# **Pre-Spring Notes**

### TERPS OPEN SPRING PRACTICE...

- Maryland opens spring football practice Tuesday when the Terps hold their first of 15 workouts over the course of the next five weeks. The Terps will practice three times per week (Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday), concluding spring ball with the annual Red-White Game on Saturday, April 30. The spring game will kick off at 3:30 p.m. at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium. The game is the culmination of Maryland Day, a university-sponsored family celebration.
- Maryland, under first-year head coach **Randy Edsall**, returns 46 letterwinners, including 14 offensive and defensive starters, from last season's 9-4 squad that won the Military Bowl.
- Quarterback **Danny O'Brien**, the 2010 ACC Freshman of the Year, and four offensive linemen headline the seven starters back on offense. O'Brien posted the sixth-highest passing yardage total (2,438) for a freshman in ACC history last season. **Davin Meggett** and **D.J. Adams** also form a formidable backfield tandem. Meggett posted a team-high 720 rushing yards in 2010, while Adams posted a freshman school-record 11 rushing TDs. The Terps will have to replace their top two receivers in first team All-ACC pick Torrey Smith and Adrian Cannon.
- Kenny Tate, Joe Vellano and Demetrius Hartsfield highlight the seven starters back on defense. Tate (100), a 2010 first team All-ACC pick, and Hartsfield (88) are the top two tacklers back for the Terrapins. Vellano was also an all-league pick a year ago, earning second-team honors after posting a team-best 5.0 sacks. The Terps also welcome back their top two cornerbacks in seniors Cameron Chism, a two-year starter, and Trenton Hughes. Chism had 70 tackles and eight pass breakups last season, while Hughes had a team-high nine PBUs.

be available prior to practice on March 29, April 14 and April 28. Edsall and the players will also be available after the Red-White Spring game. Assistant coaches will not be available during spring practice.

### **QUICK HITTERS...**

- The Terrapins return more than 75 percent of the offensive and defensive two-deep from the end of last season. There are 17 of the 22 offensive players back and 17 of 22 defenders. However, on special teams Maryland will need to replace Travis Baltz, who served as the punter and place-kicker last season, and Torrey Smith, one of the top kick returners in the nation during his three-year career.
- Despite having 46 letterwinners on the roster, the opening spring two-deep features just 11 seniors on offense (6) and defense (5).
- The Terps welcome three scholarship newcomers to the roster this spring. Joining the team are WR Tyrek Cheeseboro, OL Nate Clarke and WR Nigel King. Cheeseboro and Clarke signed last season, but attended prep school in the fall. King concluded his prep work in the fall.
- Eight bowl teams from last year appear on the Terps' 2011 schedule: Miami (Hyundai Sun Bowl), West Virginia (Champs Sports Bowl), Georgia Tech (AdvoCare V100 Independence Bowl), Clemson (Meineke Car Care Bowl), Boston College (Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl), Miami (Champs Sports Bowl), Florida State (Chick-fil-A) and NC State (Champs Sports Bowl).

### **BACK UNDER CENTER...**

The Terps are fortunate to have one of the top young quarterbacks in the nation. Danny O'Brien, the 2010 ACC Freshman of the Year, showed poise and accuracy in the pocket in 2010 and was a key to the Terps' nine-win campaign. O'Brien started the last 10 games of the season and posted a 7-3 record. Despite not starting the first three games, his 22 TD passes were third in the country among freshmen and second in school history. On the season, O'Brien had an efficiency rating of 134.5, a mark that was fourth-best in the ACC, fifth among freshmen FBS QBs and tops in the league among returning signal-callers. The freshman All-American did a good job spreading the ball around, hitting nine receivers in one start, eight different receivers in six starts, seven receivers in one start and six in two starts.

## **LOOKING FOR PLAYMAKERS...**

The Terps, who ended 2010 ranked 29th in the FBS in scoring offense (32.2 points per game) will need to replace two of their home-run threats in WR Torrey Smith and RB Da'Rel Scott. Smith, a two-time All-ACC player, posted a school record 12 touchdown receptions last season and scored three times on kickoff returns in his career. Scott was one of the top breakaway threats in the ACC during his four-year career. He was one of only four players in school history to post more than 2,000 rushing yards and 500 receiving. Scott was an all-league choice in 2008.

