Head Coach Brenda Frese

Thoughts on today's game:

"I thought the energy was awesome, we love having this kind of game for our kids. Introducing them to our team, our program and our University. I know this is a game my boys have circled on the calendar for as long as when it came out.

I thought with the game Niagara was extremely aggressive, especially in the first half. I think as a young team we need to be able to really work on that and come more prepared to be ready to play but I thought our seniors did a tremendous job being consistent and ready to kind of settle us in. And I thought, we were able to put some good things together in the third quarter but you know as we talked as a team, we have to be ready to play from the tip. Ee had to take a tough loss the other night. Understanding that, maybe we have to take a look at who we are starting and what that will look like for us but we need to have a lot better starts to our game."

On how this was a tricky game in an unconventional stretch:

"I guess if you want to give that to your team. I think I was more disappointed because I liked our approach yesterday to practice and how we were probably able to be more competitive in practice yesterday than then start of our games. Again for a young team, there are areas we have to be able to improve upon quickly."

On how she rallied the team at halftime to get them going:
