FRESE ON HARPER:

"Laura brings so much energy to our team and is ready to cap her career with her best season. Her return from a devastating injury three years ago says everything about her passion. I expect her to provide tremendous leadership for our team. She has the heart of a champion and has worked incredibly hard in the offseason."

NOTEWORTHY:

Needs just 115 points to reach 1,000 for her career ... third in the Maryland career records with 150 blocks, 36 from tying the all-time record held by Kris Kirchner ... among the top 15 in the school records in career free throw attempts, while her 54.7 percent shooting ranks in a tie for sixth all-time ... also tied for seventh with a 7.1 rebounds per game career average ... needs just 15 boards and four free throws to enter the top 15 all-time ... enters the season tied for eighth in the ACC records with a 1.9 blocks per game average.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE:

Named to the USA U21 National Team, where she helped the team capture a gold medal at the 2007 FIBA U21 World Championship in Russia ... the U21 team went 8-0 at the tournament, after winning three-straight exhibition games against the U21 French National Team ... member of the 2004 USA Basketball Junior World Championship Qualifying team which went 5-0 and won a gold medal in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, capturing a berth to the 2005 FIBA Junior World Championship ... started all five games of the tournament, averaging 12.8 points and 4.8 rebounds per game, while shooting .632 from the field.

2006-07:

A preseason candidate for the Naismith Award ... was also named to the finalist list for the national player of the year honor ... a *Street & Smith's* Honorable Mention All-American in the preseason and was ranked the No. 2 forward in the nation by ESPN.com ... set or matched career highs in the first game of the BTI Classic against TCU, including points (27), shots made (12), shots attempted (16) and steals (3) ... earned a spot on the Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament team after averaging 16.5 points per game over the two games, while shooting 66.7 percent from the floor ... also had three blocks in the games against Gardner-Webb and Ole Miss in the Bahamas ... had double-doubles at Loyola and at Florida State, scoring 11 and grabbing 12 boards in both contests ... ranked third in blocks per game (1.91), fourth in field goal percentage and 17th in rebounds per game in the ACC ... also ranked in the top 50 in the country in blocks per game ... 65 blocks was the third-highest single-season total in school history and the most by a Terrapin junior all-time.

2005-06:

The season after tearing her Achilles' tendon, went on to be named NCAA Tournament Final Four Most Outstanding Player ... returned to action for the first time since Dec. 20, 2004 to score 11 points on 5-for-6 shooting, while grabbing six rebounds and registering two blocks in the season opener at Siena ... started 17 games, playing in all but two ... had a career-high five blocks against Gonzaga on the first day of the Paradise Jam, also tallying 12 points (5-for-7) and six rebounds ... first double-double of the season came against No. 1 Tennessee in St. Thomas, netting 13 points to go with 12 rebounds, while dishing out a

career-high four assists ... 15 points and eight rebounds in first-career ACC game at then-No. 19/21 Boston College ... 17 points on 8-for-10 shooting, 10 rebounds and three blocks at NC State ... 17 points and six rebounds in the ACC Tournament semifinal victory over then-No. 2/2 Duke, then scored 13 and pulled down eight rebounds in the final vs. then-No. 1/1 North Carolina ... in her first-career NCAA Tournament appearance, posted a double-double with 16 points and 13 rebounds against Sacred Heart ... followed up with 15 points and five rebounds vs. St. John's ... scored six of the team's 12 overtime points to lead Maryland past Utah in the Elite Eight despite recovering from the stomach flu ... chipped in a career-high 24 points in the Final Four vs. the Tar Heels, going 8-for-16 from the floor, 8-for-10 from the charity stripe and adding nine rebounds ... in the championship game, tied for a team-high 16 points and hauled down seven rebounds to lead the Terps to their first national title in school history ... five double-doubles on the season ... reached double figures in 24 games ... had at least six rebounds in 30 of 36 games played ... ranked 25th in the ACC in scoring, eighth in rebounding, eighth in field goal percentage and third in blocks per game (1.94) ... 70 blocks are the second-most in a season in school history ... also recorded one of the top-10 single-season free throw totals and top five free throw attempts totals in school history ... tied for 10th all-time in scoring among sophomores and tied for second in rebounding.

