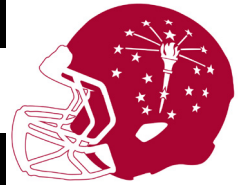

SETTING THE SCENE

- Indiana (2-1) opens its 115th year of Big Ten football hosting Maryland (3-1) on Saturday, Sept. 27. Kickoff is set for 1:30 p.m. EDT at Memorial Stadium (52,929; FieldTurf) and BTN will broadcast the game.
- The Hoosiers defeated Penn State, 44-24, in their 2013 conference opener.
- IU is playing its first East Division game and Maryland is making its Big Ten debut.
- This is the third meeting between the two programs and the first since 1935.
- Indiana has won both contests: 17-14 on Nov. 17, 1934 (H) and 13-6 on Nov. 9, 1935 (A).
- Terrapins running backs coach and special teams coordinator Andre Powell was a fullback (1986-87), student assistant (1988) and graduate assistant (1989) with the Hoosiers.

THE COACHES

- **Kevin Wilson** is in his fourth season as Indiana head coach. The Hoosiers have improved their win total in each of his three years and have posted the most wins in back-to-back Big Ten seasons (2012-13) since 2006-07.
- Randy Edsall is 16-25 in his fourth season as head coach at Maryland. Edsall owns an overall mark of 90-95 with a previous stop at Connecticut (1999-2010).

NEWS & NOTES

- Indiana coaches will wear Coach to Cure MD patches to raise awareness for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Fans are encouraged to donate online at www.CoachtoCureMD.org or donate \$5 by texting CURE to 90999.
- With their win over No. 18 Missouri, the Hoosiers claimed their first victory over a top 20 team since 2006 (No. 15 Iowa, 31-28, Oct. 14) and their first on the road since 1987 (No. 9 Ohio State, 31-10, on Oct. 10).
- **D'Angelo Roberts** capped the win with a 3-yard plunge with 22 seconds left, his second TD of the game.
- **Tevin Coleman** recorded his fifth straight 100-yard game, tied for the longest streak in the nation, with 132 yards to go along with one score and three receptions for 57 yards.
- He has scored a touchdown in 12 straight games, which is the longest streak in the nation, and tied for the longest streak in school history with Anthony Thompson (1988-89).
- The Tinley Park, Ill., native is first nationally in rushing yards (189.7) and all-purpose yards (221.3), tied for sixth in scoring (12.0), seventh in yards per carry (8.6) and tied for seventh in rushing touchdowns (6).
- Since the start of the 2013 season, Coleman is third nationally in rushing average per game (127.3), tied for fourth in rushing TDs (18) and 10th in rushing yards (1,527) despite missing three games one year ago.
- Coleman also leads the country in 30 (14), 40 (11) and 50-yard (6) runs and is second in 60-yarders (4).
- Freshman LB **Tegray Scales** earned Big Ten co-Freshman of the Week honors.
- Scales recorded five tackles, one sack and one quarterback hurry in the Missouri victory.
- The Hoosiers defense held the Tigers two TDs under their season scoring average, to 5-of-16 on third down and to one touchdown in three red zone trips. IU also collected two sacks, 11 tackles for loss and one INT.

Indiana head coach **Kevin Wilson** will hold his weekly press conference every Monday during the regular season at noon ET in the Henke Hall of Champions.

Selected players will also be available at 11:30 a.m. and coordinators will be available following Wilson. Lunch will be provided. Live streaming of the press conference will be made available on IUHoosiers.com.

PRACTICE SCHEDULE

Practices are closed to the media. Requested coaches and players will be available in the Weight Room in the North End Zone complex for post-practice interview on Tuesdays. Coordinators and players made available at Monday's press conference will not be available on Tuesdays.

INTERVIEW REQUESTS

All player and coaching staff interview requests should be directed to Jeff Keag. Requests for post-practice interviews should be made at least 24 hours in advance. Personal phone numbers will not be made available to media. Players have been instructed not to conduct interviews when contacted without prior approval from the media relations staff.

POST-GAME INTERVIEW POLICY

The Indiana locker room is closed at all times. A media relations staffer will collect all player requests in the press box midway through the fourth quarter. Requested players will be available in the Weight Room of the North End Zone complex immediately following head coach **Kevin Wilson's** post-game press conference.

Wilson will be available in the Team Room of the North End Zone facility following his post-game radio duties. Post-game interviews on the road will be held in accordance with the host school's procedures.

CREDENTIALS

Working credentials for the 2014 Indiana football season must be requested via the web. To request credentials visit IUHoosiers.com and click on the media services link under "Athletics." A link to apply for football credentials will be at the top of the page.

Credentials will be mailed to the address provided. To guarantee that your credential is mailed to you, your request should be made 10 days prior to the game. All requests made during the week of the game will be held at Media Will Call, which is located at ticket booth No. 3 located on the West side of Memorial Stadium and opens four hours prior to kickoff.

INSIDE THE OFFENSE

Offensively, IU returned eight starters, 32 letterwinners and 180 career starts. Game three's depth chart featured six seniors, eight juniors, four sophomores and five freshmen, including five true freshmen.

OFFENSIVE STAFF UPDATE

Kevin Johns assumed the role of offensive coordinator in the offseason and James Patton moved over from the defensive side of the ball to take over the tight ends and fullbacks.

Johns is in his fourth season at Indiana and was a co-offensive coordinator his first three years. He has coached the wide receivers since 2011, and he took over the quarterbacks in 2012.

Patton, who is also the offensive recruiting coordinator, returns to the side of the ball where he spent his first 20 seasons coaching.

UNDER KEVIN WILSON INDIANA HAS...

COLEMAN CLIMBING NATIONAL CHARTS

Since the start of the 2013 season, Tevin Coleman is third nationally in rushing average per game (127.3), tied for fourth in rushing TDs (18) and 10th in rushing yards (1,527) despite missing three games one year ago.

- A member of the 2014 Doak Walker Award Watch List, Coleman is first nationally in rushing yards (189.7) and all-purpose yards (221.3), tied for sixth in scoring (12.0), seventh in yards per carry (8.6) and tied for seventh in rushing touchdowns (six) in 2014.
Coleman kicked off this season in style with his second straight 200-yard game against Indiana State.
The junior set a program Memorial Stadium record with 247 yards, the fifth-highest total in school history. He carried the ball 23 times, averaged 10.7 yards per rush and scored twice.
Coleman became the second Hoosier to post back-to-back 200-yard games (Lonnie Johnson, 1980).
He nearly made it three straight with 190 yards on a career-high 24 carries (7.9) and a career-high three touchdowns (28, 46, 31), which tied for the seventh-most in IU history, at Bowling Green.
Along with his 215-yard performance in his final game against Illinois last year, Coleman rushed for an IU three-game record 652 yards, a 217.3 average.
Despite missing over a quarter of action in IU's win over No. 18 Missouri, he made it five straight 100-yard games, tied for the longest streak in the country.

