TERPS SHOOT FOR FOUR-PEAT AT ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- The Terps are ecstatic to have a healthy Karri Ellen Johnson back in the lineup in 2012. The senior captain and two-time IWLCFA First Team All-American missed 12 games last season due to an injury. She has resumed her vital role in Maryland's offense. Maryland relies on returning starters Kristy Black and Alex Aust. Black serves as a captain in 2012 after scoring 31 goals as a junior. Aust tallied 42 points as a sophomore in her first year as a starter and has a team-high 78 in 2012.
- Katie Schwarzmann, the 2011 IWLCFA National Midfielder of the Year and Tewaaraton finalist, leads the Terps through the middle. Widely known as the fastest player in the nation, Schwarzmann led Maryland in goals last season with 65 and boasts 57 as a junior.
- The defense has three new starters in 2012 after the departure of Katie Gallagher, Brittany Poist and Sara Cooper. Iliana Sanza, a second team all-region pick as a sophomore, is the lone returning starter for Maryland. While the unit is young, it is no less disciplined. Sanza leads the back line as a junior and, along with four-year starter goalie Brittany Dipper, do the majority of the organizing.
- Dipper, the 2011 IWLCFA National Goalie of the Year, is back for her final season in College Park. She has been tabbed to three straight ACC championship all-tournament teams while leading Maryland to conference titles in each season since her arrival.

SCOUTING THE TAR HEELS

- Top-seeded North Carolina defeated Virginia 14-6 to punch its ticket to the finals.
- UNC is 14-2 overall with losses coming to Georgetown and Northwestern. The Tar Heels are holding opponents to a league-best 6.75 goals per game. UNC has allowed only 47 goals in the first half this season.
- Offensively, the Tar Heels present a balanced attack with four players tallying 30 or more goals. Abbey Friend and Becky Lynch have recorded 52 points each.
- The Terps fell to UNC 14-11 earlier this month in Chapel Hill despite four goals from Katie Schwarzmann.
- Maryland leads the all-time series 18-10 including two consecutive wins in the ACC tournament championship game.

- Katie Schwarzmann tallied four goals and Alex Aust recorded five points but a second-half rally by No. 3 Maryland fell short in a 14-11 defeat at No. 4 North Carolina Saturday.
- Maryland outscored North Carolina 7-5 in the second stanza after trailing 9-4 at halftime.

JOHNSON AND THE CLIMB

- With a score at 24:05 in the first half at North Carolina, Karri Ellen Johnson secured the No. 2 spot on Maryland's career goals list with 220. The Annapolis product reached the milestone despite being sidelined 12 games in 2011 due to a concussion.
- Johnson is also quietly making her ascent on the career points list, due in part to a breakout season assist-wise, boasting 15 through 16 games in 2012. She is currently fourth on the points list with 285.

FOUR TERPS TABBED ALL-ACC

- Senior Karri Ellen Johnson and juniors Alex Aust, Iliana Sanza and Katie Schwarzmann garnered All-ACC honors. Johnson made league history by becoming the first four-time honoree in ACC annals. The honor was the third consecutive for Schwarzmann and the first for Aust and Sanza.

AUST MAKING ACC TOURNEY HISTORY

- Alex Aust has set two ACC championship records in two games this weekend.
- With five assists against Virginia Tech in the semifinals, Aust tied a single-game high for helpers in an ACC tourney match.
- By adding another four assists against Duke Saturday, the junior established a new record for assists in the tournament with nine. The old record was seven by UNC's Becky Lynch.

#3 TERPS DOMINANT IN SEMIFINAL WIN VS. DUKE

- Alex Aust tallied seven points on four assists and three goals to lead No. 3 seed Maryland in a 12-3 rout of second-seeded Duke in the semifinals of the 2012 ACC Women's Lacrosse Championship Saturday.
- Duke landed on the scoreboard first with a Kim Wenger goal at 28:03 but would not be able to notch its second goal until the 27:07 mark of the second period. Following the first media timeout, the Terps regrouped for a punishing 6-0 run, which included three goals and one assist from Aust.
- Following Duke midfielder Taylor Trimble's goal three minutes into the second half, the Terrapins erupted for another 6-0 run, this time led by a hat trick from Katie Schwarzmann.

