BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

• With its victory on Saturday, Ohio State won its 21st consecutive conference game to break the Big Ten record for longest conference winning streak. The previous mark of 20 games was set by the Buckeyes from 2005-07.

• The race for the East Division title continues this weekend as Ohio State takes its 5-0 conference record to Minnesota. Michigan State is in second place at 4-1 and visits third-place Maryland on Saturday. The Buckeyes can clinch a share of the East Division crown and a berth in the Big Ten Football Championship Game with a win on Saturday along with a Terrapins victory.

• There is a three-way tie for first place in the West Division, as Minnesota, Nebraska and Wisconsin have identical 4-1 records. The Huskers and Badgers will meet on Saturday in Madison, Wis., while the Gophers will host Ohio State. Iowa, which is in fourth place at 3-2, visits Illinois on Saturday.

• Ohio State freshman J.T. Barrett ranks among the top 10 players nationally in a wide range of statistical categories. Barrett is second in passing efficiency (172.9), fifth in passing touchdowns (26) and sixth in yards per attempt (9.25). His 26 touchdown tosses are tied for the 10th most in a season in Big Ten history while his passing efficiency rating would rank third in conference annals.

• When Nebraska faces Wisconsin, the contest will feature a matchup of nation-leading running backs. The Huskers' Ameer Abdullah paces all players with 187.9 all-purpose yards per game while the Badgers' Melvin Gordon leads the country with 166.8 rushing yards per contest.

• After Wisconsin's Melvin Gordon rushed for 205 yards at Purdue, Big Ten running backs have now broken the 200-yard plateau 11 times this season. This marks the most 200-yard rushing games since 2005, when the feat was accomplished 11 times all season. Since the start of the 2000 campaign, there have been 11 or more 200-yard performances in three seasons, including 15 times in 2000.

• Nineteen student-athletes were named to the 2014 Capital One Academic All-District Football Teams on Nov. 6. To be eligible for the award, a player must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 3.30 on a scale of 4.00 and have achieved sophomore academic eligibility. The full list of honorees can be found on page 5.

• Big Ten teams compete for 17 different rivalry trophies and the newest one will be up for grabs this weekend. Saturday's Nebraska-Wisconsin contest features the first battle for the Freedom Trophy, unveiled this week. Since 1901, the Huskers and Badgers have met eight times on the football field with each school winning four games apiece.

BIG TEN BOWL OVERVIEW

- Largest and most diverse bowl lineup in Big Ten history, with:
 - Twelve different bowls and four other College Football Playoff bowls.
 - World class cities coast-to-coast featuring Big Ten alumni and fans.
 - Great opponents from the ACC, Big 12, Pac-12, SEC, Mountain West and Conference USA.
- Selection parameters agreed to by the conference and bowls to ensure fresh and diverse experiences and destinations for student-athletes and fans.
- Big Ten teams will not go to the same bowls in back-to-back years and restrictions are in place on multiple and/or consecutive appearances within states or regions, with the exception of the Rose Bowl Game.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF OVERVIEW

- Comprised of Cotton, Fiesta, Orange, Peach, Rose and Sugar Bowls.
- Selection committee will choose top four teams, then rank and assign to semifinal sites.

- Highest-ranked champion from non-contract conference guaranteed a berth.
- There is no limit on the number of teams from a conference that can take part in College Football Playoff bowls.

For all non-College Football Playoff partners, the bowl partner will request a Big Ten team. The Big Ten will approve or assign another team based on selection parameters.

ROSE BOWL GAME PRESENTED BY NORTHWESTERN MUTUAL (Pasadena, Calif.)

1. When not hosting a semifinal, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game, unless among the top four teams.
2. If the Big Ten Champion qualifies for the playoff, the Rose Bowl Game will choose a replacement Big Ten team.
3. The Rose Bowl Game has sole discretion on a replacement team, and will generally select the highest-rated available team, but will take into consideration final College Football Playoff rankings, head-to-head competition, division champions and most recent Rose Bowl Game appearances.

CAPITAL ONE ORANGE BOWL (Miami, Fla.) or BUFFALO WILD WINGS CITRUS BOWL (Orlando, Fla.)

1. When not hosting a semifinal, the Orange Bowl will select the highest-ranked team from the Big Ten, SEC or Notre Dame to face an ACC team. The Big Ten is guaranteed a minimum of three Orange Bowl appearances over the 2014-25 seasons.
2. The Big Ten Champion cannot play in the Orange Bowl.
3. If a Big Ten team is not selected by the Orange Bowl, the Citrus Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
4. The Citrus Bowl will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

OUTBACK BOWL (Tampa, Fla.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

NATIONAL UNIVERSITY HOLIDAY BOWL (San Diego, Calif.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

FRANKLIN AMERICAN MORTGAGE MUSIC CITY BOWL (Nashville, Tenn.) or TAXSLAYER BOWL (Jacksonville, Fla.)

1. Either the Music City or TaxSlayer Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
2. The Big Ten will play in three Music City and three TaxSlayer Bowls over the six-year agreement.
3. No Big Ten team will play in more than one Music City Bowl or one TaxSlayer Bowl over the term of the agreement.

NEW ERA PINSTRIPE BOWL (New York, N.Y.)

