Maryland returns to College Park for its second home date of the season as the Terps take on West Virginia from Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium Saturday. Kickoff is set for 12:01 p.m.

2

Through two contests, Maryland's defense has surrendered a total of 24 points averaging just 12.0 points allowed per game, an average that ranks second in the Big Ten and 17th nationally.

4

Maryland scored 24 points in its victory over USF Saturday increasing its season total to 76. The Terps are averaging 38.0 points per game through their first two contests, which ranks fourth in the Big Ten. It is the second straight season Maryland has scored at least 75 points in its first two games.

10

The Terrapin defense held USF to 83 yards rushing in Saturday's victory. Since 2012, it is the 10th time a Maryland defense has accomplished that feat and the first time since Maryland held Virginia Tech to 54 yards rushing last season (Nov. 16, 2013).

26

With a victory Saturday, Maryland will move to 3-0 for the second consecutive season and the 26th time in program history.

.643

Under head coach Randy Edsall, Maryland has a .643 winning percentage in regular-season non-conference games. The Terps are 2-0 so far this season after winning all four contests a season ago.

- West Virginia sports a 1-1 record heading into Saturday's showdown. The Mountaineers dropped a tight contest to Alabama in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta before throttling Towson 54-0 at home.
- Senior Clint Trickett helms the WVU attack. The redshirt senior has completed 75 percent his passes for 713 yards and three touchdowns over the first two games.
- Many of Trickett's passes are finding the hands of Kevin White. The senior receiver leads the Mountaineers in receptions (19) and receiving yards (244).
- Junior safety Karl Joseph flies to the ball at safety, leading West Virginia in tackles with 20 so far this season.
- Head coach Dana Holgorsen is in his fourth season at West Virginia. He has led the school to two bowls, including a win over Clemson in the 2012 Orange Bowl. Holgorsen previously served as the offensive coordinator at Oklahoma State, Houston and Texas Tech.

Wide receiver **Marcus Leak** tallied his first career multi-touchdown game against the Bulls Saturday. Leak hauled in touchdowns of 10 and 44 yards in the first quarter. Leak's 44-yard scoring reception marked Maryland's longest scoring play of the season.

7

C.J. Brown has seven career 100-yard rushing performances, the most all-time by a Maryland QB. Nationally, Brown is tied for fourth with BYU's Taysom Hill among active QBs. Ohio State's Braxton Miller leads the nation with 14 career 100-yard rushing performances.

15

Maryland currently has two receivers averaging over 15 yards per reception. **Marcus Leak** leads the team with 17.8 yards per catch, while **Deon Long** is second with 15.0 ypc. Last season, Maryland's offense ranked 16th nationally averaging 14.05 yards per reception.

20

Consecutive games with a reception for wide receiver **Stefon Diggs**. He has caught a pass in every career game.

For his career, quarterback **C.J. Brown** has accounted for 4,604 yards of total offense, which ranks seventh in school history and is the 25th-highest total nationally among active FBS players.

Maryland has scored a total of 76 points in its first two contests for an average of 36.0 points per game, which ranks fourth in the Big Ten.

With two touchdowns passes Saturday, quarterback **C.J. Brown** has now been responsible for 43 career touchdowns. His total ranks fifth in school history and is within 10 of tying Scott Milanovich for the school record (53). Among active FBS players, Brown's total ranks 18th.

100

Wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** hauled in a team-high seven catches Saturday increasing his career total to 100. Diggs is one of 13 Terrapin receivers all-time to reach 100 career receptions. The total is tied for 11th in school history.

3,035

With 227 all-purpose yards through Maryland's first two games, wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** has increased his career total to 3,035. Diggs is only the 11th player in school history to reach 3,000 career all-purpose yards. He currently ranks 10th in school history and his total is the 25th highest nationally among active FBS players. In addition, Diggs' 151.8 yards per game average ranks second nationally among active players.

3,231

Last season, Maryland eclipsed the 3,000-yard passing mark for the first time since 1994 (3,037). Its mark of 3,231 yards passing is the third-highest total in school history and the most since 1993 (3,823).

