## SEASON OUTLOOK

*Terps focus on returning to NCAA Regionals*

The Maryland gymnastics team is hoping to surpass last year's fifth place finish at the NCAA regionals. In order to do so the Terps will have to face six preseason Top 25-teams. They will rely on a combination of solid veterans and several exciting newcomers.

The 2005 squad is a young but talented team that Coach Bob Nelligan thinks will be very balanced. The team is comprised of three seniors, three juniors, five sophomores and four freshmen.

Seniors Leah Brill, Ashley Oberdorff and junior Rebecca Ruppert are the tri-captains who will lead the team. Having three captains is something Nelligan thinks will help his young team.

"It will give us a better perspective on the team throughout the season," Nelligan said.

Brill will be depended on for her talents on the uneven bars, beam and floor exercise and has improved her vaulting skills. According to Nelligan, Brill has almost perfected her vault and should have a season as good as her freshman one in which she won EAGL Rookie of the Year honors.

Oberdorff is eager to return to the squad after missing last season due to injury. Oberdorff's experience on the vault and uneven bars should help Maryland. Ruppert is the team's vault specialist who will be performing a new vault this season with a higher degree of difficulty. She could also be a vital part of the Terps' beam lineup. Senior Mandy Pascual is the squad's specialist on the uneven bars. She has received EAGL honors twice in the event. She shares the school record in that event with current teammate, Rachel Martinez. Pascual could also see success on beam this season.

Junior Rachel Martinez returns as the squad's top all-around performer. Martinez just missed the opportunity to be the EAGL all-around champion for the second year in a row, tying for second, but her EAGL Championship record in the all-around (39.625) still stands. Martinez set a school record last season on the vault (9.95) and tied the record on bars (9.925). She was a three-time EAGL gymnast of the week. Another junior who will be vital to the team is Alex Gatch. Gatch had a standout performance at last season's NCAA regionals, finishing tied for third on the balance beam (9.90).

Redshirt Sophomore Ginny Scott emerged as one of the team's best performers on the floor exercise and earned second team all-EAGL honors in that event last season. Scott's balanced talent will be needed this season as she will be added to the Terps' all-around lineup. Sophomore Rachel Colon should help the squad on vault, uneven bars and the beam. Colon was a 2001 Junior Olympic Champion in all-around, balance beam and floor. Sophomore Angie Ferg should see action this season on the vault and balance beam, where she was a four-time state champion.

"Ferg's confidence has grown and her skill level has increased," according to Nelligan.

Sophomore Marisa St. Louis was a strong performer in the floor exercise at the end of last season and will also contribute on vault and uneven bars. St. Louis is also training hard on beam and has improved her confidence in that event. Rounding out the sophomore class is Ashley LeVine who competed on beam last season and was a 2001 Junior Olympic National Qualifier.

The 2005 freshmen are an exciting group of athletes. Gretchen Kittelberger is a strong all-around performer who was a level 9 Eastern National Champion in all-around, floor and vault. She qualified for level 10 Junior Olympic Regionals and level 10 Junior Olympic Nationals for three years.

"Kittelberger has an incredible work ethic and is eager to learn," said Nelligan. "She has the potential to solidify a lineup."

Morgan Fishbein was an NHIAA second place finisher in all-around, vault and bars. Fishbein was a level 10 Junior Olympic National qualifier in 2001 and 2002. Angie Watkins is a 10-time state champion in the bars and also has a strong vault. Lindsey Bonomo is a level 9 state champion in the floor exercise who could break into the lineup on vault, beam and the floor exercise.

As the newest addition to the coaching staff, Talya Vexler brings valuable national championship experience to this Terp squad. Vexler excelled at the University of Georgia where she was a four-year letterwinner. Vexler has made a quick impact on the team, including helping to improve several of the gymnasts' beam routines.

Brett Nelligan returns for his second season as an assistant coach. Brett's experience as a gymnast at the University of Massachusetts has helped him transition into coaching. His youth helps him serve as a link between the coaching staff and the team. One of his main responsibilities is to do much of the spotting in practices and meets.

Scott Welsh, head coach for the University of Maryland Gymkana team returns this season as a volunteer coach.

Maryland will begin the 2005 season at the Maui Invitational, where they will face Arizona State which is ranked ninth in the preseason coaches poll, Boise State and Alaska-Anchorage on Jan 7. The Terps head back to the mainland where they will take on Michigan which is ranked seventh in the preseason Coaches poll, Minnesota and Ohio State in Columbus, Ohio on Jan 15. The home opener will be against the Towson Tigers on Jan.22.

Maryland will face several other ranked opponents during the season. They will host the North Carolina Tarheels who are ranked 15th in the preseason coaches poll on March 5th. The Terps host Arizona, (preseason ranked 13th), Rhode Island and James Madison in their final home meet on March 18. This will be their final preparation before the EAGL Championships which take place in Raleigh, N.C., on March 25. The team hopes to return to the NCAA regionals which will be held in Gainesville, Fla., on April 9.

# 2005 MARYLAND GYMNASTICS

## HEAD COACH BOB NELLIGAN

27th season at Maryland • Massachusetts '72  
1999 NCAA Southeast Region Coach of the Year



Bob Nelligan enters his 27th season at the helm of the Maryland gymnastics program. In that time, Nelligan has been the driving force behind the Terps' success. His love for the sport and for his athletes is unique in today's world of gymnastics and has earned him the respect of the gymnastics world and his pupils.

With a lifetime coaching record of 425-359-2, Nelligan has witnessed and adapted to the numerous changes that collegiate gymnastics has undergone.

As gymnasts have gotten stronger, so has Nelligan's

the College of Health and Human Performance Department. He is also a director and master staff member at the Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Woodward, Pa., and is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches, the U.S. Elite Coaches Association and the University of Massachusetts Alumni Association. Nelligan has also taught numerous classes regarding athletics and is striving to take athletics to another level through his pioneering of a wellness program for all of the varsity athletes at Maryland. This program is currently in the process of being implemented to each varsity sport and will ensure that athletes achieve their highest potential through the best means possible.

Originally from Braintree, Mass., Nelligan has more than 25 years of gymnastics experience. Prior to accepting the position of head coach at Maryland for the 1978-

79 season, Nelligan worked in various capacities at the Masters School in Dobbs Ferry, N.Y. From 1973-78 he was a physical education instructor at the Masters School and also coached several teams, including gymnastics, lacrosse and softball. In addition to these responsibilities, Nelligan was named the Chairman of the Physical Education Department in 1975 for the Masters School. From 1972-73 Nelligan was the head instructor and coach at the Marvateens Gymnastics School in Rockville, Md., and before that was an instructor and coach at the Weymouth South School in Weymouth, Mass. Nelligan received his B.S. in physical education from the University of Massachusetts in 1971.