2004-05:

Suffered an Achilles tendon rupture at practice on Dec. 26, 2004, and underwent surgery in early January, sitting out the final 23 games of the season, including the entire ACC slate ... ACC Rookie of the Week on Nov. 29 after averaging 12.5 ppg, 12.5 rpg and 3.0 bpg at the Coors Classic in Boulder, Colo. ... also garnered all-tournament honors in Colorado. ... posted three double-doubles in nine games, including tallying 17 points and a career-high 16 rebounds in the close loss to



then-No. 2 and eventual NCAA Final Four participant LSU on the first day of the Coors Classic ... grabbed at least seven rebounds in all nine games before being sidelined ... first-career double-double was in the home opener vs. Siena (12 points, 14 boards) ... netted a career-high 22 points and had eight rebounds vs. Loyola, going 7-for-10 from the field and 8-for-11 from the charity stripe ... 9.8 rpg average prior to being sidelined was tops in the ACC.

BEFORE MARYLAND:

A 2004 McDonald's and WBCA All-American ... second team *Parade* All-American as a senior ... third team All-American by *Street & Smith's* twice ... also named to 2004 All-USA Basketball third team by *USA Today* ... 2004 Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year ... a 4A all-state honoree ... scored 2,009 points and hauled down 1,403 rebounds over her career at Cheltenham HS ... ranked in the top three among high school centers in the nation in 2004 and the 15th-best senior overall by the All Star Girls Report ... ranked No. 14 among 2004 seniors by Blue Star Report ... member of the East team that won a gold medal at the 2003 USA Basketball Youth Development Festival, averaging 9.0 ppg and 8.4 rpg, while also making a team-high seven blocks in five games.

PERSONAL:

Majoring in communications at Maryland ... daughter of Maria and Haviland Harper ... father, Haviland, played basketball at nearby George Washington University from 1973-76 ... has an older brother, Will (25) ... Laura Ashley Harper was born in Philadelphia, April 11, 1986.

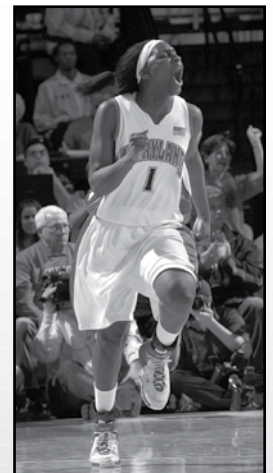

NOTEWORTHY:

Ranked third on the all-time scoring list (1,711) and second in rebounding (939) at Maryland ... led the nation in field goal percentage the last two seasons ... the only multiple All-American in school history ... three times named to the All-ACC team and is one of only three to be named to the first team twice ... currently holds the ACC and school records for career field goal percentage (.654), after setting the single-season conference record in 2007, making 70.7 percent of shots attempted ... only player in school history to have three 500-point seasons.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE:

Spent the summer of 2007 with USA Basketball, leading the U21 World Championship team to a gold medal in Russia ... averaged team highs of 5.6 ppg and 8.9 rpg, while with the U21 team, also serving as a team captain ... selected the 2005 USA Basketball Female Athlete of the Year ... tri-captain of the USA Under-19 World Championship team which went undefeated and won a gold medal at the 2005 FIBA U19 World Championship in Tunis, Tunisia, where she was named Most Valuable Player of the tournament ... averaged a team-high 16.6 ppg and was second with 6.4 rpg, while shooting a team-best .780 from the floor during the championship ... also helped USA win gold and a 5-0 record at the 2005 International Sports Invitational in San Diego, Calif., and a split in Hungary, averaging a team-leading 14.2 ppg and adding 6.3 rpg U19 squad was selected USA Basketball Team of the Year ... invited to the USA Basketball Women's Junior World Championship team camp in the summer of 2004.

