2004-05

Made the switch from the post to the guard position ... saw playing time in all but one game ... played solid defense on Duke's Monique Currie, grabbing a season-high eight rebounds, four offensive, in the three-point loss in Durham, N.C. ... six rebounds in 12 minutes in the Terps' NCAA Tournament first-round victory over UW-Green Bay ... recorded a career-high three assists and recorded season highs of six points and three field goals made against St. Bonaventure ... four rebounds and a steal in six minutes in the upset-victory over then-No. 5/4 North Carolina ... a perfect outing at Virginia Tech, going 3-for-3 ... also perfect at Florida State, tallying five points on 2-for-2 shooting, while grabbing six rebounds ... five rebounds and two points vs. N.C. State.

2003-04

Saw action in 25 games, including postseason games vs. Florida State and at No. 19/19 LSU ... came off the bench to score 13 points and grab five rebounds in a season-high 29 minutes in the season opener vs. Coppin State ... 6-for-9 in that game vs. the Lady Eagles, setting a career high in field goals made ... 4-for-5 for eight points in the Terrapin Classic vs. Niagara ... nine points, including 5-for-6 from the free throw line, and a season-high seven rebounds in the home contest vs. Loyola ... three rebounds in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals vs. Florida State.

Starter in 19 of 28 games at the center position, posting 5.1 points and 3.6 rebounds per game ... scored in double figures in four games and posted first-career double-double, 14 points and 11 rebounds, in Maryland's 104-66 victory over Rider in the Terrapin Classic ... also scored 14 points in UM's 73-72 overtime win over N.C. State on 4-of-7 shooting from the floor and 6-for-8 shooting from the free throw line ... tallied double-digit scoring efforts in two other games (at Florida State, 10 pts.; vs. Coppin State, 10 pts.) ... grabbed 10 rebounds at Niagara ... named the Terps' Most Improved Player ... named to ACC Honor Roll.

Led Gwynn Park High School to its first girl's basketball state championship ... an All-Met selection by the *Washington Post* her senior year, she was also a two-time all-county selection ... averaged 17 points, 10 rebounds and two blocks per game her senior year ... Gwynn Park's Most Valuable Player her final two years ... set new school marks for points, rebounds and blocked shots ... also played volleyball and softball in high school ... picked Maryland after being recruited by conference-rivals Virginia and Georgia Tech, as well as Big Ten foe Penn State ... member of the National Honor Society and a school peer mediator ... nicknamed Cee Cee ... high school coach was Dr. Marvin Vann.

2004-05

Suffered a knee injury during off-season workouts in April, resulting in knee surgery ... saw playing time in 16 games ... played a season-high 17 minutes in the win over Loyola, grabbing four rebounds, also a season high ... netted a season-high four points vs. Coppin State, knocking down only field goal attempt and both free throw attempts ... three rebounds in six minutes in the win over Monmouth ... had a couple of assists vs. St. Bonaventure, at Georgia Tech and in the home matchup vs. Virginia Tech ... three boards in the NCAA Tournament first-round win over No. 24/21 UW-Green Bay.

2003-04

Saw playing time in 19 games ... recorded five perfect shooting outings, including a 3-for-3 effort at St. Bonaventure for a season-high seven points ... 2-for-2 vs. Niagara and at Wake Forest ... season-high two assists against Sacred Heart and UMBC ... five rebounds in the win vs. Loyola ... five points and four rebounds at Wake Forest ... two blocks and 2-for-3 off the bench in the win over Georgia Tech ... three rebounds at No. 1/1 Duke.

2002-03

Started 23-of-28 games as a freshman, averaging 6.0 points and 5.5 rebounds per game ... tallied six double-digit scoring efforts, including three double-doubles, in her first season wearing the red, black, gold and white ... scored a career-high 19 points and grabbed 13 rebounds in Maryland's 104-66 win over Rider on 9-of-16 shooting ... netted 16 points and pulled down a career-high 15 boards in the opening round of the Miami/Gatorade Holliday Classic vs. Cleveland State ... blocked three shots against Coppin State to cap a 10-point, 10-rebound effort.

BEFORE MARYLAND

A four-year starter for Midlothian High School, finished her high school career with a 96-18 record ... her sophomore year (1999-2000), *USA Today* ranked Midlothian 13th in the nation after finishing the season 31-0 and winning the Virginia AAA State championship ... finished career with 1,285 points, fifth-best in school history ... is also the school's all-time leading rebounder, averaging over 10 rebounds a game her senior year ... nominated to first-ever girl's McDonald's All-Star game ... 2002 first team all-state by the Virginia High School Coaches Association ... her senior year she was the Player of the Year in the Dominion District and first-team All-Met by the *Washington Post* ... as a junior, received second-team All-Met recognition and was an all-region pick as well ... a three-time Central Virginia Bank Athlete of the Month ... participated in the AAU National Tournament for six-consecutive years and was a member of the James City Blazers ... also played volleyball at Midlothian, garnering second-team all-district recognition in 1999-2000, 2000-01 and 2001-02 ... her basketball coach was Doug Garrett.


