

Noteworthy:

Ninth Terrapin all-time with 1,500 career points ... one of only four Terps in the history of the program to receive All-ACC honors three times, earning a spot on the second team every year ... fifth all-time at Maryland in rebounding ... only player in school history to record a triple-double, coming in December 2006 ... third player in ACC $\,$ history and first Terp to amass 1,500 points, 700 rebounds, 300 assists and 100 blocks ... ranked in the top five in seven career statistical categories and is in the top 10 in five more ... tied for 11th in the ACC all-time in career free throw shooting and 16th in three-point shooting percentage ... 23rd player in school history to reach 1,000 career points and was the seventh-fastest in the program to reach the milestone, needing 74 games ... broke the single-season free throws record in 2008.

International Experience:

Member of the 2007 U.S. Pan American team, winning a gold medal ... played in all five games of the tournament, averaging 9.4 points and 4.2 rebounds per game, shooting 57.7 percent from the field and 46.2 percent from three-point range ... won a gold medal at the 2005 FIBA U19 World Championship in Tunis, Tunisia, in her second stint with the USA U19 Basketball team, averaging 8.8 ppg and 4.4 rpg, while shooting .778 from the free throw line ... the U19 squad was named USA Basketball 2005 Team of the Year ... also helped the USA win a gold medal at the International Sports Invitational in San Diego, Calif. ... member of

the 2004 USA U19 team (formerly the Junior World Championship Qualifying team) that captured a gold medal at the Junior World Championship Qualifying tournament in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico ... 8.6 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 2.0 apg in Puerto Rico, helping the United States capture a gold medal and a berth into the 2005 FIBA World Championship.

Garnered numerous preseason accolades, including being named a candidate for the State Farm/WBCA Wade Trophy, John R. Wooden and Naismith Awards, each presented to the top collegiate player in the country ... end of the year recognition included Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American for the second year in a row and was a second team All-American by Sports Illustrated ... one of only four Terrapins all-time to earn three all-conference nods after being named second team All-ACC for the third time ... ACC Player of the Week for the opening week of the season after averaging 17.0 and 10.0 rebounds in the opening game of the Preseason WNIT vs. Princeton and in the State Farm Classic vs. #6/6 Oklahoma ... 20 points and 12 rebounds vs. the Sooners in Chapel Hill, N.C. ... ACC Player of the Week for a second time on Dec. 31, as well as, a Terrapin Classic All-Tournament pick after averaging 19.5 ppg and 9.5 rpg, including a 23-point, 10-rebound effort vs. Richmond on the first day of competition ... on the second day of the Classic, knocked down a career-high and Comcast Center-record six threes, en



route to 18 points, also helping the Terps set an ACC single-game team record with 17 threes made \dots 85.7 percent shooting from behind the arc vs. UMBC was a league-high by an ACC player in 2007-08 ... scored 1,000th-career point vs. Delaware in the second round of the Preseason WNIT, the 23rd player in the history of the program to reach the milestone ... reached the career milestone in her 74th-career game, the seventh-fastest for a Terp all-time ... 18-of-20 from the charity stripe, both career highs, finishing with a career high 30 points at UC Santa Barbara, helping the Terps avoid the upset ... followed up UCSB outing with a 20-point, 10-rebound performance at UCLA ... 10 double-doubles on the season, four coming against ranked opponents (vs. Sooners, at #4/6 Rutgers, at #3/4 North Carolina and at #12/12 Duke) ... 17 points and 11 rebounds in the close decision at Rutgers, which was ranked fourth in the AP poll at the time of the meeting ... 5-for-5 in the second half at James Madison, finishing with 19 points and 11 rebounds, helping the Terps snap JMU's 30-game home win streak, the longest in the nation at the time of the meeting ... second 30-point outing came in the win over #10 Duke, going 9-for-13 from the floor and 4-for-5 from three-point range, also adding three blocks and four steals ... with that performance, is one of only eight Terrapins all-time with multiple 30-point games and the only player in the league in 2007-08 ... 20 points and 13 rebounds in the double-overtime setback to the Tar Heels in Chapel Hill, N.C., playing all 50 minutes ... recorded her 300thcareer assist and 100th-career block at Virginia Tech, netting 17 points in the win ... notched 25th-career double-double in win at Virginia, posting 21 points and 11 rebounds, also shooting 8-for-11 from the floor ... season-high seven assists in the win at home vs. Boston College ... moved into 10th place in career scoring and fifth in career rebounding in the regular-season finale vs. Florida State ... grabbed her 800th-career board in the ACC tourney win over the Eagles, becoming just the fifth player in school history to reach the milestone ... Surpassed the 1,500-point mark in the second-round NCAA Tournament win over Nebraska, also breaking the program's single-season free throw mark ... ranked in seven different statistical categories in the ACC, including boasting the third-best free throw percentage and was second in defensive rebounds per game (5.89) ... led the team in scoring nine times, reaching double digits 32 times, including 10 20-point games and two 30-point performances \dots also led the team in

rebounding eight times, grabbing seven or more 22 times ... 12 times had 10 or more boards ... selected to the Preseason All-ACC team for the second-straight year ... also declared the Best Wing in the nation by espn.com and was a *Sporting News* All-American (2nd team) and *Lindy's* All-American (3rd team) in the preseason, while CSTV.com selected the guard an Honorable Mention All-American.

As a Sophomore (2006-07):
