RADIO -- (Originating Network): Learfield Communications with a network of over 40 stations. Gary Dolphin and Ed Podolak will call the action, along with sideline reporter Rob Brooks. The game can also be heard on KRUI (89.7 FM), the UI student radio station, and Sirius channel 135 and XM channel 195 on satellite radio.

TELEVISION -- The game will be televised by ESPN2. The announcers are Beth Mowins, Joey Galloway and Paul Carcaterra.

THE RECORDS -- Iowa (5-1, 2-0) opened the season with wins over Northern Iowa (31-23) and Ball State (17-13) before a 20-17 last-second loss to Iowa State, all at home. The Hawkeyes rallied for a 24-20 win at Pittsburgh to close nonconference action. In Big Ten play Iowa won 24-10 win at Purdue and defeated Indiana 45-29 in Iowa City.

Maryland (4-2, 1-1) was idle last weekend. The Terrapins have wins over James Madison (52-7), South Florida (24-17), Syracuse (34-20) and Indiana (37-15), with losses at the hands of West Virginia (40-27) and Ohio State (52-24).

THE SERIES -- Iowa and Maryland have never met on the football field, as the Terrapins are in their first year in the Big Ten Conference.

COACHING RECORDS -- Kirk Ferentz is in his 19th year as a college head coach and his 16th year as Iowa's head coach. His career record is 125-101 and he is 113-80 at Iowa. He is the 12th Big Ten Conference coach to win 100 games. His Big Ten record is 66-56. Ferentz is tied for ninth in Big Ten history in total wins and conference victories.

Randy Edsall is in his fourth season as Maryland's head coach and his 16th year overall as a college head coach. His career mark stands at 91-96 and he is 17-26 at Maryland. He previously was the head coach at Connecticut (1999-2010). He has been an assistant coach at Georgia Tech, Boston College and Syracuse, and Jacksonville of the NFL.

NEXT GAME -- Iowa is idle on Oct. 25, the second open weekend for the Hawkeyes in October. Iowa returns home to host Northwestern on Nov. 1. Maryland travels to Wisconsin on Oct. 25.

IOWA/MARYLAND NOTES

- Saturday is the first ever football game between the two schools.
- Iowa has won four straight and six of its last seven on the road.
- Iowa and Maryland have benefitted from opponents penalties more than any other schools. Iowa's opponents have been flagged for an average of 72.0 penalty yards per game; Maryland's opponents have been flagged for 61.8 yards per game. Those numbers rank 1-2, respectively, in the Big Ten.
- Iowa has eight interceptions this season, tied for fourth most in the Big Ten. Maryland has thrown eight interceptions this season, the second-highest total in the conference.
- Maryland allows 212.0 rushing yards per game, ranking 13th in the Big Ten. Iowa's rushing yards have increased in five straight games, including a season-high 207 rushing yards against Indiana on Oct. 11.
- DT Louis Trinca-Pasat (39) and Maryland DL Andre Malone (36) rank first and second, respectively, in tackles among Big Ten linemen.
- Iowa has converted nine fourth-down attempts, more than any other Big Ten team. Maryland is perfect on five fourth-down attempts.
- Iowa's defense has allowed only four red-zone touchdowns, the fewest in the Big Ten. Maryland's offense has 12 red-zone touchdowns, the second-fewest in the Big Ten.
- Maryland leads the Big Ten in red-zone defense, allowing 15 scores on 24 red-zone trips. Iowa ranks 13th in red zone offense, scoring on 19-of-26 trips.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS

Saturday marks the first ever football game between Maryland and Iowa. The Hawkeyes are 0-2 in their first conference games against the Big Ten's newest member institutions. The Hawkeyes lost to Penn State, 31-0, at home in 1993, and lost at Nebraska, 20-7, in 2011. Iowa and Rutgers are scheduled to meet on the football field for the first time on Sept. 24, 2016, in Piscataway, N.J.

@HawkeyeFootball NOTES

- Iowa is one win from securing bowl eligibility for the 13th time in the last 14 seasons.
- Iowa is 2-0 in conference play for the fifth time under Kirk Ferentz (2002, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2014). Since 1999, Iowa started 3-0 in the Big Ten in 2009 (5-0) and 2002 (8-0).
- Iowa is 5-1 for the second straight year and sixth time since 1999. The last time Iowa won six of its first seven games was 2009 when it started 9-0. Since 1999, the only other time Iowa won six of its first seven games was 2002 (started 11-1, finished 11-2).
- Iowa has won four straight and six of its last seven on the road. The Hawkeyes have won four consecutive road games, dating back to last season, for the first time since 2009, when they won their first four road games of the season.
- Iowa has won six road games since the start of the 2013 season, which tie for the seventh most in the country during that span.
- Iowa has recorded an interception on its opponents' final drive in four games this season (CB Greg Mabin vs. UNI; FS Anthony Gair at Pitt; SS John Lowdermilk at Purdue; FS Jordan Lomax vs. Indiana).
- Iowa has had an interception return for a touchdown in each of the last seven seasons and 12 of the last 14 seasons. CB Desmond King returned an interception for a touchdown (35 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 11.
- The Hawkeyes are allowing only 94.0 passing yards per game in Big Ten games, the best in the conference.
- Iowa ranks No. 2 in total defense (294.0 ypg) in conference games only.
- The Hawkeyes are the least penalized team in the Big Ten (22 penalties, 29.8 ypg).
- Sixteen Hawkeyes have caught at least one pass this season (seven backs, six receivers, three tight ends). The Hawkeyes have had 10 or more players record at least one catch in four of their five wins.
- Iowa has converted nine fourth-down attempts, more than any other Big Ten team. The Hawkeyes have scored two touchdowns on fourth down (one pass, one rush).
- Iowa converted three fourth-down attempts against Iowa State and Pitt. In Kirk Ferentz' previous 189 games, the Hawkeyes had three games with three fourth-down conversions.
- Iowa has used 12 first-time starters -- four on offense (FB John Kenny, WR Jacob Hillyer, FB Macon Plewa, OL Sean Welsh) six on defense (DE Nate Meier, LB Bo Bower, CB Maurice Fleming, FS Anthony Gair, CB Greg Mabin, LB Reggie Spearman), and two on special teams (P Dillon Kidd and K Marshall Koehn).
- Three true freshmen have seen action -- K Mick Ellis, LB Ben Niemann and DB Miles Taylor.
- Iowa has received the opening kickoff in all six games.