- Senior Quintin McCree and junior Kevin Dorsey are the top returning receivers in terms of catches. McCree had 16 receptions in 2010 and Dorsey posted 15. Surprising, TE Matt Furstenburg recorded a team-best 17.2 yards per reception. The junior had 206 receiving yards and is one seven returning players who caught a TD pass last season.
- A number of other receivers will be vying for time including seniors Ronnie Tyler and Tony Logan, junior Kerry Boykins, and freshman Adrian Coxson. Tyler and Boykins spent time at slot receiver last season and combined for 23 receptions. Logan has spent most of his career as a punt returner, but has the shiftiness to be effective at receiver. Coxson impressed on the scout team last season after transferring from Florida in the summer. Others expected to get a look are freshmen Devin Burns, Nigel King and Tyrek Cheeseboro. Burns moved from quarterback to receiver in the off-season.
- Despite not starting a game last season, senior Davin Meggett led the team in rushing. He posted a career-high 720 rushing yards and showed a quicker burst than he had his first two years. Meggett had eight offensive plays (six rushes/two receptions) of 20 or more yards, which was second on the team behind Smith's 15. Sophomore D.J. Adams was the short-yardage specialist last season. He only averaged 3.6 yards per carry but posted a freshman school-record 11 rushing TDs. That mark was tied for second in the ACC last season. Gary Douglas also hopes to get in the mix at tailback. The junior, who is one of the team's shiftier backs, played in just two games last season due mostly to injuries.

### **MORE EXPERIENCED O-LINE...**

After suffering through injuries on the offensive line the last two seasons, the Terps appear to have a stable unit. Maryland has four starters back from last season - Andrew Gonnella, Bennett Fulper, Justin Lewis and R.J. Dill - and three other players who have started games - Justin Gilbert, Pete White and Pete DeSouza. Gilbert was the starter at left tackle last season before suffering a knee injury, and is atop the depth chart this spring. Max Garcia is a highly regarded tackle prospect. Others hoping to figure into the mix include De'Onte Arnett, Sal Conaboy, Josh Cary and Nick Klemm.

QB Danny O'Brien So.-1V 6-3, 215

 One of the top young QBs in the nation ... 2010 ACC Freshman of the Year and freshman All-American ... 22 TD passes rank No. 2 on single-season school list.

RB Taylor Watson Sr.-3V 6-2, 240

 Has played in 28 career games ... after a 2010 preseason injury, played in the final 11 games, including three starts at fullback.

WR Torrey Smith 3V 6-1, 200

 A two-time All-ACC choice ... ended his career No. 7 on the ACC's all-purpose yardage chart (5,264) ... third on the Terps' career receptions list (152) and second in receiving yards (2,215)

 Had 23 career starts at wide receiver ... second on the team in receptions in 2010 (36) ... ended his career ranked 17th in school history with 86 receptions.

OL Paul Pinegar 4V 6-4, 290

 A 2010 honorable mention All-ACC choice ... played in 36 career games, starting 25 contests at four of the five positions (all but right guard).

RB Da'Rel Scott 4V 5-11, 200

 A 2008 first-team All-ACC choice ... ended his career seventh on the Maryland career rushing chart (2,401) ... one of four players in school history to post 2,000 career rushing yards and 500 receiving yards.

#### LB Demetrius Hartsfield So.-1V 6-2, 235

 A two-year starter at Will LB ... ranked third on the team in tackles (88) and fourth in TFL (6.5) last season ... a 2009 freshman All-ACC choice.

#### DB Cameron Chism

Sr.-3V 5-10, 190

A two-year starter at cornerback ... has played in all 25 games the last two seasons ... tied for second on the team in PBUs (eight) last season ... had a team-best four INTs in 2009.

#### DB Trenton Hughes

Sr.-3V 5-10, 190

• Started all 13 games at cornerback last season ... led the team in pass breakups (nine).

#### SS Antwine Perez

6-1, 210

 Played in all 38 games during his three seasons after transferring from USC ... tied for sixth in the ACC and tied for 64th nationally in passes defended (0.85 pg) in 2010.

### **HOLES TO FILL...**

One of the strongest units on the defense the last two seasons was linebacker. But with three-year starter and three-time all-league performer Alex Wujciak gone, along with two-year starter and playmaker Adrian Moten, the Terps have holes to fill. Junior Demetrius Hartsfield has the most experience at the position having started two years at Will. Hartsfield, who has 152 career tackles (second on the team), will move inside to the Mike position with Darin Drakeford, the top LB reserve last season, switching from Sam to Will. Junior Ryan Donohue (Mike) and redshirt freshman Lorne Goree (Will) are among those expected to contribute in reserve roles. Senior Kenny Tate, a 2010 first team All-ACC pick, has moved from safety to the Star position, along with Mario Rowson and Desmond Kearse. Tate, who played at all three levels of the defense in 2010, ranked seventh in the ACC in tackles (7.7 per game), which was second among defensive backs. He also led the conference and tied for 15th in the FBS in forced fumbles (0.31 per game).

#### **SECONDARY ROLES...**

With Kenny Tate's move to linebacker, Maryland has two returning starters in the secondary in senior cornerbacks Cameron Chism and Trenton Hughes. Chism, a two-year starter, has 144 career tackles (third on the team), while Hughes had a team-high nine PBUs in 2010. Dexter McDougle served as the No. 3 cornerback last season and is listed as the backup to Hughes. Junior Eric Franklin and sophomore Matt Robinson enter the spring atop the depth chart at safety and while neither has been a full-time starter, both played extensively last season. Franklin played in 11 games, posting 23 tackles and three interceptions (tied for second on the team). Robinson, meanwhile, played in all 13 games and posted 29 tackles and forced a pair of fumbles (tied for second on the team). Austin Walker, a three-year letterwinner, is a veteran reserve safety. Redshirt freshman Titus Till, a highly regarded prospect, is also one of the reserves at safety.

#### ON THE D-LINE...

The Terps need to replace just one starter along the defensive line in Drew Gloster. They have seven players back, including three starters, who saw extensive action in 2010. All-ACC pick Joe Vellano and A.J. Francis should man the interior, along with Maurice Hampton and Justin Anderson, who played the anchor (strongside) in 2010. Vellano posted a teamhigh five sacks last year. Isaiah Ross and Bradley Johnson each saw time at defensive end. New to the position is sophomore David Mackall, a gifted defender, who moves from Mike LB. Mackall had three sacks last year in passing situations which ranked third on the team. Redshirt freshmen Clarence Murphy, lan Evans and Andre Monroe will also battle for time.



- 1...Andrew Gonnella is the only senior offensive lineman on the Maryland roster.

- 3...Number of full-time punters (Brooks Barnard, Adam Podlesh and Travis Baltz) the Terps have employed in the last 10 years. Baltz started the last four seasons.
- 4...The Terps scored four times on defense in 2010 which was tied for sixth in the FBS.
- 4...Maryland tied for fourth nationally in turnover margin (+1.15 pg) last season. The Terps, plus-15 on the year, won the turnover battle in 10 of 13 games.
- 7... The Terps have seven of their top 10 tacklers back from last season.
- 20...Number of points the opposition scored off 14 Maryland turnovers last season. In contrast, the Terps scored 100 points off 29 opponent turnovers.
- 23...Cameron Chism's 23 consecutive starts are tops on the team.
- 137...The Terps have not had a punt blocked since Nov. 13, 1999 (Florida State), a stretch of 137 games, which is the longest active streak in the nation.

## Sept. 6, 2010 Maryland 17, Navy 14

BALTIMORE - Navy dominated the time of possession, outgained Maryland by nearly 200 yards and made 15 more first downs

None of this lessened the enjoyment the Terrapins derived from their 17-14 victory.

Kenny Tate stopped Ricky Dobbs at the goal line with 34 seconds left, and Maryland stunned their in-state rivals to break a seven-game losing streak that began last October.

The Midshipmen (0-1) held the ball for nearly 19 minutes longer than Maryland (1-0), amassed 485 yards and collected 26 first downs. But in a game influenced by untimely turnovers and huge penalties, the outcome was decided by a gritty goalline stand

Trailing 17-14 with a fourth down at the 1, Navy decided to go for the win. Dobbs took the snap, went to his left and was met by Tate, who would not relent to the momentum Dobbs brought to the line

Maryland raced to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter and then held on behind a defense that repeatedly excelled after Navy got inside the 20.

The Midshipmen had a 7 1/2-minute edge in time of possession in the first half, yet trailed 14-7 after coming up empty on drives of 52, 63 and 66 yards.

In the second half, Dobbs lost a fumble at the Maryland 1 and was stuffed by Tate on the game's pivotal play. Dobbs ran for 63 yards and a touchdown, but the senior quarterback fumbled three times -- losing two of them at the Maryland 1.

Navy didn't punt until early in the fourth quarter, and the short kick was returned 57 yards by Tony Logan to the Navy 16.

Maryland promptly fumbled the ball away on a missed exchange.

The Midshipmen pulled even at 14 with 1:52 left in the third quarter when Dobbs scored from the 1 on a drive that began with wide receiver Greg Jones running 53 yards on a reverse.

A crowd of 69,348 showed up for the second meeting between the teams since 1965.

## Maryland 62, Morgan State 3

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - With Maryland coming off an emotional win and playing with only four days rest, coach Ralph Friedgen was worried about how the Terrapins would fare against in-state foe Morgan State. He got the answer rather

Maryland scored on its first three possessions Saturday night, and the Terrapins enjoyed their highest-scoring performance in 35 years with a 62-3 rout

Despite the quick turnaround following Monday's win over Navy, the Terrapins reached the 62-point mark for the first time since a 62-24 blowout against Virginia on Nov. 22, 1975. It was also Maryland's largest victory margin since a 61-0 win over the Citadel on Sept. 13, 2003.

Maryland has already matched its victory total from last season and owns its first winning streak since 2008.

Morgan State (1-1) gained only six yards in the first half and finished with 85 - the fewest allowed by Maryland since Friedgen arrived in 2001.

Morgan State's lone score came on a 39-yard field goal by Kemar Scarlett in the third quarter.

Maryland backup quarterback Danny O'Brien entered for starter Jamarr Robinson in the second guarter with the score 24-0. On his third play, O'Brien unleashed his first career throw: a 27-yard touchdown pass to wide-open tight end Matt Furstenburg.

A 37-yard punt return by Tony Logan led to a 24-yard TD pass from O'Brien to Torrey Smith, and O'Brien closed out Maryland's prolific first half by connecting with running back Da'Rel Scott on a 22-yard score.

Robinson also had his first game with multiple touchdown passes, connecting with Smith on a 5-yarder and Adrian Cannon for 19 yards to end Maryland's first two possessions.

Late in the first quarter, a 6-yard punt by the Bears set up a 47-yard field goal by Travis Baltz for a 17-0 lead.

With the Bears backed up on their own 11, Maryland's Demetrius Hartsfield intercepted a Dickerson pass at the 14 and coasted into the end zone for a 24-0 lead.

## No. 21 West Virginia 31, Maryland 17

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. - Jamarr Robinson had third-quarter touchdown passes of 60 and 80 yards to Torrey Smith, but a fast start lifted No. 21 West Virginia past Maryland, 31-17, on Saturday.

Geno Smith threw a career-high four touchdown passes for the Mountaineers, while Noel Devine rushed for a season-high 131 yards.

Smith, a sophomore making his third career start, had two scoring tosses apiece to sophomore Tavon Austin and redshirt freshman Stedman Bailey as West Virginia (3-0) jumped ahead 28-0 early in the third quarter.

Except for Geno Smith's 5-yard scoring toss to Bailey to start the third quarter, West Virginia struggled on offense after halftime as it tried to eat up clock time. Smith finished 19 of 29

Torrey Smith caught three passes for 149 yards. His TD catches cut Maryland's deficit to 28-14. Terps added a 35-vard field goal from Travis Baltz in the fourth guarter.

West Virginia then put the game out of reach behind fullback Ryan Clarke, who carried eight straight times on the ensuing 16-play drive that ate up nearly nine minutes of clock and ended with Tyler Bitancurt's 23-yard field goal with three minutes left for the final margin.

Maryland was trying for a 3-0 start for the first time since coach Ralph Friedgen's first season in 2001.

Austin had a big day against the Terrapins with seven catches for 106 yards to add to his team-leading totals. Early in the game, he caught a 15-yard pass, threw a key block that sprang Devine on a 50-yard run, then caught a 6-yard scoring pass from Smith on a crossing route.

After West Virginia got the ball back near midfield, Geno Smith avoided the blitz and hit Sanders on a 32-yard pass play to set up Smith's 5-yard TD toss to a wide-open Austin for a 14-0

Bailey took over from there, stretching high to snare a 26-yard scoring pass in the back of the end zone early in the second

Maryland entered the game averaging 241 yards rushing but was held to minus-10. Bruce Irvin had three of West Virginia's eight sacks.

O'Brien completed 18 of 27 passes despite being bothered by a high ankle sprain for two weeks. His backup was Logan, a wide receiver, because junior Jamarr Robinson couldn't even lift his arm before the game.

O'Brien brought the Terps back from an early 7-0 deficit and directed two long scoring drives after FIU pulled into a tie at 21.

