## 2006 MARYLAND GYMNASTICS

### 2005 SEASON RECAP

#### TERPS PLACE SECOND AT EAGL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The 2005 Maryland gymnastics squad started the season at the Maui Invitational with the highest opening-meet total in history (193.975). The Terps finished second to No. 9 Arizona State and defeated Alaska-Anchorage and Boise State. Redshirt sophomore Rachel Colon was named EAGL Specialist of the Week for her performance at the Maui Invite. Colon finished tied for second on balance beam to the defending NCAA Champion, scoring a 9.875. She added a 9.80 on uneven bars to contribute to a first-place team finish on that event.

The Terps entered the second week of the season ranked No. 15 in the nation. Maryland traveled to Ohio State for a quad meet against Ohio State, No. 3 Michigan and No. 19 Minnesota. Freshmen Lindsey Bonomo (9.80) and Gretchen Kittelberger (9.775) paced the Terps on vault. However, Maryland struggled overall and finished fourth in the meet (191.550). Bonomo was named EAGL Rookie of the Week for her performance.

Maryland would get back on track as it defeated Towson (193.525-191.425) in the home opener of the 2005 season. Rachel Martinez took first place in the all-around, scoring 38.900 and first on floor exercise with a 9.825. Alex Gatch led the Terps on balance beam with a 9.80 and Ginny Scott added a 9.775 on floor exercise.

The Terps entered the fourth week of the season with a 3-4 overall record. Maryland would once again be on the road as it traveled to No. 19 Penn State on January 29. Although the team performed well on two events, they could not overtake a Penn State team that had its best meet of the season. Maryland lost 196.300-192.325.

The tradition of the Governor's Cup continued as the Terps joined efforts with Towson against NC State and North Carolina on February 5. The state of North Carolina prevailed in the tenth annual Governor's Cup tying the series at 5-5. The Terps finished third, scoring a 192.425. The North Carolina Tar Heels took first place with a 193.225. The NC State Wolfpack finished second, scoring a 193.025. Towson came in fourth with a 191.850. Rachel Martinez (9.80) and Leah Brill (9.725) led Maryland to victory on balance beam.

Maryland returned home on February 11 to host Rutgers, Temple and SUNY Brockport. Rachel Martinez led the Terps on vault (9.70), balance beam (9.675) and floor exercise (9.750) to give Maryland the win (192.475). Alex Gatch tied Martinez on beam for first place. Rachel Colon notched a 9.725 on uneven bars, finishing first overall. Maryland improved to 7-7 on the season.

The Terps hit the road on February 19 to take on Pittsburgh. Maryland had strong performances on uneven bars and floor exercise to defeat the Panthers, 192.400-192.075. Freshman Lindsey Bonomo paced the squad on vault with a 9.725. Mandy Pascual led the team on uneven bars with a 9.775. Alex Gatch scored 9.80

on balance beam for first-place overall. Ginny Scott and Rachel Martinez led the way on floor exercise, tying for second with a 9.875. The team improved to 8-7 on the season.

Maryland hosted George Washington on February 23, edging the Colonials, 192.725-191.725. Rachel Martinez finished first or tied for first on every event. Martinez tied for first overall on vault with a 9.80 and tied teammate Rachel Colon for first place on uneven bars (9.765). Martinez added a 9.675 on balance beam for first overall and saved her best performance for last on floor exercise, scoring a 9.850. Ginny Scott added a 9.80 on floor to give the Terps the win. Martinez took the all-around title (39.0) and the Terps improved to 9-7 on the season.

George Washington would get a chance for revenge as it hosted the Terps on March 2. Rachel Martinez finished first on uneven bars and tied for first on balance beam, floor exercise and all-around. Ginny Scott notched a 9.825 on floor exercise tying Martinez for first-place. Angie Ferg took first place overall on vault with a 9.775. Despite those strong performances, the Colonials outpaced the Terps, 191.750-191.050. It was the lowest scoring total on the season for Maryland.