@HawkeyeFootball MILESTONES

- QB Jake Rudock has 3,391 career passing yards, the 10th highest total in school history. His 25 career touchdown passes are the ninth most in program history.
- RB Mark Weisman is one of eight players in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards and 20 career rushing touchdowns. He has 2,139 career rushing yards, the 11th most in program history, and 24 career rushing touchdowns, tied for the fourth most in program history.
- WR Kevonte Martin-Manley leads Iowa with 29 receptions. He ranks No. 5 in school history with 151 career receptions. He needs 23 catches to break Iowa's all-time receptions record (Derrell Johnson-Koulianos, 173). Martin-Manley ranks No. 17 with 1,527 receiving yards.

- Iowa scored four touchdowns in a span of 3:38 against Indiana (TE Jake Duzey reception, CB Desmond King interception, WR Damond Powell reception, RB Jonathan Parker rush).
- Iowa scored on three straight offensive plays in the first quarter against Indiana. TE Jake Duzey caught a 12-yard touchdown pass from QB Jake Rudock with 4:41 left. On Iowa's next play from scrimmage, WR Damond Powell caught a 72-yard touchdown pass from Rudock. On Iowa's next play from scrimmage, RB Jonathan Parker ran for a 60-yard touchdown.
- Against Indiana, Iowa scored two offensive touchdowns of 60 yards or greater (Rudock to Powell, 72 yards; Parker 60-yard rush) for the first time since Oct. 31, 2009 vs. Indiana. (Stanzi to McNutt, 92 yards; Stanzi to Johnson-Koulianos, 66 yards).

@HawkeyeFootball COMEBACKS

- Iowa is 3-0 when trailing or tied at halftime this year (trailed Ball State, 7-3; trailed Pitt, 17-7; tied Purdue, 10-10).
- Iowa trailed in each of its first four wins, and erased 10-point deficits in three wins (Ball State, Pitt, Purdue). The Hawkeyes never trailed against Indiana.
- Iowa has two fourth-quarter comebacks this season (Ball State and Pitt). Iowa erased a 10-point deficit to defeat Ball State, 17-13, at home, and rallied from down 17-7 to win at Pitt, 24-20.
- Iowa's win at Pitt was its first road win after trailing by 10 or more points in the second half during the Ferentz era.
- Iowa has outscored its opponents 69-44 in the second half.

LITTLE PARKER, BIG BOOM

Redshirt freshman RB Jonathan Parker, who at 5-8 stands as the shortest player on the team, leads the Big Ten averaging 27.4 yards per kickoff return (seven returns, 192 yards). He also averages 10.8 yards per carry, and 14.0 yards per reception. Parker averages 17.7 yards every time he touches the ball. Only WR Damond Powell averages more yards per touch among Hawkeyes (24.0).

THE NEXT NEXT-MAN-IN

Fifth-year senior C Tommy Gaul saw the most significant snaps of his career in Iowa's 45-29 win over Indiana on Oct. 11. Gaul entered the game on Iowa's opening drive when RG Jordan Walsh left due to injury. Starting center Austin Blythe slid to right guard, and Gaul handled snaps the rest of the game. Gaul, a Des Moines native, joined Iowa as a walk-on in 2010. He appeared in one game in 2011, and two games in 2013.

IOWA'S LAST TIME OUT

- Iowa (5-1, 2-0) defeated Indiana (3-3, 0-2), 45-29, Oct. 11 at Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes scored a season-high 45 points. It is the most points scored by Iowa in a Big Ten game since scoring 45 against Indiana in 2011.
- Iowa scored 28 points in the first quarter, the most points scored in the first quarter since scoring 28 against Ball State on Sept. 3, 2005.
- Iowa scored 38 first-half points, tying the most first-half points in a conference game under Kirk Ferentz (Minnesota, 2005). It is Iowa's highest scoring first half in a Big Ten game since scoring 35 against Indiana in 2011.
- Iowa scored 14 points off turnovers, its first such points this season. CB Desmond King returned an interception for a touchdown in the first quarter. RB Mark Weisman scored a rushing touchdown in the second quarter following LB Bo Bower's interception.
- Iowa scored two offensive touchdowns of 60 yards or greater for the first time since Oct. 31, 2009 vs. Indiana. (Stanzi to McNutt, 92 yards; Stanzi to Johnson-Koulianos, 66 yards).
- Iowa scored on three straight offensive plays in the first quarter. TE Jake Duzey caught a 12-yard touchdown pass from QB Jake Rudock with 4:41 left. On Iowa's next play from scrimmage, WR Damond Powell caught a 72-yard touchdown pass from Rudock. On Iowa's next play from scrimmage, RB Jonathan Parker ran for a 60-yard touchdown.
- QB Jake Rudock's 72-yard touchdown pass to WR Damond Powell was Iowa's longest play this season.
- RB Jonathan Parker rushed for a 60-yard touchdown in the first quarter. It was Parker's first career touchdown, and a career-long rush.
- CB Desmond King recorded his first career interception in the first quarter. King returned the interceptions 35 yards for a touchdown.
- FS Jordan Lomax intercepted a pass in the end zone on Indiana's final possession (1:16 in the fourth quarter). It was his first career interception.

45 JOINS 20-2,000 CLUB

Senior RB Mark Weisman is one of eight players in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards and 20 career rushing touchdowns. The other seven include Sedrick Shaw, Ladell Betts, Albert Young, Tavian Banks, Owen Gill, Ronnie Harmon, and Shonn Greene.

In 29 career games, Weisman has scored 24 rushing touchdowns and rushed for 2,139 yards. After spending the 2010 season at Air Force, Weisman joined the Hawkeyes as a walk-on and redshirted in 2011. He saw his first action as a sophomore in 2012.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 16th season as head football coach at Iowa and is the dean of Big Ten Conference football coaches. His latest contract extension runs through the 2020 season.



