coordinator, in addition to his running back chores. Last season, Johnson was responsible for the Star position on the defensive side of the ball. Powell was a special-teams coordinator during each of his last two stops Clemson (2007-10) and North Carolina (2001-06). He handled both running backs and special-teams duties the final three seasons at each job.
- Defensive line coach Greg Gattuso was elevated to assistant head coach. The former head coach of Duquesne (1992-2004), Gattuso spent six seasons

(2005-10) as the defensive line coach at Pittsburgh.

• Former offensive lineman Pete DeSouza is now a student assistant coach. DeSouza, who had not played since his redshirt freshman season (2010) when he was injured in a traffic accident, took a medical hardship.

## **BYRD GETS A FACELIFT...**

· Maryland in August finished the installation of a brand new FieldTurf Revolution surface at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium. The privately funded \$3 million project resulted in the "coolest" synthetic turf field in the nation and was completed in time for preseason camp. In order to enhance playability for all sports expected to use the facility, and after various tests and discussions, it was decided the playing surface would be a traditional green in color. The end zones for football will have a design reminiscent of the Maryland state flag and reinforcing the "Maryland Pride" theme of Maryland Athletics. The project at Maryland is the first of its kind in the United States and features exclusive new heat-reducing technology - CoolPlay - which, coupled with the patented silica sand and cryogenic rubber infill, will provide the facility with the "coolest" infill technology. FieldTurf has done extensive temperature testing which shows that CoolPlay infill provides for a difference of up to 15 degrees Fahrenheit versus traditional rubber infill systems. The many benefits of the new field include protecting the health of the student-athletes, improved playability in inclement weather, annual savings on field maintenance, a fantastic recruiting tool and tremendous revenue-generating opportunities through events such as concerts, high school games and other outside athletic events.

· On Aug. 28, head coach Randy Edsall announced that he would award six walk-ons scholarships for the 2012-13 academic year for their hard work, dedication and commitment to the football program. The six walk-ons that earned scholarships for the season are: senior defensive back Clarence Claiborne, junior linebacker Yannik Cudjoe-Virgil, senior running back Jeff Hernandez, senior running back Kwabena Ofori, junior long snapper Greg Parcher and sophomore defensive lineman Alex Walker. "I was fortunate today that I could bring [those six] in and put [them] on scholarship and to see the reaction from all of the guys. Some of them were very emotional. To be able to do that makes you feel good for them and their families. To let them know that if you work hard and have ability and do what people ask you do to there are rewards out there for you... We are all very proud of them and thankful for their hard work. I know their parents will be proud of them and what they accomplished."

# RANDY EDSALL

## Head Coach Syracuse '80 • Second Year

Randy Edsall enters his second season as head football coach at the University of Maryland coming off a tremendous off-season for the program in the areas of recruiting and academics.

Edsall was named the 34th coach in Maryland football history in January 2011 when he signed a six-year contract

In the area of recruiting Coach Edsall and his staff placed a great emphasis on the local Maryland/ Washington, D.C. market which is heavily recruited by schools across the nation and is considered a football hotbed. The result of this focus was the signing of 25 athletes, 13 from the area.

In addition, under Edsall's command and following a pattern he started at the University of Connecticut, the football program's Athletic Progress Rate (APR) moved significantly upward after a five year decline. The football team's APR, which measures eligibility and retention, increased its multi-year score from 922 (2009-2010) to 931 and its single year score from 905 to 972.

Prior to coming to College Park, Edsall, a native of nearby Glen Rock, Pa, spent 12 seasons coaching the University of Connecticut Huskies where he took the program from FCS (formerly I-AA) to five bowl games, including a BCS bowl. The 2010 Big East Coach of the Year led the Huskies to a 33-19 record over his last four seasons there, including two bowl victories and his leadership resulted in UConn being the first program ever to go from FBS newcomer to BCS bowl participant in just seven seasons.