- Coleman rushed for 132 yards on 19 carries (6.9) with one score and made three receptions for 57 yards, including a career-long 44-yarder that set up the Hoosiers game-winning touchdown.
He is the first Hoosier with five consecutive 100-yard efforts since Vaughn Dunbar had eight straight (1991) and the third (fifth time) to ever surpass 100 yards five games in a row (Anthony Thompson - three).
The Tinley Park, Ill., native has seven career 100-yard games, all in his last 12 games, and he became the eighth Hoosier to record multi-200-yard games.
Coleman is the first IU running back since Levron Williams (1998-2001) to reach 200 yards on multiple occasions. Williams did so three times. Alex Smith (1994-96) holds the school record with four.
He has five career multi-score games and 19 in his career, which is tied for eighth on IU's career charts.
Coleman also owns eight career 40-plus yard TDs, 10 30-plus yarders and 12 20-plus yarders. He scored from 13 and 73 yards vs. ISU, his second career 70-plus yard TD run and the second-longest of his career (75).
Dating back to last year, Coleman has 12 consecutive games with at least one rushing touchdown, the longest streak in the nation. He matched Anthony Thompson's school mark of 12 (1988-89).

BURSTING ON THE SCENE

- En route to honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition in 2013, Tevin Coleman rushed for 958 yards on 131 carries (7.3 average) with 12 touchdowns and finished with 1,275 all-purpose yards in nine games.
He averaged 106.4 rushing yards and 141.7 all-purpose yards per game. Coleman became the first Hoosier since Levron Williams (2001) to average over 100 rushing yards.
Additionally, he collected the most yards for an IU back since Williams in 2001 and his all-purpose yardage per game marked the highest for an IU back since Williams that same season.
Coleman tied for second in the Big Ten (T-14th nationally) in yards per attempt, was third (22nd) in all-purpose yards per game, tied for third in total yards per play (7.3, T-26th), was fourth (T-20th) in yards from scrimmage per game (127.9), was fifth in rushing yards per game (22nd) and scoring per game (8.0), tied for fifth in rushing TDs and was sixth in total scores.
His 12 touchdowns are tied for eighth on IU's single-season list, and he posted four 100-yard games and three multi-TD games.
In Coleman's final game of the season against Illinois, he was named the Big Ten's Offensive Player of the Week for the first time in his career.
He carded 215 yards on just 15 carries, a 14.3 average, with a career-long 75-yard touchdown.
Coleman joined Houston as the first Hoosiers since BenJarvus Green-Ellis in 2003 to go over 100 yards in back-to-back weeks.
Against Minnesota the previous week, he rushed for 108 yards on 14 carries (7.7) and added a 55-yard score, two catches for 51 yards and 22 kick return yards for 181 all-purpose yards.
Coleman played at Oak Forest High School, where he was named the Pepsi-Cola/Southtown Star, the South Suburban Conference and the Daily Southtown Player of the Year in 2011.

IN HIS BACKYARD

D'Angelo Roberts started the 2014 campaign just as he closed 2013, with a 100-yard rushing performance. The senior posted a career-high 129 yards on a career-best 24 carries in IU's season-opening win over Indiana State.

THE START CHART

Indiana returned 180 career starts from 16 players on offense and 172 career starts from 15 players on defense for a total of 352 career starts from 31 different players.

The Hoosiers entered 2014 ranked third nationally on Phil Steele's combined experience chart, behind UTSA and Louisiana.

IU came into 2014 third nationally with 130 career offensive line starts, trailing only Appalachian State and UTSA.

- Roberts, who added one touchdown in the game, has three career 100-yard games.
- He continued his strong start by scoring the game-winning TD, a 3-yard run, at No. 18 Missouri last weekend with just 22 seconds remaining.
- It was the second of his two scores, he added a 1-yarder, and his second career two-touchdown game.
- Roberts rushed for 65 yards on 15 carries, a 4.3 average, eclipsed 1,000 yards for his career (1,009) and caught three passes for 20 yards.
- In 2014, he owns 214 rushing yards on 44 attempts (4.9 average) with three TDs. He also has five receptions for 34 yards.
- The Bloomington North High School graduate finished with 113 yards on 14 rushes and two touchdowns in last year's victory over Purdue.
- It marked his first 100-yard game since a 102-yard effort as a true freshman against South Carolina State.
- That performance earned him Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors.
- Roberts became the eighth IU true freshman and the first since BenJarvus Green-Ellis (vs. Purdue on Nov. 22, 2003) to go over the century mark.
- The hometown product raced for 263 yards and four TDs in 2011, 300 and three in 2012, and 232 in 2013.
- Roberts rushed for 6,002 yards, the most in Monroe County history, and 75 TDs at Bloomington North.

IT STARTS UP FRONT

- Somewhat unsung in the Hoosiers prolific offense are **Greg Frey's** offensive linemen. The unit is third nationally with 145 career starts among 10 different players, trailing only Appalachian State and UTSA.
- Left tackle **Jason Spriggs** (2012-13), center **Collin Rahrig** (2013) and right guard **Dan Feeney** (2012) each have earned All-Big Ten recognition.
 - Guard **Jacob Bailey** and center **Wes Rogers** received freshman All-Big Ten accolades in 2013, joining Spriggs (2012), Feeney (2012) and guard **Bernard Taylor** (2011), and pushing Frey's total to five in his first three seasons.
 - Spriggs and Feeney collected freshman All-America honors after starting all 12 games in 2012, an Indiana true freshman record for an offensive lineman.
 - Rahrig, the lone senior in the group, is a candidate for the 2014 Rimington Trophy, which is presented to the nation's most outstanding center.
 - Rahrig and Spriggs have made 27 career starts, followed by guard **Bernard Taylor** (25), tackle **Peyton Eckert** (18), Feeney and tackle **Ralston Evans** (15), guard **David Kaminski** (8), interior lineman **Jake Reed** (5), Bailey (3) and Rogers (2).
 - Feeney and Eckert returned to a loaded lineup after missing 2013 with injuries.
 - IU started nine different linemen and used seven different lineups last season.
 - The 2013 offensive line did not allow a sack in six games and surrendered just one sack every 26.1 pass attempts, which ranked third in the Big Ten.
 - Through three games in 2014, Indiana is averaging 33.7 points, 547.0 total yards, which ranks 11th nationally, and 310.3 rushing yards per game, which ranks third nationally.