Prior to the Terps' entrance into the Southeast Region in the 1983-84 season, the Terps competed in the East Region and qualified for the championships four of the seven seasons that they were members.

Nelligan has the respect of all of his colleagues at Maryland and nationwide, and is recognized as one of the top gymnastics coaches in the country. In 1999 Nelligan was acknowledged for his contributions to collegiate gymnastics when he was honored as both the East Atlantic Gymnastics League Coach of the Year and Southeast Region Coach of the Year, the first such awards he had received in a prestigious career.

Maryland's level of success is only achieved through a strict regiment of training and conditioning, which Nelligan implements on a year-round basis. Nelligan is constantly striving to be the best and expects his gymnasts to do the same, both in athletics and academics. Last season, in addition to having six All-EAGL first team selections and three All-EAGL second team selections, Maryland had 12 gymnasts earn All-EAGL academic honors. Nelligan is responsible for ensuring that this level of success is constantly maintained. He is the Maryland Terrapin team leader and the dedication and enthusiasm of the Terrapin gymnasts is a direct reflection of Nelligan's attitude and work ethic.

Even though his work with the gymnastics team consumes most of his time throughout the year, Nelligan still finds time to focus his energies on several other projects. He assists the director of the Maryland Gymkana Troupe, the only touring exhibitional gymnastics troupe in the country. They perform nationwide and have become a main attraction on the Maryland campus. Nelligan is also the co-founder of the Maryland Gymkana Camp and on numerous occasions has been a guest lecturer in

### COACHING STAFF

#### TALYA VEXLER

*Interim Assistant Coach*  
*First Season at Maryland • Georgia '03*



Former Georgia standout Talya Vexler is the newest addition to Maryland gymnastics, joining head coach Bob Nelligan and assistant Brett Nelligan. Vexler brings valuable experience to the Terps this season.

Vexler, a four year letterwinner (1999-2002) at the University of Georgia, won a national championship in 1999 and SEC championships in 1999, 2000 and 2001. She earned first team All-America honors in 2000 and 2002 and was a NCAA North Central Regional floor co-champion in 2002.

"We're very fortunate to be able to hire a bright, young coach with a wealth of knowledge from her time at Georgia," Nelligan said. "We are looking forward to learning from her knowledge of Georgia's success. She brings a different level of accomplishment to our program with her National Championship experience."

Vexler's first season at Georgia (1999) was plagued by injuries, but 2000 proved to be Vexler's breakout year. She excelled on the floor exercise, scoring a 9.9 or higher in 11 meets. She had a superb performance at the NCAA Championships, posting a first-place finish on floor (9.9) and a third-place finish on beam (9.825) during preliminary competition and a 9.8 on beam and a 9.9 on floor in the NCAA Super Six. Vexler competed in two events at the NCAA Individual championships, finishing fourth on floor and sixth on beam. She was a 2000 Region 6 floor champion and served as Georgia's lead-off performer on beam. Vexler earned several postseason awards after her sophomore season. She earned first-team All-America honors on both balance beam and floor exercise, was a 2000 Academic All-SEC selection and Second-Team All-SEC selection. Vexler ended the regular season ranked No. 8 on floor exercise.

During the 2001 season Vexler emerged as one of Georgia's most consistent gymnasts on beam. She scored a 9.85 or higher on beam nine times in 2001, including a quartet of career-best 9.9s against Florida, Michigan, Alabama and at UCLA. She also competed on the floor exercise, averaging a 9.820 in that event. She scored a season-best 9.9 on floor twice against Michigan and versus NC State. Vexler earned second team All-America honors on the balance beam and was a member of the SEC Honor Roll.

The 2002 season saw Vexler match a career high 9.9 on beam at Michigan. She had a brilliant meet on senior night vs. LSU, scoring a 9.8 on bars, placing third on beam with a 9.875 and on floor with a season-high 9.9. She tied for second on floor with a 9.9 at the SEC Championships, tying a season-high set at the previous meet (LSU). Vexler shared the NCAA North Central Regional Floor Title with teammate Marline Stephens, matching a season-high 9.95 on the event. She was the highest scoring floor performer for Georgia at the preliminary rounds of the NCAA Championships with a 9.9 and finished tied for fourth on floor at the Individual Event finals. She garnered first team All-America honors on the floor exercise.

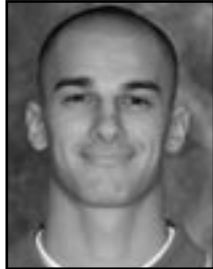
In February 2003, while finishing up her degree at Georgia, Vexler was diagnosed with breast cancer. She underwent chemotherapy and has been cancer-free since August 2003. She has been a spokesperson for breast cancer research and continues to support that cause.

Despite being treated for cancer, Vexler graduated from Georgia in 2003 with a degree in Business Administration. Prior to accepting the position of Interim Assistant Coach at Maryland, Vexler worked for the Cintas Corporation in their management training program.

Originally from Amherst, Mass., Vexler comes from a family of gymnasts. Her parents competed at the University of Massachusetts, older brother Aaron competed at Temple and her younger brother Luke is a freshman on the Temple gymnastics team. Her uncle was a member of the gymnastics team at Penn State and her grandmother was an alternate to the 1948 Olympic team.

#### BRETT NELLIGAN

*Assistant Coach*  
*Second Season at Maryland • Massachusetts '03*



Brett Nelligan is in his second season coaching the Maryland gymnastics team. A 2003 graduate of the University of Massachusetts with a degree in sport management, Brett Nelligan possesses a well-developed combination of knowledge and experience that will benefit the Terps in practice and in competition.

Nelligan competed three years of gymnastics for the Minutemen, serving as co-captain one year. He was also an Academic All-American and aided his team in winning two ECAC Championships. A

versatile athlete, he turned to diving after the UMass gymnastics program was cancelled, and witnessed the team achieve its third straight Atlantic-10 title.

In addition to his work as a student-athlete, Nelligan has compiled years of coaching experience from various gymnastics camps. He spent two years on the staff at Woodward Gymnastics Camp in Woodward, Pa., as well as two years at the University of Georgia's gymnastics camp and at the U.S. Gymnastics Training Center in Holyoke, Mass.

