The defending national champion and top-seeded Maryland men's lacrosse returns to the NCAA Semifinals for the fifth consecutive season Saturday as it faces former ACC foe at 2:30 pm at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough. The Terps are looking to advance to their fourth straight championship game, and sixth in eight seasons under head coach **John Tillman**.

2

The Terrapin specialist units are both among the best in the country, with the man-up unit ranking second and the man-down fifth. The Terrapin man-up unit is scoring at a 58-percent (25-of-43) clip, while the man-down unit has allowed six goals on 37 attempts (.162) over its last 12 games.

3

The Terps are the number one overall seed in the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season, becoming the first program to achieve the feat since Johns Hopkins (2002-05). Maryland is 18-5 all-time as the top seed, advancing to the semifinals on all eight occasions. The Terps are 62-37 all-time in the tournament, with Saturday being their 100th game.

Logan Wisnauskas is on the verge of breaking a pair of Maryland records for single-season points and goals. He needs five points to break Dan LaMonica's record of 51 set in 2001 and four goals to break Matt Hahn's record of 36 set in 1995.

The Terps have won six of their last seven meetings against Duke, and hold a formidable 62-20 advantage in the all-time series which dates back to 1940. This is the first meeting since the teams were ACC foes in 2014. Maryland knocked out Duke in the national semifinals back-to-back years in 2011-12.

The Terps feature one of the most consistent offenses in the country, having scored at least 10 goals in 16-of-17 games. Maryland also leads the nation with just 9.6 turnovers/g, which would be the lowest nationally since Penn State in 2010 (9.0/g).

The Maryland freshmen class was superb in the quarters against Cornell, with **Bubba Fairman** (5), **Logan Wisnauskas** (4) and **Anthony DeMaio** combining for 11 points and **Justin Shockey** winning 13-of-19 draws. Wisnauskas and Fairman's combined 81 points the most ever for a rookie duo at Maryland, surpassing Bob Boneillo and Pete Worstell (1977), who had 78.

20

Maryland head coach **John Tillman** is 20-6 (.769) all-time in the NCAA Tournament, with every game coming during his tenure at Maryland. His 20 victories rank 7th all-time among Division I coaches, while his winning percentage is the best among the coaches with at least 20 wins.

Tewaaraton finalist **Connor Kelly** currently ranks fourth in Maryland single-season history with 78 points, trailing Bob Boneillo (1979) for third on the list by just one point. His 127 career goals are tied for fifth in program history with the legendary Frank Urso (1973-76).

169

Maryland players have 169 games of NCAA experience under their belts, including three players who have played in all 14 NCAA Tournament games over the last four seasons: **Adam DiMillo**, **Connor Kelly** and **Bryce Young**. The Terrapin senior class has the most wins in program history with a 62-13 (.827) record, a mark that has been broken four straight years.

GAME NOTES

COACHING MATCHUP

- **John Tillman** is in 11th season as a head coach, and eighth with the Terps, with a 130-51 career record for a .718 winning percentage. Tillman is 110-32 (.775) as Maryland's head coach. Tillman is 7-4 all-time against Duke, including a 6-2 mark while at Maryland.
- Duke's John Danowski is in his 12th season at the helm for the Blue Devils.

SERIES HISTORY VS. DUKE

- Maryland has a favorable 62-20 all-time record against the Blue Devils dating back to the first meeting in 1940. The Terps won 28 consecutive games in the series between 1955 and 1989.
- The teams met every season between 1977 and 2014, before the Terps left the ACC for the Big Ten Conference. The teams have not met since 2014. Both **Dan Morris** and **Tim Rotanz** were on that 2014 team, but did not play in the game.
- Maryland has won six of its last seven games against Duke dating back to 2011, including a pair of NCAA semifinal victories back-to-back seasons in 2011 and 2012.

TILLMAN IN THE NCAA'S

- The meeting with Duke will be **John Tillman's** 27th NCAA tournament game as a head coach, compiling a 20-6 (.769) overall record. His 20 wins since 2011 are the most in the NCAA during that span, and rank seventh all-time among D-1 coaches. His 20 tournament wins is also the most of any coach in Maryland history.
- Tillman led Maryland to its first National Championship since 1975 (42 years) in 2017 when the Terps defeated Ohio State in the title game, 9-6. He has guided the Terps to seven final fours and five championship game appearances in seven seasons since taking over the program.
- Tillman is 7-1 in first round games, 7-0 in quarterfinal games and 4-1 in semifinals.
- Tillman is the only coach in NCAA history to guide two unseeded teams to back-to-back appearances in the Final Four (2011-12).