SUDFELD COOL UNDER PRESSURE

- Nate Sudfeld** is one of 32 quarterbacks on the 2014 Manning Award Watch List. The junior is first in completion percentage (61.5), seventh in passing touchdowns (30), ninth in passing yards (3,865) and 10th in completions (305) on Indiana's career lists.
- Sudfeld led the Hoosiers on their game-winning drive against No. 18 Missouri, covering 75 yards in six

plays in 1:58 and culminating with **D'Angelo Roberts** 3-yard TD with :22 remaining.

- In the contest, he passed for 252 yards and a 33-yard score with zero turnovers.
- Sudfeld added his fourth career 300-yard game at Bowling Green, going 31-of-41 (75.6) for 347 yards, one passing touchdown and two rushing TDs.
- He matched a career-high with 31 completions, which are eighth on IU's single-game list, and set a career-high with the two rushing scores.
- On the season, Sudfeld has a 135.04 pass efficiency rating and is 60-of-92 (65.2) for 710 yards with two touchdowns and just one interception.
- In 2013, Sudfeld completed 194-of-322 (60.2) for 2,523 yards with 21 TDs, nine INTs and a 142.0 pass efficiency rating.
- The 6-5 gunslinger finished fourth in scores and completion percentage, seventh in yardage and ninth in completions on IU's single-season charts.
- Sudfeld was third in the Big Ten in yards per completion (13.0) and yards per attempt (7.8), fourth in passing yards per game (210.2) and completions per game (16.2), tied for fourth in passing touchdowns, fifth in pass efficiency, passing yardage, total offense per game (207.4), completion percentage and points responsible for per game (11.2).
- A native of Modesto, Calif., Sudfeld recorded 40 completions of 20-or-more yards (T-2nd in Big Ten), 19 of 30-or-more (2nd), 11 of 40-or-more (T-2nd, T-25th nationally) and four of 50-or-more.
- Sudfeld set career-highs with 31 completions, 42 attempts, 363 passing yards, 398 total yards and four TDs (tied) against Navy.
- The 398 total yards are ninth, 31 completions share eighth and 363 passing yards are 10th all-time on the program's single-game lists.
- He earned his first career start against Bowling Green and finished with 335 yards on 17-of-26 passing with two passing strikes and one rushing score.
- He made it three 300-yard performances in four games with 321 yards on 23-of-38 with two touchdowns against Penn State.
- In 22 career games (11 starts), Sudfeld is 305-of-496 (61.5) with 3,865 yards, 30 passing TDs, 11 INTs, three rushing scores and a 142.5 passing efficiency mark.
- Sudfeld became the third true freshman quarterback to play at IU in 2012. He threw for 632 yards, completed 51-of-82 (62.2) with seven touchdowns and one interception in seven games.
- The 14th-rated quarterback nationally by *ESPN.com* set school single-season records in passing yards (2,332), passing scores (29) and passing yards per game (233.2) at Modesto Christian High School.
- Sudfeld's brothers, Zach and Matthew, are twins and no strangers to football. Zach is a tight end for the New York Jets and starred at Nevada (2007-12). Matthew was a wide receiver at Brown (2007-11).
- Nate took a mission trip to Uganda as a 14-year old.

GONE WITH THE WYNN

- With his first career rushing score at Michigan State last season, senior **Shane Wynn** became the first player in school history and is one of only eight active FBS players with receiving (17), punt return (one), kick return (one) and rushing (one) touchdowns in his career.
- On IU's career lists, Wynn is third in kick return yardage (1,685), fifth in receptions (151), tied for fifth in receiving TDs (17), ninth in all-purpose yards (3,552), 11th in receiving yardage (1,697) and tied for 12th in total scores (20).
 - One of 14 players on both the 2014 Biletnikoff (outstanding receiver) and Hornung Award (most

versatile player) Watch Lists, he became the 18th Hoosier to reach 100 catches and 1,000 yards last year.

- The Cleveland native is first in career receptions among Big Ten receivers (13th nationally), shares first with 20 total scores (T-11th), is second in receiving touchdowns (T-14th) and third in receiving yardage.
- Wynn posted his second career 100-yard game with a career-best 139 at Bowling Green on 10 grabs, his third career double-digit catch contest. He added 47 kick return yards for 186 all-purpose yards.
- On the season, Wynn leads the Hoosiers with 18 catches and 207 yards. He shares fourth in the Big Ten averaging 6.0 receptions per game.
- Wynn has led the Hoosiers in catches and yardage in each of the last two games.
- In 2013, Wynn brought in 46 passes for 633 yards (13.8 average) and 11 TDs. He finished second in the Big Ten and tied for 19th nationally with his 11 scores, which are third on Indiana's single-season list.
- Wynn added one rushing and a 58-yard punt return touchdown, reaching the end zone 13 times overall, which led the team, shared fourth in the conference and are tied for sixth in school history.
- Indiana's Offensive Teammate of the Year posted 1,158 all-purpose yards with 415 on kick returns (18 returns), 98 on punt returns (seven returns) and 12 on rushes (four carries).
- Wynn collected 12 20-plus yard, six 30-plus yard (four TDs - 68, 43, 40, 33), five 40-plus yard and two 50-plus yard receptions.
- The 5-7, 167-pounder brought in three receiving scores on seven catches for 52 yards to go along with 102 yards on four kick returns and 14 rushing yards in the team's win over Purdue in the season finale.
- His three TDs are tied for the second-most in program history (12 times).
- Wynn opened the season in style against Indiana State, as he became the first Hoosier to snare a pair of scores and return a punt for six points since Rob Turner did so vs. Missouri on Sept. 22, 1990.

WYNN-ING SINCE 2011

- In 2012, Wynn finished with a team-high 68 catches, which ranks fourth on Indiana's single-season list, for 660 yards (second on the team) and six touchdowns (tied for first on the team).
- He finished second in the Big Ten in receptions per game (5.7), tied for fourth in receiving TDs and eighth in yards per game (55.0).
- Wynn recorded his first career 100-yard game (108 at Penn State) and reached 70 yards six times. He caught 12 passes twice (Michigan State, at Penn State), which shared the Big Ten high-water mark in 2012 and is tied for fifth on IU's single-game list.
- His 1,015 kick return yards in 2011 were an IU true freshman record, second on the single-season list, fifth on the Big Ten's single-season list and the sixth-most nationally (second among true freshmen).
- Wynn set an IU true freshman single-season all-purpose yardage mark and became just the third true freshman to lead the Hoosiers in all-purpose yards.

INSIDE THE DEFENSE

Defensively, IU returned nine starters, 25 letterwinners and 172 career starts. Game three's depth chart featured seven seniors, four juniors, seven sophomores and five freshmen, including three true freshmen.