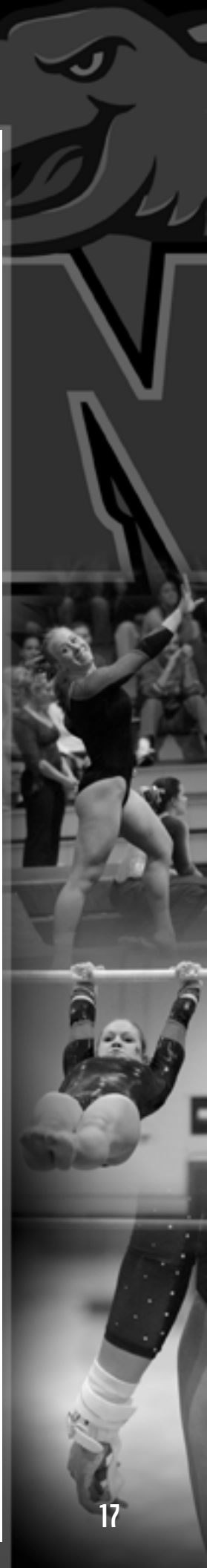
### TERP TALK with Angie

## 2004 SEASON RECAP

*Young Terps show promise for future.*

From the beginning of the 2004 season, the University of Maryland gymnastics team had its sights set on greatness. The Terps aimed to make their mark on program history, on the conference and the national scene. By the end of the season, they had accomplished these goals due to a successful combination of young talent and veteran experience.

The Terps, ranked No. 29 in the preseason GymInfo poll, began the year battling three higher-ranked opponents in four meets. Although the competitions resulted in losses for the Terps, the team's high scores caused them to climb up to No. 27 by the end of January. The end of January also marked the team's first home meet, where the Terps were finally able to add the season's first wins to their record.

Maryland opened its season at No. 23 Ohio State with EAGL rival Pittsburgh on Jan. 10, and combined to score a 192.825—the second-best opening total in school history. Headlining the meet was sophomore Rachel Martinez, who took the all-around title and tied for first on the floor exercise. She also placed second on the bars behind junior Mandy Pascual, who won the event with a score of 9.850. Martinez was honored with EAGL Gymnast of the Week following the meet, an honor she would go on to receive two more times in 2004.

In a loss at No. 24 Denver on Jan. 17, the Terps improved to score the best-ever team total for the second meet of a season, a 194.650, which beat their score from the first meet by nearly two points. The floor was the best event of the evening, with three gymnasts scoring a 9.825 or better, including Martinez, senior Sarah Hoenig and redshirt-freshman Ginny Scott. Martinez's 9.850 tied her for second on the event. Other top-three finishes included Pascual tying for second on bars, sophomore Alex Gatch placing second on beam and Martinez tying for second all-around.

The Terps dropped to 0-4 after visiting EAGL rival No. 25 North Carolina, where they were narrowly edged out, 194.375-194.900. One Terp to walk away with an event title was Hoenig, who placed first on beam and tied her career-high with a 9.925. Gatch followed close behind, notching a 9.825 to tie for third. Martinez posted a 9.850 on the vault to tie for second, while tied for second on bars was Pascual, who scored her third 9.850 of the season on her specialty event.

Determined to achieve a win, the Terps dominated their first home meet of the year on Jan. 31—a quad meet against Temple, James Madison and Towson. Scoring a 195.750, the Terps finished in front of EAGL rival Towson in second (194.275), Temple in third (189.300) and James Madison in fourth (188.950). The young Maryland squad led by team score in all four events, and combined for the fifth-best vault score in program history.

Impressive individual efforts paved the way at the quad meet to bring the Terps to 3-4 on the year. Martinez won her second all-around title of the season and tied for third on bars with redshirt-freshman Rachel Colon. Senior Rachel Sibert scored a career-high 9.90 on vault, winning the event, and Hoenig followed in second place. Hoenig also placed first on beam and second on floor, earning herself EAGL Specialist of the Week honors for her outstanding three-event performance. Scott took her first event title of the year, winning floor with a 9.90, and Pascual finished second on bars. Also making her mark was sophomore Cameron Logan, who placed second on beam with a 9.80.

The Terps next took on the ninth annual Governor's Cup on Feb. 7, where they placed second behind North Carolina and in front of NC State and host Towson. The squad again excelled on the floor, totaling a meet-best 49.100, led by Martinez's 9.90 that was good enough to tie her for second. Martinez placed first on vault, followed by sophomore Rebecca Ruppert, who hit a then-season high 9.80. Totalling another meet-high score on the bars, the Terps were paced by Martinez's 9.850 and aided by Pascual and sophomore Kristi Skowronski, who each scored a 9.800. In the all-around, Martinez tied for first place with UNC's Olivia Trusty, scoring a 39.500 that was the fifth-best all-around mark in school history.

On Feb. 11, the Terps traveled to nearby George Washington and trounced the Colonials, 195.400-192.975. A Terp placed first on every event, highlighted by Martinez's title on the vault where she scored a school-record 9.950. She also took her third-straight all-around win with a 39.500 and tied Hoenig for first on beam with

a 9.90. Notching their second event titles of the year were Pascual and Scott, who placed first on bars and floor, respectively. The Terps swept the top three spots on bars and beam, with Martinez in second and Skowronski in third on bars, and Colon finishing third on beam with a 9.850. At this point, the young squad rose to 6-5 but was about to face its biggest challenge yet in No. 9 Iowa.

The tough competition brought out the best in the young Terps, who hosted the ninth-ranked Hawkeyes on Valentine's Day. The Terps combined for what was then a season-best score of 196.325 that marked the fourth-best team total in school history. Despite losing the meet by less than one point, the squad reached many new heights, including a new school record on vault with a 49.025 and the fourth-best floor score in team history—a 49.350. Additionally, all six floor competitors notched a 9.800 or higher, led by Martinez's 9.90 tied her for second. The sophomore sensation also placed second all-around, third on vault and tied for fourth on bars and beam, culminating in her second EAGL Gymnast of the Week award. Also stepping up her performance was Hoenig, who set personal-bests of 9.875 on vault and floor.

Following the Iowa meet, the Terps stumbled slightly, losing to No. 23 West Virginia and No. 13 Michigan on the road Feb. 22. The host Mountaineers pulled an upset over the Wolverines and won the meet with a 196.375. The Terps were once again led by Martinez, who tied for first-place finishes on floor and bars. Her bars score of 9.925 tied the school record held by Pascual, who turned in a 9.825 at the tri-meet. Scott, in the No. 5 position in the floor lineup for the first time, tallied her fourth 9.90 of the season, tying for fifth place. Despite the losses, Maryland's team score was good enough to propel them to No. 25, their highest ranking of the year.

The Terps next competed in a quad meet at Rutgers on Feb. 28, placing second

behind Rutgers but beating out Temple and Bridgeport. Although suffering uncharacteristic falls from several key performers, the team saw a breakout performance by freshman Ashley LeVine. She delivered a 9.80 beam routine her first time in the lineup, coming to the squad's aid when three gymnasts were not able to stay on the beam. Martinez dominated the competition, winning titles on vault, bars, floor and all-around. Taking first on beam was Hoenig with her fourth 9.90 of the season.

At 8-9 on the season, the Terps looked to end their season strong with a three-meet homestand in the friendly confines of Comcast Center Pavilion. First up was a March 3 meet against the George Washington Colonials, who were looking to avenge their earlier loss to the Terps. However, the Terps prevailed, 195.800-195.350, thanks to an outstanding performance by Martinez, who finished first on vault, bars, floor and all-around and placed second on beam. The Terps swept the top three spots on bars, beam and floor, and led the meet in all four events. They also combined for a 49.525 on floor, which marked the second-best total all-time. Outstanding individual achievements included Hoenig taking her sixth beam title of the year and Scott setting a new personal-best floor score of 9.925.

The Terps again rose to the occasion against No. 5 Stanford on March 6, setting a new school-record team score of 197.375 in a narrow loss to the Cardinal. The meet marked the Terps' best performance of the season, as they set another school record on vault and tied the school bars record. Martinez turned in a season-high 39.600 all-around score, tying for first, and garnered her third conference Gymnast of the Week award. She also tied for first on floor with a 9.95, while Pascual placed first on bars with a school-record tying 9.925 and Hoenig tied for first on beam. Many gymnasts set personal-best scores against Stanford, including sophomore Rebecca Ruppert's 9.850 vault, Brill's 9.90 bar routine, and freshman Marisa St. Louis's 9.875 floor routine. Additionally, Gatch, Colon and Martinez earned career-high 9.90's on beam, tying for third place.

March 12 marked Senior Night for the Terrapins, who hosted Air Force, NC State and Pittsburgh in their final home meet of the season. The Terps placed third to EAGL rivals NC State and Pittsburgh with a score of 195.350, but enjoyed an outstanding performance from Hoenig in her last home meet as a Terp. She set a new career-high score of 9.95 on the beam, tying the school record and winning her eighth beam title of the season. She also tied her career-high on vault with a 9.875, tying her for third on vault with Martinez. Martinez set a season-high 9.925 on beam, coming in second behind Hoenig. Also performing well was Scott, who

took second place on floor with her third consecutive 9.925, and Pascual, who tied for third on bars. The meet served as the final-tune up for the March 20 EAGL Championships, where the Terps looked for a solid score that would assure them an NCAA Regionals berth.

At the conference championships in Pittsburgh, Pa., Martinez, the 2003 EAGL all-around champion came just 0.025 away from repeating that feat. Instead, she tied for second all-around with a 39.550 and led the team to a fifth-place finish. The Terps were able to total a 196.025 despite having to count one fall in the meet, and solidified their spot at the NCAA Regional Championships. The Terps' bars score tied NC State for the best at the meet, while their beam total was the highest of the night. Martinez scored the second-best vault mark of the evening, a 9.925 that put her tied for fourth, and posted her third 9.95 of the season on floor, tying for second place. Sophomore Kristi Skowronski notched a season-high 9.9 on the bars, tying for second overall.

Moving on to the NCAA Southeast Regional Championships, the Terps were dreaming of their first NCAA Championships berth. Unfortunately, No. 1 UCLA, the defending national champion, and No. 13 Nebraska finished first and second, leaving the four EAGL teams behind. The No. 31 Terps upset No. 22 host NC State to finish fifth overall, despite having to count two falls on bars. The young squad performed well on beam, scoring a 49.300 that was second to only UCLA. Gatch tied for third on beam with a 9.90 behind a two-way tie for first place, and Martinez tied for second on floor with the same score.

Maryland ended its season ranked No. 28 with high conference honors, as at least one Terp made it onto the all-conference team in each event and 12 gymnasts received conference academic awards. Martinez was a unanimous selection for first team All-EAGL in the all-around, also receiving first-team honors on bars, floor and vault, and second-team honors on beam. Hoenig was awarded first team All-EAGL beam for the third time and was named to second team on floor and vault. Also receiving all-conference honors were Pascual and Scott.

Pascual was named first team on bars and Scott received second team All-EAGL floor honors.

Although the Terps fell short of their goal of reaching the NCAA Championships, one could argue they are the closest they've ever been. Maryland's proven ability to hang tough with national top-10 teams is a testament to its rise into the national scene. The Terps lose only three seniors next season, and with a slew of talented underclassmen and incoming freshmen, the team will be once again poised to make its mark on the school, the EAGL and beyond.

## 2004 EAGL REVIEW

The ninth annual EAGL Championship was once again a record-breaking event. West Virginia won its fifth EAGL Championship with a meet record of 197.050 at the Petersen Events Center at the University of Pittsburgh. North Carolina finished second with a 196.725.

The Mountaineers gained a strong lead on the first rotation as they set an EAGL meet record with a 49.525 on vault. Freshman Janae Cox and junior Jessica Bartgis scored a 9.95 to lead the team in vault.

After earning a 49.15 team score on bars and a 48.90 on beam, the Mountaineers used a 49.475 team score on floor exercise to clinch the title. North Carolina tied a meet record in the floor exercise with a 49.550 score.

Sophomore Courtney Bumpers led North Carolina to its second place finish. She won the all-around competition with a 39.575 score. The EAGL Gymnast of the Year scored a perfect 10.0 on the floor exercise, edging Maryland's Rachel Martinez and West Virginia's Janae Cox for the all-around title. Martinez and Cox finished tied for second in the all-around with 39.55 scores.

Bumpers also finished first on the balance beam with a 9.925 score. Gretchen Richter of West Virginia came in second on the beam with a 9.90 score.

Senior Juliya Kovaliova of Towson finished first in the bars for the second straight year. She earned a 9.925 score to win the event. Junior Olivia Trusty of North Carolina and sophomore Kristi Skowronski of Maryland tied for second with a 9.90 score.

Coach Derek Galvin of North Carolina was honored as the EAGL Coach of the Year for the third time in his career.

NC State finished third behind West Virginia and North Carolina with a 196.600 score. Maryland (196.025) finished only .025 behind the host Pittsburgh Panthers, who totaled 196.050 for fourth place. New Hampshire came in sixth place, scoring a 195.950, followed by Towson in seventh (194.650) and Rutgers in eighth (192.475).

