

2006 SEASON RECAP

TERPS PLACE FIFTH AT EAGL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The 2006 Maryland Gymnastics team began the season aimed at returning to the NCAA Southeast Regionals. The Terps kicked off the season with a win at home against James Madison, 189.3-177.75. Rachel Martinez scored 38.925 to win the all-around. Her best performance of the meet came on floor exercise where she scored a 9.875. Angie Ferg led the Terps on vault with a 9.825 and first-place finish. Martinez tallied first place on uneven bars, floor and all-around and took second place on vault and balance beam, earning her EAGL Gymnast of the Week honors.

Maryland entered the second week of the season ranked No. 19 in the nation but would have to travel to Georgia to face the defending National Champion Georgia Bulldogs on January 14. Georgia which was ranked No. 2 in the nation featured freshman and former Olympian Courtney Kupets.

The Bulldogs defeated the Terps 195.825-188.3.

Kupets won the all-around title with a score of 39.475. Martinez finished third in the all-around with a score of 38.6. Rachel Colon finished fifth on balance beam (9.7) and sixth on vault (9.625). Martinez and Mandy Pascual notched 9.725 and tied for seventh place on uneven bars. The Terps competed without freshman Kim Loew who suffered a groin injury in the season opener.

The season didn't get any easier for the Maryland squad as it traveled to Illinois on January 21 to take on a talented Fighting Illini team. The Terps lost a close meet, 192.45-190.4 but raised its team score. Martinez notched a 9.825, finishing third on vault and added a second-place finish on uneven bars with a score of 9.775. Rachel Colon took third place (9.75) on uneven bars, giving Maryland the win on the event. Martinez won the all-around competition with a 38.9.

The Terps entered the fourth week of the season with a 1-2 overall record. Maryland would once again be on the road as they traveled to North Carolina for a quad meet with the No. 24 ranked Tar Heels, the No. 16 ranked Kentucky Wildcats and James Madison on January 29. The Terps were edged by the Wildcats, 193.45-191.975 but defeated North Carolina (191.725) and James Madison(183.35). It was a huge win for Maryland over the Tar Heels who were 6-0 and in first place in the EAGL Conference. Ferg notched a 9.75 for fifth place on vault and Alex Gatch and Martinez tied for sixth place on uneven bars with a score of 9.75. Martinez finished fourth on floor exercise with a 9.775 and third in the all-around competition with a 38.775

The tradition of the Governor's Cup continued this season as the Terps joined efforts with Towson against NC State and North Carolina at the Comcast Pavilion on February 4. The state of North Carolina prevailed in the eleventh annual Governor's Cup and now lead the series at 6-5. Maryland tallied a season-high 192.375 for second place and the Tar Heels placed first with a 195.05. The Wolfpack finished third, scoring a 192.25 and the Tigers came in fourth with a 191.3. The Terps placed 1-2 on uneven bars with Martinez taking

first (9.8) and Pascual finishing second (9.775). Gatch tallied a season-high 9.8 for second place on beam and Colon scored a 9.775 for third place. Martinez was second on floor exercise with a season-high score of 9.9 and finished second in the all-around competition with a season-high score of 39.2. Freshman Kim Loew returned from injury to compete on bars, beam and floor.

Maryland hit the road on February 11 to take on Pittsburgh, Ohio State and SUNY Brockport. The Terps entered the meet with a 5-4 record overall. Maryland scored a 190.85, finishing in third place. Pittsburgh won the meet with a 192.925, Ohio State placed second (192.85) and SUNY Brockport finished fourth (178.325). Martinez (9.8) and Ferg (9.725) took first and second place on vault. Colon notched a 9.8 for fourth place on beam. Maryland tallied a season-high total on floor (48.375) as Martinez placed fifth with a 9.8. Morgan Fishbein broke into the floor lineup for the first time in her career and scored a 9.625. Colon scored a career-high 38.85 in the all-around competition for third place.

The Terps returned home on February 17 for a rematch against Pittsburgh. They faced Rutgers. Maryland scored a season-high team total 193.075 to defeat the Panthers (191.15) and Scarlet Knights (191.05). Ferg paced the squad on vault with a first-place finish and career-high score of 9.85. Colon notched a 9.775, tying for second place on vault. Martinez tied for first on uneven bars with a score of 9.725 and also finished first on floor exercise, tying a season-high 9.9. With the win, the Terps improved to 8-6 on the season and 4-2 in the EAGL Conference.

The Terps hosted Temple on February 26 and honored seniors Alex Gatch, Rachel Martinez, Mandy Pascual and Rebecca Ruppert. Maryland scored a season-high score of 194.15 to defeat the Owls (186.125). Colon won the all-around title with a career-high score of 39.25. She tied for first place on uneven bars

with Pascual (9.75) and won balance beam with a season-high 9.85. Gatch notched a 9.775, finishing second on balance beam. Martinez paced the squad on with first-place finishes on vault (9.85) and floor exercise (9.925). Colon added season-highs on vault (9.825) and floor exercise (9.825), finishing second on both events.

Maryland traveled to Towson for a tri-meet with the Tigers and the Tribe of William & Mary on March 4. Despite scoring one of its highest team totals of the season, the Terps were edged by the Tigers 193.55-193.025. William & Mary finished third with a 189.175. Ferg continued her consistency on vault, notching a 9.8 for second place. Pascual scored a season-high 9.875 on uneven bars, tying for first-place overall with Towson's Cristina Lindo. Martinez took first place on floor exercise with a score of 9.825 and Loew added a 9.725, tying for fourth place.

