QUICK HITS

• The No. 4/2 Maryland women's lacrosse team will play its second home game of the week, as the Terps welcome Hofstra to College Park on Saturday March 3 at 12:00 p.m.

• Maryland heads into this weekend's contest with a 3-1 record and No. 4/2 ranking. In the Terps last game, Maryland defeated UMBC 21-12, off seven goals from senior attacker **Megan Whittle** and 13 draw controls from junior midfielder **Meghan Silversen**.

• **Megan Whittle** (18 goals, two assists) leads the team with 20 points, while junior midfielder **Jen Giles** (12 goals, seven assists) stands right behind her with 19. **Whittle** leads the Big Ten in many offensive categories, including goals (18), goals per game (4.50), points per game (5.00) and leads the country in free position goals per game with 3.25, after scoring a career-best six against UMBC. **Giles** is second in the conference in assists (seven) and ranks right behind **Whittle** in the conference with 1.50 free position goals per game.

• The Terps had five players named to the initial Tewaaraton Watch List, as announced by the Tewaaraton Foundation Thursday evening. **Whittle** and a quartet of juniors: **Julia Braig**, **Giles**, **Caroline Steele** and **Megan Taylor** were all selected for the watch list.

• **Megan Whittle** became the fastest player to reach 200 career goals last year and stands at 232 through four games in her senior season, to move to third all-time in Maryland lore. With 36 more goals, **Whittle** can become Maryland's career scoring leader, passing Jen Adams.

• As a team, Maryland is second in the nation and first in the Big Ten in draw controls per game, with 17.75. The duo of **Kali Hartshorn** and **Meghan Silversen** have been key to giving Maryland possession. Against UNC (2/24), **Hartshorn** posted a career-best 12 draw controls. **Silversen** followed that up with a career-high of her own, 13 draw controls against UMBC (2/28).

• Maryland is on a 66-game win streak at the Field Hockey & Lacrosse Complex and hasn't lost in College Park since March 10, 2012. The Terps led the nation in attendance in 2017.

TERPS TAKE ON HOFSTRA SATURDAY

The No. 4/2 Maryland women's lacrosse game will play its second home game of the week, as the Terps welcome Hofstra to College Park on Saturday March 3 at 12:00 p.m.

MEG(H)AN'S LEAD THE WAY VS. UMBC

Senior **Megan Whittle** tied a career-high with seven goals, while three freshmen tallied their first-career goal as the No. 4/2 Maryland women's lacrosse team defeated in-state foe UMBC 21-12 on Wednesday night. The 21 Maryland goals in the contest came from 11 different players. **Whittle** led the way with seven while sophomore midfielder **Nikki Sliwak** posted a career-best three goals. Freshmen **Kylie Davis**, **Maggie Root** and **Tori Barretta** all tallied the first goals of their Terrapin career in the second half.

Junior midfielder **Meghan Siverson** paced the Maryland offense with a career-best 13 draw controls.

TERPS - PRIDE HISTORY

Maryland leads the all-time series with Hofstra, 6-0. The two programs met last season up in New York, with Maryland defeating the Pride, 18-7. Zoe Stukenberg scored on all five of her shots she took, while current Terps **Whittle** and **Taylor Hensh** each had hat tricks.

Goalie **Megan Taylor** had a stellar outing in cage, making 10 saves while allowing six goals for a .625 save percentage.

Hofstra enters Saturday's contest with a 2-1 record.

CONTROLLING THE DRAW

As a team, Maryland is second in the nation and first in the Big Ten in draw controls per game, with 17.75. The duo of **Kali Hartshorn** and **Meghan Siverson** have been key to giving Maryland possession. Against UNC (2/24), **Hartshorn** posted a career-best 12 draw controls. **Siverson** followed that up with a career-high of her own, 13 draw controls against UMBC (2/28).

WHITTLE PASSES TAYLOR CUMMINGS IN ALL-TIME GOALS

While tying a career-best with seven goals against UMBC on Wednesday night, **Megan Whittle** passed three-time Tewaaron winner Taylor Cummings (2013-16) in all-time goals at Maryland. The senior attacker now has 232 goals in her career, eclipsing Cummings' 229. With five more goals, **Whittle** will move into second place in Maryland lore, passing Karri Ellen Johnson's (2008-12) 236. Jen Adams (1998-01) is the all-time Terrapin leader with 267.

TOURNEY TERPS

The Terps lead the nation with 33 NCAA appearances and are also tops in wins (68), championship game appearances (20) and NCAA titles (13). Maryland made its 28th consecutive appearance in the postseason (1990-2017) last season. The Terrapins have made nine straight Final Fours (2009-17) and captured four titles in that time (2010, 14, 15, 17).



CATHY REESE

12TH SEASON AT MARYLAND/15TH OVERALL MARYLAND '98

One of the most decorated coaches at the collegiate level, former Maryland standout and three-time IWLCAs National Coach of the Year Cathy Reese led the Terps to their 14th national title in 2017.

