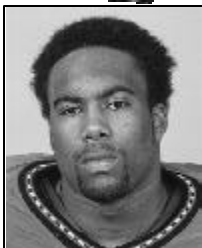

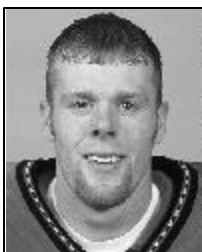
2001 (Sophomore): Saw action in all 11 games ... finished the season with eight tackles (four solo) and one sack ... successfully overcame a dislocated right wrist suffered in the spring ... (vs. UVa) had the biggest play of his career by recovering a blocked punt for a touchdown to put Maryland up 24-7 at halftime ... it was the first time that a Maryland player returned a blocked punt for a touchdown since 1992 when Jermaine Lewis scored vs. Georgia Tech.

2000 (Redshirt Freshman): Appeared in nine games and totaled eight tackles ... saw extensive action on special teams in addition to playing a reserve role at an outside linebacker spot ... season-high three total tackles vs. Wake Forest ... had two assisted tackles vs. Middle Tennessee State.

1999 (Freshman): Redshirt season.

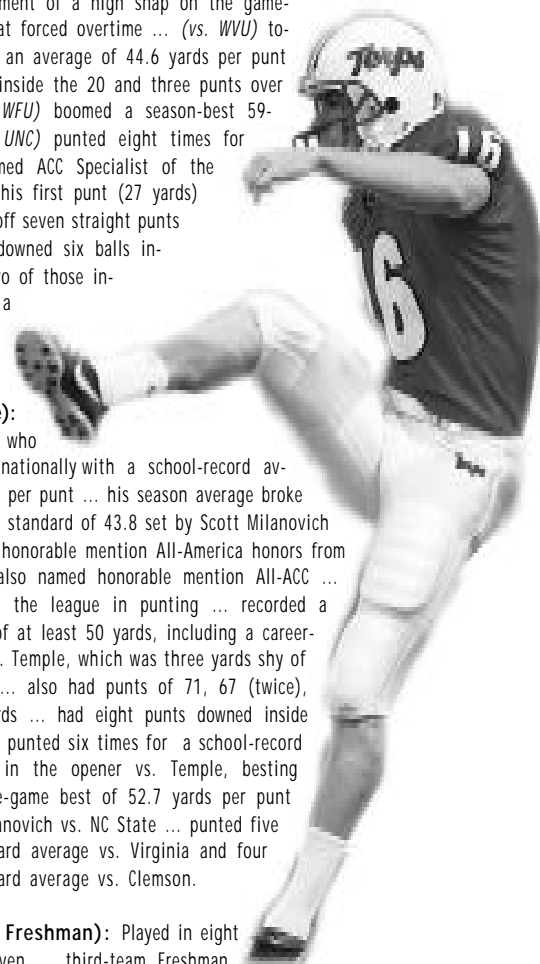

On Barnard: All-America and Ray Guy Award candidate who enters his senior season as Maryland's leader in career (43.9), single-season (44.7 in 2000) and single-game (53.8 vs. Temple, 2000) punting averages ... the nation's fourth-leading returning punter from 2001 after posting a 44.5-yard average ... a first team all-conference pick and a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award last year ... local product who originally went to Oklahoma to pursue a degree in meteorology ... tall, lean, athletic specialist who owns six of the top 12 single-game punting efforts in Maryland history ... has games where he can find the "zone" and play a major role in the game's outcome from a field position standpoint ... has opened each of the last two seasons with huge outings (53.8 average against Temple in 2000 and 50.4 average against UNC in '01) ... has started all but one game the past three seasons.

2001 (Junior): Starting punter in all 11 games plus the Orange Bowl ... a Ray Guy Award semifinalist ... first team All-ACC ... second team All-America by the *Football News* ... ranked seventh in the NCAA in punting (44.5) ... net punting average ranked fourth in the NCAA ... had 17 punts downed inside the 20 ... (vs. NCSU) punted four times for an average of 43 yards per kick ... boomed one punt over 50 yards (52) and also had one punt inside the 20 ... (vs. CU) had another solid outing, punting four times for an average of 43.5 yards per punt including three kicks inside the Clemson 20 ... boomed a 47-yard punt on his first kick of the game to pin Clemson on its own five yard line ... kicked a 51-yarder on his second attempt ... (vs. FSU) punted six times for an impressive 47.3 average ... boomed

one punt over 50 yards (53) and also pinned the Seminoles on the three-yard line in the first half ... (vs. Duke) kicked just one punt for 43 yards ... punt came on the last play of the game ... if Barnard did not punt, it would have been only the second time in school history that Maryland did not punt in a game ... (vs. GT) punted seven times for an average of 44.7 yards per kick ... saved the game with his excellent placement of a high snap on the game-tying field goal that forced overtime ... (vs. WVU) totaled 10 punts for an average of 44.6 yards per punt ... had two punts inside the 20 and three punts over 50 yards ... (vs. WFU) boomed a season-best 59-yard kick ... (vs. UNC) punted eight times for 50.4 yards ... named ACC Specialist of the Week ... following his first punt (27 yards) of the day, he ran off seven straight punts over 50 yards ... downed six balls inside the 20 and two of those inside the 10 ... had a net average of 46.1 in the game.