The Terps hosted George Washington in their final home meet of the season on March 7. Maryland totaled a 192.925 to defeat the Colonials (191.3). Ferg tied a career-best score of 9.85 on vault, finishing first overall. Colon (9.775) and Pascual (9.75) finished 1-2 on uneven bars. Gatch (9.8) and Colon (9.775) finished 1-2 on balance beam. Martinez paced Maryland on floor exercise with a 9.9 and first-place finish. She scored a 9.9 or higher on that event in four of the six previous meets. Freshman Kim Loew scored a career-best 9.85 for second place on floor and Colon earned her second all-around title of the season with a score of 38.425. With the win, the Terps improved to 11-7 on the season and 5-2 in the EAGL conference.

Maryland returned to action on March 17, when they traveled to Raleigh, North Carolina for a quad meet with NC State, New Hampshire and George Washington. It would be the final tune-up before EAGL Conference Championships. The Terps scored their highest team total of the season (194.575), finishing second to NC State. New Hampshire placed third (193.75) and George Washington finished fourth (193.25).

Ferg and Martinez tied for third on vault with a 9.825. Martinez added a second-place finish on uneven bars (9.775), while Ferg scored a career-best 9.8 on beam for second place. Martinez finished second on floor with a 9.875 and Colon placed third with a 9.85. Martinez and Colon finished 1-2 in the all-around competition. Martinez tallied a season-high 39.225 and Colon notched her second highest total of the season (39.125). Loew added a career-best 9.7 on beam and a 9.8 on floor. The Terps ended the regular season with a 13-8 overall record and 7-3 in the EAGL Conference.

The Terps would look to carry the momentum of their last regular season meet to the EAGL Conference Championships at Rutgers University on March 25. Maryland scored a 194.75, finishing fifth overall. North Carolina won the meet with

a score of 195.325. Ferg scored a career-best 9.875 on vault and finished tied for second-place overall. Colon and Martinez tied for eighth place with a score of 9.825. Ferg also paced the squad on beam with a 9.775 and seventh-place finish. Loew scored a career-best 9.725, finishing ninth overall. Maryland tied a season-high team total on beam (48.475). Martinez led the Terps on floor exercise with a 9.85 and fourth-place finish. Loew added a 9.775 for twelfth place.

Although Maryland did not qualify as a team for the NCAA Regionals, four gymnasts were individual qualifiers. Rachel Martinez and Rachel Colon qualified in the all-around; Angie Ferg on vault and Alex Gatch on balance beam. Colon (2005 beam alternate) and Ferg made their first appearances at NCAA Regionals. Martinez finished eleventh in the all-around competition, scoring a 38.725. She notched a 9.75 on vault (tied for 19th), 9.5 on uneven bars (36th), 9.65 on balance beam (24th) and 9.825 on floor exercise (Tied for 13th). Rachel Colon placed eighteenth in the all-around competition, scoring a 37.725. Colon tallied 9.25 on vault (40th), 9.675 on uneven bars (26th), 9.075 on balance beam (41st) and 9.725 on floor exercise (tied for 29th). Ferg tied Martinez on vault, scoring 9.75 (tied for 19th) and Gatch scored 9.375 on beam (32nd).

Several Terps garnered postseason accolades. Rachel Martinez earned first team All-EAGL on floor exercise and all-around and second team All-EAGL on vault, uneven bars, and balance beam. Rachel Colon earned first team All-EAGL on balance beam and second team All-EAGL in all-around. Angie Ferg was named second team All-EAGL on vault.

The Maryland team ended the season with high scores but the late-season surge was not enough to qualify for the NCAA regionals as a team. Colon and Ferg are the senior leaders of the squad in 2007. Kim Loew overcame injury earlier in the season to emerge as one of the Terps' most consistent floor performers. She will look to join Colon as the squad's top all-around performers. Morgan Fishbein entered the floor exercise lineup in the middle of the season and provided solid performances for the team. While Maryland loses several talented seniors (Gatch, Martinez, Pascual and Ruppert), they have its most talented incoming class ever. The Terps are young but extremely talented and look to return to NCAA Regionals this season.

2006 EAGL REVIEW

The North Carolina gymnastics team won the East Atlantic Gymnastics League (EAGL) Championship on Saturday, March 25, at the Louis Brown Athletic Center in Piscataway, N.J.

The 23rd-rated Tar Heels claimed their third EAGL title and second straight title with a team score of 195.325 after forging ahead from second-place finisher North Carolina State (195.075) and third-place finisher No. 22 West Virginia (194.9).

NC State head coach Mark Stevenson was voted EAGL coach of the year by his peers.

EAGL gymnast of the year Courtney Bumpers paced the Tar Heels by winning the all-around title with an EAGL season high score of 39.525, and was closely followed by teammate Christine Robella (39.475) and New Hampshire's Mariana Pena Trestini (39.175).

Bumpers and Robella also finished Nos. 1 and 2 on the floor exercise with scores of 9.95 and 9.9, respectively. Third-place on the floor went to EAGL rookie of the year Meghan Morris, who tumbled a 9.875.

NC State's Leigha Hancock won the vault with a score of 9.9, while Bumpers, Maryland's Angela Ferg and New Hampshire's Amanda Hall, the defending champion on the event, tied for second on the event with a 9.875.

Robella took home top marks on the uneven bars with a 9.9, which was closely followed by a four-way tie for second place among Hall, Morris, and NC State's Elyse Adams and Amanda Jones with 9.85.

Pena Trestini won the balance beam competition with a 9.925, while Hancock and Bumpers tied for second carding scores of 9.875.

Bumpers' two individual titles gives her a league-record eight for her career. North Carolina becomes the third team in the 11-year history of the league to win back-to-back titles joining West Virginia (1996-98) and NC State (1999-2000).