Randy departed UConn as the school's all-time leader in career wins (74) and most games coached (144). He was a two-time recipient of the prestigious Bowl Championship Division Head Coach of the Year in New England by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston (2007, 2010).

During his tenure at UConn, the Huskies finished in the top twenty nationally for total offense twice (2003, 2004) and total defense three times (2002, 2005, 2008). Under Edsall's guidance Connecticut defeated teams from the ACC, Big Ten, Big East, Big 12, Conference USA and the SEC.

In 2007, as Edsall continued to grow the program to prominence, the Huskies earned their first-ever national rankings peaking at #13 in the BCS standings in November. That year they became just the second Big East team ever to go 7-0 at home and defeat three teams at home that were ranked in the top ten during the season.

Off the field, just as he is doing at Maryland, Edsall's teams were strong in the classroom as well. In 2007,

2008 and 2009 UConn was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its high graduation rate. In 2003 UConn was the only public Division I-A school to graduate at least 90% of its football players and in 2005, it was one of only eight schools to both graduate 70% and win a bowl game.

When Randy was named the head coach at Connecticut on December 21, 1998 he brought 19 years of coaching experience with him. He earned the job at Connecticut after a year as the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech where the 14th ranked Yellow Jackets went 9-2.

Prior to his season at Georgia Tech Edsall spent three seasons under two-time Super Bowl Champion coach Tom Coughlin as the secondary coach for the NFL Jacksonville Jaguars. During his time in Jacksonville the expansion Jaguars reached the playoffs twice, including a berth in the 1996 AFC Championship Game.

Edsall began his coaching career in 1980 at his alma mater, Syracuse University. The former quarterback at Syracuse started as a graduate assistant (1980-82) before joining the staff in 1983 overseeing the running backs under head coach Dick MacPherson. Edsall oversaw the running backs for three years (1983-84 and 1986) and oversaw the tight ends in 1985 before making the switch to defense.

He coached the Syracuse defensive backs from 1987-1990 and during that time the Orangemen were ranked among the Division I-A leaders in pass defense. After the 1990 season Tom Coughlin, then coach of Boston College, hired Randy to coach the defensive backs at BC.

Edsall was a three-year letter winner in football, basketball and baseball at Susquehannock High School (Pa.) and was an all-state selection in all three sports as a senior which led to induction into the York Area Sports Hall of Fame.

At Syracuse he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Syracuse in 1980 and a master's degree in health and physical education in 1982.

Edsall and his wife, Elleen met at Syracuse University where she was a basketball and volleyball standout who was later inducted into the Syracuse University Hall of Fame. They have a daughter, Alexi (23) and a son, Corey (20).

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Justus Pickett ran for a 6-yard touchdown with 9:52 left in the fourth quarter, and Brad Craddock added the tie-breaking extra point to give Maryland a 7-6 victory over William & Mary in the season opener for both

Maryland overcame a slow start against its Football Championship Subdivision opponent, which led most of the game before losing its opener for the 10th time in 11 years.

The Terrapins won despite turning the ball over four times and missing a short field goal.

Freshman quarterback Perry Hills, in his first collegiate start, completed 16 of 24 for 145 yards and directed the winning 10-play, 69-yard drive, but he threw three interceptions.

The Terrapins turned the ball over three times in the first quarter, when the Tribe took a 6-0 lead on two Drake Kuhn field goals.

Maryland missed a short field goal in the second quarter and left the field at halftime trailing 6-0.

Maryland's scoring drive came on its first possession of the fourth quarter and began after Kuhn missed a 48-yard field goal.

The Terrapins went 69 yards in 10 plays to get up Pickett's 6-yard scoring scamper around left end. The Terps converted two third-down plays on the drive, including a 22-yard pass from Hills to Kevin Dorsey on a third-and-8.

Hills went 3-for-4 passing for 41 yards on the drive and added an 8-yard scramble.