Five EAGL teams qualified for the NCAA Regionals: West Virginia, North Carolina, NC State, Maryland, and New Hampshire

# COMCAST CENTER



Maryland's new student activities building and home of Maryland Athletics was completed in fall 2002. Comcast Center's main arena provides a seating capacity of 17,950 fans for basketball, and will serve as a campus site for university special events and select community events.

The 1,500-seat Comcast Center Pavilion serves as home to the Terps' gymnastics, wrestling and volleyball teams, and the Nextel Heritage Hall multi-purpose room (capacity 400) is equipped to host banquets, press conferences, large meetings and serve as a pre-game restaurant suite overlooking the competition arena.

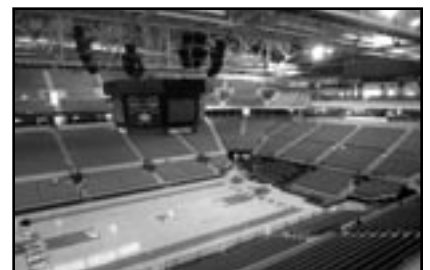
The Comcast Center also houses the university's athletics administration offices and includes a 7,000-square-foot Academic Support Center, providing an enhanced study atmosphere for the school's nearly-700 student-athletes on 25 teams.

The Terrapins' first public event for basketball was its annual Midnight Madness celebration. Both basketball teams have state-of-the-art facilities at

their fingertips including locker room and lounge areas, training areas complete with jacuzzis, and outstanding weight training facilities.

Twenty suites provide enhanced viewing and entertainment capabilities for Maryland fans. Maryland's student seating capacity accommodates 4,000, with students ringing the first 10 rows around the floor and a majority of seats on the arena's west wall.

Comcast Center is an excellent place for alumni and fans to enjoy their favorite sports and share their common Terrapin spirit. Visitors will learn about the men and women who have made Maryland Athletics great as they stroll through the dramatic Terrapin Walk of Fame and History. And the Terrapin Team Store, located just off the soaring three-level atrium lobby, allows visitors to outfit their pride. Maryland has once again reclaimed the status of having the best student activities center and athletics home in the country.

# STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

One of the most unique aspects of Maryland's women's gymnastics team is the nature of its strength and conditioning program. "We have a vigorous weight program," says head coach Bob Nelligan. "We're physically stronger and tougher, and the support staff that's allowing us to do this should be applauded."

The team's strength and conditioning coach, Barry Kagan, has been a part of Maryland's strength and conditioning program since 1993 and has worked with the gymnasts for the last six years.

According to Kagan, the gymnastics weight training program is one that is constantly changing. "It's continuously adapting depending on the individual needs of the current team," said Kagan.

The primary goal of the team's program is injury prevention. Next, the weight program strives to enhance each gymnast's performance. "Most gymnastics programs take a fairly conservative approach, doing moderate weight training," said Kagan. "We take a very balanced approach, emphasizing strength over muscular endurance, as most of the other programs do."

The team begins lifting in September upon returning to campus. The first two weeks are comprised of a learning/reacquaintance phase. "Most gymnasts don't lift in the style that we do," said Kagan. "We want to make sure they are ready to take on the more complicated lifts."

After the two-week introductory period the team progresses into a complex training program which involves several Olympic-style lifts. The main lower body exercise is the squat exercise, to enhance lower body stability. For upper body training, the women use dumbbells rather than bars to alleviate some of the stress on the shoulders. The athletes also train aerobically in September and October to prepare for full routines.

"In season, our approach becomes more of a maintenance phase," said Kagan. "We alternate the daily intensity of the lifts by organizing around the meet schedule." The women lift as a team twice a week with occasional conditioning circuits in the gym.

As for strength-to-body weight ratio, the gymnasts are the "strongest women in the department," said Kagan.

The Terrapins are fortunate to train in two of the premier weight training facilities in the country. Conveniently located in the Gossett Football Team House at Byrd Stadium, this facility has excellent aesthetic appeal, with two magnificent skylights and large windows overlooking the playing field at Byrd Stadium. The Terps' spacious weight room includes 7,200 square feet of functional floor space, with two elevated offices that are easily accessible to the training floor.

Maryland gymnasts train with some of the best equipment available, including 20,000 pounds of customized York free weights, seven pieces of Keiser progressive air resistance machines, and a full line of Hammer strength equipment. The weight complex also features immense, self-contained rack stations, Olympic lifting platforms with Eleiko bumper plates, and 10 upper body pressing stations.

## PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT AT NORTH GYM

The Maryland gymnastics team practices in the North Gym, located near the Campus Recreation Center. North Gym is a state of the art gymnastics facility that covers 18,000 square feet. There are two spring floor exercise mats which lie side-by-side with a travelling overhead spotting rig used for vaulting as well as floor exercise. There are spotting belts that are placed above the uneven bars, the single rail bar, and the trampolines. The single rail bar, tumbling strip and vaulting area are all connected into or onto brand new fitted Tiffin resi pits. Twenty centimeter mats surround AAI uneven bars and four new AAI Elite series balance beams. One of the most attractive features of the practice facility is the lighting, which is soft and leaves no shadows anywhere in the gym. Finally, there is a glassed-in trampoline room with four-string bed Goliath tramps surrounded by spotting platforms and 12-inch landing mats.

## THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND

### The Campus

By virtually every measure of quality, the University of Maryland has gained national recognition as one of the fastest-rising comprehensive research institutions in the country. The momentum of recent years has poised the university to move it into the top ranks of higher education and take leadership in shaping the research university of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

The university has enjoyed a decade of momentum in all of the areas that affect quality. The average high school GPA of entering students has zoomed from 3.01 to nearly 3.90, and the average SATs are now more than 1270. The student body is a model of diversity, with minorities making up more than 32 percent of all students, and at least one graduate and undergraduate student from every state in the nation.

The university has 67 graduate and undergraduate programs ranked in the Top 25 by *U.S. News and World Report*, up from just one program in 1991.

Sponsored research and outreach has nearly tripled in the same 10-year period, exceeding \$350 million last year. Private giving also has increased, and the university last year concluded its first campaign by topping its \$350 million goal by more than \$100 million. Alumni Association membership has been growing at an average rate of 10 percent a year since 1992.

One of the largest research universities in the United States, Fall 2002 enrollment was 25,240 undergraduate and 9,561 graduate students. There are 94 undergraduate programs, 89 master's programs, 70 doctoral programs and one first professional degree program. More than 100 centers and institutes are engaged in research and outreach.