2000 (Sophomore):

An 11-game starter who finished fourth nationally with a school-record average of 44.7 yards per punt ... his season average broke the previous school standard of 43.8 set by Scott Milanovich in 1993 ... earned honorable mention All-America honors from *Football News* ... also named honorable mention All-ACC ... finished second in the league in punting ... recorded a total of 13 punts of at least 50 yards, including a career-long of 85 yards vs. Temple, which was three yards shy of the school record ... also had punts of 71, 67 (twice), 66, 63 and 61 yards ... had eight punts downed inside the 20-yard line ... punted six times for a school-record 53.8-yard average in the opener vs. Temple, besting the previous single-game best of 52.7 yards per punt set in 1993 by Milanovich vs. NC State ... punted five times for a 51.0-yard average vs. Virginia and four times for a 49.8 yard average vs. Clemson.

1999 (Redshirt Freshman):

Played in eight games, starting seven ... third-team Freshman All-America by *The Sporting News* ... ranked 34th nationally with 42.1 yards per punt ... had the Terps' best punting average since 1993, third-best overall and best ever by a freshman ... after taking over as Maryland's full-time punter against Wake Forest, team rose 41 positions in NCAA net punting statistics (103rd to 62nd) ... following an eight-yarder in his second punt at Wake, he boasted 39 punts the rest of the year for 1,687 yards and a 43.3-yard average ... 48.8 and 45.0-yard averages vs. Duke and Florida State were among top 10 single-game efforts in Maryland history ... 10 punts downed inside the 20-yard line ... 11 punts of 50 yards or better ... entered fall camp as a walk-on, finished camp listed No. 2 on the depth chart ... first action came at Georgia Tech; was named the No. 1 punter the following week.

1998 (Freshman): Attended Oklahoma for one semester in the fall before transferring to Maryland.

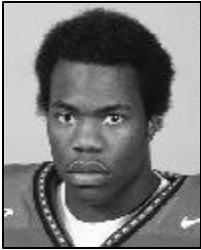

On Brooks: Second-year player who will enter 2002 as a player to watch on the Terp offensive front ... earned a starting job at left tackle in the spring of last year as a redshirt freshman ... a Freshman All-American last year ... a very technical blocker who, despite his youth, has a firm grasp of the offense and blocking schemes ... takes pride in finishing his blocks ... has good feet and ideal size for his position.

2001 (Redshirt Freshman): Started all 11 games as well the Orange Bowl ... graded out as the Terps' top lineman once and the second-best lineman three times (Eastern Michigan, Georgia Tech and Clemson) ... (vs. NCSU) started at left tackle and played 51 snaps ... (vs. Duke) had one of the finest games of his young career ... graded out as Maryland's top offensive lineman along with Melvin Fowler ... registered a team-high six "big blocks" (pancakes, downfield, etc.) ... offense averaged 7.7 yards per play and totaled 34 first downs ... had an excellent block to spring Shaun Hill for his 57-yard touchdown run ... nominated for ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week ... played 56 snaps ... (vs. WFU) nominee for ACC Rookie of the Week ... graded out as the Terps' third-best performer and played 66 snaps.

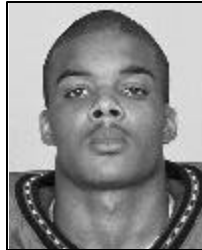

2001 (Sophomore): Started all 11 games including the Orange Bowl ... graded out as the team's third-best lineman vs. West Virginia and Virginia ... played a season-high 88 snaps vs. Clemson ... (vs. NCSU) started at right guard and played 73 snaps.

2000 (Redshirt Freshman): Talented young prospect who figured into the mix on the offensive line ... did not play in the first two games of the season, but came on to play in the final nine games, earning a total of six starts at right guard ... entered the season listed No. 2 on the depth chart behind Bob Krantz but seized the opportunity to move into a starting role when Krantz was bothered by injuries.

2001 (Redshirt Sophomore): Played in four games ... completed 5-of-14 passes for 25 yards with no touchdowns or interceptions ... fifth on the team in rushing with 140 yards on 19 carries with one touchdown ... averaged 7.4 yards per carry ... (vs. Duke) rushed five times for 47 yards including a six-yard touchdown run ... the touchdown was the first of his career ... was 2-of-3 passing for 12 yards ...