As a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach for the Terrapins, Reese has earned 11 NCAA Championships.

The Terps competed perfection in 2017 as the team went 23-0 and won the program's 14th national title. Maryland won both the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles. Five Terps were honored as All-Americans while Maryland featured the IWLCAs National Midfielder, Defender and Goalie of the Year in Zoe Stukenberg, Nadine Hadnagy and Megan Taylor. Zoe Stukenberg went on to win the Tewaaraton Award, Maryland's sixth-straight honoree.

Maryland had a near-perfect season in 2016 as the Terps posted a 22-1 record with the only blemish coming in the national championships game. Maryland won the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles. Five Terps earned All-American honors while six players were named All-Big Ten. Taylor Cummings finished her playing career as the most decorated player in lacrosse, three-peating as the Tewaaraton and Honda Award winner and as the IWLCAs National Midfielder of the Year. Alice Mercer garnered IWLCAs National Defender of the Year honors.

The Terps gained their second-straight NCAA Championship in 2015 under Reese. Maryland posted a 21-1 overall record and earned the first-ever Big Ten Regular Season Championship with a 5-0 conference record. Reese was named the IWLCAs National Coach of the Year for the third time while Taylor Cummings and Megan Dooty repeated as the IWLCAs National Midfielder and Defender of the Year, respectively. Five Terps were named IWLCAs All-Americans while eight players earned All-Big Ten honors. Cummings repeated as the Tewaaraton Award and Honda Award winner while posting her best season to date under Reese.

Reese led the Terps to their second NCAA title in five years in 2014. Maryland garnered a 23-1 record on their way to a sixth consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference title in the team's last season in the conference. Reese was named ACC Coach of the Year for a league-high seventh time. The Terps boasted six IWLCAs All-American, including IWLCAs National Midfielder of the Year Taylor Cummings and IWLCAs National Defender of the Year Megan Dooty. Cummings went on to become the first sophomore to earn the women's Tewaaraton Award. Reese capped the season with IWLCAs Regional and National Coach of the Year honors.

The Terps were near perfect in 2013, going 22-1 with its lone loss coming in heartbreaking fashion in overtime against North Carolina in the national title game. Maryland won its unprecedented fifth straight ACC title and senior Katie Schwarzmann won the Tewaaraton Award for the second straight year. The Terps boasted the IWLCAs Midfielder and Attacker of the Year in Schwarzmann and Alex Aust. Taylor Cummings was named ACC Rookie of the Year.

Maryland captured its conference-record fourth consecutive ACC title in 2012 and landed in the final four for the fourth straight season. Reese mentored her second Tewaaraton winner - Katie Schwarzmann - and landed four student-athletes on the IWLCAs All-America list.

Reese's Terps won their third-straight conference championship in 2011 while landing in the final four of the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship for the third consecutive season. Maryland concluded the season with a 21-2 record, falling short in the title game to Northwestern. The Terps put together another stellar season, boasting two Tewaaraton finalists, an ACC Player of the Year and four IWLCAs First Team All-Americans.

With the Terps falling just once in regular season play, Maryland wrapped up the 2010 campaign on a 10-game winning streak, which concluded in elation with a gallant comeback against five-time defending national champion Northwestern in the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship. Reese coached Maryland's first Tewaaraton Award winner since Jen Adams as Caitlyn McFadden was tabbed the top player in all of women's lacrosse. Four other Terrapins landed All-America status as well and Reese garnered IWLCAs National Coach of the Year honors along with being named the top coach in the conference for the second straight season.

Reese had Maryland on the verge of perfection in 2009, leading the Terps to a 21-1 record, an NCAA Final Four trip and ACC Tournament and Regular Season championships. She boasted three Tewaaraton nominees, five All-Americans, five All-ACC honorees, the ACC Player and Rookie of the Year and the IWLCAs Midfielder of the Year.

Reese returned to her alma mater in 2007 as the head coach and guided the Terps to a 16-4 record, including a first-place finish in the Atlantic Coast Conference at 4-1, earning the conference's Coach of the Year award. Reese continued to move Maryland in a positive direction in 2008, steering the Terps to an 18-3 record and an Atlantic Coast Conference regular season title. Once again, Reese boasted some of the top talent in the nation as senior Dana Dobbie was tabbed ACC Player of the Year in addition to being named a finalist for the Tewaaraton Trophy, given annually to the nation's best player.

Reese returned to Maryland after spending her first three seasons as head coach at the University of Denver where she guided the Pioneers to their most successful season in school history in 2006 with a 16-5 record.

Prior to lifting the Denver program to national attention, Reese spent nine seasons in College Park, four as a student-athlete and five as an assistant coach. During that span, the women's lacrosse program had one of the most successful streaks seen in collegiate women's sports history. The Terps won seven national championships in her first nine years on campus.

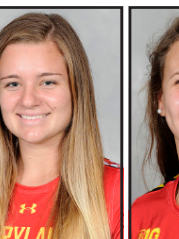