Da'Rel Scott ran for 103 yards and two touchdowns for the Terrapins (3-1), who have already exceeded their win total of last year. Torrey Smith had eight catches for 159 yards and a score

Wes Carroll went 35 for 58 for 355 yards for FIU (0-3). He threw two TD passes but was intercepted twice.

FIU amassed 472 yards on a whopping 98 snaps, but the Terrapins made the big plays when it counted most.

After the Panthers got within a touchdown with 4:16 left, Maryland's Davin Meggett ran for a 76-yard touchdown on the next play from scrimmage to clinch the victory.

Down 21-14 at halftime, FIU got a 5-yard touchdown pass from Carroll to Jonathan Faucher with 5:34 left in the third

After the kickoff, a pass interference call wiped out a thirddown incompletion. On the next play, O'Brien lofted a 68-yard touchdown pass to Smith to put the Terrapins on top to stay.

A 9-yard run by Scott made it 35-21, and FIU subsequently missed two chances to get within a touchdown after getting inside the Maryland 11.

## Maryland 21, Duke 16

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Maryland was in desperate need of a big play when Tony Logan wrapped his arms around a punt at his own 16-yard line

Eight-four yards later, the Terrapins had their first lead against Duke.

Logan's electrifying punt return in the third quarter provided Maryland with the push it needed, and the Terrapins opened the ACC portion of their schedule with a 21-16 victory.

Maryland (4-1, 1-0) trailed 9-0 midway in the second quarter and 9-7 at halftime before coming back. Logan's touchdown made it 14-9, and the Terps held on.

Logan sidestepped a potential tackler immediately after catching the punt. He then headed upfield, juked to his left and then cut right at his own 25 before sprinting down the sideline to the end zone. It was Logan's second punt return for a score in two weeks

Duke (1-4, 0-2) lost for the fourth-straight time. Sophomore Sean Renfree completed 28 of 56 passes for 351 yards and a touchdown, but he was intercepted twice.

Donovan Varner had eight catches for 128 yards, and Conner Vernon gained 99 yards on six receptions.

A 2-yard touchdown pass from Renfree to Brandon King made it 21-16 with 7:20 to go, and after a Maryland punt the Blue Devils moved from their own 19 to the Maryland 39 with two minutes left. Facing a fourth-and-15, Renfree threw a pass to Austin Kelly that was tipped away.

Duke has been tormented this season by too many turnovers and the Terrapins got their first touchdown late in the first half following an interception, and in the second half Logan and Scott scored on long plays.

But the Duke defense - which was allowing 44.5 points per game - made it tough on O'Brien, who was playing in place of injured starter Jamarr Robinson for a second straight week. O'Brien went 9 for 26 for 170 yards, including his TD pass to

Davin Meggett capped off an eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 3-yard TD plunge which cut Duke's lead to 9-7 with under two minutes left in the first half.

Will Snyderwine kicked three first-half field goals when the Maryland defense stiffened in the red zone three times.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. -- D.J. Adams ran for three touchdowns and Danny O'Brien ran for one and threw for two, leading Maryland to a 42-23 victory against Virginia.

The Terrapins (7-3, 4-2 ACC) remained in control of their chance to play in their first ACC championship game. Maryland will gain the Atlantic Division's berth if they win their final regular season games, both at home, against Florida State and North Carolina State.

Virginia (4-6, 1-5) saw its three-game winning streak in the series end on Senior Day, and lost to its northern border rival for only the fifth time in the last 19 meetings.

Adams scored his third touchdown on a 2-yard run just 35 seconds into the fourth quarter, capping a drive kept alive by a pass that went through the hands of Virginia linebacker Darnell Carter and into the arms of LaQuan Williams for a 26-yard gain on third-and-14.

After Virginia backed up inside its own 5 yard-line and punted, with the Terps taking over at the Cavaliers' 42, O'Brien drove them for the clinching score in eight plays. His 2-yard toss to Da'Rel Scott pushed the lead to 35-23, and the outcome was determined.

Two interceptions of Virginia's Marc Verica followed on the Cavaliers' ensuing possessions, and O'Brien hit Torrey Smith with a 12-yard TD pass with 2:35 remaining.

The Terps freshman finished 17 for 28 for 289 yards, and Smith caught seven for 157 yards. Verica was mistake-free before the final quarter, and was 25 for 43 for 265 yards.

The Terps led 21-20 at halftime, and all three scoring drives included a long pass.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -- Christian Ponder threw for 170 yards and a touchdown, and Florida State beat Maryland 30-16 to remain in the hunt to play in the ACC title game.