- Named Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year in 2002, 2004 and 2009, joining Hayden Fry, Bo Schembechler and Joe Paterno as the only three-time recipients.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004.
- Ferentz ties for ninth with 113 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 66 Big Ten wins, tying for ninth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl.
- Iowa has played in seven January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 104-60 (.634) overall mark and a 61-43 (.587) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference nine times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and a second-place finish in 2009.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 113-80 (.585) and a 66-56 (.541) mark in Big Ten games. In his 19th season as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 125-101 (.553). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- Believed to be the only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, in his third season as Iowa's offensive line coach, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven is an offensive lineman in his third season.

FERENTZ AMONG TOP 10

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz has 113 wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference, tying Fielding Yost (MICH) for No. 9 in conference history. He has 66 Big Ten wins, tying George Perles (MSU) and Murray Warmath (MINN) for ninth most in conference history. He is one of eight coaches to rank among the top 10 in both categories. The others include Woody Hayes (OSU), Amos Alonzo Stagg (CHI), Bo Schembechler (MICH), Hayden Fry (IOWA), Robert Zuppke (ILL), Lloyd Carr (MICH), and Barry Alvarez (WIS).

Ferentz also has six bowl wins as a member of the Big Ten, tying Fry and Carr for No. 2 all-time. Only Alvarez has more (8).

KOEHN No. 1 ON KICKOFFS

Junior K Marshall Koehn leads the conference and ranks second in the nation in touchback percentage. He has recorded a touchback on 24 of his 31 kickoffs (77.4 percent). His 24 touchbacks tie for the Big Ten lead.

- Koehn is perfect on 13 PAT attempts, and has connected on 6-of-9 field goal attempts.
- Connected on a 52-yard field goal in the third quarter (0:48) at Pitt. It was a career long and ties for the eighth longest in school history. It was Iowa's longest field goal since All-American Nate Kaeding split the uprights from 55 yards against Minnesota in 2003.
- Hit a game-tying 44-yard field goal in the fourth quarter (4:08) against Iowa State.
- Including his 22-yard field goal against Indiana, Koehn has connected on his last four field goal attempts.

LB QUINTON ALSTON (SR., 6-1, 232)

Career Games Played/Starts: 39/7

Senior LB Quinton Alston has started all six games this season and leads the team with 44 tackles. He entered the year with one career start (at Michigan, 2012).

- Ranks No. 16 in the Big Ten in tackles.
- Entered the season with 24 career tackles. Has 44 tackles, including three for loss, one sack, two breakups, and one forced fumble.
- Recorded a career-high 10 tackles against Iowa State.
- Recorded the first sack of his career against Northern Iowa.

C AUSTIN BLYTHE (JR., 6-3, 290)

Junior C Austin Blythe is in his second season as Iowa's starting center. Blythe has started 24 consecutive games. He started all 19 games at center since the 2013 season opener. He made nine starts at right guard in 2012.

QB JAKE RUDOCK (JR., 6-3, 208)

Career Games Played/Starts: 18/18

Junior QB Jake Rudock returned to the starting lineup against Indiana after missing one game due to injury. He has started 18 of Iowa's 19 games since the start of 2013. He is 12-6 as a starter, including a 5-1 record on the road, and a 7-4 mark at home (0-1 neutral).

- Among Iowa's all-time career passing leaders. He has 3,391 career passing yards, the 10th highest total in school history. He threw two touchdown passes against Indiana, raising his career total to 25, the ninth most in program history.
- Led Iowa to four road wins in 2013-14, the highest total for an Iowa starting quarterback since Ricky Stanzi won four games in 2009. Iowa is 1-0 on the road this season when Rudock starts.
- Set a career high in passing yards (322), completions (33) and attempts (52) in Iowa's come-from-behind win against Ball State.
- Rushed for a career-high 36 yards on seven carries against Ball State.
- First Big Ten quarterback with 570-plus yards and 60-plus completions through a team's first two games since Northwestern's Brett Basanez in 2004.
- He has three career game-winning drives in the fourth quarter or overtime (Michigan and Northwestern in 2013, Ball State in 2014). Only five active quarterbacks in NCAA have more game-winning drives in the fourth quarter or overtime.
- Streak of 17 consecutive starts was snapped Sept. 27 at Purdue. Rudock was injured in Week 4 at Pitt, and did not return to the game after halftime. He had started 17 straight dating back to the 2013 season opener.
- On Iowa's final two drives against Ball State, Rudock was 9-for-11 for 81 yards passing and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 32 yards on Iowa's final two drives. He finished the game with a career-high 322 yards on 33-of-52 passing. He became Iowa's first QB with 30-plus completions, 300-plus passing yards and no interceptions in a game since Jon Beutjer against Indiana in 2000.
- His 322 passing yards against Ball State rank No. 29 in program history for a single-game.
- Completed 31-for-41 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns against Northern Iowa. Rudock distributed the ball to 13 different receivers, the most during the Kirk Ferentz era (1999-2014). It marked only the fourth game by a Big Ten team, since 2000, where at least 13 different players recorded at least one reception.
- His career totals include 308-of-500 pass attempts for 3,391 yards and 25 touchdowns.
- 2014 Preseason Watch Lists include the Manning Award and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Trophy.
- Threw for a then career-best 256 yards in 2013 season opener against Northern Illinois. Completed 21-of-37 passes, including one touchdown and one interception. The 256 passing yards ties for the fourth-highest by a Hawkeye quarterback making his first career start.
- Ten of Rudock's 18 touchdown passes in 2013 were 20-plus yards.
- Rushed for five touchdowns in 2013, the highest single-season total by an Iowa quarterback since Nathan Chandler rushed for six touchdowns in 2003. He scored his first touchdown of the season vs. Iowa State.
- 2013 Capital One District Academic All-America first team, Academic All-Big Ten.