NEAR PERFECTION

- Maryland put together its finest showing of the year in its semifinal win against Duke Saturday.
- The Terps turned the ball over only once the entire game and dominated the ground ball category 14-4. Goalie Brittany Dipper saved nine of the 13 shots Duke attempted on the day.
- The Terrapin defense held Duke scoreless for over 30 minutes after the Blue Devils tallied the first goal of the game.

#3 TERPS ROLL PAST #6 HOKIES IN ACC QUARTERS

- Alex Aust tied a conference tournament record with five assists as third-seeded Maryland toppled Virginia Tech 15-7 in the quarterfinals of the ACC Women's Lacrosse Championship Friday.
- Karri Ellen Johnson tallied a game-high four goals and Katie Schwarzmann and Brooke Griffin added a hat trick each for Maryland. Aust, who tied a single-game tournament record with five assists, is now ninth in Maryland single-season history with 39.

TERPS AND TAR HEELS MEET AGAIN

- For the third consecutive season, Maryland will battle North Carolina for the ACC tournament title.
- The Terps downed the Tar Heels 10-5 to win their second straight title in 2010 and went on to capture the national championship. Maryland staged an incredible comeback in a 12-7 victory in the 2011 finals.

2012 MARYLAND WOMEN'S LACROSSE

AUST NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Maryland junior attacker Alex Aust has been named Atlantic Coast Conference Offensive Player of the Week two times in the last three weeks.
- Aust played an integral role in two wins against Penn and Towson in late March. Aust tallied 10 assists over two games, including a school record six assists at No. 8 Penn.
- She then recorded a career-high 10 points, including a school-record six assists, as Maryland cruised past #18 Princeton 15-9 last Wednesday to garner last week's award.

SCHWARZMANN NABS ACC OFFENSIVE WEEKLY HONOR

- Katie Schwarzmann was named Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Lacrosse Offensive Player of the Week in mid-March.
- Schwarzmann scored six goals and tallied two assists on the week, including a hat trick against No. 6 Virginia. The junior from Sykesville, Md., also racked up two draw controls and caused a turnover to pace the Terps to their first ACC win of the year.

HIGH OCTANE OFFENSE

- Maryland is averaging 14.7 goals per game through its first 16 matches this season. The Terps are outscoring opponents 265-132 this season.
- Katie Schwarzmann leads the Terps with 57 goals. Seven Terps boast double-digit goals this season, seven have tallied 20 or more scores.

MILESTONES GALORE IN DELAWARE WIN

- It was a milestone-laden day for the No. 2 Maryland women's lacrosse team as it routed Delaware 21-4 at the Field Hockey & Lacrosse Complex.
- Head coach and former Terrapin All-American Cathy Reese won her 100th career game at Maryland and senior attacker Karri Ellen Johnson scored career goal No. 188 to move into sole possession of third on the Terps' all-time goals list.

NEW-LOOK DEFENSE

- The Terps lost starters Katie Gallagher, Sara Cooper and Brittany Poist from last year's back line. Iliana Sanza is poised to lead the defense this season as a junior.
- Sanza was named an IL Preseason All-American after garnering all-region honors in 2011. She teams up with freshmen Megan Douty and Shanna Brady and junior Melissa Diepold to form Maryland's defensive four. Maryland has surrendered only 57 goals in the first half this season.

SANZA NETS ACC WEEKLY HONOR

- Junior Iliana Sanza was named Atlantic Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Week (2/21) for her work in wins against Delaware and No. 17 Penn State.
- The Tewaaraton Trophy Watch List nominee racked up eight draw controls over two games, while also tallying four groundballs and a caused turnover.