The Terrapins (7-4, 4-3) were eliminated from contention. Maryland, which became the last ACC team to lose at home this season, needed to beat the Seminoles and Wolfpack to win the division crown for the first time.

Down 23-16, Maryland drove to the Florida State 19 in the final minute before Nick Moody intercepted a fourth-down pass by redshirt freshman Danny O'Brien and took it 90 yards for the clinching score with 36 seconds left.

The Seminoles took advantage of four Maryland turnovers including two interceptions and a fumble in the fourth quarter after FSU took a 20-16 lead. The Terrapins came in with an ACC-low eight turnovers in 10 games.

Neither team led by more than seven points until the closing seconds and the lead changed hands three times.

Chris Thompson ran for 95 yards, including a 70-yard touchdown, Ponder completed 16 of 26 passes and Bert Reed had six catches for 93 yards and a touchdown for the Seminoles.

Da'Rel Scott gained 84 yards rushing for the Terrapins and Davin Meggett ran for 72 yards. O'Brien went 25 for 45 for 269 yards and a touchdown.

Maryland took a 16-13 lead in the third quarter on a 32-yard field goal by Travis Baltz after Thompson lost a fumble at the

Florida State answered with a 44-yard touchdown pass from Ponder to Reed, who caught a short throw over the middle and weaved his way into the end zone.

Greg Reid then intercepted a pass by O'Brien at the Maryland 43. The Seminoles punted, but the kick hit Maryland's Cameron Chism and was recovered by FSU. That led by a field goal by Dustin Hopkins for a 23-16 lead with 4:37 left.

The Terrapins wore black helmets for the first time this season, along with black jerseys and pants with camouflage trim to support the Wounded Warrior Project. Maryland fans were also dressed in black

Needing a victory to win the league's Atlantic Division, the Wolfpack (8-4, 5-3) scored touchdowns on their first two possessions to take a 14-0 lead. But the Terrapins (8-4, 5-3) rallied behind O'Brien, who made up for a running game that finished with negative vardage.

North Carolina State ended up in a second-place tie with Maryland behind Florida State, which will face Virginia Tech in the championship game on Dec. 5.

O'Brien, a redshirt freshman, completed 33 of 47 passes in the first 400-yard game by a Terp quarterback since Scott Milanovich in 1993

Smith had a career-high 14 catches for 224 yards and became the first Maryland player with four touchdown receptions in a single game.

Smith scored on passes of 11, 10, 12 and 71 yards. The last touchdown came with 6:26 left immediately after Maryland's Drew Gloster sacked Russell Wilson on a fourth-down play from the Maryland 8 with the Terrapins ahead 31-17.

Wilson scored on a 1-yard run with 2:39 remaining. The Wolfpack recovered the onside kick and Wilson threw a TD pass with 1:16 left, but Maryland pounced on the ensuing onside kick.

Travis Baltz had the wind behind him when he kicked a career-long 52-yard field goal to put the Terrapins up 17-14 at

WASHINGTON - The Maryland Terrapins forced four turnovers and Da'Rel Scott ran for 200 yards with a 51-20 victory over East Carolina in the Military Bowl.

Scott had second-half touchdown runs of 61 and 91 yards on back-to-back offensive plays and posted the school's first 200-yard rushing game since 2003. D.J. Adams had four short touchdown runs for the Terrapins, who finished 9-4.

Dominique Davis completed 33 of 54 passes for 255 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions for East Carolina (6-7), which scored a season-low in points and committed 15 penalties.

The first half included 12 penalties, four turnovers, a blocked extra point and a missed 25-yard field goal. The Terrapins scored on a 45-yard touchdown pass from ACC rookie of the year Danny O'Brien to Kevin Dorsey, a 1-yard run by Adams and a 23-yard field goal by Travis Baltz.

East Carolina didn't score until Mike Barbour's 37-yard field goal with 6:08 left in the half - the longest the Pirates had gone into a game without scoring this season.

The Terrapins began scoring at will in the second half. They added to a 16-3 halftime lead when David Mackall returned a tipped interception 35 yards to East Carolina's 1, setting up Adams' second touchdown.

Dwayne Harris' 36-yard punt return led to East Carolina's first touchdown, a 20-yard pass to Lance Lewis that made the score 23-10, but the Terrapins responded with a 69-yard drive capped by another touchdown from Adams.

Scott ran up the middle untouched for a 61-yard score on the first play of a drive late in the third quarter, and did virtually the same from 91 yards on the first play of the next drive early in the fourth.