TRIO JOINS DEFENSIVE STAFF

Brian Knorr, Larry McDaniel and Noah Joseph joined the Indiana coaching staff in the offseason.

Knorr is the program's new defensive coordinator and he coaches the defensive ends and outside linebackers.

He spent the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator at Wake Forest. Knorr, the former head coach at Ohio (2001-04), has 23 years of coaching experience at the Air Force Academy (1992-94, 2005-07), Ohio (1995-2004) and Wake Forest (2008-13).

McDaniel oversees the defensive line. He worked in the same capacity at Bowling Green from 2011-13. A four-year starter (1989-92) at nose tackle and a senior captain with the Hoosiers, McDaniel graduated in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in business management.

Joseph leads the safeties and is the defensive recruiting coordinator. He spent the 2012 and 2013 seasons as safeties coach and recruiting coordinator at North Texas.

UNT went 9-4 in 2013 with a victory in the Heart of Dallas Bowl. The Mean Green's nine wins tied for the second-most in program history.

ON THE MARK

Safety **Mark Murphy** is Indiana's active leader with 241 tackles and 148 solo stops in his career.

- The four-year starter recorded his third career interception to go along with one tackle for loss and five tackles in IU's win over No. 18 Missouri.
- Murphy has 11 stops, 1.5 TFLs and the pick in 2014.
- The four-year starter appeared in all 12 games (11 starts) and finished second on the team with 84 tackles one season ago.
- Murphy posted 51 solo stops with his first career forced fumble, one interception and a half-tackle for loss, and he led the team in tackles in Big Ten play (62).
- He also leads the Hoosiers with eight career double-digit tackle games, with a career-high of 13 (twice).
- In the classroom, Murphy is just as successful. He became the ninth Hoosier to earn Academic All-America honors last year, and he is a two-time Academic All-District and Academic All-Big Ten honoree.
- This season, he is a candidate for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® and the Senior CLASS Award.
- Murphy finished fourth on the team with 70 stops, third with 49 solos and started 11 games in 2012.
- The Akron, Ohio, native played in all 12 games in 2011 and started three times at weak-side linebacker and the final six at safety.
- Murphy earned a spot on the *Yahoo Sports, BTN.com* and *ESPN.com* Big Ten All-Freshman teams. He led all Big Ten true freshmen with 76 tackles, the most for a Hoosier true freshman since 2003.
- He intercepted his first pass and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown at North Texas, becoming the first true freshman since Tracy Porter (2004) to do so.
- Murphy's father, Mark, played safety for the Green Bay Packers from 1980-91 and was enshrined into the Green Bay Packers Hall of Fame in 1998.

SIMMONS SETTLED IN

T.J. Simmons became the first Hoosier true freshman to start at middle linebacker since John Kerr in 2002. He started all 12 games, which tied an Indiana freshman record.

- Simmons has started all three games in the middle this season and has led the Hoosiers in tackles twice.
- Against Bowling Green, he set a career-high with 13 stops and he made six more with 1.5 tackles for loss in IU's win over No. 18 Missouri.
- Simmons paces the club with 22 tackles, 11 solo, to go along with the 1.5 TFLs this season.
- He finished 2013 as the Big Ten's leading freshman tackler with 5.7 per game and made 68 stops overall, 42 solo, with one sack and 3.5 tackles for loss.

- *CollegeFootballNews.com* named Simmons an honorable mention freshman All-American and *ESPN.com* selected him freshman All-Big Ten.
- Simmons enrolled in the spring semester out of Lakeland (Fla.) High School and found a home in the starting lineup immediately.
- The 6-0, 240-pounder made an immediate impact, posting nine stops apiece in the opening two games against Indiana State (game-high) and Navy.
- He has recorded at least seven tackles seven times in his career.
- At Lakeland, Simmons finished his career with 325 tackles and was a first team all-state selection.

BREAK IT UP

Tim Bennett moved from safety to cornerback during the 2013 summer and he adapted well to his new position, leading the nation with 20 pass breakups and 21 passes defended.

- At Bowling Green, Bennett matched a career-high with four PBUs and reached double digits in tackles for the second time in his career with 10, including a career-high-tying eight solo.
- Bennett is second in the Big Ten with five pass breakups and he has 16 tackles, 11 solo, in 2014.
- En route to 2013 honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition, Bennett started all 12 games and paced the team with 61 solo stops, which shared the top spot among conference defensive backs.
- He finished fourth on the team with 73 tackles overall and added 3.5 for loss, one interception and one fumble recovery
- IU's Defensive Teammate of the Year recorded at least three pass breakups four times, including four against Penn State.
- Bennett posted seven games with seven-or-more stops, including a career-high 12 against Navy.
- The Columbus, Ga., native arrived at IU in 2012 from Ellsworth Community College in Iowa Falls, Iowa. He made 50 tackles, 35 solo, with one interception and one TFL en route to all-region honors in 2011.
- In his first season as a Hoosier, Bennett played in 11 games and started three times (twice at nickel back, once at safety).

YOU ARE THE MAN...GIERI

Nick Mangieri started 10 times and played in 22 games at defensive end in his first two seasons. In 2014, the junior has found a home playing the bandit position for new defensive coordinator **Brian Knorr**.

- In his first start at bandit, Mangieri picked up one sack in the IU's season-opening win over Indiana State.
- Start number two also provided quality results: five tackles, one sack (the fifth of his career), one interception (the second of his career), two quarterback hurries and one pass breakup.
- Overall in 2014, Mangieri owns 10 tackles, two sacks, two TFLs, one INT, three QBHs and one PBU.
- The Peoria, Ill., native made 10 starts in 2013 and collected 26 stops, 15 solo, three sacks (14 yards), six tackles for loss (22 yards), one pick, one forced fumble and five pass breakups.
- Mangieri finished second on the Hoosiers in sacks and TFLs. He was a three-time IU defensive player of the week and earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.
- As a true freshman in 2010, Mangieri played in 10 games and finished with 12 tackles, one for loss.
- Mangieri's brother, P.J., was a long snapper at Nebraska (2009-12).
- His uncles, Ed and Dan Sutter, both played linebacker at Northwestern. Ed also played five seasons in the NFL (Cleveland, Baltimore and Atlanta).

BIG, BAD BOBBY

Kevin Wilson kept mentioning one name when asked about the defense during preseason camp...

Bobby Richardson. The senior defensive lineman showed why his head coach spoke so highly of him in the team's season-opening win over Indiana State.