MARYLAND IN THE NCAA'S

- Maryland is playing in its 41st NCAA Tournament - the second-most since the inception of the NCAA Tournament in 1971. The Terps have also qualified for 16 straight NCAA Tournaments - the longest active streak in the nation.
- The Terps have won the third-most Division I NCAA Tournament games, compiling a 62-37 overall record in 99 games. Only Johns Hopkins (71-37) and Syracuse (65-27) have won more Division I tournament games.

KELLY FOR TEWAARATON

- Senior **Connor Kelly** is just the third player in Maryland history to be named a finalist for the prestigious Tewaaraton Award, joining Matt Rambo (2017) and Joe Walters (2006). Rambo was the first Terp in history to win the award last year.
- Kelly is in the midst of the most historic season for the Terrapins, becoming the first midfielder in program history to record 40 goals and 30 assists in a season. Attackman Matt Rambo is the only other Terp to achieve the feat.
- Kelly has totaled 78 points on the season against the second toughest schedule in the country and the top-ranked RPI.

TERPS ADVANCE TO FIFTH STRAIGHT SEMIFINAL

- The top-seeded Maryland men's lacrosse team used a six-goal run in the second half to knock off Cornell 13-8 in the NCAA Quarterfinal round May 20.
- **Jared Bernhardt** and **Bubba Fairman** paced the Maryland offense with three goals each, while **Logan Wisnauskas** and **Anthony DeMaio** both posted two goals to help clinch the five-goal victory. Fairman's game-high five points (three goals, two assists) were a career high.

TERPS DEFEAT RUTGERS IN B1G SEMIS

- The Maryland men's lacrosse underclassmen contingency of **Jared Bernhardt**, **Logan Wisnauskas** and **Bubba Fairman** combined for 12 points in a methodical 12-9 victory over 4th-seeded Rutgers in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals May 3.
- Senior **Dan Morris** was sensational in net for the Terps, making seven second half saves en route to a 12-save effort. Wisnauskas matched his career-high with five points in the game, including a career-best three assists.

GET TO 10 AND WIN

- Since **John Tillman** took over the program in 2011, Maryland has won 92 of the 102 games in which it has scored 10 or more goals for a .902 winning percentage.
- Maryland is also 73-7 in the last six seasons when scoring at least 10 goals.

HOLDING OPPONENTS TO SINGLE-DIGITS

- Maryland is 88-11 since Tillman took over the program in 2011 when it allows nine goals or less, for an .889 winning percentage.
- The Terps are 65-6 over the last six seasons when allowing less than 10 goals.

SNIDER WINNER DOWNS HOPKINS IN 3OT

- Junior **Will Snider's** game-winning goal in triple overtime was the difference as Maryland defeated Johns Hopkins, 8-7, in arguably the greatest game in the rivalry's storied history April 28. The win clinched the B1G regular season title for the Terps.
- Snider scored the winner with 3:11 remaining in the third overtime, in addition to the game-tying goal with 2:26 remaining in regulation to send the game to extra frames. Senior goalkeeper **Dan Morris** was incredible in the cage for Maryland, tying a season-best with 13 saves. Freshman **Logan Wisnaukas** led all players with four points (3g, 1a), while **Tim Rotanz** had two goals and an assist.

MARYLAND TAKES DOWN #7 RUTGERS

- Senior **Connor Kelly** totaled eight points on four goals and four assists to lead the No. 1 Maryland men's lacrosse team to an 11-10 victory over No. 7 Rutgers in rainy conditions April 15.
- Trailing 9-8 with less than five minutes to play, a three-goal outburst in a span of 1:20 was the difference as the Terps took an 11-9 lead and held on for the win. Anthony DeMaio, Tim Rotanz and Kelly were the goal scorers in the 3-0 run.

TERPS NOTCH GRITTY WIN AT PENN STATE

- **Connor Kelly** scored a career-high six goals and Dan Morris made eight second half saves to lead Maryland to a gritty 13-12 road victory at Penn State April 8.
- Trailing at halftime for the first time all season, the Terps responded in positive fashion by outscoring Penn State, 8-6, in the second half. Maryland came into the game having trailed for just four minutes and 29 seconds the entire season.
- Kelly's six goals were the most for a Terrapin in a game since Grant Catalino scored six against UMBC in 2011.

