

# BRENDA FRESE

## HEAD COACH • ARIZONA '93

### SIXTH YEAR AT MARYLAND (144-54, .727)

### NINTH YEAR OVERALL (201-84, .705)

When Athletics Director Deborah A. Yow courted Brenda Frese for the position of head women's basketball coach at the University of Maryland, she could not have written a better success story. The 2002 *Associated Press* Coach of the Year came to College Park looking to rebuild a program which was once one of the elite teams in the nation. Four seasons later, the Terrapins ascended to the top of the podium at the Final Four and hoisted the 2006 NCAA Championship trophy while leading the team to four-straight NCAA Tournament appearances in her five seasons.

Described as dynamic, overachieving, determined and enthusiastic, the 37-year old coach is one of college basketball's rising stars. The fifth-youngest coach in NCAA history to win a national title and only the ninth to win on her first trip to the Final Four, she has built the team's success around recruiting, hard work and a positive atmosphere. The instant she arrived on campus, she hit the recruiting trails in an effort to reclaim the elite status Maryland once had in the 1980s. Success came quickly and early. Her first recruiting class of high school All-Americans Shay Doron and Kalika France was ranked No. 10. Since then, she has lured five-straight top-10 classes, the last four in the top five, including two classes ranked as high as No. 2 in 2004 and 2007.

Frese's recruiting classes have lived up to their billing and her pupils have earned numerous accolades which had eluded the Terrapins for over a decade. Crystal Langhorne was a two-time *Associated Press* (AP) and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) All-American, the program's first multiple All-American. She was selected a WBCA All-American in 2007, the first since 1989. Frese's players have earned 12 All-ACC citations and twice were selected the ACC's Rookie of the Year.

Terps have also garnered national recognition under Frese, making history in the fall of 2006. For the first time ever, four players from the same team were selected preseason candidates for the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's (WBCA) prestigious Wade Trophy when Doron, Coleman, Langhorne and Kristi Toliver were put on the Watch List. All five starters were on the Wooden Award watch list, while three were candidates for the Naismith Award.

Frese has seen success on her three stops in seven seasons as a head coach. Making amazing turnarounds her calling card, she captured her 100th-career victory in 2005 against Georgia Tech and boasts a 201-84 record (.705), recording seven winning seasons in all, while leading her teams to five NCAA Tournament appearances. Her Maryland squads have posted an 144-54 mark in six years (.727), advancing to at least the second round of the tournament in each of the last four seasons and posting 20 wins the last three years, a feat which had not been accomplished since 1978-80. The Terps' 34-win season in 2006 was a school record.

In 2006-07, Frese's squad spent 10-weeks at No. 1 and most of the season ranked in the top 10. It placed third in the ACC standings, the third time in her five seasons Maryland has placed among the top three in the league. The Terps also advanced to the semifinals of the ACC Tournament for the fourth-straight year.

Returning all five starters from the 2006 National Championship team, Maryland led the nation for the second-straight year in rebounding margin, outrebounding its foes +14.3 rpg. The Terps also led the nation in assists per game (18.3), while ranking second in scoring offense (82.6 ppg) for the second-straight year, and fourth in scoring margin (+21.3 ppg). Two-time All-American Crystal Langhorne also led the country in field goal percentage for the second-straight year, making 70.7 percent of her shot attempts, breaking the ACC and school record, while also threatening the NCAA mark.

During Frese's tenure, the Terps have broken attendance records. In 2006-07, Maryland announced its first women's basketball sellout in Comcast Center against North Carolina, then sold out for its home finale against Duke. The 17,950 in attendance set and tied the ACC record. The Terps had over 150,000 fans come through the turnstiles in Comcast Center, a school record. Its average home attendance of 9,533 over 16 games not only ranked sixth in the nation, but was also the single-season best improvement in average attendance from the previous season.

Last year, Maryland boasted six attendances of over 10,000 and claimed eight of the top 10 best attendances in ACC history, seven coming during Frese's tenure.

### NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE

- Langhorne is the only two-time All-American in school history.
- Only the third player in NCAA history to lead the nation in field goal percentage two years in a row.
- ACC Player of the Week a league-high three times this season. Owns the school record for most career selections with six. Also the ACC's active leader in career player of the week honors.

- Terrapin Classic MVP after posting double-doubles in both games of the tournament, including a then-season high 15 boards against Richmond.
- Recorded her 50th-career double-double at BC, adding 18 points to her rebounding total.
- Seventh double-double of the season in win at Virginia, scoring 20 points and grabbing 16 rebounds, becoming Maryland's all-time scoring leader in the process.
- Scored season-high 31 points in double-overtime win against Georgia Tech, playing a career-high 48 minutes, while tying career marks for free throws made and attempted. Also broke the school record for games started with 120.
- Had fourth 20-point scoring effort of the season and third straight in loss at North Carolina, scoring 23 points.
- Scored 2,000th-career point against Miami, the first 2,000-point scorer in Maryland women's basketball history. Also became the only player in men's and women's Maryland basketball history with 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds.
- Also shot a career-best 9-for-9 at the free-throw line against Miami.
- Recorded 53rd career double-double, scoring 19 points and securing 16 rebounds at Virginia Tech. It was the 15th time this season Langhorne grabbed 15 or more boards.
- Became school's all-time leader in made field goals, making season-high 11 at #12/12 Duke, passing Vicky Bullett.
- Scored 25 points and grabbed 12 boards at Duke, recording 54th double-double of career and 10th of season.
- Had jersey honored after the Florida State victory, the first player in Maryland women's basketball history to have her jersey honored while still an active player.
- Shot 11-for-13 against Boston College, her fourth straight 20+-point game.
- Became first Terrapin to be named to the All-ACC Tournament team four-straight years, making the second team for the second time.
- Had 35th career 20+-point game against Coppin State with 25 points and seven rebounds. Langhorne made nine free throws to move into ninth place in ACC history. It was her 58th career double-double and 14th of the season.
- Recorded sixth career double-double in NCAA Tournament play against Nebraska, scoring 18 points and grabbing 12 rebounds.
- Surpassed 2,200-career points mark against Nebraska and tied Shay Doron's record for minutes played in the NCAA Tournament at 407.
- Also tied Doron's school record in NCAA Tournament games played with 12 against Nebraska.
- Second in the nation and ACC in field goal percentage at 64.6.
