COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Maryland coach Ralph Friedgen opened his head coaching career in grand fashion, beating conference opponent North Carolina, 23-7, at Byrd Stadium.

With the win, Friedgen became the first Maryland head coach since Tom Nugent in 1959 to win his first-ever game as a Terp. In addition, Friedgen became the first Terrapin coach ever to win his ACC opener in his first year.

Shaun Hill threw two TD passes to complement a stellar performance by the Maryland defense, and the Terrapins rolled to a 23-7 victory.

Maryland (1-0, 1-0 ACC) scored 23 straight points after Parker's run stunned Friedgen and the crowd of 44,080.

UNC (0-2, 0-1) remained winless under first-year coach John Bunting. Darian Durant replaced senior QB Ronald Curry for the second straight game, but unlike last week against Oklahoma, the redshirt freshman failed to generate any offense.

Curry went 6-for-12 for 61 yards and an interception. Durant, who entered in the third quarter, finished 10-for-14 for 97 yards and two interceptions.

The Terrapins kept the Tar Heels in their own end of the field for much of the game, thanks in part to punter Brooks Barnard, who averaged 50.4 yards on eight kicks and had seven of his eight punts travel over 50 yards.

Parker (25 yards on 12 carries after his initial run) was undone by Maryland's Bruce Perry, who gained 116 yards on 21 attempts. Maryland pulled away with two touchdowns in the fourth quarter. After Perry ran for 12 yards on a 3rd-and-5 from the North Carolina 19, Hill hit Scooter Monroe for a five-yard score.

LB Mike Whaley then intercepted Durant, setting up a one-yard run by Marc Riley with 6:35 left and launching a celebration in the stadium that was a long time coming.

Stung by Parker's early run, Maryland's defense bounced back on North Carolina's next possession by forcing the Tar Heels to punt from their own one. A 10-yard return by Guilian Gary gave the Terrapins the ball at the North Carolina 32, setting up Hill's TD pass to Williams.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Maryland continued its winning ways at the start of 2001 as it manhandled Eastern Michigan of the Mid-American Conference, 50-3, at Byrd Stadium.

Bruce Perry ran for 133 yards and three touchdowns as Maryland recorded its most lopsided victory since a 52-0 rout of Wake Forest in 1996.

The defense limited Eastern Michigan to just 124 yards in offense - fewest by a Maryland opponent since 1980 - in helping Friedgen become the first coach since Jim Tatum in 1947 to win his first two games at Maryland.

EMU produced only 69 yards and five first downs in falling behind 41-0 after three quarters.

Perry scored on runs of 8, 24 and 31 yards. The sophomore averaged 8.3 yards per carry before being pulled early in the third quarter.

Showing no signs of a letdown after last week's emotional 23-7 rout of ACC rival North Carolina, Maryland scored on its first two possessions to take control.

First, the Terrapins moved 62 yards in 11 plays, taking a 6-0 lead on Perry's first career score. Maryland then forced a punt and proceeded to embark on another 62-yard march. Perry ran for 47 yards on four carries before giving way to Marc Riley, who scored from the one.

The Eagles' first turnover, an interception by Tony Okanlawon, set up a 19-yard touchdown pass from Hill to Guilian Gary for a 19-0 lead in the second quarter. Hill salvaged the drive with a 30-yard completion to Daryl Whitmer on a third-and-25.

Perry's second touchdown, with 3:37 left in the half, capped a 52-yard drive in which Hill completed two passes to Gary totaling 24 yards. Hill then completed two passes for 26 yards before Perry raced around right end to make it 34-0 early in the third quarter.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. - Bruce Perry rushed for a career-high 276 yards, scoring on runs of 50 and 80 yards, as Maryland beat Wake Forest, 27-20.

The game featured the two top rushers in the Atlantic Coast Conference in Perry and Wake's Tarence Williams, who came into the game averaging 137 yards. Williams finished with 100 yards -- 70 coming in the second half -- but could never find the kind of holes that allowed Perry to rumble frequently into the secondary.

Perry finished with the second-highest rushing total in school history and the seventh-highest in ACC history.

Perry opened with an 80-yard touchdown run. He added a 50-yard score with 8:38 to play in the game that gave the Terps (3-0, 2-0 ACC) a 27-13 edge.

The Deacons (2-1, 0-1) answered with a 42-yard TD pass from James MacPherson to Jason Anderson that pulled them to 27-20 with 6:54 to play. The Deacons had two late chances to tie the game.

The first drive ended with an incompletion, while a Tony Jackson interception in the end zone with 39 seconds to play stopped the second.

Maryland had 519 yards of offense and got 222 passing yards from quarterback Shaun Hill.

The Terps led 10-3 at halftime, but made several mistakes that kept Wake Forest close. The Terps had a 13-yard scoring pass from Hill to Daryl Whitmer called back because of a holding penalty in the second quarter. On its next drive, Maryland moved the ball 72 yards on 12 plays, but turned the ball over when safety Adrian Duncan intercepted a pass in the end zone just before halftime.

The Terrapins are soaring to new heights under Ralph Friedgen, who joins H.C. "Curley" Byrd as the only two coaches to begin their first season at Maryland with four straight wins.

It was the fourth straight 100-yard game for Perry to start the season, who carried 31 times and caught two passes for 28 yards against a defense geared to stop him.

Shaun Hill threw for a touchdown and ran for another as Maryland improved to 4-0 for the second time since 1978. The 1995 team started 4-0 but faded to a 6-5 finish and did not receive a bowl bid.

Avon Cobourne ran for 128 yards and Shawn Terry returned a kickoff 100 yards for West Virginia (2-2). But Brad Lewis threw four interceptions and the Mountaineers lost two fumbles.

The Mountaineers' fifth turnover enabled the Terrapins to take a 25-13 lead with 41 seconds left in the third quarter. After Randall Jones returned an interception 30 yards, Guilian Gary caught a pass from Hill on a slant pattern and sprinted the rest of the way for a 29-yard score.

Maryland later got some breathing room with an 81-yard drive capped by Hill's 1-yard sneak with 12:11 left. Perry accounted for 47 yards, including 18 on a pass from Hill.

Maryland took advantage of two turnovers to go up 19-13 at halftime. WVU's first possession ended with an interception in the end zone by Tony Jackson, and late in the half Mike Whaley scooped up a Lewis fumble and ran 52 yards for a touchdown.

Lewis went 31-for-52 for 279 yards and a touchdown, but his five turnovers were too much for WVU to overcome.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Off to their best start in 23 years, the Maryland Terrapins found themselves in a rather unaccustomed spot after playing Uva -- alone atop the ACC.

Shaun Hill threw for two touchdown passes and Bruce Perry ran for 143 yards and a score as No. 25 Maryland remained unbeaten by defeating Virginia, 41-21.

The Terrapins let a 24-7 halftime lead dwindle to three points, then pulled away in the fourth quarter to snap a nine-game losing streak against the Cavaliers and emerge as the lone undefeated team in the ACC through October 6.

Billy McMullen had 11 catches for 175 yards and a TD for Uva. Backup QB Matt Schaub was 20-for-33 for 271 yards and a TD, but he threw a costly fourth-quarter interception.

After Virginia closed to 24-21 late in the third quarter, Hill capped an 80-yard drive with a five-yard touchdown pass to Jafar Williams with 13:26 left. Maryland's Tony Okanlawon then returned an interception 34 yards to the Virginia 28, setting up a six-yard touchdown run by Perry.

That assured Maryland its first win over Virginia since 1991 and its first 5-0 start since 1978. Hill went 22-for-35 for 237 yards and ran for a score. Perry had a career-high eight catches for 51 yards.

The Terrapins scored two touchdowns in a 73-second span to go up by 17 points at halftime. After Hill threw a 53-yard touchdown pass to Gary, Maryland's Curtis Williams blocked a punt and Leroy Ambush recovered the ball in the end zone.

Held to four yards on five carries over the first 15 minutes, Perry took a pitch and ran 45 yards on the first play of the second quarter to set up a four-yard touchdown run by Hill.

Nick Novak kicked a 26-yard field goal in overtime and Maryland (No. 22 AP/No. 20 ESPN/USA Today) remained unbeaten when Joe Burns fumbled for 15th-ranked Georgia Tech, giving Friedgen a 20-17 victory over his former school. Novak, a redshirt freshman, forced the extra session with a career-long 46-yard field goal on the final play of regulation and the Terps' win was their first over a ranked opponent since 1990, a span of 33 games.

Tech won the coin toss and put Maryland on offense first. The Terps picked up a first down before settling for Novak's short field goal. The ball then went to the Yellow Jackets and on 2nd-and-7, Burns took a handoff on a simple run up the middle but appeared to hit one of his own linemen as he tried to cut. The ball popped loose, safety Randall Jones fell on it for the Terrapins and the game ended, Maryland victorious.

The drive to tie the game in the fourth started when the Terps got the ball at their own 20 and drove to the Tech 46, where Shaun Hill hooked up with freshman Rich Parson on a 17-yard completion on 3rd down. Maryland then spiked the ball and Novak booted the long field goal as time ran out.

Maryland's first score came early when Burns fumbled while taking a handoff from Godsey and E.J. Henderson scooped it up at the 36 and ran the other way for a TD less than three minutes into the game.

The Terrapins made it 14-0 in the second after another Jack-ets turnover launched an eight-play, 68-yard drive that ended with Jafar Williams scoring on an 11-yard reverse.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Unbeaten Maryland has opened 2001 with a seven-game winning streak and the confidence generated by a 59-17 rout of Duke.

With scouts from the Sugar Bowl in attendance, the Terrapins made 34 first downs, amassed 697 yards in total offense and punted only once — on the final play of the game.

Shaun Hill passed for 323 yards, ran for 105 and led the Terrapins to touchdowns on their first six possessions as Maryland built a 42-10 halftime lead.

The 59 points are Maryland's second-most in an ACC game behind only a 62-point effort against Virginia in 1975. Five different players scored TDs, led by Hill, who ran for two and threw for another. Hill completed 26 of 32 passes before being pulled late in the third quarter with Maryland up 52-10.

The Terrapins' 7-0 start is the team's best since 1978, and the seven wins its most since 1985, the last time the Terps won an ACC title.

Duke committed three turnovers in the first half, each of which was converted by Maryland into a touchdown. After Duke went three-and-out on its first series, the Terps moved 58 yards on five runs to take a 7-0 lead. Rich Parson had a 31-yard run, Bruce Perry ran three times for 25 yards, and Hill capped the drive with a two-yard run over left tackle.

Hill ran the same play on Maryland's second possession, this time running for 57 yards to the Duke 22. Three plays later, Perry scored from the 12. Tony Jackson then intercepted Bryant's pass, setting up a 14-yard touchdown run by James Lynch for a 21-0 lead.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Chris Rix came back from an early injury and threw five touchdown passes to lead Florida State (No. 19 ESPN/USA Today, No. 18 AP) to a 52-31 victory that ended Maryland's perfect season and put the Seminoles right back in the middle of the ACC title hunt.

Rix threw two TD passes to Talman Gardner late in the second quarter to help the Seminoles claim a 21-17 halftime lead and then threw three more TD passes in the fourth quarter.

Maryland tied it at 31 with 1:53 left in the third quarter on quarterback Shaun Hill's one-yard sneak, but the Terps fell apart in the game's final quarter.

Rix teamed with Gardner, who finished with six catches for 140 yards and three scores, Javon Walker and Atreus Bell for the decisive fourth-quarter touchdowns. Florida State scored its points in bunches, getting 21 second-quarter points in less than three minutes and putting up 21 more in just over 5 minutes in the final period.

Maryland, plagued later in the game with four turnovers, took its early lead on a 65-yard touchdown run by 261-pound fullback James Lynch and a one-yard run by Marc Riley.

But then Rix started throwing darts to his wideouts, combining twice for touchdowns with Gardner on plays covering 16 and 9 yards around Michael Boulware's 23-yard interception return that catapulted the Seminoles into a 21-14 advantage in a span of just 2 minutes and 57 seconds.

Maryland's Bruce Perry, the ACC's leading rusher, picked up 67 yards and went over 1,000 (1,016) on the season.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Shaun Hill threw for 228 yards and two TDs as Maryland cruised to a 47-14 victory over Troy State.

The victory was a complete one. The Terps (8-1) scored on six of eight possessions in building a 34-0 halftime lead. Maryland's defense limited Troy State to two first downs and 26 yards in the decisive first half.

TSU came into the game with a three-game win streak that included a 21-9 upset of Mississippi State, but it was no match for Maryland, which last won eight games in 1985.

The Terrapins took a 7-0 lead with less than five minutes elapsed. Marc Riley burst through a hole at right tackle on 3rd-and-1 and ran for a 69-yard TD, his eighth score of the year.

Later in the quarter, Scooter Monroe made an over-the-shoulder catch of a perfectly thrown Hill spiral for a 42-yard gain, setting up the first of Nick Novak's four field goals.

The Trojans got their initial first down on the ensuing possession, but E.J. Henderson subsequently blocked a punt to give the Terrapins the ball at the Troy State 30. Six plays later, Bruce Perry took a screen pass 17 yards to make it 17-0.

After a Trojan punt, Perry capped a 46-yard drive with a 10-yard run, putting Maryland up 24-0. It was Perry's 11th touchdown, tied for eighth on the school's single-season list.

Minutes later, Hill ended a 65-yard drive with a 15-yard TD pass to Daryl Whitmer. Troy State then punted again, leaving enough time for Novak to kick a 50-yard field goal on the final play of the half.

It was 44-0 in the third quarter before Demontray Carter returned a kickoff 79 yards, which led to 17-yard touchdown pass from Brock Nutter to Heyward Skipper. By that time, Maryland was already looking forward to Clemson.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Maryland's rare victory over Clemson was followed by an even more unusual occurrence: the goal posts being torn down at Byrd Stadium.

