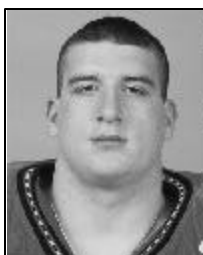
2000 (Sophomore): Saw action in five games ... played primarily on special teams.

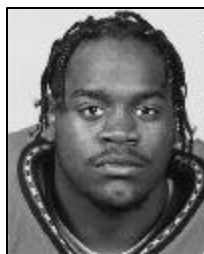

his already big frame in the offseason ... a big, strong back with good hands ... is a good runner for a player his size (267 pounds) ... an imposing force as a blocking back ... is the starter at a fullback position that features three talented players (Lynch, Killian and Fiddler).

2001 (Sophomore): Played in all 11 games (plus the Orange Bowl), starting all but four ... rushed 16 times for 130 yards and two touchdowns ... was not thrown for a loss all season ... also caught seven balls for 53 yards ... averaged 8.1 yards per carry, best among Terps with 10 carries or more ... (*vs. FSU*) scored the game's first touchdown by rumbling 65 yards on an option play up the middle of the FSU defense ... the 65-yard carry was the longest of his career ... led the team in rushing with three carries for a career-high 71 yards and a touchdown ... also caught two passes for 13 yards ...

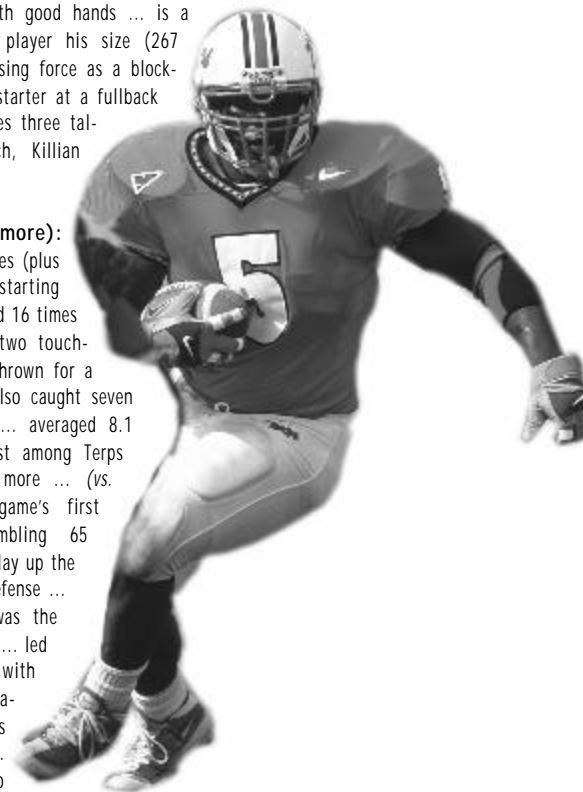
(*vs. Duke*) carried the ball two times for 18 yards including a 14-yard touchdown run up the middle ... also caught one pass for 18 yards ... the touchdown run was his first career TD via the rush ... (*vs. GT*) caught one pass for four yards from Brooks Barnard on a fake field goal, falling just one yard short of a first down ... also had a three-yard carry ... (*vs. EMU*) rumbled for 23 yards on five carries ... (*vs. UNC*) first career start.

2000 (Freshman): Backed up veteran fullback Matt Kalapinski as a true freshman, appearing in eight games ... rushed four times for six yards and caught a pair of passes, including one for a touchdown in Maryland's double-overtime victory over NC State.

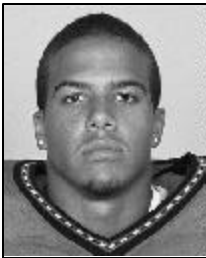

2000 (at WVU): Saw action in 10 games as a redshirt freshman, starting one ... completed 42-of-99 passes for 755 yards, three touchdowns and three interceptions ... first extensive action came against Notre Dame, where he played the final three quarters in relief of Brad Lewis ... started slow but finished with 252 yards passing with one TD pass ... first collegiate start came against Syracuse (8-of-21 for 156 yards and two interceptions) ... had a strong showing in relief against Pittsburgh (13-of-28, 257 yards, two TDs).