- Richardson kicked off 2014 with three sacks, which tied an IU record for the fifth-most in a single game.
- He is tied for the Big Ten lead with his three sacks, owns a team-best 8.5 career sacks and shares the top spot with 16 career tackles for loss.
- The Tampa, Fla., native has started 18 games and played in 36, all consecutive.
- Richardson played defensive tackle and led all D-linemen with 39 tackles one season ago, including a career-high-tying eight vs. Navy.
- At defensive end in 2012, he delivered 28 stops with 2.5 sacks and five TFLs.
- As a true freshman the previous year, Richardson worked his way from defensive tackle on the scout team to starter at defensive end.
- He started six times, all in league action, and played in the final nine. Richardson collected 27 tackles, three sacks (second on team), four tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

THE FUTURE IS NOW

Six of the eight freshmen Hoosiers to earn postseason accolades reside on the defensive side of the ball: defensive tackles **Ralph Green III** and **Darius Latham**, linebackers **Clyde Newton**, **Marcus Oliver** and **T.J. Simmons**, and safety **Antonio Allen**.

- Each of the six collected All-Big Ten freshman recognition last year, while Green and Simmons earned All-America honors.
- Green started nine times and posted 25 tackles, one sack, 4.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and two blocked field goals in 2013 and has 2.5 TFLs in 2014.
- Simmons matched an Indiana true freshman record with 12 starts at middle linebacker and made 68 stops, 42 solo, with one sack and 3.5 TFLs.
- Fellow true freshmen Newton and Oliver appeared in 12 and 11 games, respectively.
- Newton started four times and added 32 tackles, while Oliver, who made a career-high nine stops with one forced fumble at Bowling Green, played all three linebacker positions and recorded 37 tackles, 2.5 sacks and two forced fumbles.
- Allen also posted a career-high with 11 stops at BGSU and has 19 overall this season (third on team).
- He played in seven games as a true freshman before a season-ending ACL injury and notched 35 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and one fumble recovery.
- The final true freshman, Latham, corralled 22 stops, two sacks, three tackles for loss, one fumble recovery and three pass breakups. He owns one TFL and recovered his second fumble this year.

HANGING WITH MR. COOPER

Looking to strengthen the team's linebacking unit, the Hoosiers coaching staff uncovered its 2012 starting middle linebacker from Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College in **David Cooper**.

- Cooper started all 12 games and finished second on the team with 86 tackles, 50 solo, with three sacks (26 yards) and nine tackles for loss (36 yards).
- Showing his versatility, Cooper started on the weak-side in all 12 games in 2013 and once again proved to be one of the team's most productive defenders.
- Cooper led the team with 85 stops, 52 solo, to go along with 2.5 sacks (15 yards), six TFLs (22 yards) and one fumble recovery.

- He tied for second on IU in tackles for loss and was third in sacks, while he shared 13th in the Big Ten with 7.1 tackles per game.
- Remaining on the weak-side this season, Cooper led the Hoosiers with eight tackles and added one for loss in the season-opening win over Indiana State.
- He contributed nine more at Bowling Green and has 18 overall this season.
- The fifth-year senior owns four career 10-tackle games and has reached eight stops 16 times, twice in 2014 and seven times in both 2012 and 2013.
- Cooper redshirted the 2010 season at Coffeyville before a big 2011 campaign, which saw him collect 102 tackles, two sacks, 13 tackles for loss, three fumble recoveries, one interception and one forced fumble.
- The 6-1, 225-pounder enrolled at Indiana in the 2012 spring, where he immediately found himself starting in the middle during spring drills.
- He tied for 15th in the Big Ten with 7.2 stops per game and his nine TFLs ranked third on the team.
- A native of Lilburn, Ga., Cooper attended Brookwood High School before heading to Coffeyville.

- Both classes were ranked in the top 40 nationally, which is also a program first.
 - The hard work on the recruiting trail has paid off, as eight Hoosiers earned All-Big Ten freshman recognition last year, including All-America selections **Jacob Bailey** (offensive lineman), **Ralph Green III** (defensive tackle) and **T.J. Simmons** (linebacker).
 - Offensive linemen **Jason Spriggs** and **Dan Feeney** earned freshman All-America honors in 2012.
 - Wilson has coached five freshman All-Americans and 16 freshman All-Big Ten honorees during his tenure in Bloomington.

SIX WALK-ONS AWARDED SCHOLARSHIPS

- Junior wide receiver **Damon Graham** and junior tight end **Michael Cooper** were awarded scholarships as the Hoosiers broke preseason camp.
- Fifth-year center **Collin Rahrig**, fifth-year senior wide receiver **Isaiah Roundtree**, junior punter **Erich Toth** and junior tight end **Anthony Corsaro** previously earned scholarships and have done so once again for the 2014 season.
 - A former walk-on himself at North Carolina, head coach **Kevin Wilson** awards scholarships on a yearly basis. Now in his fourth season, 23 players have been rewarded since his arrival in Bloomington.

ALL-BIG HONORS

One season after boasting nine All-Big Ten honorees, IU produced seven more in 2013. The 16 honorees mark the most for Indiana in a two-year span since 18 combined in 2000 (6) and 2001 (12).

Wide receiver **Cody Latimer** and kicker **Mitch Ewald** collected second team accolades. Cornerback **Tim Bennett** (media), tight end **Ted Bolser** (coaches and media), running back **Tevin Coleman** (coaches and media), center **Collin Rahrig** (media) and left tackle **Jason Spriggs** (coaches and media) were honorable mention.

RECORD SETTERS

The Hoosiers 2013 offense set single-season program records with 6,102 total yards, 508.5 total yards per game, 461 points, 38.4 points per game, 36 passing touchdowns, 62 total TDs and 300 first downs.

- It marked the first time in school history IU averaged over 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards.
- Indiana joined Baylor and Florida State as the only three teams nationally to average 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards.
- The Hoosiers led the Big Ten in passing, finished second in scoring and total offense, and fourth in rushing.
- IU tied for ninth nationally in total offense, 17th in passing, 16th in scoring and 30th in rushing.
- Indiana was just one of six teams (Baylor, Colorado State, Florida State, Marshall and Oregon) in the nation to rank in the top 30 in total, passing, scoring and rushing offense.
- The Hoosiers were the only team in the FBS with four players with 100 receptions and 1,000 yards in their careers, the first team since 2011 (Houston and Texas A&M) and the first Big Ten team since 2008 (Northwestern).
- IU was the first team in Big Ten history, the only team in the FBS and the first team since 2011 (Houston) with five 1,000-yard pass-catchers playing together at one time.
- Indiana became the first team in FBS history with two quarterbacks to account for 20 touchdowns in the same season.

TAKING IT TO THE NEXT LEVEL

Wide receiver **Cody Latimer** was selected by the Denver Broncos with the 56th pick in the 2014 NFL Draft. Latimer became the first Hoosier taken in the second round since St. Louis Rams offensive lineman **Rodger Saffold** in 2010 (33rd pick).