MARYLAND TAKES DOWN MICHIGAN IN B1G OPENER

- Freshmen **Logan Wisnaukas** and **Bubba Fairman** combined for eight points and senior **Dan Morris** made 10 saves to lead Maryland to a 13-5 victory over No. 17 Michigan March 31 at U-M Stadium.
- It was the Terps' seventh straight victory in conference openers, including a 4-0 mark in the Big Ten. It was also Michigan's first-ever loss at U-M Stadium. The Terrapin defense was tremendous throughout the game, holding the Michigan attack line 0-for-14 shooting and forcing nine turnovers among the trio.
- Sophomore **Drew Harrison** changed the game in the third quarter when he scored a spectacular transition goal – the first of his career – to spark a debilitating 7-0 Maryland scoring run to close the game.

CONSECUTIVE 10-WIN SEASONS

- Maryland's 11-10 win over 7th-ranked Rutgers on April 15, 2018 extended the Terps' streak of double-digit win seasons to 16, which is the longest active streak in NCAA Division I men's lacrosse.
- There are only two programs with a current streak of at least 10-straight 10-win seasons, after Notre Dame's streak was snapped last season at 11.

TERPS' 93RD SEASON OF LACROSSE

- Did you know: In the 93 seasons of Maryland lacrosse, the program has never had a losing season.
- Through 2017, the Terps boast an all-time record of 808-267-4 (.751), dating back to the first varsity team in 1924 (a team was not fielded in 1944 and 1945 due to World War II). Maryland has finished with a .500 or better record in all 92 seasons of existence, including last season when the Terps went 16-3. The program reached the 800-win milestone with a thrilling 12-6 victory on April 12, 2017 on the road against Albany.
- During the decade of the 2000s, Maryland went 111-49 for a .694 win percentage, making it the winningest decade in Terrapin lacrosse history. In the decade of the 1990s, Maryland posted a 95-47 record. The .669 winning percentage matched Maryland's win percentage of the 1980s when the Terps went 83-41 and also compiled a .669 win percentage.
- Through 2017, Maryland is 108-34 in the 2010's for a .761 winning percentage - on pace for the best decade in Maryland history.

REST IN PEACE, "BIG MAN"

- The Maryland lacrosse mourns the passing of former legendary head coach Dick Edell, affectionately known as "Big Man," who passed away in the early hours of May 2.
- Edell's coaching successes were well-documented, but he was even better known for the immense impact he had on the entire lacrosse community. The sheer outpouring of love and support for Edell across Twitter on the day of his death was incredible.
- A member of the USILA and National Lacrosse Hall of Fames, Edell's 171 victories at Maryland ranks second in program history.

JOHN TILLMAN

HEAD COACH • EIGHTH SEASON AT MARYLAND • CORNELL '91

Blending a mix of the program's historic motto, "Be The Best," with his own principles of high character in all aspects of life, John Tillman has created a formula that has resulted in one of the most successful eras in Maryland lacrosse's illustrious history.

Tillman's formula came to ultimate fruition in 2017 when Maryland captured its first NCAA National Championship since 1975. Since taking over the helm as Maryland head coach seven years ago, Tillman has led the Terps to six NCAA Final Fours, five national title games and a 96-29 (.768) overall record.

Tillman became the fastest coach in Maryland history to reach 100 victories with a 13-6 win over Penn in 2018. The win moved him into third all-time in Maryland history in coaching victories.

Tillman's numbers since arriving in College Park in 2011 are impressive, leading the country in All-American selections (47), Major League Lacrosse draft selections (36), NCAA Tournament wins (18) and Final Fours (6) during that seven-year span.

Additionally, the program's accomplishments have translated to the classroom, as Tillman has had 12 USILA Scholar All-Americans in six seasons. The 2015 spring semester and 2016 fall semester combined for the program's highest GPA in more than 10 years.

Maryland went 16-3 and captured the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles en route to capturing the 2017 National Championship. Tillman coached Matt Rambo, who set team records for points (257) and goals (155) en route to capturing the program's first-ever Tewaaron Award, and Tim Muller, who earned the Schmeisser Award for being the nation's top defender. The Terps had a nation's-best nine USILA All-America selections, while Isaiah Davis-Allen became just the second student-athlete in Maryland history to receive the Senior CLASS Award.

The Terrapins won a program record 17 games in addition to piecing together a single-season record 16 consecutive wins in 2016 as they returned to the National Championship game, where they lost an overime heartbreaker to UNC. Tillman's team swept the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles, while compiling the NCAA's top-ranked RPI. Eight players earned USILA All-America honors and Matt Dunn was named a Senior CLASS Award First Team All-American.