FOUR TERPS TABBED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Four Maryland players were named to the 2012 Tewaaraton Watch List, the early compilation of players who will be under consideration for college lacrosse's highest individual honor.
- The Terps boasted more Tewaaraton nominees than any other program in the nation. Brittany Dipper, Karri Ellen Johnson, Iliana Sanza and Katie Schwarzmann were tabbed to this year's list. All four were named Inside Lacrosse Preseason First Team All-Americans earlier this season.

SYRACUSE HALTS TERPS HOME WINNING STREAK

- No. 6 Syracuse edged the No. 3 Maryland women's lacrosse team 10-9 to snap the Terps' 36-game home winning streak at the Field Hockey & Lacrosse Complex.
- Despite holding a distinct advantage in nearly every statistical category including shots in which it trumped the Orange 30-20, Maryland picked up its second loss this season. It was the first regular season loss at home in head coach Cathy Reese's six-year tenure.

THREE'S COMPANY

- Maryland topped North Carolina 12-7 last season to capture its third consecutive ACC championship.
- Then-senior Laura Merrifield was named Most Valuable Player. Current Terps Brittany Dipper and Katie Schwarzmann were tabbed to the all-tournament team.
- The Terps are seeking to become the first team to win an unprecedented four straight ACC titles.

NEWEST TERP

- Head coach Cathy Reese and husband Brian welcomed the newest addition to the Maryland family in late January.
- Reese, gave birth to her fourth child. Braxton Jacob weighed in at 8 pounds, 11 ounces and is the third boy in the Reese brood. He joins brothers Brody and Riley and sister Cayden.

SCHWARZMANN ON THE ATTACK

- Katie Schwarzmann, the 2011 IWLCA National Midfielder of the Year and Tewaaraton finalist, continues to lead the Terps through the middle. Widely known as the fastest player in the nation, She led Maryland in goals last season with 65 and has tallied 57 through 18 games this season.
- She was the first junior to be named captain since Sarah Mollison in 2010. Schwarzmann is second on the team in points (68) and second in ground balls (28) and draw controls (34).

FOUR TERPS TABBED INSIDE LACROSSE PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Maryland led the way with four first-team honorees on the 2012 Inside Lacrosse Preseason All-America list.
- Katie Schwarzmann, Karri Ellen Johnson, Iliana Sanza, and Brittany Dipper all landed on this year's list.

ONE TERP vs. ONE TEAM

- Four times this season, one player from Maryland has tied or outscored the Terps' opponent.
- Brooke Griffin tallied five goals against Delaware in a 21-4 rout of the Hens. Katie Schwarzmann scored six goals at No. 17 Penn State in a 16-6 victory on the road. Karri Ellen Johnson (5g) and Schwarzmann (3g), tallied the same or more goals as the Tigers against Towson.
- Schwarzmann single handedly outscored Duke with four goals in the ACC semifinals Saturday.

- Maryland boasts a large, talented class of freshman this season. A total of 10 freshmen saw their first collegiate action in the season opener.
- Nicole Aust, Shanna Brady, Erin Collins, Megan Douty, Kristen Lamon, Kelly McPartland, Mattie Meredith and Taylor Salandra join redshirt freshmen Kelsey Horton, Brooke Griffin and Abbey Clipp.
- Brady, Douty, Griffin and McPartland have started in all 18 matches in 2012.

113-14 record at Maryland

Former Maryland standout and IWLCA National Coach of the Year Cathy Reese enters her sixth season at the helm of the storied Terrapins' women's lacrosse program. The four-time ACC Coach of the Year has highly impacted Maryland on every level, garnering unprecedented success as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

Reese's Terps won their third-straight conference championship in 2011 while landing in the final four of the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship for the third consecutive season. Maryland concluded the season with a 21-2 record after falling short in the title game to Northwestern. The Terps, despite playing the majority of the season minus Lacrosse Magazine Preseason National Player of the Year Karri Ellen Johnson, put together another stellar season, boasting two Tewaaraton finalists, an ACC Player of the Year and four IWLCA First Team All-Americans.