Tight end **Ted Bolser** joined Latimer, as he went to the Washington Redskins with the second pick of the seventh round (217th pick).

In addition to the draft picks, wide receiver **Kofi Hughes** (Bears, Texans, Redskins), running back **Stephen Houston** (Steelers, Patriots) and kicker **Mitch Ewald** (Broncos) signed free agent deals.

Currently, eight former Hoosiers appear on NFL rosters. Guard **James Brewer** (Giants), wide receiver **Tandon Doss** (Jaguars), offensive tackle **Andrew McDonald** (Seahawks), cornerback **Tracy Porter** (Redskins), wide receiver **Courtney Roby** (Falcons) and Saffold (Rams) join Latimer and Bolser.

Previously located in a 3,000 square foot area in Assembly Hall, the new center is located on the East side of Memorial Stadium and opened in 2010. - One of the most innovative and prolific offensive minds in the country, Kevin Wilson was named Indiana University's 28th head football coach on Dec. 7, 2010.
- The Hoosiers improved their win total in each of Wilson's three years and posted the most wins in back-to-back Big Ten seasons (2012-13) since 2006-07.
- Twelve IU standouts have either moved on to the NFL or received camp invites, including wide receiver Cody Latimer, who was selected 56th overall by the Denver Broncos in the 2014 NFL Draft.
- In addition to Latimer, tight end Ted Bolser was taken in the seventh round by the Washington Redskins. Running back Stephen Houston (New England) and wide receiver Kofi Hughes (Houston) signed undrafted free-agent deals.
- In Wilson's three years, the offense has set 22 school records, including points, total yardage and passing yardage in a single season.
- The 2013 Hoosiers were one of six teams (Baylor, Colorado State, Florida State, Marshall and Oregon) nationally to rank in the top 30 in scoring, total, passing and rushing offense and one of three programs (Baylor and Florida State) to average over 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards.
- One season after boasting nine All-Big Ten honorees, Indiana produced seven more in 2013. The 16 honorees mark the most for Indiana in a two-year span since 18 combined in 2000 (6) and 2001 (12).
- The Hoosiers nine All-Big Ten players and six on offense, including three along the offensive line, were the program's most since 2001.
- Wilson and his staff assembled the highest-rated recruiting classes in school history over the past two seasons. Both classes ranked in the top 40 nationally, which is also a program first.
- The hard work on the recruiting trail has paid off, as eight Hoosiers earned All-Big Ten freshman recognition last year, including All-America selections Jacob Bailey (offensive lineman), Ralph Green III (defensive tackle) and T.J. Simmons (linebacker).
- Offensive linemen Jason Spriggs and Dan Feeney earned freshman All-America honors in 2012. Wilson has coached five freshman All-Americans and 16 freshman All-Big Ten honorees.
- Replogle (2012) and safety Mark Murphy (2013) became the eighth and ninth Hoosiers to collect Academic All-America honors.
- For the second time in Wilson's tenure, the program set a school record with 26 Academic All-Big Ten recipients in 2013. Along with 24 honorees in 2011 and 22 in 2012, Indiana set a three-year school mark with 72 award winners in the Wilson Era.
- Spent the 2002-10 seasons at the University of Oklahoma. He served as co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach (2002-05) and offensive coordinator and tight ends and fullbacks coach (2006-10).
- Led some of the most productive offenses in the history of college football, coached in 10 consecutive bowl games and made seven BCS bowl appearances, including three national championship games (2003, '04, '08).
- OU played in seven Big 12 Title games in Wilson's nine years, going 6-1 in those appearances. His offenses were vital to accumulating an overall record of 99-24 (.805) during his time in Norman, including seven 10-win seasons.

- Over Wilson's time at Oklahoma, 26 offensive players were drafted in to the NFL, including seven first-rounders, with three going among the first 10 picks and two in the top five.
- Served as position coach for three All-Americans, an Outland Trophy winner (Jammal Brown), a Mackey Award finalist (Jermaine Gresham) and a two-time Rimington Trophy finalist (Vince Carter).
- As position coach, Wilson tutored three first-round draft picks (Jermaine Gresham, TE - 2010, Davin Joseph, OL - 2006 and Jammal Brown, OL - 2005), a second-round pick (Chris Chester, OL - 2005), a fifth-round pick (Brody Eldridge, TE - 2010), two sixth-round picks (James Hanna, TE - 2012; Wes Sims, OL - 2004) and six free agents at Oklahoma.
- Twice a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award - awarded to the nation's top assistant coach, Wilson won the award in 2008. His 2008 offense shattered NCAA records by scoring 60-or-more points in five straight games and 716 total points, to average more than 51 points per contest.
- The 2008 team played in the BCS National Championship Game behind Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Sam Bradford. Bradford passed for 4,720 yards and 50 touchdowns, Chris Brown and DeMarco Murray both rushed for over 1,000 yards, Juaquin Iglesias caught 74 balls for 1,150 yards and Jermaine Gresham added 66 catches for 950 yards.
- Bradford ranked No. 1 nationally in passing efficiency as a freshman in 2007 and again in 2008, as he threw for more touchdowns (86) in two seasons than anyone in NCAA history.
- In the 2010 NFL Draft, Bradford was selected with the No. 1 overall pick by the St. Louis Rams. He captured the 2010 Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honor.
- Wilson was also instrumental in the development of Adrian Peterson. Peterson rushed for 1,925 yards in his freshman campaign (2004), which set an OU single-season record and marked the highest total for a freshman in NCAA history.
- Peterson went on to place second in the Heisman voting, which at the time was the highest finish ever by a freshman. He was drafted by the Minnesota Vikings as the seventh pick in the 2007 NFL Draft, where he was named the AP Offensive Rookie of the Year. Peterson won the 2012 NFL Most Valuable Player Award after he rushed for 2,097 yards, just nine shy of the NFL's single-season mark.
- Prior to his stint in Norman, Wilson was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Northwestern University in 2001 after serving as offensive coordinator in 1999 and 2000. He worked with the quarterbacks during his time in Evanston.
- Followed Randy Walker to Northwestern from Miami University after spending nine years in Oxford, coaching alongside former Indiana head coach Terry Hooppner.
- Served as offensive line coach for his first two years at Miami and was promoted to offensive coordinator for the next seven, spending 1992-1997 in charge of the offensive line and the 1998 season with the quarterbacks.
- A walk-on offensive lineman at North Carolina, Wilson earned a scholarship while playing in four bowl games. He earned his bachelor's degree in education (1984) and his master's degree in physical education (1987).
- Wilson was a three-sport star at Maiden High School in Maiden, N.C.
- Kevin and his wife, Angela, have five children, including three daughters, Elaina (18), Makenzie (16) and Marlee (13), and two sons, Trey (14) and Toby (11).