Maryland's defense, led by 13 stops by Demetrius Hartsfield and 11 by Joe Vellano, held the Tribe to 229 yards in total offense, no touchdowns in the game and no points in the final three quarters.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Freshman Stefon Diggs had 223 all-purpose yards, including a 29-yard touchdown catch, but Maryland's comeback attempt fell short as Connecticut defeated the Terps 24-21 Saturday.

Lyle McCombs rushed for 94 yards and a fourth-quarter touchdown to lead the Huskies. Scott McCummings, who also came in at quarterback occasionally, ran for a 3-yard score that gave the Huskies a 14-0 first-half lead.

That came after Nick Williams scored the game's first touchdown on a 58-yard punt return.

The Huskies outgained Maryland 148-80 in total yardage in the first half and controlled the ball for 18 minutes, 40 seconds. They also came up with timely plays, converting four of nine third-down situations to keep the Maryland offense off the field.

But Maryland's offense responded in the second quarter. A key play came on fourth-and-4 from the Connecticut 37, when quarterback Perry Hills completed an 18-yard pass to Diggs.

One play later, Wes Brown ran for a 19-yard touchdown, and Brad Craddock's extra point cut the lead to 14-7 with 10:24 remaining in the half

Connecticut linebacker Yawin Smallwood sacked Hills and forced a third-quarter fumble that Angelo Pruitt recovered for the Huskies at the Maryland 23. They couldn't pick up a first down, but Chad Christen kicked a 34-yard field goal with 3:29 left in the quarter for a 17-7 lead.

After a 75-yard drive, Maryland made it 17-14 on the second play of the fourth quarter when Hills threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to Stefon Diggs on third-and-10. The Terrapins' Marcus Leak tipped the pass and Diggs grabbed it for a touchdown to make it 17-14.

The Huskies answered on their next possession, driving 76 yards to take a 24-14 lead on McCombs' 11-yard touchdown run, but Maryland again countered.

Diggs returned the ensuing kickoff 45 yards to setup great field position, and Hills led the Terps on a seven-play, 53-yard drive capped by his 10-yard touchdown run to make it 24-21 with 4:39 left

After the defense forced a three-and-out and Maryland got the ball back following a Huskies punt, the Terps reached the Connecticut 39 before their drive stalled with 17 seconds left.

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. - Freshman Perry Hills threw for a season-high 305 yards and three touchdowns, two to freshman Stefon Diggs, but Maryland fell to No. 8 West Virginia 31-21 on Saturday.

Maryland held the high-powered offense of West Virginia, which came in averaging 55.5 points per game and 612 yards per game, mostly in check.

Fourteen of the Mountaineers points came off Terrapin turnovers, including a 51-yard fumble return TD by Doug Rigg early in the first quarter. The Terps allowed 363 yards of total offense, had nine tackles for loss and allowed just 25 rushing yards on 25 attempts.

West Virginia's Geno Smith threw three touchdown passes to Tavon Austin, who had 13 catches for 179 yards. Austin and Diggs were the all-purpose stars of the game - Austin finished with 225 all-purpose yards and Diggs had 201.

Hills completed 20 of 29 passes with Diggs, Marcus Leak and Matt Furstenburg as his main targets. Diggs totaled 113 receiving yards, Leak had 69 and Furstenburg had 65.

After trailing 14-0 early, Hills threw in the flat to Diggs, who raced down the sideline 42 yards and leaped into the end zone for the score with 1:54 left in the first quarter. The Terps tied it on a 12-yard TD pass from Hills to Leak with 12:16 left in the second quarter.

West Virginia, though, scored the game's next 17 points to take a 31-14 lead. Hills capped the scoring on a 56-yard touchdown pass to Diggs with 7:25 left, but Maryland was unable to get any closer.

Maryland's defense limited Wake Forest to 45 yards in the second half, including just three in the fourth quarter. The Terps controlled possession in the second half, holding the ball for 19:59 compared to 10:01 for Wake Forest.

That allowed Maryland, now 3-2 overall and 1-0 in the ACC, to win its ACC opener for the fifth straight season. The last time the Terps didn't win their conference opener was 2007, a 31-24 overtime loss at Wake Forest.