QB C.J. BEATHARD (SO., 6-2, 203)**Career Games Played/Starts: 10/1**

Sophomore QB C.J. Beathard made his first career start and led Iowa to a 24-10 win at Purdue on Sept. 27. He became the first Iowa quarterback to win his first career start in a road game since Jason Manson won at Syracuse in 2006. Beathard completed 17-of-37 passes for 245 yards and one touchdown. The completions, attempts and yardage totals are career highs. He also rushed eight times for 29 yards, both career highs.

- Beathard has appeared in four games this year (Ball State, Purdue, Pitt, Indiana). He started the second half at Pitt and led Iowa on three straight scoring drives to start the second half (TD, FG, TD). He was 7-for-8 for 98 yards on Iowa's three scoring drives.
- His 62-yard completion to WR Damond Powell in the third quarter at Pitt was a career long.
- Led Iowa on a seven-play, season-long 94-yard touchdown drive to open the second half at Pitt.
- He was 9-27 for 179 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions in five appearances in 2013.
- He was 2-of-3 passing for 20 yards this season entering the Pitt game.

RB DAMON BULLOCK (SR., 6-0, 205)**Career Games Played/Starts: 30/12**

Senior RB Damon Bullock ranks fourth on the team with 17 receptions. He set a career high with 20 receptions for 173 yards in 2013. Bullock returned to the lineup against Indiana after missing Iowa's game at Purdue due to injury.

- Caught a career-high six passes for 32 yards in Iowa's win over Ball State.
- Has 1,052 career rushing yards on 283 carries. He is the 44th player in program history to rush for 1,000 career yards. He rushed for 20 yards as a true freshman in 2011, 513 yards as a sophomore in 2012, and 467 yards as a junior. Iowa's 44 career 1,000-yard rushers is the eighth most by any FBS school.
- In 2013, he was Iowa's third-leading rusher (467 yards), and fourth-leading receiver (20 receptions).
- Rushed for 513 yards in 2012, despite missing six games due to injury.
- Has two career 100-yard rushing games (Northern Illinois, 2012; Northwestern, 2012).
- In the 2012 season opener, Bullock rushed for 150 yards in his first career start.
- Preseason Watch Lists include Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award.

LT BRANDON SCHERFF (SR., 6-5, 320)**Career Games Played/Started: 37/29**

Senior LT Brandon Scherff has started the last 19 games at left tackle. He was named the Roy J. Carver Most Valuable Player (offense) following the 2013 season, when he started all 13 games at left tackle and was named second team All-America by Football Writers Association of America, Phil Steele, and College Sports Madness.

RB JORDAN CANZERI (JR., 5-9, 192)**Career Games Played/Starts: 25/2**

Junior RB Jordan Canzeri ranks second on the team with 323 all-purpose yards, including 184 yards rushing, 66 yards receiving, and 73 yards in kickoff returns.

- Rushed for a season-high 63 yards on a season-high 15 carries at Purdue.
- Made his second career start Sept. 20 at Pitt. It was his first start since the 2012 Insight Bowl.

CB DESMOND KING (SO., 5-11, 190)

Career Games Played/Starts: 19/18

Sophomore CB Desmond King has started 18 consecutive games since entering the starting lineup in Week 2 of his true freshman season.

- Recorded his first career interception in the first quarter against Indiana, returning it 35 yards for a touchdown.
- Had a season-high seven tackles, including six solo stops, against Indiana.
- Recorded five tackles at Purdue.
- Recorded four tackles, including one for a loss (2 yards), and a pass break-up at Pitt.
- Recorded five tackles against Iowa State.
- Credited with five tackles and a pass break-up against Northern Iowa.
- Recorded three tackles against Ball State.
- In 2013, appeared in all 13 games and started the final 12.

TE JAKE DUZEY (JR., 6-4, 245)

Career Games Played/Starts: 30/10

Junior TE Jake Duzey has 18 receptions this season, one shy of matching his single-season career best of 19 set in 2013. He ranks third among Big Ten tight ends in receptions.

- Recorded a season-high four receptions against Indiana, including a 12-yard touchdown, the fourth of his career and second this season.
- Caught the game-winning touchdown pass (12 yards) from QB Jake Rudock with 1:23 left in the fourth quarter against Ball State on Sept. 6.
- Ranks third on the team with 18 receptions. Among Big Ten tight ends, only Purdue's Justin Sinz (22) has more receptions.
- Caught a career-high seven passes for 34 yards against Northern Iowa.
- His 138 receiving yards on a career-best six catches against Ohio State in 2013 are the most by a tight end in the Kirk Ferentz era, and the most by a Hawkeye since Marvin McNutt had 151 yards on nine catches at Purdue in 2011.
- His 85-yard touchdown reception is the ninth-longest in school history, and the third-longest by a tight end (Dallas Clark, 95 yards vs. Purdue in 2002). It was also the third-longest pass-play in the Big Ten in 2013.
- Caught three passes for 58 yards in the 2014 Outback Bowl.

Senior WR Kevonte Martin-Manley leads Iowa and ties for ninth in the Big Ten with 29 receptions. Thirteen of his 29 catches have resulted in a first down or a touchdown. He ranks No. 5 in school history with 151 career receptions, and his 1,527 receiving yards rank No. 17 all-time.

- Needs 23 catches to break Iowa's all-time receptions record (Derrell Johnson-Koulianos, 173).
- Caught team-high five passes for 74 yards and a touchdown at Purdue. Four of his five grabs resulted in a first down, the other was a touchdown. The touchdown was his first of the season and 11th of his career.
- Caught a game-high eight passes for 70 yards against Ball State.
- Caught a game-high eight passes for 62 yards against Northern Iowa.
- Led Iowa in receiving yards in 2012 and 2013. His 232 receiving yards lead Iowa in 2014. Since 1943, only three players have led Iowa in receiving yards three straight seasons (Jim Gibbons, 1955-57; Tim Dwight, 1995-97; Derrell Johnson-Koulianos, 2007-09).
- He needs one reception to tie Kahlil Hill (152) for No. 4 on the all-time receptions list.
- Has caught at least one pass in 35 of the last 36 games. He had a reception in 23 consecutive games before leaving the Michigan State (10/5/13) contest with a leg injury and without a reception.
- Led Iowa with 40 receptions and 388 receiving yards in 2013.
- He ranked second in the Big Ten and eighth in the nation in punt return average (15.7) in 2013. He had 20 returns for 314 yards and two touchdowns last season. Iowa led the Big Ten, averaging 14.0 yards per punt return.
- Had consecutive punt return touchdowns of 83 and 63 yards against Western Michigan in 2013, becoming the first Big Ten player to ever return back-to-back-punts for touchdowns, and the first Iowa player to return two punts for a touchdown in a single game.

Junior DE Drew Ott leads Iowa and ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 4.5 sacks. He also has a team-high 7.5 tackles for loss, the fifth most in the conference. He has started 18 of the last 19 games at defensive end, including all six games this season.

- Through six games, Ott has 7.5 tackles for loss, more than he had all of last season (6.5).
- He leads Iowa with 4.5 sacks (27 yards). He entered the season with 4.5 career sacks, including a then-season best 2.5 sacks in 2013.

Senior RB Mark Weisman has 24 career rushing touchdowns, tying David Hudson for fourth in program history. Only Sedrick Shaw (33), Tavian Banks (33), and Ladell Betts (25) have more career rushing touchdowns than Weisman.

- Weisman has 24 career rushing touchdowns and 2,139 career rushing yards.
- Through six games, he has matched his single-season touchdown total from 2013 (8) and 2012 (8).
- He has more rushing touchdowns (24) than any other player under Kirk Ferentz.
- He is one of eight players in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards and 20 career rushing touchdowns. He has 2,139 career rushing yards, and 24 career rushing touchdowns. The other seven include Sedrick Shaw, Ladell Betts, Albert Young, Tavian Banks, Owen Gill, Ronnie Harmon, and Shonn Greene.
- Eight rushing touchdowns are fourth most in the Big Ten.
- He has rushed for a touchdown in nine of his last 10 games dating back to last season. He has 13 rushing touchdowns over the last 10 games.
- Weisman is 6-for-6 on fourth down conversion attempts this season, including two 1-yard touchdowns.
- Weisman has 2,139 career rushing yards, a number that ranks 12th all-time in program history.
- Has three straight games with two rushing touchdowns (at Purdue, at Pitt, vs. Indiana). Has seven career multi-touchdown games, including three this season.
- In 2013, he led Iowa in rushing yards (975) for the second straight season and matched his career high with a team-best eight touchdowns. He led Iowa with 815 yards and eight touchdowns in 2012.
- Rushed for 100 or more yards four times in 2013, and has eight career 100-yard games.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- There are 27 Hawkeyes currently active in the NFL.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 22 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State (23) has more. Iowa has had three first round picks in the last five NFL drafts, only Wisconsin (4) has more among league teams.
- Iowa had 18 players drafted from 2010-12. Six Hawkeyes were drafted in each of those years, including three first round picks (OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012).
- Iowa and Alabama were the only two college football programs to have a first round draft selection following the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles.
- Former Hawkeyes Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) and Chad Greenway (Minnesota LB) were named to the Pro Bowl for the first time in their respective NFL careers in 2012. Greenway was a repeat selection in 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his second year as Iowa's offensive line coach, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Every Iowa senior starting tight end (10) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team in his first year as a rookie.
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Over the past 12 years, 114-of-128 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.

BEST IN THE BIG TEN

Iowa has posted a 6-5 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Since the 2001 season, no Big Ten team has won more bowl games or has a higher winning percentage in bowl games, than Iowa. Following is the record for Big Ten teams in bowl games since 2001:

LEARNING LINEBACKERS

LB Quinton Alston, LB Bo Bower, and LB Reggie Spearman have started all six games this season at their respective linebacker positions. Entering this year, the trio combined for one career start (Alston).

- Alston leads the team with 44 tackles.
- Bower recorded an interception against Indiana, his second of year. The pass was broken up by Alston, tipped in the air by Spearman, and caught by Bower. Iowa turned the turnover into a RB Mark Weisman rushing touchdown.
- The trio has accounted for 7.0 tackles for loss this season.
- Each player has recorded one sack.
- Alston has one forced fumble.
- Bower has two of Iowa's eight interceptions.

49 AND COUNTING

The Hawkeyes have played 49 consecutive games without a missed or blocked PAT, the longest streak of any school in the nation. Iowa has converted on 143 consecutive PATs during the streak.

GLANCE AT THE SCHEDULE

- The Hawkeyes defeated Purdue in their Big Ten opener on Sept. 27. It marked the 12th time in Kirk Ferentz' 16 years at Iowa that the Hawkeyes opened the conference season on the road.
- Iowa plays only two games during the month of October.
- Iowa will face Maryland on Saturday at College Park, Maryland. It is the first meeting between the teams.
- The Hawkeyes do not face Big Ten opponents Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State, and Rutgers.
- Iowa has four trophy games on its schedule in 2014: Iowa State (Cy-Hawk), Minnesota (Floyd of Rosedale), Wisconsin (Heartland), and Nebraska (Heroes). Iowa lost possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy following a 20-17 loss to Iowa State on Sept. 13. The Hawkeyes currently have possession of the Floyd of Rosedale and Heroes trophies.

2 GAMES FOR THE RECORD BOOK

QB Jake Rudock passed for more yards (572) through the first two games of the season than any quarterback in program history. His completions (64) and attempts (93) were also more than any other quarterback through two games.

As a team, Iowa's 592 passing yards (66-of-96) were the most through two games since 1985 when Chuck Long and Marc Vlasic threw for a combined 671 yards (44-of-74) against Drake and Northern Illinois.

Iowa's 55 passes in Week 2 against Ball State marked the highest number of pass attempts for an Iowa team under Kirk Ferentz since the 2006 Outback Bowl (55 vs. Florida). Iowa's 35 completions against Ball State were the second most under Kirk Ferentz (36 vs. Indiana in 1999).



IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- Iowa has 102 wins since 2002. Only 22 programs across the country have 100 or more wins since the start of the 2002 season.
- Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls in four of the past 11 seasons, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and the Hawkeyes were also 20th in 2008.
- Iowa established a school record with 11 wins in 2002 (11-2) and matched that record in 2009. In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (2002, 2004 & 2009) and he was named National Coach of the Year in 2002. Ferentz joins Michigan's Bo Schembechler (four), Iowa's Hayden Fry (three) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (three) as the only coaches to be honored in more than two seasons.
- Iowa has had national award winners in: Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back).
- Iowa has appeared in the final Associated Press poll 22 times in program history, a total that ranks 25th-best in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's.
- Part of the Hawkeye's long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry, leading the program for the last 15-plus seasons. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa fans are known for their support of Hawkeye athletics, and the attendance figures from 2012-13 support that claim. Iowa was one of four programs in the nation to

rank among the top 25 in attendance for football, men's basketball and women's basketball events in 2013-14. In addition, Iowa was the only program in the nation to rank among the top 25 in attendance a year ago in football, men's basketball, women's basketball, and wrestling. Iowa sold an estimated 11,000 tickets to the 2014 Outback Bowl, with more than 15,000 Hawkeye fans attending the game in Tampa. Iowa sold 95-percent of its bowl game ticket allotment, the highest percentage of any bowl team.

IOWA BOWL NOTES

Iowa has appeared in 27 bowl games with a record of 14-12-1 (.537). The Hawkeyes have competed in the Rose (five times), Outback (four), Alamo (four), Holiday (three), Orange (two), Peach (two), Sun (two), Insight (two), and the Capital One, Gator and Freedom bowls once.

- Iowa has been bowl eligible 12 of the last 13 seasons under head coach Kirk Ferentz and his staff.
- Iowa ranks third in Big Ten bowl appearances. Ohio State and Michigan have received a conference-best 42 bowl bids, followed by the Hawkeyes (27) and Wisconsin (24). All four schools were bowl-eligible in 2013.
- The Hawkeyes have appeared in 11 bowl games since 2001.
- Iowa (14-12-1, .537), Penn State (27-15-2, .636) and Purdue (9-8, .529) are the only Big Ten teams with a positive winning percentage in bowl games.
- During the BCS bowl era (1998-2013), the Big Ten qualified 27 teams for BCS bowls, more than any other conference. Eight different Big Ten programs played in BCS bowl games, including two appearances by Iowa (1-1).

FERENTZ THIRD IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 16th season as Iowa's head football coach and ranks third in longevity among FBS head coaches. Ferentz is first among Big Ten coaches and nationally ranks behind Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer and Larry Blakeney of Troy. Blakeney will retire at the end of the season. Ferentz is tied for third with Bob Stoops of Oklahoma.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,186 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 611-536-39 (.530). That includes a 385-211-16 (.642) record in home games, a 226-325-23 (.412) record in games away from Iowa City, a 304-362-25 (.455) mark in Big Ten games and a 168-175-15 (.601) record in Kinnick Stadium.



HAWKEYES JOIN 100 CLUB

Iowa has posted 102 wins since the start of the 2002 season, which ties as the 22nd highest total in Division I football. The list includes the following: Boise State (140); Oklahoma (134); Ohio State (133); LSU (131); USC (130); Georgia (123); Texas (122); Alabama (120); Virginia Tech (120); Oregon (118); TCU (118); Florida State (117); Wisconsin (115); Auburn (114); Florida (113); Virginia (110); West Virginia (110); Utah (107); Nebraska (106); Miami, FL (103); Texas Tech (102); Iowa (102); Michigan (100); Boston College (96).

RECRUITING LANDSCAPE

Iowa's roster includes 119 players from 20 states and one foreign country. Among Big Ten schools, only Nebraska (25) and Penn State (21) have a larger footprint in the United States. Of the Hawkeyes' 119 players, 40 are from Iowa. The roster includes 19 players from Illinois; 10 from Ohio; seven from Maryland, six from Michigan and Texas; four from Missouri, New Jersey and Florida; three from Minnesota, Nebraska and Wisconsin; two from Canada; one from Arizona, Connecticut, Indiana, New York, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia; and three from Canada. Only four FBS schools – Michigan State (4), UCONN (3), UNLV (3), Wyoming (3) – have more Canadians on their 2014 roster.

IOWA WILL RECEIVE

Iowa has received the opening kickoff in all six games this season. In 16 seasons as Iowa's head coach, Kirk Ferentz and the Hawkeye received the opening kickoff in 156-of-193 games (93-63). Iowa has started the game on defense in 37-of-193 games under Ferentz (20-17).

FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

Iowa has seven players on its roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes. The seven legacy players ties Tennessee for the third most on any one team in the country. California and Idaho each have eight legacy players.

Iowa's seven players include WR Brandon Bishop (Willie in 1984-86), LB Andrew Cerney (Tim in 1971-73), OL Cole Croston (Dave in 1984-86), OL Mitch Keppy (Myron in 1986-87), LS Tyler Kluver (Todd in 1986-87), TE George Kittle (Bruce in 1977-80), and TE Peter Pekar (Jim in 1980-81).

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each Wednesday night. The 90-minute radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs each Wednesday evening at 7 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

Tickets to Iowa's three remaining Big Ten Conference home games can be ordered online at hawkeyesports.com, by calling 1-800-IA-HAWKS, or in person at the UI athletics ticket office located in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

- Youth tickets (\$25) are available for the Northwestern game.
- Capacity at Kinnick Stadium is 70,585. Iowa has sold out 63 of its last 77 games.

ADDED TO SCHOLARSHIP LIST

Four Hawkeye players have been granted scholarships after originally joining the football program as walk-ons. Those players include fullbacks Adam Cox and Macon Plewa, line-backer Bo Bower and offensive lineman Boone Myers.

AFTER THIS

The Hawkeyes have their second bye week of the season Oct. 25. Iowa returns to the field Nov. 1 at home against Northwestern.

GAME RECAP

Iowa posted a 31-23 victory over Northern Iowa in Kinnick Stadium in both team's season opener.

The Hawkeyes rushed 36 times for 151 yards and totaled 250 yards passing. QB Jake Rudock completed 31 of his 41 pass attempts to 13 different targets. The 13 different receivers are the most during the Kirk Ferentz era in a single-game. Seven Hawkeyes accounted for the 151 yards rushing, led by WR Tevaun Smith's 35 yards.

Defensively, the Hawkeyes amassed nine tackles for loss, including five sacks, and held the Panthers to 25 yards rushing on 25 carries (1.0 average). The 25 yards rushing are the fewest by an Iowa opponent since Minnesota had seven yards rushing against the Hawkeyes in 2008.

Iowa scored first on a LeShun Daniels, Jr. 13-yard scoring run to cap a 41-yard drive on its opening possession. The scoring play was the first of Daniels' career. The opening drive was set up by a 50-yard return on the opening kick by RB Mark Weisman; the first return of his career.

UNI answered with 10-straight points to take a 10-7 advantage. Michael Schmadeke converted a 36-yard field goal, followed by a Kevin Vereen 23-yard TD reception.

Weisman crossed the goal line from 1-yard out to reclaim the lead with 5:03 left in the second quarter.

The teams exchanged field goals before the end of the half, which included Iowa junior's Marshall Koehn's first career field goal (40 yards).

Iowa stretched its lead to 24-13 on a 6-yard scoring strike from Rudock to Smith with 10:13 left in the third period.

UNI answered with a 70-yard pass play from QB Sawyer Kollmorgen to RB David Johnson. Schmadeke's third field goal trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to 24-23 with 12:42 left in the fourth quarter.

WR Damond Powell tallied his third career TD on a 12-yard pass from Rudock to give Iowa the eight-point victory.

WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught a game-high eight passes for 62 yards, while TE Jake Duzey caught a personal-best seven passes for 34 yards.

DT Louis Trinca-Pasat recorded career bests in tackles (10), tackles for loss (3) and sacks (1.5). DB Jordan Lomax also posted a career high in tackles (9). LB Bo Bower and CB Greg Mabin each had their first career interception.

GAME RECAP

Iowa rallied from a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit to upend Ball State, 17-13, in Kinnick Stadium. The comeback equaled the team's second-largest in the fourth quarter since 1999; Iowa posted a 17-point comeback versus Pittsburgh in 2011 and had another 10-point rally against Indiana in 2009.

QB Jake Rudock engineered his third career fourth-quarter comeback (Northwestern and Michigan in 2013). The junior was 9-of-11 for 81 yards and two touchdowns on Iowa's final two scoring drives. Rudock finished the game posting career highs in completions (33), pass attempts (52), passing yards (322), and rushing yardage (36). Rudock became the first Hawkeye QB with 30-plus completions, 300-plus pass yards and zero interceptions in a game since Jon Beutjer against Indiana in 2000.

Ball State scored for the first time in three games against Iowa on a 35-yard fumble return in the second period to give the Cardinals an early 7-0 advantage.

Iowa answered with a Marshall Koehn 26-yard field goal to close within four points on its next possession.

Ball State scored the only points of the third quarter on two Scott Secor field goals (27 and 42 yards).

Trailing by 10 points in the fourth quarter, Iowa tallied a pair of 12-yard touchdown passes in the final 2:52 of the game to notch its second victory of the season. Rudock connected with WR Derrick Willies for his first career touchdown reception with 2:52 remaining. After Iowa's defense forced a three-and-out, TE Jake Duzey culminated a six-play, 59-yard drive with the game-winning TD reception from Rudock.

For the second-straight game, Kevonte Martin-Manley led the Hawkeye receiving corps, catching eight balls for 70 yards. WR Tevaun Smith caught six passes for 59 yards.

DE Drew Ott recorded a career-high 13 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss, and one sack. He also forced a fumble (recovered by Carl Davis) on Ball State's final offensive play with 25 seconds left. His efforts earned the junior Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors. SS Jordan Lomax matched a personal-best with nine tackles.

After accumulating nine tackles for loss against Northern Iowa the previous week, the Hawkeye defense amassed another eight TFL's versus Ball State. DT Carl Davis and LB Quinton Alston each registered 1.5 TFL's.

GAME RECAP

Iowa State rallied from a 14-3 halftime deficit to edge Iowa, 20-17, in front of a sold-out crowd at Kinnick Stadium.

RB Mark Weisman (one yard) and QB Jake Rudock (five yards) accounted for the Hawkeyes' first-half touchdowns. Weisman's scoring run capped a 16-play, 55-yard drive that consumed 7:54 off the play clock in the first quarter. Rudock's 5-yard run completed a 10-play drive that saw Iowa convert two fourth-down plays.

Iowa thwarted a Cyclone scoring threat late in the second quarter when LB Quinton Alston forced an ISU fumble at the goal line. CB Greg Mabin recovered the fumble in the end zone with 1:28 left in the first half.

Iowa State quarterback Sam Richardson connected with WR EJ Bibbs in the end zone on a fourth-and-one midway through the third period to make the score 14-10. The score was the first red-zone touchdown the Hawkeyes allowed in 2014. Later in the fourth quarter, the Cyclones claimed the lead on a 27-yard touchdown pass from Richardson to RB DeVondrick Nealy.

Iowa tied the game on its ensuing drive, with a 44-yard field goal from Marshall Koehn. However, the Cyclones generated a 51-yard drive that culminated with Cole Netten's game-winning 42-yard field goal with two seconds remaining. Netten also split the uprights from 47 yards in the first period.

Rudock finished the game completing 16-of-24 passes for 146 yards and 39 yards rushing on 12 attempts. Richardson completed 25-of-37 passes for 255 yards and two touchdowns for the Cyclones.

Weisman led the Hawkeye ground attack, rushing 16 times for 49 yards, while Aaron Wimberly led Iowa State's ground game with 33 yards on 11 carries.

Three Hawkeyes recorded career high in tackles, including Alston (game-high 10), LB Reggie Spearman (7) and Mabin (6). Jevohn Miller led the Cyclones in tackles, amassing nine.