- Bearden worked the 2012-13 and 2013-14 campaigns as a sports dietitian graduate assistant at Auburn. She is a registered dietitian through the Commission on Dietetic Registration.

DON FISCHER

This marks the 42nd year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University football and men's basketball games. The past 27 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor and is currently serving the

Indiana University Radio Network owned by Learfield Communications out of Jefferson City, Mo.

In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches radio talk shows for both the football and men's basketball programs and has a daily show, Monday through Friday, from September through March. The daily show is called "IU Sports Today" and is syndicated throughout the state of Indiana. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, which for the past 20 years has included being the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts.

During his 41 years with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 28 times by two different organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has awarded him 24 times, including the last five seasons, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times.

In October of 2010, Fischer was one of eight inductees into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Richard M. Fairbanks Hall of Fame. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association (ISSA) inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

He has won several awards for best play-by-play performance, and he has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Fischer also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

He has broadcast more than 1,600 Indiana University games - a total that includes seven bowl games, four NCAA basketball championship games and two N.I.T. championship games.

From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC and several additional major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that period, Fischer also served WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

A native of Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 46 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont.; Ottawa, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Terre Haute, Ind.

Fischer has four sons and 10 grandchildren. Don and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Ind.



BUCK SUHR

Buck Suhr rejoined the Indiana University Football Radio Network as color commentator in 2010. Suhr, who served in the same capacity from 1997-2001, reunited with the Voice of the Hoosiers, Don Fischer, and Joe Smith (pre-game, post-game and halftime).

Suhr was a member of the Hoosier football program for 18 years as a running backs coach and administrator. He spent 12 seasons (1984-95) as running backs coach under IU's all-time winningest coach, Bill Mallory. After his stint as a coach, where he tutored All-America selections Anthony Thompson

and Vaughn Dunbar, Suhr was named administrative assistant to the head coach and athletic director from 1996-2001.

As running backs coach, Suhr helped direct one of the nation's most productive rushing attacks. From 1984-95, the Hoosiers had three different 1,000-yard rushers who topped that mark on six separate occasions. In 1988, the IU offense rushed for a school-record 2,963 yards.

During his tenure, Suhr coached Thompson, the 1989 Heisman Trophy runner-up, along with Dunbar and Alex Smith, the 1994 UPI National Freshman of the Year.

Suhr and his wife, Jane, are the parents of one son, Errek, and the deceased Jenny Suhr. Errek played in 74 games and earned four letters as a guard for the IU men's basketball program from 2004-07.



JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 32nd year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his

46th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill.

From 1973-89, Joe worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, currently resides in Brownsburg, Ind., with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden and Kaleb. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, currently reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan and daughter, Emerson.

POST-GAME NOTES

- For the second straight game, the Hoosiers posted a pair of 100-yard rushers. Stephen Houston (120) and **D'Angelo Roberts** (113) broke the century mark in last year's Old Oaken Bucket victory over Purdue on Nov. 30.

- With 455 rush yards, this is the third time in school history that IU has had back-to-back 400 yard rushing games (401 - Purdue, Nov. 30, 2013). The 455 rush yards are a new Indiana Memorial Stadium record.

- This marks the second time in the **Kevin Wilson** Era (2011-present) that the Hoosiers have amassed 400-plus rushing yards as a team.

- With 566 yards of total offense, it marks the ninth time that a Wilson led team has totaled 550-plus yards.

- IU's defense surrendered just 170 total yards to ISU, the fewest amount allowed since Sept. 6, 2008, when Murray State gained only 149 yards.

- The Indiana defense gave up just 30 rush yards, its lowest opponent rushing total since allowing 22 yards vs. Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 2009.

- True freshmen **Chris Covington, J-Shun Harris II, Dominique Booth, Donovan Clark, Tegray Scales, Simmie Cobbs, Tony Fields, Kiante Walton, Devine Redding, Greg Gooch** and **Jordan Fuchs** each made their debuts.

- Cornerback **Kenny Mullen**, running back **D'Angelo Roberts**, wide receiver **Isaiah Roundtree** and wide receiver **Nick Stoner** served as today's game captains. It marked the first career honor for each senior.

- Indiana won the opening coin toss and deferred until to the second half.

- The Hoosiers wore the "Block I" helmet in honor of College Football Hall of Famer Anthony Thompson, who was honored prior to the ballgame.

- Redshirt freshman nose tackle **Nate Hoff** made his first career start on defense.

- Redshirt junior tight end **Michael Cooper** and true freshman wide receiver **J-Shun Harris II** earned their first career starts on offense.

- Indiana is now 38-17 all-time in Memorial Stadium openers, including winning 12 of its last 13 and 29 of its last 33. **Kevin Wilson** improved to 3-1 in openers.

- The Hoosiers moved to 6-0 all-time against Indiana State.

- Junior **Tevin Coleman** finished with a career-high and an Indiana Memorial Stadium record 247 yards on 23 attempts (10.7 average) with two touchdowns. The junior owns five career 100-yard games and became the eighth Hoosier to record multi-200-yard games in a career. His 247 rush yards rank him fifth all-time on the IU single-game list.

- Coleman has four career multi-TD games and 15 in his career, as he scored from 13 and 73 yards. The 73-yarder is his second career 70-plus yard TD run and the second-longest of his career (75). Coleman shared the top spot nationally with eight 40-plus yard runs one season ago.

- The Tinley Park, Ill., native is the first IU running back since Levron Williams (1998-2001) to reach 200 yards on multiple occasions. Williams did so three times. Alex Smith (1994-96) holds the school record with four.

- Dating back to last season, Coleman now has 10 consecutive games with at least one touchdown. Coleman trails Anthony Thompson's school mark of 12 (1988-89).

- Senior **D'Angelo Roberts** also reached the 100-yard mark, posting a career-high 129 yards on 24 carries (5.4 average). Roberts recorded his second consecutive 100-yard game and the third of his career.

- Senior defensive end **Bobby Richardson** recorded the Hoosiers first sack of the season in the second quarter and added two more in the fourth. His three sacks tied for the fifth-most in a single game in program history. Richardson now has 8.5 sacks in his career.

- Junior Bandit **Nick Mangieri** followed with sack No. 2 on the next play and has four in his career.

- Senior linebacker **David Cooper** led the Hoosiers with eight stops, including one tackle for loss.