Maryland had another phenomenal season in 2015 when Tillman led the team to a Terrapin single-season record 15 victories and a berth in the NCAA national title game. The Terps featured the top-ranked scoring defense (7.1 goals allowed/g), as junior Kyle Bernlohr claimed the Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award. Additionally, five players earned USILA All-America honors and Casey Ikeda was also a USILA Scholar All-American.

Tillman captured his first career ACC Coach of the Year honor by leading the Terps to the 2014 ACC regular season championship and the program's third Final Four appearance in four seasons. Senior Niko Amato earned the Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award as the nation's most outstanding goalie, as five Maryland players earned USILA All-America honors.

Tillman's third season in College Park saw the Terps ascend to the top of the national rankings for the first time since 2006, following a 12-10 win at then-No. 1 Loyola on Feb. 21. Maryland earned a bid to the NCAA tournament for the 11th consecutive season. Seniors Jesse Bernhardt and John Haus became the first Terrapins since 2006 to earn first-team All-America honors, leading a group of seven Maryland honorees.

The 2012 season was viewed by many as a rebuilding year after Maryland graduated 17 seniors in 2011, but Tillman rallied the team and the Terrapins returned to the NCAA championship game. Five Terps earned All-America honors following Maryland's 12-6 campaign and junior Jesse Bernhardt was selected as co-recipient of the ACC's first-ever Defensive Player of the Year award.

In his first season in College Park Tillman guided the Terps to a 13-5 record, the 2011 ACC championship (the program's first since 2005) and a berth in the NCAA championship game (the first for the Terps since 1998). Eight Terrapins earned All-America honors in Tillman's first season, which is the most Maryland players selected in a single-season since 2004.

Widely considered one of the top coaches in the country and a dynamic recruiter, Tillman was the head men's lacrosse coach at Harvard for three seasons prior to his arrival in College Park. His last recruiting class for the Crimson was rated No. 3 in the nation, according to Inside Lacrosse.

During his three seasons at Harvard, Tillman compiled an overall record of 20-19, including an 8-5 mark in 2009, which was the Crimson's highest win total since 1999.

Tillman's time at Harvard produced a number of the most memorable wins in the program's history. This past season, during which Harvard climbed as high as No. 11 in the national polls, Tillman guided the Crimson to an 11-8 victory over No. 6 Princeton, which was the first time Harvard had defeated the Tigers in 20 years. In 2009, Tillman led the Crimson to a season-opening 9-6 upset victory at No. 5 Duke.

Tillman improved his teams in every aspect over the past three seasons. Prior to his arrival in Cambridge, Mass., the Crimson ranked 40th and 42nd, respectively, in total offense and defense. Tillman's defense ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation, while his offense rose to No. 15 in the country. He also dramatically improved Harvard's extra-man offense, from the 51st-ranked unit before he arrived, to a perennial top 15 unit.

Prior to Harvard, Tillman spent 12 seasons at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md. After six seasons as an assistant coach, he was promoted to head assistant coach and offensive coordinator prior to the 2002 season. From 2004 through 2007, Tillman helped lead the Midshipmen to some of the most successful seasons in program history, including four straight NCAA tournament berths, four consecutive Patriot League tournament titles and four straight Patriot League regular season championships.

Tillman's third-ranked scoring offense in 2004 helped lead Navy to the NCAA Championship game. Following the season, Tillman was awarded the first of his two Collegiate Lacrosse Assistant Coach of the Year Awards by the Maryland State Lacrosse Coaches Association.

During his 12 season at the Naval Academy, Tillman was responsible for helping develop first team All-America midfielders Graham Gill and Billy Looney and second team All-America attackman Jon Birsner. In his 12 seasons in Annapolis, the Mids compiled an overall record of 104-63.

Tillman started his coaching career as an assistant coach at Ithaca College. He spent four seasons (1992-95) with the Bombers, helping lead them to the Division III national semifinals in 1992.

In addition to his extensive coaching experience, Tillman also serves as a member of the Tewaaron Award Men's Selection Committee.

A 1991 graduate of Cornell University's School of Hotel Administration, Tillman was a three-year member of the school's Dean's list. He had the opportunity to play for legendary coach Richie Moran and was a member of the 1989 squad that earned a berth in the NCAA tournament.

Tillman was a goalie when he entered college, but played a number of positions for the Big Red, giving him a great appreciation and understanding for the overall game of lacrosse.

Tillman played professionally for the Baltimore Thunder and the Washington Power of the National Lacrosse League. During his final two seasons in Baltimore, he helped the Thunder reach the NLL Championship and Semifinals. Tillman also played for the Toyota Lacrosse Club, who won five-consecutive Southern Division Championships, including a world championship in 2000.