Maryland answered on the next drive as Brad Craddock connected on a 49-yard field goal to cut the Wake Forest lead to 7-3. Craddock added another field goal later in the first quarter, this time from 52 yards, to make it 7-6.

Just before halftime, Maryland quarterback Perry Hills connected with Kevin Dorsey for a 33-yard touchdown to give the Terps a 13-7 lead heading into the locker room.

Wake Forest answered and took a 14-13 lead in the third quarter when Price threw a 7-yard touchdown to Tommy Bohanon

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. - Stefon Diggs returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and fellow freshman Perry Hills threw for one TD and ran for another as Maryland defeated Virginia 27-20 in Atlantic Coast Conference action on Saturday.

The kickoff return was the beginning of a 17-point lead the Terrapins would build in the first quarter.

After the teams traded three-and-outs in the third quarter, Virginia cut the margin to 17-10 on Sims' 20-yard touchdown pass to a well-covered E.J. Scott.

On the next play, Virginia's Will Hill recovered a Hills fumble at the Virginia 31. The Cavaliers reached the Maryland 3, but Sims' third-down lob to tight end Jake McGee was incomplete and Virginia settled for Frye's 22-yard field goal.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Mike Glennon directed a frantic drive to set up a 43-yard field goal by Niklas Sade with 32 seconds left, and North Carolina State overcame a valiant performance by Maryland backup quarterback Devin Burns in a 20-18 victory Saturday.

After Sade's kick, the Terrapins moved 60 yards in five plays behind third-string quarterback Caleb Rowe before a 33-yard field goal try by Brad Craddock hit the left upright with two seconds remaining.

The Wolfpack (5-2, 2-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) trailed 18-17 and had no timeouts left upon getting the ball at their own 20 with 2:17 to go. Glennon completed a 14-yard pass to Quintin Payton on a third-and-10 and pushed NC State into field-goal range with a 14-yard completion to Rashard Smith.

Burns replaced injured Perry Hills late in the second quarter and nearly produced a victory for Maryland (4-3, 2-1) in the first extensive action of his college career.

Burns, a sophomore, rushed for 50 yards and completed 3 of 4 passes for 47 yards. He wasn't even on the depth chart at quarterback at the beginning of summer practice and ran only two plays this season before being pressed into action.

Maryland trailed 10-3 at halftime and 17-15 in the fourth quarter before rallying behind Burns and true freshman Wes Brown, who ran for 121 yards on 25 carries.

The Terps went up 18-17 on a 48-yard field goal by Craddock with 13:39 left, but the lead wouldn't stand up.

Maryland trailed 10-3 before a blocked punt and interference penalty set up a 1-yard touchdown run by Brown midway through the third quarter. The conversion kick failed.

On the first play following the kickoff, Underwood slipped free down the middle and was 10 yards behind the closest Maryland defender when he hauled in a rainbow pass from Glennon for a 68-yard score.

Undaunted, Burns directed a 74-yard drive that got the Terrapins to 17-15. After peeling off runs of 23, 5 and 14 yards in addition to completing a 38-yard pass to Marcus Leak, Burns scored on a bootleg from the 2.

## Georgia Tech 33, Maryland 13

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Converted linebacker Shawn Petty became the fifth quarterback of the season for Maryland, but Georgia Tech used its option offense to churn out a 33-13 victory over the Terrapins on Saturday.

The Yellow Jackets (4-5, 3-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) amassed 370 yards on the ground against the nation's fourthranked defense against the run.

It was 27-0 late in the third quarter before Maryland finally scored on a 16-yard touchdown pass from Petty to Stefon Diggs. Petty also threw a 23-yard TD pass to Diggs on the game's final play, but the injury-depleted Terrapins (4-5, 2-3) dropped their third straight.