It wouldn't get any easier for the Terps as they returned home to host No. 24 North Carolina Tarheels on March 5. Maryland led after the first rotation, scoring 48.500 on vault, while North Carolina notched 47.950 on uneven bars. Rachel Martinez paced the team on vault, scoring 9.825 and Angie Ferg added a 9.750. The Tar Heels took the lead after the second rotation and would never relinquish it. The Terps turned in a strong performance on floor exercise but could not overtake

a tough Carolina squad. Martinez tied for first-place on floor exercise (9.80) with Courtney Bumpers (defending Co-National Floor Champion). The Tar Heels defeated the Terps, 193.150-192.475.

Maryland entered the 11th week of the 2005 season with a 9-9 overall record. The squad traveled to Towson to face Rutgers and Pittsburgh in a quad meet. The Terps led the meet entering the final rotation but were edged by Towson's strong performance on floor exercise. Towson finished first, scoring a season-high 193.475. Maryland took second, totaling 192.850. Rutgers finished third (192.700) and Pittsburgh rounded out the scoring (191.225). Rachel Martinez scored a season-high 9.850 on vault, finishing second overall. Leah Brill paced the Terps on uneven bars, scoring 9.80 to finish tied for first-place overall. Alex Gatch took first on balance beam with a 9.775 and Martinez finished first on floor exercise with a season-high 9.90. Martinez finished second in the all-around with a 38.525.

The Maryland squad would save its best meet of the season for its regular-season finale on March 18. Seniors Leah Brill and Ashley Oberdorff were honored in their final home meet of their careers. The Terps hosted No. 20 Arizona, Rhode Island and James Madison. Angie Ferg notched a career-high on vault (9.825) and Martinez added a 9.80 to give Maryland a 48.675 on that event. Mandy Pascual led the team on uneven bars with a 9.775. Rachel Colon and Alex Gatch added a 9.750. Balance beam proved to be the Terps' most difficult event, but Gatch finished tied for second overall (9.725). Maryland continued its consistency on floor exercise as every competitor notched a 9.70 or higher. Martinez tied for first overall with Arizona's Katie Johnson (9.875). Ginny Scott added a 9.850 for third-place as the Terps scored its highest total on floor exercise of the season (48.925). Martinez finished second in the all-around with a 38.525. Arizona won the meet with a 195.650. Maryland finished second with a 194.125, Rhode Island was third (189.975) and James Madison rounded out the scoring with a 186.600.

The Terps would look to carry the momentum of their last regular season meet to the EAGL Conference Championships in Raleigh, N.C., on March 25. Maryland scored season-highs on vault, uneven bars and floor exercise, giving its best performance of the season. Angie Ferg and Marisa St. Louis paced the squad on vault, scoring a 9.825 and tying for fourth-place overall. Rachel Martinez added a 9.80 to give the Terps a team total of 48.825. Leah Brill started her career as EAGL Rookie of the Year and finished it as an EAGL Champion on uneven bars. Brill notched a season-high 9.875 to share the EAGL title with North Carolina's Courtney Bumpers. Rachel Colon and Mandy Pascual added a 9.825 to give Maryland its best total on uneven bars this season and a first-place finish overall (49.050). Ginny Scott led the squad on floor exercise with a 9.850, tying for fourth overall. Angie Ferg finished an excellent meet with a 9.825 on floor. Marisa St. Louis added a 9.80 to lead the Terps to a second place finish on the event. Maryland

scored 48.950 which was its highest floor total of the season. The Terps entered the EAGL Conference Championships averaging the fourth-highest score in the league and emerged as a second-place finisher (195.200), tying West Virginia and finishing behind North Carolina (195.975). NC State finished in fourth-place with a 194.974, George Washington was fifth (194.200), New Hampshire was sixth (193.250) Rutgers finished in seventh place (192.625) and Pittsburgh (191.100) rounded out the scoring. Coach Nelligan was proud of his team's performance. "I was impressed with our team's resolve. Injuries, distractions and some low scores could have spelled disaster, but we came out with a second-place finish at EAGL and an individual title (Leah Brill-Bars).

