#### INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Guided the Under-20 Israeli National Team to the 2005 Division B European Championship title in Brno, Czech Republic, the first-ever international tournament title for an Israeli women's team ... averaged a tournament-best 24.7 points per game, in leading Israel to a perfect 6-0 mark and Most Valuable Player honors ... participated in the 2005 Maccabi Games in Israel, where she led the USA to a 5-0 record and a gold medal ... selected Maccabi MVP, her second tournament honor of the summer ... went on to be named Athlete of the Month in July of 2005 by Israel's Safsal Newspaper ... played for Israel's national team during the summer of 2003 ... first Israeli to be named MVP of the European National Tournament and was also the MVP of the qualifying round played in Turkey ... top scorer in the semifinal round of the European Championships played in Greece ... drew a record six charges against the Croatian National Team.









#### 2005-06

Second player in school history to earn All-ACC honors three times, earning a spot on the second team ... 21st player in school history to score 1,000-career points, reaching the milestone against Xavier in the second game of the season, her 64th-career game, the school record until teammate Crystal Langhorne broke the mark later in the season ... became the school's all-time free throw record holder against St. John's, ending the season with 416 ... one of three players in school history to have two 500-point seasons ... a preseason Wooden Award and Wade Trophy candidate national player of the year candidate ... preseason All-ACC ... opened the season with back-to-back 23-point games and was tabbed ACC Player of the Week ... made a dramatic improvement from the three-point line, knocking down 38.4 percent of her attempts, up nearly 100 percentage points from the previous season ... went 17-for-29 (.586) from the floor in the first two games. also shooting 5-for-9 from three-point range with 11 rebounds ... reached double figures in 13-consecutive games from Nov. 25-Jan. 5 ... 16 points and six rebounds vs. then-No. 9/9 Michigan State at the Paradise Jam ... returned home to score 20 points on 6-for-10 shooting (2-for-3 from three), handing out five assists against Appalachian State ... recorded first-career double-double, posting 17 points and a then-career high 10 assists at Monmouth, playing the point guard position for most of the game in the absence of Kristi Toliver, who was out with injury ... went on to take over the point guard duties for most of the next six games while Toliver sat out ...... followed up with another double-double against Arizona, scoring 12 points and dishing out a career-high 13 assists ... scored 26 points in both games of the Terrapin Classic, going 17-for-25 (.680) and 8-of-11 (.727) on threes, en route to tournament Most Valuable Player honors ... hit a clutch three pointer with 57 seconds remaining in overtime, then knocked down a pair of free throws to seal up the team's ACC opener at No. 19/21 Boston College ... finished the game with 13 points and eight rebounds ... career-high nine rebounds at Wake Forest ... 26 and 23 points in back-to-back wins against Miami and Virginia ... 4-for-4 from three-point land against the Hurricanes and 12-for-13 from the charity



First woman from France to win a national championship ... opened the season with (3-for-4) eight points and five rebounds at Siena ... eight rebounds in the convincing win over Gonzaga at the Paradise Jam ... netted a season-high tying eight points against Mount St. Mary's, also grabbing a then-career high nine rebounds ... was a bucket short of her first-career double-double, hauling down a career-best 10 rebounds and scoring eight points vs. Clemson ... played in all three games of the ACC Tournament, contributing three points in the win over Georgia Tech in the quarterfinal round ... made an appearance in the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament at the Bryce Jordan Center, logging her first block of the season vs. Sacred Heart ... grabbed one rebound and dished out an assist in the Sweet 16 win over defending NCAA Champion Baylor ... also saw playing time in the Final Four victory over then-No. 1 North Carolina ... named to the ACC Honor Roll for the third time.
