BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

• With its victory on Saturday, Ohio State secured a berth in the Big Ten Football Championship Game for the second consecutive season and also clinched at least a share of the Big Ten East Division title. The Buckeyes improved to 7-0 in the Big Ten, earning at least a share of a division title for the third straight year. Michigan State won over Rutgers to improve to 6-1 in conference and still maintains hopes for a share of the division title. But Ohio State clinched a berth in the championship game based on its victory over the Spartans on Nov. 8.

• Wisconsin improved to 6-1 in conference play and earned at least a share of the Big Ten West Division crown with its win at Iowa on Saturday, clinching the program's second division crown. Minnesota posted a road triumph at Nebraska on Saturday to move to 5-2 in conference and still has an opportunity to secure a share of the division title and a trip to the Big Ten Football Championship Game. The Badgers host the Gophers on Saturday, with the winner representing the West Division in the title game against the Buckeyes.

• With 200 rushing yards against Iowa, Wisconsin running back Melvin Gordon matched the Big Ten and school record for most rushing yards in a season of 2,109 yards set by former Badger Ron Dayne in 1996. Gordon, who leads the country in all-purpose yards per game (205.1), rushing yards per game (191.7) and rushing touchdowns (25), became the fastest player to reach 2,000 yards in NCAA history, doing so on his 241st carry of the season.

• After 200-yard performances by Indiana's Tevin Coleman and Gordon on Saturday, conference backs have now rushed for more than 200 yards 15 times this season, the most since the feat was accomplished 15 times in 2000. Four different conference players have rushed for at least 200 yards in a game this season, a group that includes Coleman (four times), Minnesota's David Cobb (two), Nebraska's Ameer Abdullah (four) and Gordon (five).

• Ohio State extended its Big Ten record conference winning streak to 23 games with its win over Indiana on Saturday. The Buckeyes will look to become the first team to go without a loss in Big Ten play for three straight seasons since Minnesota from 1933-35, and the first team ever to produce no ties or losses in conference contests over a three-year period in Big Ten history.

• With four touchdowns against Indiana, Ohio State quarterback J.T. Barrett is now responsible for 42 touchdowns this season (33 passing, nine rushing). That total matches the Big Ten record for most touchdowns responsible for in a season, tying the mark set by Purdue's Drew Brees in 1998 (39 passing, three rushing).

• Illinois, Michigan and Northwestern each have the opportunity to secure bowl eligibility with a victory on Saturday. The Wolverines will visit the Buckeyes while the Illini and Wildcats will meet in Evanston. Nine teams from the Big Ten have secured bowl eligibility so far this season.

BIG TEN BOWL OVERVIEW

- Largest and most diverse bowl lineup in Big Ten history, with:

- Big Ten teams will not go to the same bowls in back-to-back years and restrictions are in place on multiple and/or consecutive appearances within states or regions, with the exception of the Rose Bowl Game.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF OVERVIEW

- Comprised of Cotton, Fiesta, Orange, Peach, Rose and Sugar Bowls.
- Selection committee will choose top four teams, then rank and assign to semifinal sites.

ROSE BOWL GAME PRESENTED BY NORTHWESTERN MUTUAL (Pasadena, Calif.)

1. When not hosting a semifinal, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game, unless among the top four teams.
2. If the Big Ten Champion qualifies for the playoff, the Rose Bowl Game will choose a replacement Big Ten team.
3. The Rose Bowl Game has sole discretion on a replacement team, and will generally select the highest-rated available team, but will take into consideration final College Football Playoff rankings, head-to-head competition, division champions and most recent Rose Bowl Game appearances.

CAPITAL ONE ORANGE BOWL (Miami, Fla.) or BUFFALO WILD WINGS CITRUS BOWL (Orlando, Fla.)

1. When not hosting a semifinal, the Orange Bowl will select the highest-ranked team from the Big Ten, SEC or Notre Dame to face an ACC team. The Big Ten is guaranteed a minimum of three Orange Bowl appearances over the 2014-25 seasons.
2. The Big Ten Champion cannot play in the Orange Bowl.
3. If a Big Ten team is not selected by the Orange Bowl, the Citrus Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
4. The Citrus Bowl will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

OUTBACK BOWL (Tampa, Fla.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

NATIONAL UNIVERSITY HOLIDAY BOWL (San Diego, Calif.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

FRANKLIN AMERICAN MORTGAGE MUSIC CITY BOWL (Nashville, Tenn.) or TAXSLAYER BOWL (Jacksonville, Fla.)

1. Either the Music City or TaxSlayer Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
2. The Big Ten will play in three Music City and three TaxSlayer Bowls over the six-year agreement.
3. No Big Ten team will play in more than one Music City Bowl and one TaxSlayer Bowl over the term of the agreement.

NEW ERA PINSTRIPE BOWL (New York, N.Y.)