Although Maryland did not qualify as a team for the NCAA Regionals, four gymnasts were individual qualifiers and one was an alternate. Rachel Martinez qualified in the all-around; Mandy Pascual on uneven bars; Alex Gatch on balance beam and Ginny Scott on Floor exercise. Rachel Colon was named an alternate on balance beam. Martinez scored 38.775 in the all-around competition. She notched a 9.50 on vault, 9.70 on uneven bars, 9.750 on balance beam and 9.825 on floor exercise. Mandy Pascual scored a 9.650 on uneven bars. Alex Gatch tied Martinez on balance beam, totaling 9.750. Ginny Scott scored a 9.80 on floor exercise.

Several Terps garnered post season accolades. Rachel Martinez earned first team All-EAGL on balance beam and floor exercise and second team All-EAGL on vault, uneven bars and all-around. Rachel Colon earned second team All-EAGL on balance beam.

The Maryland team finished the season well, scoring the highest team totals of the season in its last regular-season meet and EAGL conference championship meet. Although the late-season surge was not enough to qualify for the NCAA regionals as a team, the squad looks poised to return to that stage, as it loses only two seniors and return top performers on every event. The team will rely on the senior leadership of Rachel Martinez, Mandy Pascual, Alex Gatch and Rebecca Ruppert. Add to that mix, a solid junior class and a group of talented underclassmen and the Terps will be poised return to NCAA Regionals next season.

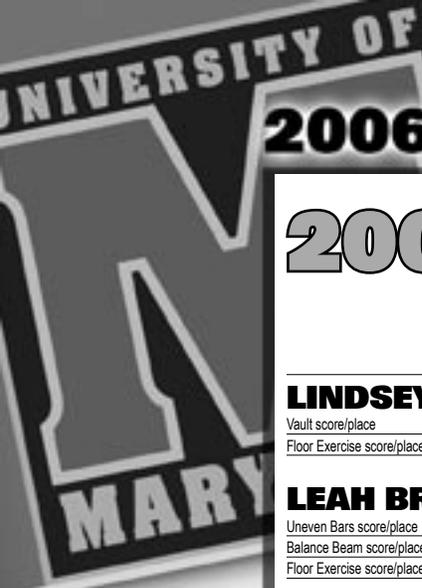

### 2005 EAGL REVIEW

With a team score of 195.975, North Carolina won its second EAGL title at NC State's Reynolds Coliseum, outpacing Maryland and West Virginia, which tied for second place with team totals of 195.2 points.

North Carolina was led by junior Courtney Bumpers, who earned her second consecutive all-around title in a tie with West Virginia sophomore Janáe Cox. Both Bumpers and Cox scored 39.475 points to win the all-around championship.

Bumpers also won her second consecutive floor exercise championship, scoring a season-high 9.925 points to lead UNC to a team total of 49.1 after a one-tenth deduction for competing out of order. She also tied for the uneven bars title with a score of 9.875. Her three titles on Friday evening gave Bumpers six in her three-year career, a new EAGL record. The old record of four was held by West Virginia's Kristin Quackenbush and TeShawne Jackson, and Towson's Erin Shanley.

The 2005 EAGL Gymnast of the Year, New Hampshire's Amanda Hall, won the vault title with a 9.875, her first individual championship and the Wildcats' second on vault in three years (Tara Phillips, 2003). It was Hall's sixth score this season of at least 9.875 points.

Maryland's Leah Brill tied with Bumpers on bars to win her first EAGL title in her senior season, scoring a 9.875 on the uneven bars to help the Terrapins make a last-rotation push into a second-place tie with West Virginia. The second-place finish by the Terps matched their best at the EAGL Championships, also done in 1999 and 2001.

Cox earned her second and third individual EAGL titles with a 9.925 on the balance beam and her tie for first in the all-around. She tied for first place on the vault in 2004 and her career-best score on the beam Friday evening was enough to keep the Mountaineers in the top two for the seventh time in the 10-year history of the EAGL Championships.

Host North Carolina State finished in fourth place for its ninth top-four finish in 10 years. In its debut at the EAGL Championships, George Washington placed fifth, ahead of sixth-place New Hampshire, seventh-place Rutgers and eighth-place Pittsburgh.