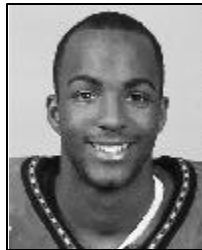

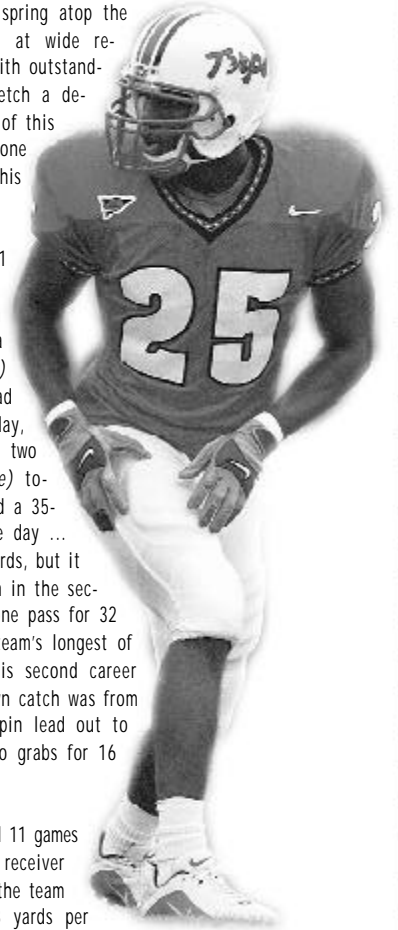
2001 (Junior): Saw action in all 11 games with two starts ... also played in the Orange Bowl ... finished fourth on the team with 14 receptions for a career-high 229 yards ... (vs. TSU) made two catches for 54 yards ... had the team's longest reception of the day, good for 42 yards ... (vs. FSU) had two receptions for 22 yards ... (vs. Duke) totaled two catches for 50 yards ... had a 35-yard catch, the team's longest of the day ... (vs. NCSU) had career-highs in receptions (three) and receiving yards (80) ... the 80 yards receiving led the team ... caught a pass over the middle for a career-long 64 yards before he was stripped at the goal line ... also returned five kickoffs for 123 yards and handled the punt return duties for the first time this season ... (vs. Duke) rushed two times for 39 yards including a 31-yard scamper ... the 31-yard run was the longest of his career ... also caught one pass for nine yards ... (vs. GT) had just two catches for 23 yards, but had the game's most important reception with his 17-yard grab that set up the game-tying field goal at the end of regulation ... the 17-yard catch was, at that time, the longest of his career ... 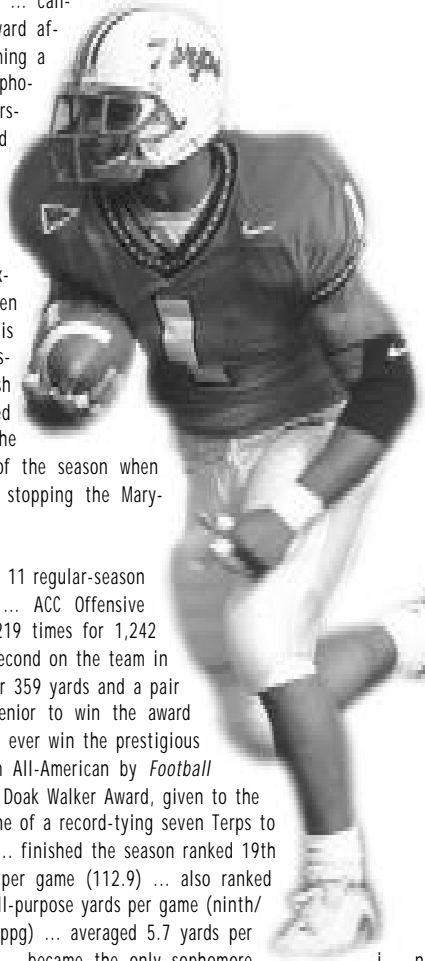

On Perry: Fourth-year junior and All-America candidate who enters the season as a player to watch at both the

conference and national levels ... candidate for the Doak Walker Award after working his way into becoming a finalist for the honor as a sophomore ... enters spring still nursing a stomach strain suffered prior to the Orange Bowl ... a quick, explosive tailback who is surprisingly powerful ... combines quick feet, a strong burst, breakaway speed and excellent open-field moves ... when healthy, hits holes hard and is always a threat to go the distance ... always seems to finish plays falling forward ... proved to be a potent receiver out of the backfield in the second half of the season when the opposition's focus became stopping the Maryland rushing attack.

2001 (Junior): Starter in all 11 regular-season games and the Orange Bowl ... ACC Offensive Player of the Year ... rushed 219 times for 1,242 yards and 10 TD's ... finished second on the team in receiving with 40 receptions for 359 yards and a pair of TDs ... was the first non-senior to win the award and is just the first Terrapin to ever win the prestigious award ... named a second-team All-American by *Football News* ... a 2001 finalist for the Doak Walker Award, given to the nation's top running back ... one of a record-tying seven Terps to earn first-team All-ACC honors ... finished the season ranked 19th in the NCAA in rushing yards per game (112.9) ... also ranked among the nation's leaders in all-purpose yards per game (ninth/156.2) and scoring (69th/6.55 ppg) ... averaged 5.7 yards per carry and had 12 touchdowns ... became the only sophomore in Maryland history to have five consecutive 100-yard efforts ... with his 64 yards on 10 carries in the first half of the WVU game, it snapped a streak of three straight 100-yard outings by halftime ... was just the fifth Terp to crack the 1,000-yard plateau in a season ... (vs. NCSU) ran for 91 yards on 21 carries ... also caught five passes out of the backfield for 35 yards including a clutch fourth-down conversion on the team's final drive that he caught as he was falling backwards toward the sideline ... (vs. CU) led the Terps with 90 rushing yards on 21 carries ... also caught three passes for 37 yards including the game-breaking score to put the Terps ahead 24-6 ... (vs. FSU) led the Terps in receiving with six catches for 70 yards ... had the team's longest pass play on the day when he raced 38 yards on a swing pass to set up a Maryland touchdown ... the 38-yard reception was the longest of Perry's career ... rushed for 67 yards on 13 carries (5.2 average) and a touchdown ... was selected the player of the game for Maryland by ABC ... (vs. Duke) had 79 rushing yards on 13 carries in limited action ... led the team with six catches for 62 yards ... scored the Terps' second touchdown on a 12-yard run in the first quarter ... (vs. GT) was held under 100 yards for the first time in the season,