The goal is to have eight different teams participate in eight years, with a minimum of six different teams over the eight-year agreement.

FOSTER FARMS BOWL (Santa Clara, Calif.)

Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over the six-year agreement.

QUICK LANE BOWL (Detroit, Mich.)

Will select a bowl-eligible team, subject to conference approval.

LOCKHEED MARTIN ARMED FORCES BOWL (Fort Worth, Texas) or ZAXBY'S HEART OF DALLAS BOWL (Dallas, Texas)

1. Will select a bowl-eligible team, subject to conference approval.
2. In 2014, the Heart of Dallas Bowl will submit a request for a Big Ten team.
3. The Big Ten will play in three Armed Forces and three Heart of Dallas Bowls over the six-year agreement.

BIG TEN FOOTBALL DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKER

The Big Ten football championship will be decided by a game played between the two division champions. A team or teams that are not eligible to participate in a postseason football bowl game as a result of NCAA and/or Big Ten sanctions shall not be eligible to participate in the Big Ten Football Championship Game. The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will represent the conference in one of the bowls that comprise the College Football Playoff - the Cotton, Fiesta, Peach, Orange, Rose or Sugar Bowl. If the Big Ten Champion is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team will play in a semifinal game. Otherwise, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game (when not hosting a semifinal) or the Cotton, Fiesta or Peach Bowl.

The following procedure will determine the representative from each division in the event of a tie:

- (a) If two teams are tied, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
- (b) If three or more teams are tied, steps 1 through 7 will be followed until a determination is made. If only two teams remain tied after any step, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
 1. The records of the three tied teams will be compared against each other.
 2. The records of the three tied teams will be compared within their division.
 3. The records of the three teams will be compared against the next highest placed teams in their division in order of finish (4, 5, and 6).
 4. The records of the three teams will be compared against all common conference opponents.
 5. The highest ranked team in the first College Football Playoff poll following the completion of Big Ten regular season conference play shall be the representative in the Big Ten Championship Game, unless the two highest ranked tied teams are ranked within one spot of each other in the College Football Playoff poll. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the Big Ten Championship Game.
 6. The team with the best overall winning percentage [excluding exempted games] shall be the representative.
 7. The representative will be chosen by random draw.

If one or both of the Big Ten division champions is ineligible to play in the Big Ten Championship Game, then the participant(s) in the Big Ten Championship Game shall be determined by the following procedure:

- a) If the ineligible team is tied for the division championship, then the team it tied with shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- b) If two or more teams are tied with an ineligible team for the division championship, then the ineligible team is removed and the remaining teams revert to the tie-break procedure.
- c) The division runner-up shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- d) If there is a division runner-up tie, then the tied teams shall revert to the tie-break procedure.

If the championship game cannot be played (due to any reason beyond the control of the Big Ten Conference), the two division champions (using divisional tie-breakers as set forth above) shall be declared co-champions and the following procedure will be used to determine the Big Ten Conference representative to the College Football Playoff:

- a) Teams ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll will automatically be placed in the College Football Playoff.
- b) If the two divisional representatives met previously in the season and neither is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team ranked highest in the final poll shall be the representative to the College Football Playoff, unless the other team is ranked within five or fewer places of the higher ranked team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the two teams shall determine the conference's representative.
- c) If the two divisional representatives did not meet previously during the season, the team ranked highest in the College Football Playoff poll shall be the representative.
- d) If the two teams are tied in the College Football Playoff poll, the team with the best overall Big Ten record shall be the representative.
- e) If the two teams remain tied after d), the team with the best combined record of the tied teams against all common Big Ten opponents each team played that season shall be the representative.
- f) If the two teams remain tied after e), the representative will be the team with the best overall winning percentage.
- g) If the two teams remain tied after f), the representative will be the team furthest removed from College Football Playoff, Bowl Championships Series or Rose Bowl Game participation (as appropriate).
- h) If the two teams remain tied after g), the representative shall be determined by a random draw.

Seventeen of the honors will be awarded immediately following the regular season, including awards for the best quarterback, running back, receiver, tight end, offensive lineman, defensive lineman, linebacker, defensive back, kicker and punter. Each of these individual position awards features the names of two former student-athletes.

The Big Ten will also continue to honor the conference's top coaches, offensive and defensive players and linemen and freshmen with end-of-year trophies. Big Ten coaches have the opportunity to claim two awards. Media voters will select the Dave McClain Coach of the Year, which has been awarded since 1972, while coaches vote for the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award. The top offensive player will receive the Graham-George Offensive Player of the Year award, the best defensive player will be awarded the Nagurski-Woodson Defensive Player of the Year award and the best first-year standout will receive the Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year award.

The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will receive the Amos Alonzo Stagg Championship Trophy, while the most outstanding player in the game will be awarded the Grange-Griffin Championship Game MVP award. The conference also created two postcollegiate awards - the Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award and the Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award.