With the Terps falling just once in regular season play, Maryland wrapped up the 2010 campaign on a devastating 10-game winning streak, which concluded in elation with a gallant comeback against five-time defending national champion Northwestern in the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship at Towson. Reese coached Maryland's first Tewaaraton Award winner since Jen Adams as Caitlyn McFadden was tabbed the top player in all of women's lacrosse. Four other Terrapins landed All-America status as well and Reese garnered IWLCA National Coach of the Year honors along with being named the top coach in the conference for the second straight season.

Reese had Maryland on the verge of perfection in 2009, leading the Terps to a 21-1 record, an NCAA Final Four trip, and ACC Tournament and Regular Season championships. She boasted three Tewaaraton nominees, five All-Americans, five All-ACC honorees, the ACC Player and Rookie of the Year and the IWLCA Midfielder of the Year. Reese also earned a few honors of her own, racking up IWLCA South Region Coach of the Year accolades along with her second ACC Coach of the Year award in only three short seasons at the helm of the storied Maryland program.

Reese continued to move Maryland in a positive direction in 2008, steering the Terps to an 18-3 record and an Atlantic Coast Conference regular season title. Once again, Reese boasted some of the top talent in the nation as senior Dana Dobbie was tabbed ACC Player of the Year in addition to being named a finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy, given annually to the nation's best player. Dobbie and fellow seniors Kelly Kasper and Lauren Cohen joined sophomore Caitlyn McFadden on the All-America team while Kasper accompanied Dobbie as a Tewaaraton finalist. The Terps' 18-3 record was the best for the program since 2003 as Maryland punched its ticket to the NCAA Tournament for the 18th consecutive season.

Reese returned to her alma mater in 2007 as the head coach and guided the Terps to a 16-4 record, including a first-place finish in the Atlantic Coast Conference at 4-1, earning the conference's Coach of the Year award.

Maryland had bowed out of the NCAA Tournament in the first round the previous two seasons, but Reese's Terps advanced to the quarterfinals for the first time since 2004 and had the most wins since 2003. Included in those 16 wins were a pair against teams ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the country against North Carolina and Duke, respectively.

Reese's guidance produced more than just team success. Dana Dobbie was a finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy, given annually to the nation's best player, and was the ACC Player of the Year. In addition, Dobbie along with Becky Clipp, Kelly Kasper, and Krista Pellizzi were named All-Americans.

Reese returned to Maryland after spending her first three seasons as head coach at the University of Denver where she guided the Pioneers to their most successful season in school history in 2006. Denver finished that year with a 16-5 record and rattled off 11-straight wins over the course of 43 days. The 11-game win streak was more victories than the school had seen in an entire season as its eight wins in 2003 was the most in a season for the Pioneers prior to 2006.

Prior to lifting the Denver program to national attention, Reese spent nine seasons in College Park, four as a student-athlete and five as an assistant coach. During that span, the women's lacrosse program had one of the most successful streaks seen in collegiate women's sports history. The Terps won seven national championships in her first nine years on campus. That is the third-longest streak in women's NCAA history in any sport.

As a student-athlete from 1995-98, she was a two-time All-America selection. As a senior, she was tabbed the NCAA Tournament Most Valuable Player and was the second-leading scorer on that championship team with 58 goals and 25 assists. She finished her career with 140 goals, 77 assists, and 217 points. Her 77 assists is tied for eighth all-time at Maryland and her 217 points is 11th.

Reese graduated in 1998 with a degree in speech communications. She and her husband, Brian, who is also a volunteer coach for the program, have four children, Riley, who is seven years old, and Brody, who is five years old, Cayden Elizabeth who is three years old and Braxton Jacob who was born Jan. 21, 2012.