Maryland has lost four quarterbacks for the season with injuries, so Edsall turned to Petty, a true freshman recruited as a linebacker. The 6-foot-1, 230-pound left-hander ran for 24 yards on 17 carries and completed 9 of 18 passes for 115 yards. He also fumbled twice and threw an interception.

Maryland had 61 yards in offense in the first half and 198 after halftime,

The Yellow Jackets finished with 401 total yards - all but 31 on the ground. After building a 20-0 lead at halftime, the Yellow Jackets attempted only one pass over the final 30 minutes.

Georgia Tech took a 6-0 lead late in the first quarter when Washington capped a 12-play, 69-yard drive with a 1-yard run. Orwin Smith kept the march alive with a 17-yard run on a fourth-and-3 from the Maryland 35.

The Yellow Jackets capitalized on a Petty fumble to make it 13-0 early in the second guarter. After Jeremiah Attaochu recovered the loose ball at the Maryland 33, Smith scored from the 5. Another three-and-out by the Terrapins followed, and a 17-yard punt provided Georgia Tech the ball at the Maryland 49. Seven plays later, Lee scored for a 20-0 lead.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Tajh Boyd threw for 261 yards and three touchdowns in No. 10 Clemson's 45-10 victory over Maryland on Saturday, the Tigers' sixth straight win.

Clemson (9-1, 6-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) had little trouble with the banged-up Terps (4-6, 2-4), who again started linebacker Shawn Petty at quarterback because of seasonending injuries to their four scholarship passers.

The Tigers controlled things early as Boyd passed for a 13-yard touchdown to Adam Humphries and a 28-yard score to DeAndre Hopkins. In between, Clemson defensive end Corey Crawford brought a Petty fumble 16 yards for a touchdown as part of his team's 21-point first quarter.

Besides the four scholarship quarterbacks lost for the season, Maryland was without leading tackler Demetrius Hartsfield because of a torn ACL and star freshman Stefon Diggs due to a bad ankle.

The Tigers scored on their second possession, Humphries stretching out in the end zone to make his first career touchdown grab.

Twelve seconds later, Petty was chased down by defensive end Corey Crawford, who forced a fumble, scooped the ball up and went 16 yards for another score.

A Tigers mistake - Humphries muffed a punt catch inside his team's 20 - led to Maryland's lone score as Petty connected with Devonte Campbell.

Redshirt freshman Brandon Ross finished with 100 yards rushing for the Terrapins.

## No. 10/6 Florida State 41, Maryland 14

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - The Maryland Terrapins needed to be flawless against No. 10 Florida State - but were not. The result was a 41-14 defeat Saturday that extended Maryland's losing streak to five games and ruined its chances of becom-

Season-ending injuries to four quarterbacks forced true freshman linebacker Shawn Petty to call the signals for the offense. Making his third straight start, Petty went 8 for 19 for 136 yards and two touchdowns, both to Kevin Dorsey.

But it wasn't nearly enough after the Seminoles scored two touchdowns in a span of 12 seconds in the first quarter to go

Devonta Freeman ran for 148 yards and two touchdowns, FSU's top-ranked defense lived up to its billing. The victory enabled the Seminoles (10-1, 7-1) to clinch the league's Atlantic Division crown.

Florida State led 27-0 at halftime and coasted to its fifth straight victory. The Seminoles will play for their 13th ACC crown on Dec. 1.

EJ Manuel completed 17 of 23 passes for 144 yards and two scores to supplement a running game that amassed 237 yards. In their previous game at Virginia Tech, the Seminoles were held to minus-15 yards rushing.

Florida State allowed 27 yards and three first downs before halftime and ended up giving up 170 yards -- well below their nation's best average of 242.9 per game. Were it not for a 42-yard touchdown pass from Petty to Dorsey with 25 seconds left, the Seminoles would have held the opposition under 10 points for the sixth time in 11 games.

In the third quarter, Petty threw a 33-yard touchdown pass to Dorsey on a fourth-down play. It was the final home game for Dorsey and 16 other Maryland seniors.