2006-07:

The first Terp since 1989 to be named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) All-American team ... also became the first two-time All-American in school history receiving the national honor by the *Associated Press* and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) for the second time ... finalist for the WBCA's Wade Trophy, the Wooden Award and the Naismith Award, presented to the nation's top collegiate women's player ... a Midseason Wooden All-American, after being named to the preseason candidate list for the second time ... also named to the preseason watch lists for the Wade and Naismith Awards ... first team All-ACC for the second-straight year, the third-consecutive all-conference honor in her career ... was just 1.7 percent off the NCAA record, shooting an ACC and school-record 70.7 percent on the season ... only player in school history to score 500 points in three seasons ... has recorded 98 double-figure scoring games in her career, including a 44-game consecutive streak which was snapped on Jan. 21, 2007 ... 11 double-doubles, 45 for her career, the most of any active player in the conference ... BTI Classic Most Valuable Player after posting double-doubles in two of the three games, shooting 75 percent for the tournament ... Junkanoo Jam All-Tournament team, averaging 16.5 ppg and 10.5 rpg, also shooting 72.2 percent from the floor ... ACC Player of the Week after dominating performances against NC State and Michigan State ... netted 28 points on 13-of-14 shooting against the Spartans, also grabbing nine boards, while dishing out three assists ... career-high six assists in the rout of eventual NCAA Sweet 16 participant Marist in the Terrapin Classic ... ACC All-Tournament team selection for the third-straight year ... in the ACC, ranked ninth in scoring, tied for sixth in rebounding, first in field goal percentage, seventh in offensive rebounding and eighth in defensive rebounding ... has ranked in the top 10 in each of those categories every season ... preseason accolades include preseason All-American nods by the AP, *Athlon's* and ESPN.com ... named a *Street & Smith's* Terrific 10 and the third-best center in the nation by ESPN.com in the preseason, while also being selected to the Preseason All-ACC squad ... also an academic standout, garnering Academic All-ACC honors, ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District 2 recognition, as well as, third team Academic All-American nods by CoSIDA.

2005-06:

Received numerous honors, including earning a spot to the Associated Press second team All-American squad and the USBWA All-American team ... was also a finalist for the Wooden Award, was a WBCA Honorable Mention All-American, a Wade Trophy candidate and a Region II All-American by the WBCA ... NCAA Albuquerque Region Most Outstanding Player after double-doubles against Baylor and Utah, including 34 points against the Bears ... was nearly a unanimous pick for first team All-ACC nods, garnering 65 of 70 votes ... led the nation with a school-record .670 field goal percentage ... led the ACC in double-doubles for the second-straight year (15) and has 33 for her career, the most of any active player in the conference ... fastest player in school history to reach 1,000 points (60 games), breaking teammate Shay Doron's record set earlier in the season, and 22nd Terrapin overall to reach the mark ... broke the single-season free throws record set twice by teammate Shay Doron ... made 200 trips to the free throw line for the second-straight year ... 14th player in school history to have 1,000 points and 500 rebounds ... one of three to have two 500-point seasons and one of only four to score 600 ... along with Kris Kirchner, one of two players in school history with two 300-rebound campaigns ... also had a school-record four 30-point games and tied the school record for shooting percentage in a game (minimum eight attempts), going 9-for-9 vs. Central Connecticut State in the Terrapin Classic ... first team All-ACC Tournament for the second-consecutive year ... named to Paradise Jam All-Tournament team and ACC Player of the Week after posting double-doubles against Michigan State and Tennessee, including going 8-for-10 from the field with 11 rebounds and 19 points vs. the Lady Vols ... named to Terrapin Classic All-Tournament team for the second-straight year ... had three-straight 20-point outings (21 points at Virginia Tech; 23 vs. Georgia Tech; 34 at Wake Forest) en route to Player of the Week nods ... also had two double-doubles in that stretch ... perfect from the floor against Appalachian State (6-for-6), then hit her first 10 attempts in the next game vs. Mount St. Mary's



to continue her perfect streak ... nearly outrebounded Florida State, tearing down 19 boards, seven less than the Seminoles ... third in the ACC in scoring and second in rebounding ... was slightly better in conference games, netting 17.7 ppg, which ranked fourth in the league, and a second-best 8.7 rpg ... had 35 double-figure games, scoring at least 20 11 times ... 16 double-figure rebounding games ... preseason AP Honorable Mention All-American and All-ACC ... earned a spot on the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District 2 team.

2004-05:
