BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- The race for the East Division title continues this weekend as Ohio State puts its 6-0 conference record on the line against Indiana. Michigan State is in second place at 5-1 and hosts Rutgers on Saturday. The Buckeyes can clinch at least a share of the East Division crown and a berth in the Big Ten Football Championship Game with a win on Saturday or a Rutgers victory.
- With its win over Nebraska, Wisconsin moved into first place in the West Division with a 5-1 mark in Big Ten play. Iowa, Minnesota and Nebraska are tied for second place with 4-2 conference records. The Badgers would earn at least a share of the West Division title with a win over the Hawkeyes and could also clinch a berth in the Big Ten Football Championship Game with a victory combined with a Huskers win over the Gophers.
- Penn State and Rutgers each secured bowl eligibility with their sixth victory of the season on Saturday, giving the Big Ten nine teams with at least six wins. Michigan would become bowl eligible with one more victory.
- Wisconsin running back Melvin Gordon set a school, Big Ten and Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) record with 408 rushing yards in the Badgers' win over Nebraska on Saturday. Gordon now leads the country in all-purpose yards per game (199.2), rushing yards per game (190.9), rushing touchdowns (29) and yards per carry (8.56).
- Indiana running back Tevin Coleman also broke the 300-yard rushing plateau on Saturday, carrying the ball 32 times for 307 yards against Rutgers. The total was the second most in school history, trailing only Anthony Thompson's previous Big Ten record of 377 yards set in 1989.
- The performances by Coleman and Gordon marked the first time since 2002 that Big Ten running backs produced two performances of 300 or more yards in a single season. Conference backs have now rushed for more than 200 yards 13 times this season, the most since the feat was accomplished 15 times in 2000.
- With four touchdowns against Minnesota, Ohio State quarterback J.T. Barrett has now accounted for a school-record 38 total touchdowns this season. That total is tied with Oregon's Marcus Mariota for the national lead this season and is more touchdowns through 10 starts than any other FBS quarterback in at least the last 10 years.
- With its victory on Saturday, Ohio State extended its Big Ten record conference winning streak to 22 games. The Buckeyes will look to add to that streak on Saturday against Indiana.
- Michigan's Devin Gardner and Nebraska's Ameer Abdullah were named finalists for the 2014 Senior CLASS Award in collegiate football, which honors student-athletes who excel both on and off the field.

BIG TEN BOWL OVERVIEW

- Largest and most diverse bowl lineup in Big Ten history, with:
 - Twelve different bowls and four other College Football Playoff bowls.
 - World class cities coast-to-coast featuring Big Ten alumni and fans.
 - Great opponents from the ACC, Big 12, Pac-12, SEC, Mountain West and Conference USA.
- Selection parameters agreed to by the conference and bowls to ensure fresh and diverse experiences and destinations for student-athletes and fans.
- Big Ten teams will not go to the same bowls in back-to-back years and restrictions are in place on multiple and/or consecutive appearances within states or regions, with the exception of the Rose Bowl Game.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF OVERVIEW

- Comprised of Cotton, Fiesta, Orange, Peach, Rose and Sugar Bowls.
- Selection committee will choose top four teams, then rank and assign to semifinal sites.
- Selection committee will then assign next group of teams to play in other host bowls.
- Highest-ranked champion from non-contract conference guaranteed a berth.
- There is no limit on the number of teams from a conference that can take part in College Football Playoff bowls.

For all non-College Football Playoff partners, the bowl partner will request a Big Ten team. The Big Ten will approve or assign another team based on selection parameters.

ROSE BOWL GAME PRESENTED BY NORTHWESTERN MUTUAL (Pasadena, Calif.)

1. When not hosting a semifinal, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game, unless among the top four teams.
2. If the Big Ten Champion qualifies for the playoff, the Rose Bowl Game will choose a replacement Big Ten team.
3. The Rose Bowl Game has sole discretion on a replacement team, and will generally select the highest-rated available team, but will take into consideration final College Football Playoff rankings, head-to-head competition, division champions and most recent Rose Bowl Game appearances.

CAPITAL ONE ORANGE BOWL (Miami, Fla.) or BUFFALO WILD WINGS CITRUS BOWL (Orlando, Fla.)

1. When not hosting a semifinal, the Orange Bowl will select the highest-ranked team from the Big Ten, SEC or Notre Dame to face an ACC team. The Big Ten is guaranteed a minimum of three Orange Bowl appearances over the 2014-25 seasons.
2. The Big Ten Champion cannot play in the Orange Bowl.
3. If a Big Ten team is not selected by the Orange Bowl, the Citrus Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
4. The Citrus Bowl will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

OUTBACK BOWL (Tampa, Fla.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

NATIONAL UNIVERSITY HOLIDAY BOWL (San Diego, Calif.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

FRANKLIN AMERICAN MORTGAGE MUSIC CITY BOWL (Nashville, Tenn.) or TAXSLAYER BOWL (Jacksonville, Fla.)

1. Either the Music City or TaxSlayer Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
2. The Big Ten will play in three Music City and three TaxSlayer Bowls over the six-year agreement.
3. No Big Ten team will play in more than one Music City Bowl or one TaxSlayer Bowl over the term of the agreement.

NEW ERA PINSTRIPE BOWL (New York, N.Y.)

The goal is to have eight different teams participate in eight years, with a minimum of six different teams over the eight-year agreement.