Faculty at the University of Maryland, in all fields of knowledge, are engaged at the highest levels of national and international concern. The university's location near the center of federal policy-making and international political and economic activity enables it to play an active role in research and analysis of public policy.

Maryland is one of 30 public universities in the prestigious 63-member Association of American Universities and the only public institution in the Maryland-D.C. area with membership in the nation's most distinguished honor society, Phi Beta Kappa.

### DID YOU KNOW?



In 1991, Maryland had one program listed among Top 25 entrants in the U.S. News & World Report Rankings. Maryland now has 67 programs ranked among the nation's elite, and the university is ranked 18th nationally among public universities.



A report card published in *Technology Review* rated the top U.S. universities in their quest for intellectual property, commercial partners and profits. Johns Hopkins University and the University of Maryland (28th) were the Mid-Atlantic (Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, District of Columbia) schools to make the "campus patenting" top 50 list.



*Black Issues In Higher Education* ranked the university fourth nationally in bachelor's degrees earned by African-American students at traditionally white schools. Maryland ranks first in African-American undergraduate degrees in social sciences and history.



The *Wall Street Journal* ranked the Robert H. Smith School of Business No. 16 among the world's business schools. Maryland is the top-ranked school in the Mid-Atlantic region (Delaware, Maryland, District of Columbia, Virginia). The *Financial Times* of London ranked the Robert H. Smith School of Business No. 8 in information technology, No. 6 in faculty research and No. 7 in entrepreneurship.



In the only undergraduate program rankings released by *U.S. News & World Report*—business and engineering—both the Robert H. Smith School of Business (No. 18) and A. James Clark School of Engineering (No. 24) were ranked among the top 25. The university also ranked in the top 25 for its learning communities (3rd), first-year experience (12th) and service learning programs (24th).



### DR. C.D. MOTE

*University President  
California '59  
Seventh Year*

As the 19th president of the University of Maryland, C. D. "Dan" Mote Jr. has presided since 1998 over a university that is claiming a well-earned position in the top echelon of research universities in the nation. An internationally-respected researcher

and member of the National Academy of Engineering, Dr. Mote is Glenn L. Martin Institute Professor of Engineering. He serves on the Technology Council of Maryland, is co-chair of the Potomac Conference of the Greater Washington Board of Trade and heads its Technology Transfer Committee.

Under President Mote's leadership, Maryland has received national and international notice for innovative undergraduate education opportunities, high-impact research and academic programs, outstanding performing arts, and athletes and athletic teams competitive with the best in the nation.

"The future of the state depends on this university," says Mote. "It is the State of Maryland's most important asset." As president, Dan Mote has been determined to make that asset even greater by nourishing a culture of excellence and civility across the campus, strengthening the university's connections with its various stakeholders, building partnerships with State and national corporations and federal agencies and achieving distinction as an institution where discovery takes place every day and everywhere. The university's progress can be seen in all areas, from its nationally-ranked programs to its success in building external partnerships to its state-of-the-art facilities.

### Quality Programs

Over the past decade, the quality of Maryland's programs and reputation has climbed steadily. In 2003, the University of Maryland moved up to 17th place among public universities in *U.S. News & World Report* rankings, up from 30th in 1998. We currently have 44 graduate and undergraduate programs and units ranked in the top 15 by *U.S. News & World Report*, up from 5 in 1995.

While our academic successes have spread across the board, the university has emerged as a true powerhouse in business, computer science, earth sciences, engineering, environmental policy, education and journalism. Maryland is one of only 10 public and private universities that have their programs in computer science, mathematics, physics, and engineering each ranked in the top 20. Our College of Education is ranked in the top 20 nationally and 5 of its programs are in the top 10.

### Athletic Excellence

Mote sees athletics as an integral part of the university experience. Indeed athletic success more often than not reflects academic success, he notes. For example, all four of the teams that played in the 2002 NCAA basketball Final Four, including Maryland, are members of the prestigious Association of American Universities, the organization that comprises the leading research and academic universities in North America. "That's no accident," Mote says. "Institutions that are committed to excellence tend to be excellent in every endeavor. Our successes in football, basketball, lacrosse and other sports reflects our culture of quality as much as our successes in engineering, business, education and journalism."

### Faculty Stature

Dr. Mote believes a university's quality is built by its faculty, and under his leadership, Maryland continues to attract the best faculty available. The university recruited a Nobel Laureate in Physics in 2001 and three more Pulitzer Prize winners (to join three already on the faculty). More than 30 of our faculty are members of the national academies, the highest professional recognition attainable.



## DEBORAH A. YOW

*Athletics Director • 11th Year at Maryland*



Deborah A. Yow is in the 11th year of her outstanding tenure as director of athletics at the University of Maryland, a tenure that has seen unprecedented success and achievement in Maryland athletics. Each year has brought about continued improvement and accomplishment in Terrapin athletics. In Yow's 10 years at Maryland, the Terrapins have won a remarkable **nine NCAA national championships** and **graduated its student athletes at an enviable rate** as Maryland

athletics has soared to sustained new heights.

The comprehensive success of Terrapin athletics under Debbie Yow's leadership is a clear and compelling testimony of her values of **excellence, teamwork and accountability**.

Likewise, her election to the presidency of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics four years ago is an indication of the wide respect with which she is regarded among its 6,100 members representing 1,600 colleges and universities in the U.S. and Canada. She was singled out by *Street and Smith's Sports Business Journal* as one of the leading administrators in the U.S. and she received the Carl Maddox Sport Management Award presented by the United States Sports Academy for excellence in athletics administration. Yow was selected to serve on the U.S. Department of Education's Commission on Opportunities in Athletics to review the status of Federal Title IX regulations. She has served as the chair of the Atlantic Coast Conference Committee on Television for 2003 through 2004. The committee, comprised of the ACC's athletics directors, is charged with overseeing the league's TV contracts and dealing with issues related to television. Yow led the committee during the recent, very successful renegotiation of comprehensive, multiyear ACC football and basketball contracts with ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 and syndication entities. Additionally, she has represented intercollegiate athletics with presentations in a number of prominent settings such as the Harvard University School of Law conference on "Shaping the Future of Collegiate Athletics" and the *Street and Smith's Sports Business Journal* "National Forum on the Direction of

Intercollegiate Athletics." She was also recently inducted into the State of Maryland Women's Hall of Fame.

Yow, who has served on the NCAA Management Council and the NCAA Division I Budget Committee, is a strong and steady voice on behalf of intercollegiate athletics in America.