rushing for 49 yards on 18 carries ... caught five passes, though ... (vs. UVa) finished with 143 yards on 25 carries and a touchdown ... also caught a career-high eight passes for 51 yards ... (vs. WVU) posted a 31-carry, 153-yard performance ... rushed for one touchdown while also catching two passes for 28 yards ... (vs. WFU) turned in the second-best rushing performance in Maryland history with a career-high 276 yards on 30 carries ... was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week for his efforts ... the 276 yards trails only LaMont Jordan's 306 yards gained vs. Virginia in 1999 in the Maryland record book ... scored two touchdowns on the day on long runs of 80 and 50 yards ... the 80-yard scamper was the first play of the game for the Terps on offense and was the longest run by a Terp since Jordan had a 90-yard run vs. Virginia in '99 ... his 276 yards were the most ever vs. Wake Forest, breaking the old mark by South Carolina's George Rogers, who ran for 237 yards in 1978 ... (vs. EMU) ran for 133 yards on just 16 carries ... reached the century mark before halftime for the second straight week ... scored a career-best three touchdowns ... (vs. UNC) turned heads after his first career start ... ran for 116 yards on 21 carries (5.5 yards per carry) ... continued to get better and better as the game went on ... totaled 70 yards in the second half at an impressive 7.8 yards per attempt.

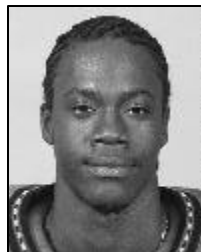

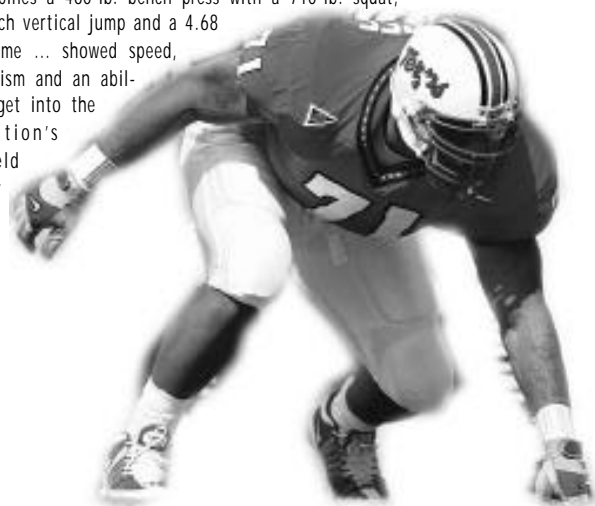

... one of the strongest players, pound-for-pound, in the history of Maryland football ... led defensive linemen in every strength/athleticism category (bench press, clean, squat, vertical jump and 40-yard dash time) after last year's testing day ... strength index of 796 is the highest of any player at any position in school history ... combines a 460-lb. bench press with a 710-lb. squat, a 36-inch vertical jump and a 4.68 forty time ... showed speed, athleticism and an ability to get into the opposition's backfield a year ago.



2001 (Junior): Started every game but one (including the Orange Bowl) at defensive end ... finished the season with 27 tackles (15 solo), five tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks and a fumble recovery ... sack total was second best on the team ... had a team-high 12 quarterback hurries ... (vs. *TSU*) had a busy day, finishing with 1.5 sacks for minus 13 yards and two TFLs along with four total tackles ... (vs. *GT*) finished with one sack and five tackles ... also had two quarterback hurries ... (vs. *UVa*) recovered a fumble by UVa quarterback Bryson Spinner in the first quarter ... also assisted on one tackle ... (vs. *WFU*) made three tackles before leaving the game with a sprained ankle ... (vs. *EMU*) had one sack for 11 yards ... also had three quarterback hurries ... (vs. *UNC*) had three tackles ... also had a sack and two quarterback hurries ... the sack was almost a safety as he downed Ronald Curry at the one-yard line.

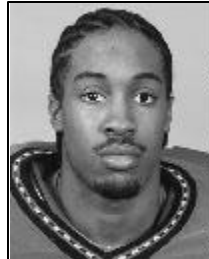
On Starks: A talented player who is making a name for himself early in his career ... a key addition to the defensive line in his first season of collegiate ball in '01 ... can