- The Hoosiers had 582 total yards. This marks the 10th time in the **Kevin Wilson** Era that Indiana has gained over 550 total yards.
- True freshman **J-Shun Harris II** finished the day with a career-high seven receptions for a career-best 68 yards and one touchdown.
- Sophomore linebacker **Marcus Oliver** and sophomore defensive tackle **Darius Latham** worked in tandem for the Hoosiers first turnover of the season. Oliver forced his third career fumble and Latham made his second recovery with 4:28 remaining in the opening quarter.
- Bandit **Nick Mangieri** collected one sack, his second in as many games, and one interception - the second of his career, both against Bowling Green. The junior also added five tackles.
- Senior linebacker **Flo Hardin** and sophomore linebacker **T.J. Simmons** each set career-highs in tackles with 11 and 13, respectively.
- Other defenders accumulating double-digit tackles included true freshman linebacker **Tegray Scales** with 11, sophomore safety **Antonio Allen** with 11 and senior cornerback **Tim Bennett** with 10. These totals set new career-highs for Scales and Allen.
- Bennett led the Hoosiers with a career-high-tying four pass breakups. Hardin also added a pair.
- Senior wideout **Nick Stoner** set career-highs with six receptions for 59 yards.
- Junior tight end **Michael Cooper** recorded his first reception in a Hoosier uniform, netting 14 yards.
- True freshman **Dominique Booth** made his first career grab for 15 yards.
- Safety **Mark Murphy** and wide receiver **Shane Wynn** served as game captains for the first time this season and the third time in their careers.
- Bowling Green won the opening coin toss and elected to receive.
- Indiana wore the two-tone helmet with numbers on both sides.
- Tevin Coleman** recorded his fourth straight 100-yard game, three of which have surpassed 175 yards, with 190 yards on a career-high 24 carries (7.9 average) and a career-high three touchdowns (28, 46, 31). The three rushing scores ties for the seventh-most in IU history for a single game. He is the first Hoosier with four consecutive 100-yard efforts since Levron Williams (2001) and the ninth to ever surpass 100 yards four games in a row.
- The junior has six career 100-yard games and five career multi-TD games. Coleman also owns eight career 40-plus yard scores, 10 30-plus yarders and 12 20-plus yarders.
- He has scored a touchdown in 11 straight games, which is the longest streak in the nation and the second-longest streak in school history behind Anthony Thompson's 12 (1988-89). His 18 career rushing scores share ninth in program history with Mike Harkrader (1976-80).
- In his last three games, Coleman has accumulated an IU three-game record 652 yards (217.3 yds/game) on the ground.
- Wide receiver **Shane Wynn** pulled in his third double-digit catch game with 10 receptions for a career-high 139 yards. The senior eclipsed the 1,600-yard mark in his career and now ranks 12th all-time for yards and sixth all-time for receptions. His 139 yards mark his second career 100-yard game.
- With 186 all-purpose yards, Wynn is now 10th on the all-time list with 3,464 yards.
- Nate Sudfeld** added his fourth career 300-yard game and his first this season, going 31-of-41 for 347 yards, one passing touchdown and a career-high two rushing scores. He matched a career-high with 31 completions, which share eighth on IU's single-game charts.
- Sudfeld turned the BGSU miscue into the Hoosiers first points as he ran in for a 1-yard score. Sudfeld has three rushing scores in his career, all against the Falcons.
- Sudfeld struck again in the second quarter, this time through the air. The junior found wide receiver J-Shun Harris II from 22 yards out, the first TD of the true freshman's career.
- Sudfeld is now 10th all-time in passing yardage after eclipsing Harry Gonso's (1967-69) mark of 3,376 yards. The junior also moved into 10th in career completions.

POST-GAME NOTES

- This marks the first time in 47 consecutive games that Missouri did not force a turnover. It was the longest streak in the nation.

- With the win over Missouri, this is the first Indiana win over a top 20 team since beating No. 15 Iowa, 31-28, on Oct. 14, 2006, and the first on the road since downing No. 9 Ohio State, 31-10, on Oct. 10, 1987.

- Tevin Coleman** recorded his fifth straight 100-yard game and the seventh in his career with 132 yards on 19 carries (6.9 average) and one touchdown. The junior is the first Hoosier with five consecutive 100-yard efforts since Vaughn Dunbar had eight straight (1991) and the third (fifth time) to ever surpass 100 yards five games in a row (Anthony Thompson - three times and Dunbar).

- Coleman has scored in 12 straight games, which is the longest streak in the nation and tied for the longest in IU history with Thompson (1988-89). He is tied for eighth all-time with 19 career rushing scores and tied for 12th with 20 total touchdowns.

- He set up the go ahead touchdown on a career-long 44-yard reception with less than one minute remaining in the fourth quarter.

- D'Angelo Roberts** rushed for 65 yards on 15 attempts and added three catches for 20 yards with two touchdowns.

- Roberts scored the game-winning TD from three yards out with 22 seconds remaining in the game to give him his third touchdown on the season and 10th rushing touchdown of his career. He added a 1-yard run in the second quarter for his second career multi-score game.

- Shane Wynn** had a team-high six receptions for 60 yards. He is now fifth on the all-time Indiana receptions list with 151 and 11th on the all-time receiving yardage list with 1,697.

- Junior **Nate Sudfeld** finished the game 18-for-33 with 252 yards through the air and one touchdown. Sudfeld is now ninth on Indiana's career passing yardage list (3,865) and seventh in career touchdown passes (30).

- True freshman **J-Shun Harris II** put the Hoosiers in front with a 33-yard touchdown reception, his second of the season. Harris pulled in a 22-yard TD at Bowling Green last weekend. He finished the game with two catches for 43 yards.

- True freshman **Devine Redding** set career-highs with 10 carries for 49 yards.

- Nick Stoner** recorded a career-long 47-yard reception to set up Indiana's first touchdown. The senior finished with two receptions for 56 yards.

- Indiana's defense collected two sacks and 11 tackles for loss. IU last reached double figures in TFLs at Illinois on Oct. 27, 2012, finishing with 12.

- The Hoosiers held the Tigers to 27 points. Missouri entered the game averaging 41.7 points on the season.

- Senior safety **Mark Murphy** recorded his third career interception on the first play of the second half. Murphy added five tackles and one tackle for loss.

- Junior bandit **Zack Shaw** netted his first sack of the season and now has 4.5 in his career. He also made five tackles and broke up one pass.

- True freshman linebacker **Tegray Scales** also picked up his first sack of the year and recorded five tackles.

- Center **Collin Rahrig**, defensive lineman **Bobby Richardson** and wide receiver Shane Wynn (second time this season) served as game captains.

- Missouri won the opening coin toss and elected to defer.

- Indiana wore the state flag two-tone helmet for the first time this afternoon.