Since taking over as AD at Maryland in 1994, she and her staff have:

- Transformed Terrapin athletics into a responsive, goal-oriented organization.
- Balanced all 10 of the department's annual budgets (the first balanced budgets in the 10 years prior to her arrival). The budget has now reached \$43 million annually and the multi-million dollar accumulated operating debt which her administration inherited has been eradicated.
- Greatly enhanced the academic support services provided for student-athletes, with an enviable exhausted eligibility graduation rate of approximately 85 percent for student athletes at Maryland.
- Led the Terrapins to a national all-sports ranking in the upper 10 percent of all NCAA Division I institutions.
- Significantly expanded marketing and fund-raising efforts on behalf of Terrapin athletics. As a result, private gifts to athletics have increased over 350 percent and corporate sponsorship revenues have increased by over 300 percent during her tenure at Maryland.
- Continued to dramatically improve venues and facilities for the department's 27 teams. The Comcast Center for men's and women's basketball and other sports that use the facility is a prime example of the dramatic upgrade of athletic facilities.
- Implemented a strategic management model.
- Developed a comprehensive Internet strategy with management, marketing and fund-raising applications.
- Significantly improved customer care in every area of Maryland athletics.

The most recent achievements of Maryland athletics are exceptional:

- Maryland was selected by *U.S. News & World Report* as one of the Top 20 athletic programs in the nation (for overall quality and competitive excellence).
  - In men's basketball, the Terps won the Atlantic Coast Conference title over Duke in the championship game in 2004 and won the NCAA National Championship in 2002. Under Coach Gary Williams, the men's basketball team has appeared in the last 11 consecutive NCAA Tournaments, one of only five programs to do so.
  - Women's basketball also won its way to the NCAA Tournament in 2004, advancing to the Second Round.
  - In football, the Terps won the 2001 Atlantic Coast Conference championship and played in the 2002 Orange Bowl, and followed with an 11-win season and a 30-3 victory over the University of Tennessee in the Peach Bowl, again followed by a 10-win season and a 41-7 win over West Virginia in the Gator Bowl on New Year's Day 2004.

As a manager and a leader, she clearly models these principles. She is the only known current AD in NCAA Division I who has hired both the National Coach of the Year in football (while at Maryland) and the National Coach of the Year in men's basketball (while at Saint Louis University). Yow is known as "a coach's AD," while also being highly organized and a strategic and proactive leader and administrator. Quite simply, Debbie Yow personifies the relational and management dynamics that are necessary to be an excellent administrator.

A successful former coach at the University of Kentucky and University of Florida, she moved into athletics administration at the University of Florida and the University of North Carolina, Greensboro, followed by a successful tenure as AD at Saint Louis University.

She has authored numerous articles and books on athletics management and human behavior, and is a respected leader in intercollegiate athletics in the United States.

Reflecting on the status of the Terrapin men's basketball program, Maryland's Director of Athletics points out, "Our men's basketball team has become one of America's premier collegiate programs under the leadership of Coach Gary Williams and his staff. We are one of only five institutions to advance to the NCAA postseason tournament in each of the last 11 years, and the only team in the ACC to do so."

Summing up the entire athletics program, our athletics director recently stated, "We have the finest student-athletes, coaches, support staff and administrative team in America. It is because of their courage, hard work and cooperative spirit that we now have a strong, viable athletic program. I am immensely proud of each of them. I am equally proud of our Terrapin fans who buy tickets, our Terrapin Club members who faithfully support the Maryland athletic program with their donations for scholarships, and the M Club members who serve and give liberally. We are also blessed with a terrific President, Dr. Dan Mote, who has fostered a mindset of excellence across our institution. He is a strong and balanced advocate for what he calls "the three A's of the University — Academics, the Arts and Athletics." We have a great Terrapin family. That's the foundation for all of our success... and the basis for our bright future. It's a great time to be a Terp."



Additionally, Maryland is one of only six universities to win a National Championship in both basketball and football (UCLA, Michigan, Michigan State, Syracuse, Ohio State and Maryland).

- Maryland was selected as the sixth-finest athletic program in the nation by the Laboratory for the Study of Intercollegiate Athletics, based on criteria such as graduation rates, financial efficiency, equity effectiveness and competitive excellence.
- Hired the Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Brenda Frese, as the new women's basketball coach. In her second season at the helm, her team drew 13,250 to a regular-season game and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.
- Hired Dave Cottle, the third-winningest active men's lacrosse coach in the U.S., who guided his team to the NCAA Final Four in his second year.
- Field Hockey played for the National Championship in 2001 and continues to be a Final Four team.
- Women's Lacrosse has continued its winning ways with seven national championships from 1995-2001, with additional Final Four appearances.
- Football facilities have been significantly enhanced with team house, stadium and practice field upgrades.
- The Terrapins moved into the new \$125 million Comcast Center, housing athletic department offices and seating for 18,000 fans for basketball and other events.
- In 2003-04, 12 Maryland teams competed in NCAA postseason play, which earned Maryland a place in the Top 25 national rankings in the USSA Directors' Cup for competitive excellence.
- The productivity, morale, and the competitive and academic achievement of Terrapin athletics are exceptional and continue to gain momentum.

Regarding the many achievements of Terrapin athletics over the past 10 years, Yow says, "We are pleased, but we are not satisfied... our vision is to be one of the Top 5 programs in the nation consistently... we see no reason to settle for less."

Yow is known for her goal-oriented and proactive management style. She consistently inspires and challenges those around her to "raise our sights and sharpen our tools... to work hard and smart... to recognize that our only limitations are those that we place upon ourselves."

# ACADEMIC SUPPORT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT

The Gossett Academic Support and Career Development Center for Terrapin student-athletes, named for long-time Terp supporters Barry and Mary Gossett, is located in the Comcast Center. It features a study center that includes 25 desktop computers, a tutoring center, a classroom, a CHAMPS/Life Skills resource room and individual offices for six professional academic counselors, a director of ILP programs, an assistant program coordinator and two graduate assistants. In addition, a new academic wing was added to the Gossett football team house last Fall. It features offices for two counselors, three learning specialist, and a graduate assistant; as well as a quiet study area, 29-desk computer lab, classroom, tutor rooms and classroom/lab for the individualized learning program.

## Maryland Gameplan

The Maryland Gameplan is intended to assist graduating Terrapin student-athletes as they begin the job search process. It is distributed to more than 500 corporations and businesses across the country, in addition to being featured on the M Club website. Prospective employers are introduced to our graduating student-athletes with resume information relative to academic, career and personal achievements. The Maryland Gameplan directory is produced annually in collaboration with the M Club.