The goal is to have eight different teams participate in eight years, with a minimum of six different teams over the eight-year agreement.

FOSTER FARMS BOWL (Santa Clara, Calif.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

QUICK LANE BOWL (Detroit, Mich.)

Will select a bowl-eligible team, subject to conference approval.

LOCKHEED MARTIN ARMED FORCES BOWL (Fort Worth, Texas) or ZAXBY'S HEART OF DALLAS BOWL (Dallas, Texas)

1. Will select a bowl-eligible team, subject to conference approval.
2. In 2014, the Heart of Dallas Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
3. The Big Ten will play in three Armed Forces and three Heart of Dallas Bowls over the six-year agreement.

BIG TEN FOOTBALL DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKER

The Big Ten football championship will be decided by a game played between the two division champions. A team or teams that are not eligible to participate in a postseason football bowl game as a result of NCAA and/or Big Ten sanctions shall not be eligible to participate in the Big Ten Football Championship Game. The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will represent the conference in one of the bowls that comprise the College Football Playoff - the Cotton, Fiesta, Peach, Orange, Rose or Sugar Bowl. If the Big Ten Champion is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team will play in a semifinal game. Otherwise, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game (when not hosting a semifinal) or the Cotton, Fiesta or Peach Bowl.

The following procedure will determine the representative from each division in the event of a tie:

- (a) If two teams are tied, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
- (b) If three or more teams are tied, steps 1 through 7 will be followed until a determination is made. If only two teams remain tied after any step, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
 1. The records of the three tied teams will be compared against each other.
 2. The records of the three tied teams will be compared within their division.
 3. The records of the three teams will be compared against the next highest placed teams in their division in order of finish (4, 5, and 6).
 4. The records of the three teams will be compared against all common conference opponents.
 5. The highest ranked team in the first College Football Playoff poll following the completion of Big Ten regular season conference play shall be the representative in the Big Ten Championship Game, unless the two highest ranked tied teams are ranked within one spot of each other in the College Football Playoff poll. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the Big Ten Championship Game.
 6. The team with the best overall winning percentage [excluding exempted games] shall be the representative.
 7. The representative will be chosen by random draw.

If one or both of the Big Ten division champions is ineligible to play in the Big Ten Championship Game, then the participant(s) in the Big Ten Championship Game shall be determined by the following procedure:

- a) If the ineligible team is tied for the division championship, then the team it tied with shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- b) If two or more teams are tied with an ineligible team for the division championship, then the ineligible team is removed and the remaining teams revert to the tie-break procedure.
- c) The division runner-up shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- d) If there is a division runner-up tie, then the tied teams shall revert to the tie-break procedure.

If the championship game cannot be played (due to any reason beyond the control of the Big Ten Conference), the two division champions (using divisional tie-breakers as set forth above) shall be declared co-champions and the following procedure will be used to determine the Big Ten Conference representative to the College Football Playoff:

- a) Teams ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll will automatically be placed in the College Football Playoff.
- b) If the two divisional representatives met previously in the season and neither is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team ranked highest in the final poll shall be the representative to the College Football Playoff, unless the other team is ranked within five or fewer places of the higher ranked team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the two teams shall determine the conference's representative.
- c) If the two divisional representatives did not meet previously during the season, the team ranked highest in the College Football Playoff poll shall be the representative.
- d) If the two teams are tied in the College Football Playoff poll, the team with the best overall Big Ten record shall be the representative.
- e) If the two teams remain tied after d), the team with the best combined record of the tied teams against all common Big Ten opponents each team played that season shall be the representative.
- f) If the two teams remain tied after e), the representative will be the team with the best overall winning percentage.
- g) If the two teams remain tied after f), the representative will be the team furthest removed from College Football Playoff, Bowl Championships Series or Rose Bowl Game participation (as appropriate).
- h) If the two teams remain tied after g), the representative shall be determined by a random draw.

BIG TEN FOOTBALL AWARDS

The Big Ten will continue to honor its past while recognizing its current standouts at the conclusion of the 2014 campaign. The Big Ten's enhanced football awards program presents 18 individual trophies in addition to the Big Ten Championship trophy, bearing the names of one or two former standouts. The distinguished names on these football awards honor just a small sampling of the countless student-athletes and coaches who have contributed to the conference's rich and storied history.

Seventeen of the honors will be awarded immediately following the regular season, including awards for the best quarterback, running back, receiver, tight end, offensive lineman, defensive lineman, linebacker, defensive back, kicker and punter. Each of these individual position awards features the names of two former student-athletes.

The Big Ten will also continue to honor the conference's top coaches, offensive and defensive players and linemen and freshmen with end-of-year trophies. Big Ten coaches have the opportunity to claim two awards. Media voters will select the Dave McClain Coach of the Year, which has been awarded since 1972, while coaches vote for the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award. The top offensive player will receive the Graham-George Offensive Player of the Year award, the best defensive player will be awarded the Nagurski-Woodson Defensive Player of the Year award and the best first-year standout will receive the Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year award.

The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will receive the Amos Alonzo Stagg Championship Trophy, while the most outstanding player in the game will be awarded the Grange-Griffin Championship Game MVP award. The conference also created two postcollegiate awards - the Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award and the Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award.