.531

Through two games, Maryland has converted 17 of its 32 third-down opportunities (53.1 %). The Terrapins' success rate ranks third in the Big Ten and is tied for the 17th-best average in the country. It is a significant improvement from the squad's 31.7 percent conversion rate from a season ago.



Breakin' Down Brown

Quarterback **C.J. Brown** threw for two scores and 201 yards in Saturday's victory over USF a week after totaling 172 yards of total offense, while rushing for three scores and throwing for another in a win over JMU. Brown's two touchdown passes against USF increased his career total to 43 touchdowns responsible for. That mark is 10 shy of the school record and is the 18th-highest total among active players at the FBS level.

- Brown has accounted for 4,604 yards of total offense during his career. He ranks seventh on Maryland's all-time list and 20th nationally among active players.
- Brown is the only player in school history to pass for and rush for 20 or more touchdowns. Brown has 23 career passing touchdowns and 20 career rushing touchdowns.
- The sixth-year quarterback is averaging 5.12 yards per carry for his career, the 20th-highest average all-time at Maryland.
- Brown has seven 100-yard yard rushing performances, which is tied for the fourth-most among active QBs nationally.
- Brown rushed for 100-yards or more in four games last season, which tied for the eighth-highest single-season total in school history. Steve Atkins (1978) and Charlie Wysocki (1980) hold the school record with eight 100-yard rushing performances.

ALL-PURPOSE DIGGS

Wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** leads the team in receptions (12) and receiving yards (103) through the first two contests. On Saturday, Diggs totaled 115 all-purpose yards with 65 kick return yards and 50 yards receiving. Diggs ranks second among active FBS career leaders in all-purpose yards per game averaging 151.75 yards per game.

- Diggs' seven catches Saturday moved him into a tie for 11th in school history with 100 receptions.
- His 3,035 career all-purpose yards is the 25th-highest active total nationally.
- He ranks 11th in Maryland history with 1,538 career receiving yards.

BROWN CARRIES THE LOAD

Running back **Wes Brown** led the Terps in carries (13) and rushing yards (61) Saturday in Tampa. The sophomore leads the squad with 142 yards rushing through two games this season with a team-high long run of 33 yards, which came against JMU (8/30).

- Brown is averaging 5.5 yards per carry in 2014.
- He is also averaging a team-best 71.0 yards per game.

LEAK HAULS IN TWO

Wide receiver **Marcus Leak** pulled in two touchdown receptions Saturday, one of 10 yards and one of 44 yards, marking his first career multi-TD game.

- Leak is averaging a team-high 17.8 yards per reception.
- The 44-yard touchdown catch is the longest scoring play of the season for the Terps.

ROSS ON THE CAREER RUSHING LIST

Running back **Brandon Ross** eclipsed the 1,200-yard rushing plateau against James Madison with a 86-yard performance against the Dukes along with scoring his sixth career rushing touchdown. Ross now has 1,277 rushing yards in three years at Maryland, which is 25th all-time.

- Ross is tied for 19th in school history averaging 4.68 yards per carry.

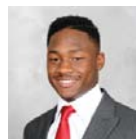

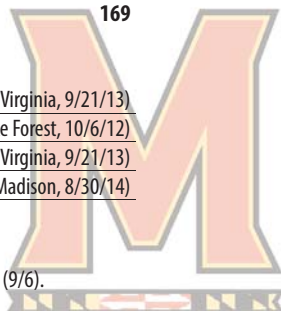

RANDY EDSALL

Head Coach

Syracuse '80 • Fourth Year at Maryland

Randy Edsall enters his fourth season as head football coach at the University of Maryland, leading a program that continues to make great strides both on and off the field.

Edsall was named the 34th coach in Maryland football history in January 2011. Since taking over, Edsall and his staff have placed a strong emphasis on recruiting the local Maryland/Washington, D.C. market, which is heavily recruited by schools across the nation and is considered a football hotbed. The result of this focus was the signing of 63 athletes, 33 from the area, since 2012. Edsall and his staff have recruited classes ranked in the top 35 nationally by Rivals.com in two of the last three years, including the 31st overall in 2013.

"Randy Edsall is an excellent football coach. He teaches and believes in the physical nature of the game. He is a great recruiter and his success at Connecticut earned his program compliments and recognition from college football's finest coaches. In addition, under Edsall's command the football program's Athletic Progress Rate (APR) has reached all-time highs. The football team's APR, which measures eligibility and retention, increased its multi-year score from 922 (2009-2010) to 950 (2012-2013) and its single-year score from 905 to 977. Both of which are program bests since the APR's inception in 2003.

The Maryland program continued its ascent in 2013 totaling seven victories and earning its first bowl appearance since 2010 (2013 Military Bowl). Offensively, the Terps passed for over 3,000 yards for only the fourth time in program history and the first time since 1994. Additionally, Maryland totaled over 500 yards of offense in its first three games, the first time that has happened since 1983.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Terps attacked opposing offenses and tied for third in the ACC in sacks (37) and averaged 2.85 sacks per game, tied for the 18th most in the nation. The unit also excelled on third down holding opponents to a 34.2 conversion rate, which was the 21st-best mark nationally.

Prior to coming to College Park, Edsall, a native of nearby Glen Rock, Pa., spent 12 seasons coaching the University of Connecticut Huskies where he took the program from FCS (formerly I-AA) to five bowl games, including a BCS bowl. The 2010 Big East Coach of the Year led the Huskies to a 33-19 record over his last four seasons there, including two bowl victories with his leadership resulting in UConn being the first program ever to go from FBS newcomer to BCS bowl participant in just seven seasons.

Edsall departed UConn as the school's all-time leader in career wins (74) and most games coached (144). He was a two-time recipient of the prestigious Bowl Championship Division Head Coach of the Year in New England by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston (2007, 2010).

During his tenure at UConn, the Huskies finished in the top-20 nationally for total offense twice (2003, 2004) and total defense three

times (2002, 2005, 2008). Under Edsall's guidance Connecticut defeated teams from the ACC, Big Ten, Big East, Big 12, Conference USA and the SEC.

In 2007, as Edsall continued to grow the program to prominence, the Huskies earned their first-ever national rankings peaking at No. 13 in the BCS standings in November. That year, they became just the second Big East team ever to go 7-0 at home and defeat three teams at home that were ranked in the top-10 during the season.

Off the field, just as he is doing at Maryland, Edsall's teams were strong in the classroom as well. In 2007, 2008 and 2009, UConn was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its high graduation rate. In 2003, UConn was the only public Division I-A school to graduate at least 90 percent of its football players and in 2005, it was one of only eight schools to both graduate 70 percent and win a bowl game.

When Edsall was named the head coach at Connecticut on December 21, 1998 he brought 19 years of coaching experience with him. He earned the job at Connecticut after a year as the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech where the 14th-ranked Yellow Jackets went 9-2.

Prior to his season at Georgia Tech, Edsall spent three seasons under two-time Super Bowl Champion coach Tom Coughlin as the secondary coach for the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars. During his time in Jacksonville, the expansion Jaguars reached the playoffs twice, including a berth in the 1996 AFC Championship Game.

Edsall began his coaching career in 1980 at his alma mater, Syracuse University. The former quarterback at Syracuse started as a graduate assistant (1980-82) before joining the staff in 1983 overseeing the running backs under head coach Dick MacPherson. Edsall oversaw the running backs for three years (1983-84 and 1986) and oversaw the tight ends in 1985 before making the switch to defense.

He coached the Syracuse defensive backs from 1987-90 and during that time the Orangemen were ranked among the Division I-A leaders in pass defense. After the 1990 season, Tom Coughlin, then coach of Boston College, hired Edsall to coach the defensive backs at BC.

Edsall was a three-year letter winner in football, basketball and baseball at Susquehannock High School (Pa.) and was an all-state selection in all three sports as a senior, which led to induction into the York Area Sports Hall of Fame.

At Syracuse, he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1980 and a master's degree in health and physical education in 1982.

Edsall and his wife, Eileen met at Syracuse University where she was a basketball and volleyball standout who was later inducted into the Syracuse University Hall of Fame. They have a daughter, Alexi and a son, Corey.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - C.J. Brown accounted for 172 total yards and four touchdowns to lead the University of Maryland football team to a 52-7 rout of James Madison in the Terps' 2014 season opener.