Shaun Hill passed for 189 yards and two TDs as Maryland ended an eight-game skid against Clemson and gained sole possession of first place in the ACC with a 37-20 victory.

Adding another highlight to a remarkable turnaround season, the Terrapins (9-1, 6-1) thrilled their first sellout crowd since 1995 by taking a 17-6 halftime lead and cruising behind a defense that had four second-half interceptions.

Maryland led 34-6 in the fourth quarter before Clemson managed to make the final score appear deceptively close. When the game ended, thousands stormed the field to celebrate.

Playing with the same confidence and poise they've showed all season, the Terps scored on their first possession and never let up in delighting their largest home crowd (52,462) since 1983. Maryland finished 7-0 at home, a school record, and set the school record for points (367) in a season.

After throwing for 177 yards in the decisive first half, Hill did most of his work on the ground after halftime, finishing with 54 yards on 12 carries.

Clemson quarterback Woody Dantzler left early in the fourth after going 11-for-22 for 153 yards and a career-high three interceptions. He had only 30 yards rushing, 62 below his average.

Wasting no time in proving that big-game jitters would not be a factor, the Terps moved 80 yards after the opening kickoff. Hill completed two third-down passes and Clemson was called for two penalties before Riley bulled in from the one.

RALEIGH, N.C. - The play that clinched Maryland's first outright ACC championship in 16 years hadn't been used since fall camp. That's the same time first-year coach Ralph Friedgen began building a winning attitude among a group of players who refused to quit again after NC State.

The Fridge and his Terps rallied late to slam the door on FSU's nine-year run as ACC champions, becoming one of the more unlikely champs in ACC lore with a 23-19 win over NC State.

Shaun Hill's eight-yard scoring pass to Guilian Gary with 41 seconds left capped a dream regular season for Friedgen and Maryland's long-suffering fans.

NC State (6-4, 4-4) saw its three-game winning streak come to a close in dramatic fashion on its home turf. The Wolfpack beat Florida State the week before and were gunning for consecutive wins over top 10 teams for the first time in school history.

Friedgen pumped his fist in the air as the clock hit zero, becoming the first coach to win the ACC crown in his initial season in the league, going 7-1. He also led the Terrapins to their first 10-win season since 1976 and fifth in school history.

NC State took a 19-16 lead with 3:59 left as Philip Rivers completed 8 of 9 passes on an 80-yard drive. Meanwhile, Maryland looked like it lost a chance to win the ACC title outright when NC State's Lamont Reid ran down Rich Parson from behind on a long pass play, forcing a fumble at the Wolfpack 1 with 2:51 left.

After the turnover, the Terrapins held, and got the ball back with 2:18 remaining.

Hill completed a 4th-and-5 play early in the drive to keep the 61-yard march alive. He then completed two more passes before the game-winner to Gary in the front right of the end zone.

Maryland took its first lead with 8:51 left in the third when Hill led the Terps on a 15-play drive, capped by a five-yard pass to Gary. Adam Kiker's fourth field goal five minutes later gave the Wolfpack the lead again in the tight defensive struggle and set up the final drama over the last three minutes.

MIAMI - Banished to the bench for the first 24 minutes of the Orange Bowl, Rex Grossman led Florida to touchdowns on his first six drives and the No. 5 Gators set record after record in a 56-23 defeat of No. 6 Maryland.

Grossman threw for 248 yards and four touchdowns. Another so-called backup, third receiver Taylor Jacobs, caught 10 passes for 170 yards, both Orange Bowl records.

The Gators showed they might, indeed, have the most talent in the nation, even though they wouldn't for the national title in the Rose Bowl.

Jacobs also caught two touchdown passes - one from Berlin, one from Grossman - as the Gators (10-2) rolled to a rout, hardly distracted by Spurrier's decision to bench Grossman. Berlin played about the way an untested sophomore would be expected to. His six drives to open the game produced two touchdowns and two interceptions, a bunch of nice passes and a handful of dreadful ones, a slim 14-10 lead despite a prolific 224 yards in total offense.

While Berlin played, Grossman stood on the sideline with his helmet on, ready to go. But indeed, his time came, and his first six drives were much more impressive than Berlin's. The Heisman Trophy runner-up entered to big cheers with 6:03 left in the second quarter and showed exactly how he earned the starting position and kept it through all 11 regular-season games.

Gaffney finished with seven catches for 118 yards, but Jacobs was the best receiver on this night, and he was selected the game's MVP.

The teams combined for 79 points, breaking the combined record of 69 set by Texas and Georgia in 1949. Their 1,019 total yards broke the record of 903 set by Florida State and Notre Dame in 1996.