## Career Networking Night

Because career development is an ongoing process, ASCDU provides a variety of programs for student-athletes throughout the year. Professional assistance with resume-writing, interviewing skills, graduate school search and job search is readily available to all student-athletes. During the spring semester ASCDU hosts the Career Networking Night, where student-athletes can learn about career interests and career planning. Unlike typical "job fairs," the purpose of this program is to allow student-athletes to explore multiple career opportunities by speaking directly to individuals in their chosen areas of interest. Employers at the Career Networking Night recognize the marketable qualities student-athletes have gained through athletic participation. Student-athletes learn about opportunities for internships and full-time jobs.

## Student-Athlete Advisory Council

The Student-Athlete Advisory Council (S.A.A.C.) plays an important role in the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics. It consists of two representatives from each varsity sport and meets on a regular basis with representatives from the athletic administration. The S.A.A.C. mission is to enhance the total student-athlete experience by developing leadership skills, promoting student-athlete welfare and fostering a positive student-athlete image on the Maryland campus, local area and nationally.

## CHAMPS/Life Skills Programs

ASCDU houses the NCAA's (National Collegiate Athletic Association) Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success (C.H.A.M.P.S.) Life Skills Program. The ASCDU staff, in collaboration with various other Department of Intercollegiate Athletics' units and campus resources, strives to provide a systematic personal development program designed to reach each student-athlete based on his or her individual needs. The focus of the program is on the individual academically, athletically and emotionally, and on the changing needs and skills of that individual in the years during college and after graduation. The menu of presentations, workshops and seminars is a comprehensive and balanced system of "life learning" programs promoted for use by each varsity sport team.

## DAVE HAGLUND

Dave Haglund is in his seventh year on the University of Maryland athletic staff and his second as associate athletics director for varsity sports. He joined the University of Maryland athletic staff in January of 1998 following a 16-year career in the sports information office at Fresno State University.

In June 2003, after more than five years as the associate athletic director for media relations, he took over as associate athletic director for varsity sports and championships coordinator. Haglund is the sport supervisor for volleyball, baseball, men's golf, gymnastics, softball and competitive cheer, in addition to overseeing the sports medicine and strength and conditioning units. In addition, he coordinates ACC and NCAA championship events hosted by the university.

A 1981 graduate of Oregon State University, Haglund began his sports information career as an assistant SID at Fresno State in 1981 and was elevated to sports information director in 1996. During the course of his career at Fresno State, he served as the primary contact person for the Bulldogs' Division I football, basketball, baseball and soccer programs. He also served as information director of the California Bowl (1982-83) for two years.

Haglund and his wife, Cindy, are the parents of two children: Samantha (11) and Matthew (8).

# THE EAST ATLANTIC GYMNASTICS LEAGUE

The East Atlantic Gymnastics League became a reality on July 31, 1995 when eight prominent universities banded together to form a consortium created solely for the purpose of showcasing women's gymnastics on the East Coast.

Representing three conferences and six states, the EAGL is comprised of the University of Maryland, the University of North Carolina and North Carolina State University of the Atlantic Coast Conference, the University of Pittsburgh, Rutgers University and West Virginia University of the BIG EAST Conference, the University of New Hampshire of the America East Conference and George Washington University of the Atlantic 10 Conference. George Washington was added as the eighth member of the league when Towson was removed following the 2004 season. In August, 1996, the NCAA Council accepted the EAGL as an official affiliated member of the NCAA.

EAGL schools have had a long history of gymnastics success. Prior to joining the EAGL, New Hampshire won four ECAC titles. West Virginia won four straight Atlantic-10 Conference titles before leaving that league to join the EAGL.

Prior to joining the EAGL, seven of the eight schools had competed in the NCAA regionals. New Hampshire and West Virginia had both gone on to NCAA Championship competition. UNH qualified for nationals in 1994 and WVU made the trip in 1995. In 1982, Pittsburgh produced the NCAA bars champion, Lisa Shirk.

Now in its tenth season of competition, the East Atlantic Gymnastics League (EAGL) has earned a reputation as one of the most well-balanced leagues in NCAA gymnastics. The addition of George Washington University for the 2005 season makes the EAGL even more competitive as the Colonials have been well represented in the NCAA Regionals over the past decade.

Last season, West Virginia University claimed its fifth EAGL title in the nine-year history of the league. Led by freshman Janae Cox and junior Jessica Bartgis, West Virginia University earned a meet record 197.05 team score to win the title.

Despite the fact that West Virginia set a meet scoring record, it was not an easy victory for Coach Linda Burdette and her Mountaineers.



Ranked 13th in the nation, North Carolina finished second in the very high-scoring meet with a 196.725 score while North Carolina State (196.600) was third. Host Pittsburgh took fourth place with a 196.050 score while Maryland finished fifth with a 196.025 score. Defending champion New Hampshire took sixth place with a 195.950, ahead of Towson (194.650). Rutgers finished eighth with a 192.475 team score.

Cox, the 2004 EAGL Rookie of the Year, finished in a tie for second place in the all-around competition with a 39.55 score. Bartgis placed fourth in the all-around with a 39.50.

Sophomore Courtney Bumpers led North Carolina to its second place finish. She won the very competitive all-around title with a 39.575 score. The 2004 EAGL Gymnast of the Year, she earned her seventh perfect 10.0 score of the season on floor exercise, winning the event. It was only the fourth 10.0 score in EAGL history and just the second 10.0 on floor.

Bumpers also finished first on the balance beam with a 9.925 score. She also earned 9.825 scores on vault and bars. Freshman Christine Robella (Alexandria, Va.) helped the Tar Heel cause with a fifth place finish in the all-around (39.475).

Sophomore Kylah Bachman (York, Pa.) was the top performer for North Carolina State. She finished sixth in the all-around with a 39.425 score. Bachman tied for third place on beam (9.825).

In April, Bumpers became the first EAGL gymnast to win a national championship when she tied for first place on the floor exercise at the NCAA National Championship Meet at UCLA in April.

Bumpers, who qualified for nationals as an individual all-around, tied for first place on floor with Ashley Miles of Alabama. Bumpers and Miles each had scores of 9.9375 to tie for the national title.

Honored as an All-American for the second year in a row, Bumpers was the NCAA Southeast Region Gymnast of the Year. She was the number-one ranked gymnast in NCAA Division I for most of the season and had seven perfect 10.0 scores on the floor exercise during the season.

At nationals, she qualified for the finals by finishing third on floor with a 9.925 score. Bumpers also had a 39.45 all-around score at nationals in addition to a 9.775 on vault, a 9.875 on bars and a 9.825 on balance beam. Bumpers finished 15th in the all-around competition.