Brown scored on runs of 11, eight and two yards in the first half to help the Terps build a 24-0 lead going into halftime.

Brandon Ross opened the scoring in the third quarter with an impressive 8-yard run before Brown capped his day with a 41-yard touchdown strike to Deon Long.

Kenneth Goins Jr. and Albert Reid capped the Terrapins' scoring efforts with touchdown runs of two and 12 yards, respectively.

Ross led the Terps with 86 rushing yards on 16 carries, while Wes Brown had 81 yards on 13 carries.

Stefon Diggs was Maryland's leading receiver with five catches for 53 yards and thrilled the 45,080 at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium with a 59-yard kickoff return. Diggs led all players with 112 all-purpose yards.

James Madison's lone score came early in the third quarter when the Dukes turned a Maryland turnover into a short field. That 27-yard drive was finished off by a 1-yard plunge by John Miller.

The Terrapin defense was led by L.A. Goree, who totaled 14 tackles, including seven solo efforts. Sean Davis also turned in a double-digit tackle day with 10, including eight solos.

Anthony Nixon and Jeremiah Johnson had interceptions for the Terps, with Johnson's coming in the end zone as the first half clock came to a close.

William Likely also had a big day for Maryland with four solo tackles, including a sack for 15 yards, a pass break-up and one punt return for 35 yards.

Brad Craddock connected on his only field goal attempt of the day, a 49-yarder in the first quarter. He also converted all seven extra-point attempts and had seven of his nine kickoffs result in touchbacks.

The Dukes were led by quarterback Vad Lee, who had 141 passing yards and 27 rushing yards. Khalid Abdullah finished the game with 67 yards on 20 carries for JMU.

Maryland returns to action on Saturday, Sept. 6 when the Terps hit the road for the first time in 2014 at South Florida. Kickoff for the Terrapins and Bulls is set for 3:30 p.m. at Raymond James Stadium. The game will be televised on the CBS Sports Network.

TAMPA, Fla. - C.J. Brown threw for two touchdowns and Avery Thompson recovered a blocked punt in the end zone for a fourth-quarter TD that helped Maryland beat South Florida 24-17 on Saturday.

Marcus Leak scored on receptions of 10 and 44 yards for the Terrapins (2-0), who overcame six turnovers, including a pair of interceptions that stopped promising drives.

Thompson's TD put Maryland ahead for good with 12:25 remaining. Brad Craddock's 23-yard field goal made 24-17, and cornerback Alvin Hill's late interception helped the Terrapins put it away.

USF (1-1) lost quarterback Mike White with an arm injury on the first play of the game. Backup Steven Bench scored on a 17-yard run and linebacker Auggie Sanchez scored on a 21-yard fumble return for the Bulls, who led 17-14 at halftime.

Maryland's defense limited Marlon Mack, who began the day as the nation's leading rusher, to 73 yards on 22 carries.

Mack ran for 275 yards and four TDs, helping USF overcome an early 11-point deficit to beat Western Carolina in the Bulls opener. The true freshman who scored on runs of 62, 60 and 56 yards in the opener found the going much tougher against a defensive front primed to slow down the 6-foot, 195-pound blend of power and speed.

The USF running back had a couple of nice runs for 15 and 19 yards, but averaged just 3.3 yards per carry after gaining nearly 12 per attempt in his debut last week.

Brown threw for 111 yards, no touchdowns and one interception in Maryland's season-opening rout of James Madison. He was much more effective Saturday, completing 17 of 28 passes for 201 yards. He also was intercepted on the Terps' opening series, the first of four first-half turnovers that threatened his team's chances of winning, and threw a third-quarter pick that stopped a drive deep in USF territory.

USF lost White when he was hit after throwing 12 yards to Sean Price on the first play of the game. Bench started two games and appeared in seven overall a year ago, but didn't play nearly as well as he did Saturday in guiding the Bulls to his touchdown and a 35-yard field goal that put the Bulls up 17-14.

Bench finished 14 of 36 for 162 yards. He was sacked twice and threw the late interception that helped Maryland stay in control in the closing minutes.

Stefon Diggs had seven receptions for 50 yards for the Terrapins. Leak had three receptions for a team-leading 72 yards.