FOSTER FARMS BOWL (Santa Clara, Calif.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

QUICK LANE BOWL (Detroit, Mich.)

Will select a bowl-eligible team, subject to conference approval.

LOCKHEED MARTIN ARMED FORCES BOWL (Fort Worth, Texas) or ZAXBY'S HEART OF DALLAS BOWL (Dallas, Texas)

1. Will select a bowl-eligible team, subject to conference approval.
2. In 2014, the Heart of Dallas Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
3. The Big Ten will play in three Armed Forces and three Heart of Dallas Bowls over the six-year agreement.

The winner of the East Division will meet the winner of the West Division, with the game's victor earning the Big Ten Championship and a chance to play in one of the six bowls that comprise the College Football Playoff, including the Rose Bowl Game.

FOX will serve as the official broadcast partner of the Big Ten Football Championship Games through 2016, and Lucas Oil Stadium will host the title games through 2021.

BIG TEN FOOTBALL DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKER

The Big Ten football championship will be decided by a game played between the two division champions. A team or teams that are not eligible to participate in a postseason football bowl game as a result of NCAA and/or Big Ten sanctions shall not be eligible to participate in the Big Ten Football Championship Game. The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will represent the conference in one of the bowls that comprise the College Football Playoff - the Cotton, Fiesta, Peach, Orange, Rose or Sugar Bowl. If the Big Ten Champion is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team will play in a semifinal game. Otherwise, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game (when not hosting a semifinal) or the Cotton, Fiesta or Peach Bowl.

The following procedure will determine the representative from each division in the event of a tie:

- (a) If two teams are tied, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
- (b) If three or more teams are tied, steps 1 through 7 will be followed until a determination is made. If only two teams remain tied after any step, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
 1. The records of the three tied teams will be compared against each other.
 2. The records of the three tied teams will be compared within their division.
 3. The records of the three teams will be compared against the next highest placed teams in their division in order of finish (4, 5, and 6).
 4. The records of the three teams will be compared against all common conference opponents.
 5. The highest ranked team in the first College Football Playoff poll following the completion of Big Ten regular season conference play shall be the representative in the Big Ten Championship Game, unless the two highest ranked tied teams are ranked within one spot of each other in the College Football Playoff poll. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the Big Ten Championship Game.
 6. The team with the best overall winning percentage [excluding exempted games] shall be the representative.
 7. The representative will be chosen by random draw.

If one or both of the Big Ten division champions is ineligible to play in the Big Ten Championship Game, then the participant(s) in the Big Ten Championship Game shall be determined by the following procedure:

- a) If the ineligible team is tied for the division championship, then the team it tied with shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- b) If two or more teams are tied with an ineligible team for the division championship, then the ineligible team is removed and the remaining teams revert to the tie-break procedure.
- c) The division runner-up shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- d) If there is a division runner-up tie, then the tied teams shall revert to the tie-break procedure.

If the championship game cannot be played (due to any reason beyond the control of the Big Ten Conference), the two division champions (using divisional tie-breakers as set forth above) shall be declared co-champions and the following procedure will be used to determine the Big Ten Conference representative to the College Football Playoff:

- a) Teams ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll will automatically be placed in the College Football Playoff.
- b) If the two divisional representatives met previously in the season and neither is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team ranked highest in the final poll shall be the representative to the College Football Playoff, unless the other team is ranked within five or fewer places of the higher ranked team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the two teams shall determine the conference's representative.
- c) If the two divisional representatives did not meet previously during the season, the team ranked highest in the College Football Playoff poll shall be the representative.
- d) If the two teams are tied in the College Football Playoff poll, the team with the best overall Big Ten record shall be the representative.
- e) If the two teams remain tied after d), the team with the best combined record of the tied teams against all common Big Ten opponents each team played that season shall be the representative.
- f) If the two teams remain tied after e), the representative will be the team with the best overall winning percentage.
- g) If the two teams remain tied after f), the representative will be the team furthest removed from College Football Playoff, Bowl Championships Series or Rose Bowl Game participation (as appropriate).
- h) If the two teams remain tied after g), the representative shall be determined by a random draw.

The Big Ten's enhanced football awards program presents 18 individual trophies in addition to the Big Ten Championship trophy, bearing the names of one or two former standouts. The distinguished names on these football awards honor just a small sampling of the countless student-athletes and coaches who have contributed to the conference's rich and storied history.

Seventeen of the honors will be awarded immediately following the regular season, including awards for the best quarterback, running back, receiver, tight end, offensive lineman, defensive lineman, linebacker, defensive back, kicker and punter. Each of these individual position awards features the names of two former student-athletes.

The Big Ten will also continue to honor the conference's top coaches, offensive and defensive players and linemen and freshmen with end-of-year trophies. Big Ten coaches have the opportunity to claim two awards. Media voters will select the Dave McClain Coach of the Year, which has been awarded since 1972, while coaches vote for the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award. The top offensive player will receive the Graham-George Offensive Player of the Year award, the best defensive player will be awarded the Nagurski-Woodson Defensive Player of the Year award and the best first-year standout will receive the Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year award.

The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will receive the Amos Alonzo Stagg Championship Trophy, while the most outstanding player in the game will be awarded the Grange-Griffin Championship Game MVP award. The conference also created two postcollegiate awards - the Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award and the Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award.