The visiting team has won the last three games in the series, dating back to 2011.

GAME RECAP

For the second time in as many meetings, Iowa rallied past Pittsburgh in the fourth quarter for victory. Trailing 20-17 at the start of the fourth quarter, Iowa engineered a 13-play, 52-yard touchdown drive that proved to be the game-winning score in a 24-20 win. The win marks Iowa's third straight on the road, dating back to last season.

Each team scored a touchdown in the first period. The Panthers scored first on a Chris James 14-yard rush. On the next possession, Iowa QB Jake Rudock found TE Henry Krieger Coble, on a fourth down play, in the end zone from 13 yards out for his second career TD to even the score.

Pittsburgh dominated the second quarter, scoring 10 points on a James Connor 1-yard run and a Chris Blewitt 33-yard field goal. The Hawkeyes had possession for 2:44, running only five plays during the second period, and Pitt went into halftime with a 17-7 lead.

QB C.J. Beathard replaced an injured Rudock at the start of the second half. Beathard led Iowa on three-straight scoring drives beginning with a seven-play, season-long 94-yard drive resulting in a RB Mark Weisman 10-yard scoring run to cut the deficit to 17-14.

Each team traded field goals before the end of the third quarter, including Iowa PK Marshall Koehn connecting from a career-long distance of 52 yards. The 52-yard field goal equals the eighth-longest field goal in school history.

Weisman tallied his second TD of the game from one yard out with 6:56 remaining in the contest to give the Hawkeyes a 24-20 advantage.

Iowa's defense stopped Pittsburgh on the Panthers' final two drives, including Anthony Gair collecting his first career interception as time expired to preserve the victory.

Weisman finished the contest with a season-high 88 yards rushing on 22 attempts. Rudock and Beathard combined to complete 12-of-18 passes for 178 yards and a TD. Beathard was 7-of-8 for 98 yards, with 62 of the 98 yards coming on a pass to WR Damond Powell, which helped set up Iowa's first touchdown of the second half.

After allowing 132 yards rushing the first 30 minutes, the Hawkeye defense yielded only 53 the second half. SS John Lowdermilk led Iowa with a career and game-best 11 tackles.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's final 24 points in a 24-10 Big Ten-opening triumph over the Boilermakers at Ross-Ade Stadium in West Lafayette. The win was the second in as many years at Purdue.

Iowa fell behind 10-0 after a 39-yard interception return and a 42-yard field goal. However, the Hawkeyes answered before halftime with 10 points of their own via a 2-yard RB Mark Weisman rushing score and a 28-yard field goal by K Marshall Koehn.

Iowa's offense totaled 420 yards of offense. QB C.J. Beathard completed 17-of-37 passes for 245 yards with one touchdown in his first career start, while Weisman led the ground attack with 76 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries. Weisman's totals put him over the 2,000-yard rushing plateau as he became only the seventh Hawkeye to rush for more than 2,000 yards and over 20 touchdowns.

The Hawkeyes dominated the second half, outscoring the Boilermakers 14-0. WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught the game-winning touchdown, his first score of the season, on a 23-yard pass with 45 seconds left in the third quarter. Weisman tallied his second rushing score of the day, this time from five yards out, to put the game out of reach.

Eight different receivers caught at least one pass, with Martin-Manley leading the way with five receptions for 74 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown. Martin-Manley's totals moved him into fifth all-time in career receptions with 148.

Beathard became the first Iowa QB to win his first career start in a road game since Jason Manson in 2006 at Syracuse.

The Hawkeye defense limited Purdue to nine first downs, 156 total yards -- 72 of which were in the air -- forced two turnovers, six three-and-outs, and recorded six tackles for loss, including four sacks. The 72 yards passing are the sixth-fewest by a team during the Kirk Ferentz era. Also, the nine first downs tie for the seventh-fewest by an Iowa opponent since 1999.

SS John Lowdermilk picked off Purdue QB Danny Etling twice in the fourth period to go along with a team-best seven tackles.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 38 of its season-high 45 points in the first half en route to a 45-29 victory over Indiana at Kinnick Stadium on Homecoming. Six different Hawkeyes accounted for the 45-point outburst.

The Hawkeye offense totaled 426 yards of offense, while the defense collected three interceptions and forced eight three-and-outs. After missing the last game due to injury, QB Jake Rudock returned in a starting role, completing 19-of-27 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns.

Iowa scored 28 first-quarter points for the first time since scoring 28 against Ball State in 2005. Rudock connected with TE Jake Duzey (12 yards), and hit WR Damond Powell for a season-long 72 yard scoring play. Jonathan Parker scored on a 60-yard rush, and CB Desmond King returned an interception 35 yards. Iowa has recorded a defensive score in each of the last seven years.

The Hoosiers closed to within 28-21 on a 13-yard pass play from QB Nate Sudfeld to Nick Stoner and a 45-yard scoring run by Tevin Coleman, his second of the game; he had an 83-yard scoring run in the first period.

Iowa closed the half with a 22-yard Marshall Koehn field goal and a 1-yard touchdown run by Mark Weisman as time expired. The Hawkeyes led 38-21 at halftime.

Weisman crossed the goal line a second time from one yard out to extend Iowa's advantage to 45-21 with 13:17 left in the fourth period. Indiana's Coleman added a 69-yard scoring run -- his third touchdown of the game -- to close the scoring.

Iowa totaled 207 rushing yards, led by Weisman's 89 yards and two scores on 25 carries. Parker rushed three times for 58 yards and a score. WR Tevaun Smith led the Iowa receivers with four catches for 69 yards.

Sudfeld completed 4-of-9 passes for 85 yards and one interception before exiting the game due to injury in the second quarter. Coleman rushed for a game-high 219 yards on 15 attempts and three scores to lead the Hoosiers.

Nate Meier amassed a career-high 10 tackles, while Quinton Alston had eight stops and Reggie Spearman equaled a personal best with seven tackles. Bo Bower and Jordan Lomax had Iowa's other two interceptions.
